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
IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

This product is intended for HOUSEHOLD USE ONLY and is not intended to be used for commercial purposes.

IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS: To avoid the risk of serious injury when using your kitchen composter and accessories, basic safety precautions must be followed, including but not limited to the following.

- To protect against the risk of electrical shock do not put in water or other liquids.
- This composter is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory, or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge unless they are closely supervised and instructed concerning the use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety. Close supervision is necessary when any appliance is used by or near children. Children should be supervised to ensure they do not play with the appliance.
- Turn the appliance OFF and unplug from the power outlet when not in use, before assembling/disassembling parts, and before cleaning. To unplug, grasp the plug and pull from the outlet. Never pull the power cord.
- When Permanently Installed – Make sure the appliance is OFF when not in use, before putting on or taking off parts, and before cleaning.
- Avoid contacting moving parts. Do not attempt to defeat or override any safety interlock mechanisms.
- Do not operate any appliance with a damaged cord or plug or after the appliance malfunctions, or is dropped or damaged in any manner. Contact the AIRTHEREAL customer service team for information on examination, repair, or adjustment.
- The use of attachments not recommended or sold by the AIRTHEREAL may cause fire, electric shock, or injury.
- Do not use outdoors.
- Do not let the cord hang over the edge of the table or counter.
- Keep hands and utensils away from moving blades or discs while processing food to reduce the risk of severe injury to persons or damage to the food processor. A scraper may be used but must be used only when the food composter is powered off and unplugged from the power outlet.
- Blades are sharp. Handle carefully.
- To reduce the risk of injury, never place the cutting blade or discs on the base without first putting the bucket properly in place.
- Be certain the cover is securely locked in place before operating the appliance.
- Never feed food by hand. Always use a food pusher.

- Do not fill the bucket above the (top edge of the bucket) (maximum fill line) (or maximum marked capacity) to avoid the risk of injury due to damage to the cover or bucket.
- Allow the composter to cool before opening the lid (approximately 35 minutes after the cycle has completed). Allow the composter's interior components to cool completely before handling. Use the handles or knobs provided for safe handling.
- Ensure that the composter is placed on a flat surface when in operation. To allow proper airflow, make sure to place the machine at least 10 inches away from all walls and in a well-ventilated space.



OPERATION

Prepare


1. Remove the Filter label.
Take off the stickers from the back of the carbon filter outlet.

2. Open lid


Press the lid switch lightly and the lid will pop up automatically.

3. Remove the bucket from the unit

Using the handle, pull the bucket straight up from the unit.

4. Add waste to the bucket

Refer to “What can I put in my composter” on page 8 for guidance.

- Waste must fit into the bucket without using force or packing it down.
- Cut waste into smaller pieces if necessary.
- Fill up the bucket no higher than the max line.
- Do not direct excess moisture into the bucket.
- Do not add foods that are too high in sugar.




5. Place the bucket with waste back into the unit.

Align the protruding part of the barrel with the recessed part of the main unit and put it in.



6. Close the lid


Press the lid down and close it, the lid will lock automatically.



7. Plug in the composter.

The control screen will light up and enter the main page, and then enter the APP connection page.

NOTE:You can temporarily not connect to the app, and the machine can work normally through the screen settings.



APP Connect

Step1

Preparation before connecting:

Make sure your Wi-Fi router supports 2.4GHz (NOT 5GHz) and 802.11b/g/n bands.

Note: Most 5GHz routers can also be set to a 2.4GHz band or dual band.

Make sure the Wi-Fi name and password are correct.

Make sure your smartphone or tablet supports a 2.4GHz network.

Download the App named **AIR.ai** from the App Store(iOS devices) or Google Play.


Step 2

Connect your phone to the 2.4 GHz wireless network of your composter.

Press the connect button to connect the app.

Open AIR.ai and tap the “+” icon in the top right corner.

The add device page will appear. Tap “Go to add.”




Tap “Next.”

Enter the password of your Wi-Fi network when prompted (same Wi-Fi network on which your smartphone is connected) then click confirm.






NOTE:


- When the cover is opened during operation, the machine will automatically stop working and will continue to work after closing the machine.
- The machine has a memory function. Once the power is cut off, it will resume the last setting when it is turned back on.
- DO NOT put your hands inside the composter until it has finished cycling, has gone

through all cycle modes, and you have unplugged the unit.

SETTING


● WIFI SETTING

If the composter is not connected to the app when it is turned on, you can reconnect by setting the WiFi connection button.



● FILTER HEALTH

You can check the life of the filter through settings. If the life health is less than 10%, the machine will remind you to replace the filter element.




Blue: 60-100%

WHAT CAN I PUT IN MY COMPOSTER

See below for what can and can not be put in the composter.

Do put in	Don't put in
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Weeds / dead houseplants• Nuts (Beans/Seeds)• Soft bones (fish)• Soft shells (eggs, shrimp)• Soft peels (watermelon, melon)• Fruit and vegetable scraps• Food leftovers, plate scrapings• Dairy products (cheese, yogurt)• Meat scraps (Fish/shellfish/poultry)• Coffee filters, grounds, and tea bags• Small amounts of starches (bread, pasta, rice, potatoes, cereals, oats and other grains)• Small amounts of Sauces (Jam/sauce/salad dressing/Peanut Butter)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Candy/gum• Flammable materials (alcohol)• Decomposable tableware• Hard bones (beef, pork, lamb)• Cooking oil, grease, liquids• Large-grained fruit cores (peach cores, etc.)• Diapers, wipes, hygiene products <p>Warning:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Do not leave foreign objects, such as spoons, forks, knives or other utensils in the bucket as this will damage the unit components when starting the composter and may cause injury.• Do not put shellfish into the work, otherwise the bucket will be damaged.• Do not use products that contain too much sugar, as they will condense and jam the cutter head after cooling.

Note: make sure to cut up to big food/rigid stems/fibrous vegetables (e.g. corn/corn husk, flower stems, Fiber plant, etc.) so that they don't get stuck during grinding. If the bucket appears to be damaged from the addition of any of the items listed in the don't put in column, the warranty is void.

HOW TO CARE FOR YOUR COMPOSTER

Cleaning your composter

We recommend cleaning the composter exterior once a month or as frequently as you would clean any other kitchen appliance. To keep your machine at optimal performance, clean the interior of the bucket routinely.

1. Ensure your composter is unplugged before cleaning.

2. Simply wipe with a damp dishcloth. If your composter is particularly dirty, add a small amount of dish soap to your cleaning process.
3. Use a dry cloth to remove excess moisture.

Note: never submerge your composter under water. There are electrical components inside and any excess water can cause significant damage and may cause electric shock.

Cleaning the bucket

The bucket can be easily removed and washed by hand or placed in the dishwasher for a more thorough cleaning.

- Allow your bucket to cool before handling it or placing it back in your composter.
- It is recommended to soak for a while before cleaning.
- Ensure the bucket is free from any excess dirt/ particles before placing it in the dishwasher.
- Note that only the bucket is dishwasher safe. Do not put any other part of the composter into the dishwasher.
- For a deeper clean, add 4.5L of water & start a Cleaning cycle which will run for about 1 h. For detailed instructions see Page [X](#). Be sure to let the bucket cool after a Cleaning cycle before removing from composter.


REPLACE THE CARBON FILTER

The Filter once used up, can also be used as an additive to your soil! The filter cartridge uses biodegradable materials and can decompose on its own.

1. Remove the filter caps.
2. Locate and remove the filters.
3. Install the new filters.



Note: take off the black stickers before installing the filters.

4. After replacing the filter cartridge, press the reset button, the life of the filter cartridge will reset to zero, and the life of the new filter cartridge will be counted again.
