1. FCC Regulation

According to §15.247(i), systems operating under the provisions of this section shall be operated in a manner that ensures that the public is not exposed to radio frequency energy levels in excess of the Commission's guidelines. See § 1.1307(b)(1) of this Chapter.

Limits for Maximum Permissive Exposure: RF exposure is calculated.

MPE (Maximum Permissive Exposure) Prediction

Predication of MPE limit at a given distance: Equation from KDB 447498 D01 General RF Exposure Guidance v06 $S = PG/4\pi R^2$ ($\Rightarrow R = \sqrt{PG/4\pi S}$)

S = power density [mW/cm²]

P = Power input to antenna [mW]

G = Power gain of the antenna in the direction of interest relative to an isotropic radiator

R = distance to the center of radiation of the antenna [cm]

2. RF Exposure Compliance Issue

The information should be included in the user's manual:

This appliance and its antenna must not be co-located or operation in conjunction with any other antenna or transmitter. A minimum separation distance of 20 cm must be maintained between the antenna and the person for this appliance to satisfy the RF exposure requirements.



MPE Calculations: GFSK

- Frequency Range : 902 MHz ~ 928 MHz

- Measured RF Maximum Output Power : 9.83 dBm

- Target Power & Tolerance 10.00 dBm & ± 1.00 dB

(Maximum : <u>11.00</u> dBm & Minimum : <u>9.00</u> dBm)

- Maximum Peak Antenna Gain: 3.00 dBi

- Maximum Output Power for the Calculation : 11.00 dBm

The EUT will only be used with a separation of 20 centimeters or greater between the antenna and the body of the The MPE Calculations for this exposure is shown below.

-EIRP = P + G

= 11.00 dBm + 3.00 dBi

= 14.00 dBm

= <u>25.12</u> mW

- NOTE

P: Max tuneup Power (dBm)

G: Maximum Peak Antenna Gain (dBi)

Power Density at the specific separation

 $-S = EIRP / (4 X R^2 \pi)$

= 25.12 / (4 X 20² X π)

= **0.004 997** mW/cm² (Limit: 1.00)

- NOTE

S: Maximum Power Density (mW/cm²)

EIRP: Equivalent Isotropic Radiated Power (mW)

R: Distance to the center of the radiation of the

antenna (20 cm)
