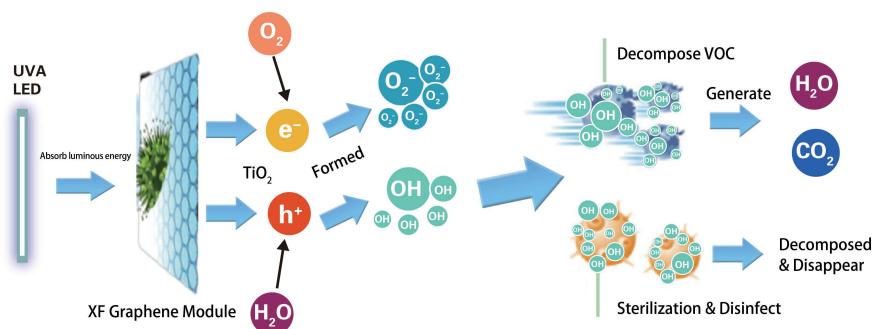

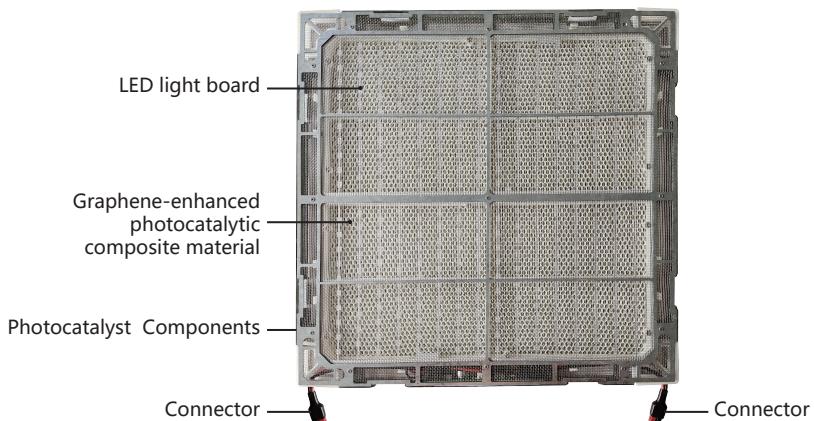
1. Description
