2 Know Your Phone

2.1 Insert SIM Card

The **device** is a Single SIM mobile phone

Turn off your mobile phone

1. Insert the SIM card correctly in the SIM slot(s).
2. Finally, replace the rear cover of the mobile phone.

3 Basic Operations

3.1 Switch Phone ON/OFF

To switch ON/OFF your phone, press and hold the **End key** for a few seconds.

3.2 Unlock the phone

If you do not use the phone for a while, the screen is replaced with a locked screen.

Press **Left** key, and then press **#** key.

3.3 Make a call

You can make a call in the following ways:

Enter the desired number in standby mode and press the **Call key** to make the call.

Go to **Menu > Contacts** and then select and dial the desired number.

Just press the **Call key** to dial the contacts listed in Call logs.

You can also dial a contact from the messages.

3.4 Choose User Profiles

Menu>Settings>Profiles

You can choose your profile and setting ring,volume.

4 Notable Features

Secure your Phone

Menu > Settings > Security > Phone Locked

Let you lock/unlock your phone via a security password which you can change anytime.

The default security code to unlock the phone is **1122**.

Note: After you activate the phone lock, you would be asked for a password when you power on your phone next time.

5 Contacts

Your Contacts stores all your saved contacts for anytime use. Your Contacts data can be stored in your SIM card or your phone memory. You can manage your contacts from here.

In the Contacts list, select the entry you want to delete.

You can compose and send SMS . Pressing the **Left Key** during/after composing the message gives you a host of messaging features.

6.3 Outbox

Menu > Messages >outbox: Display sent out SMS

6.4 Drafts

Menu > Messages >drafts: Display save edit SMS

6.5 sentbox

Menu > Messages >sentbox: Save the information that has been sent

Menu > Messages > Templates

11 Taking Care of Your Device
