## 1. Display on the scoreboard:

- 1) Display editable competition time per period. Time counts down. When the time is greater than 1 min, it is displayed in the format "minutes: seconds". When the time is less than 1 min, the displayed format is "seconds: milliseconds".
  - 2) Display periods (1-9).
  - 3) Display scores of home and guest team, up to 199.
  - 4) Ball possession indicator.

## 2. Basic operations of remote controller:

- 1) Reverse to a game.
- 2) / on the left: Home Score +1; / on the right: Guest Score +1.
  - 3) on the left: Home Score -1; on the right: Guest Score -1.
  - 4) on the left: Home Score +2; on the right: Guest Score +2.
  - 5) on the left: Home Score +3; on the right: Guest Score +3.
  - 6) Poss / Poss : toggle between Home and Guest Possession.
  - 7) : go to next period; : back to previous period.
  - 8) Back : time -1s; second : time +1s.
  - 9) Press the key, (Bonus) turns on (home's foul and free throw sign

indicator light), press the key again, and the indicator light goes out,

- 10) Press the (Bonus) turns on (guest's foul and free throw sign indicator light), and press the key again, and the indicator light goes out.
  - 11) : adjust the brightness of the scoreboard in five levels.
  - 12) : turn on or off buzzer.

## 3. Time editing:

To edit the time, press this key followed by displaying first jumping digit of the time. Then edit the number displayed on the scoreboard according to the number below the corresponding keys.
