## 2. BEFORE USING

The device needs to be plugged into an SD card.

## 3. GETTING STARTED

### Basic Function

- Turn on the phone

Connect the Charger and the device will start automatically.

- Turn off the phone

Long press the power key until a menu shows. Choose “Power off” ’ to turn off .

- Restart the phone

Long press the power key until a menu shows. Choose “Restart” to restart.

### Quick Menu

- Volume Control 


Adjust media volume, ring tone, and notification volume

- Bluetooth switch 

When turned on, you can search for nearby Bluetooth devices

- BLAN switch 

Once Open, you can search for nearby networks

- Settings Menu 

You can change time, language, restore factory settings, view device information, and so on

## 5. LED light flicker status

Blue Light : The blue light flashes when the machine is turned on

Red Light : Flashing red lights while the equipment is working
