7. Standalone MPE Result

As declared by the Applicant, the EUT is a wireless device used in a fix application, at least 20 cm from any body part of the user or nearby persons; from the maximum EUT RF output power, the minimum separation distance, r =20cm, as well as the gain of the used antenna is -3.86dBi, the RF power density can be obtained.

8. Simultaneously MPE Results

The BT and wireless charge share difference modular and antenna, BT and wireless charge can support simultaneously transmission.

Maximum MPE Ratio $_{\mathrm{BT}}$ + MPE Ratio $_{\mathrm{WPT}}$ = 0.0006 + 0.070 = 0.076 < 1.0
