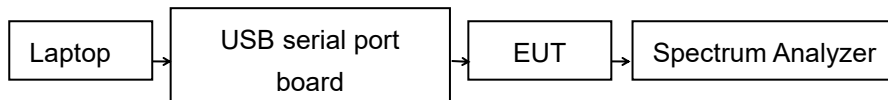

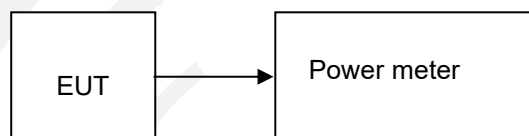

4. Bandwidth

4.1. Limit

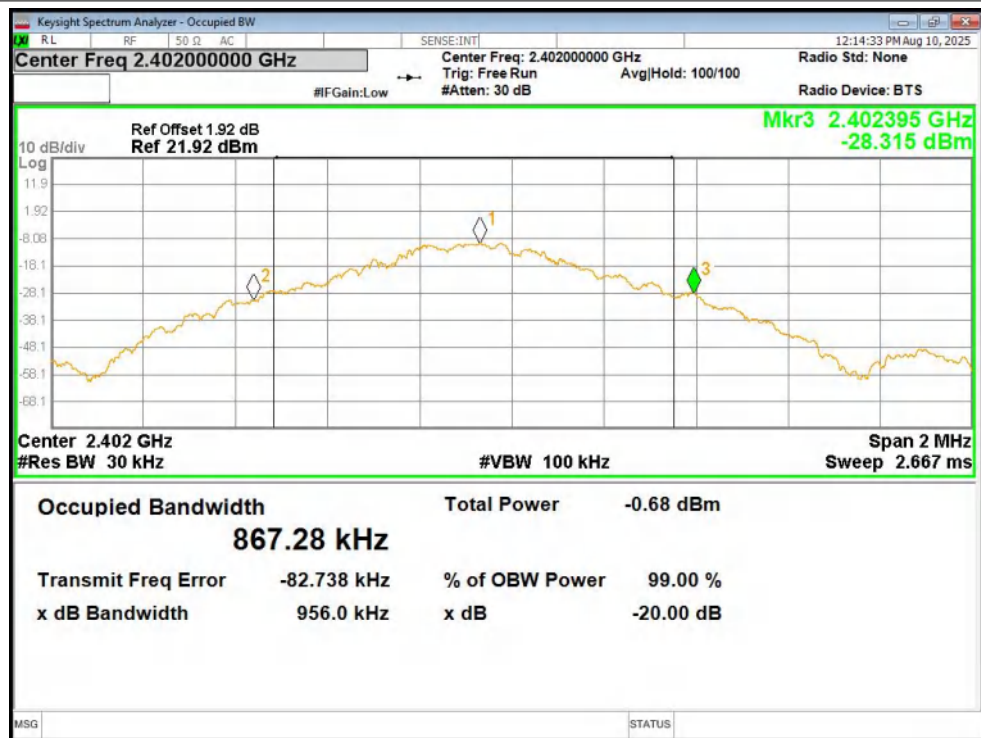
The RF output of EUT was connected to the spectrum analyzer by RF cable and attenuator. The bandwidth of the fundamental frequency was measured by spectrum analyzer with 30kHz RBW and 100kHz VBW. The 20dB bandwidth is defined as the total spectrum the power of which is higher than peak power minus 20dB.

5. Carrier Frequency Separation

5.1. Limit

Frequency hopping systems shall have hopping channel carrier frequencies separated by a minimum of 25 kHz or the 20 dB bandwidth of the hopping channel, whichever is greater.

Alternatively, frequency hopping systems operating in the 2400-2483.5 MHz band may have hopping channel carrier frequencies that are separated by 25 kHz or two-thirds of the 20 dB bandwidth of the hopping channel, whichever is greater, provided the systems operate with an output power no greater than 125 mW

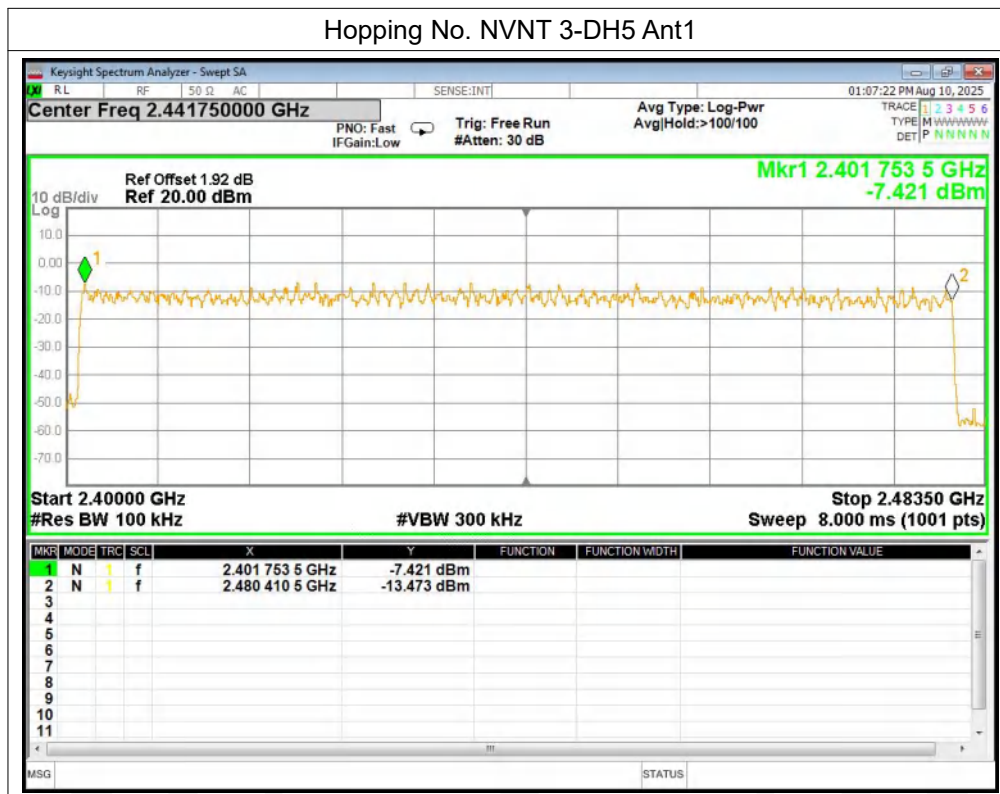

7. Dwell Time

7.1. Test limit

Please refer FCC part 15.247 & RSS-247.

Frequency hopping systems operating in the 2400MHz-2483.5MHz. The average time of occupancy on any frequency shall not greater than 0.4 s within period of 0.4 sec- onds multiplied by the number of hopping channel employed.

7.2. Test Procedure

7.2.1. Place the EUT on the table and set it in transmitting mode.

7.2.2. Remove the antenna from the EUT and then connect a low loss RF cable from the antenna port to the spectrum analyzer.

7.2.3. Set center frequency of spectrum analyzer = operating frequency.

7.2.4. Set the spectrum analyzer as RBW=1MHz, VBW=3MHz, Span = 0Hz, Sweep = auto.

7.2.5. Repeat above procedures until all frequency measured were complete.

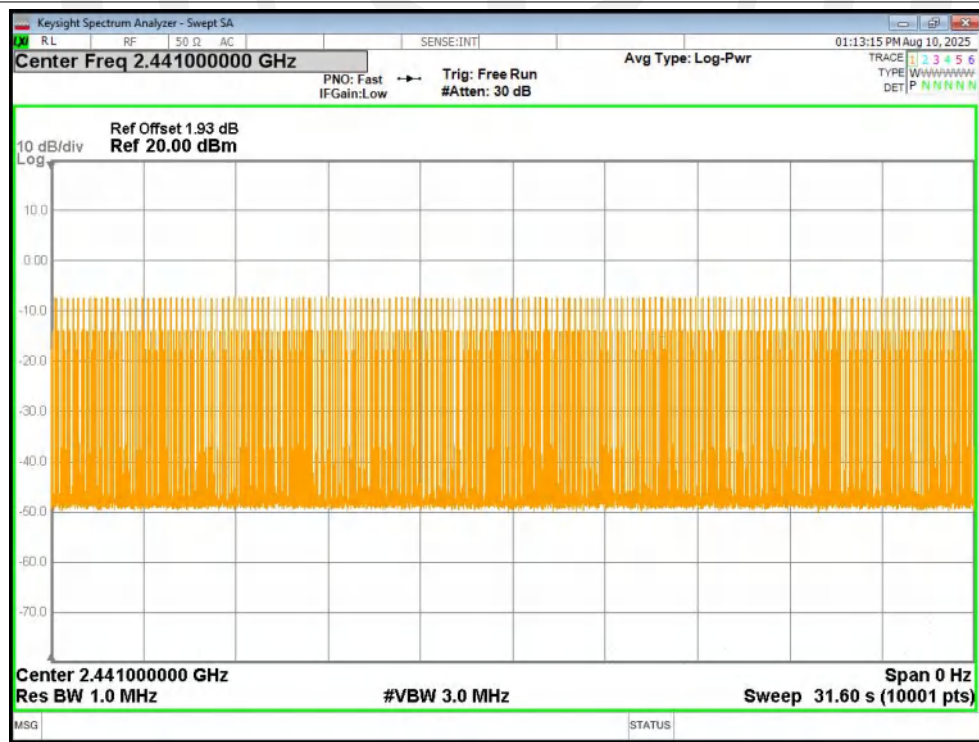
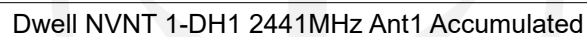

8. Out-of-band Emissions

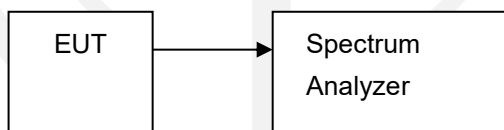
8.1. Test Limits

In any 100 kHz bandwidth outside the frequency band in which the spread spectrum or digitally modulated intentional radiator is operating, the radio frequency power that is produced by the intentional radiator shall be at least 20 dB below that in the 100 kHz bandwidth within the band that contains the highest level of the desired power, based on either an RF conducted or a radiated measurement, provided the transmitter demonstrates compliance with the peak conducted power limits. If the transmitter complies with the conducted power limits based on the use of RMS averaging over a time interval, as permitted under paragraph (b)(3) of this section, the attenuation required under this paragraph shall be 30 dB instead of 20 dB. Attenuation below the general limits specified in FCC Part 15.209(a) is not required. Please refer section 15.247.

8.2. Test Procedure

Connect the transmitter output to spectrum analyzer using a low loss RF cable, and set the spectrum analyzer to RBW=100 kHz, VBW= 300 kHz, peak detector, and max hold. Measurements utilizing these settings are made of the in-band reference level, band edge and out-of-band emissions.

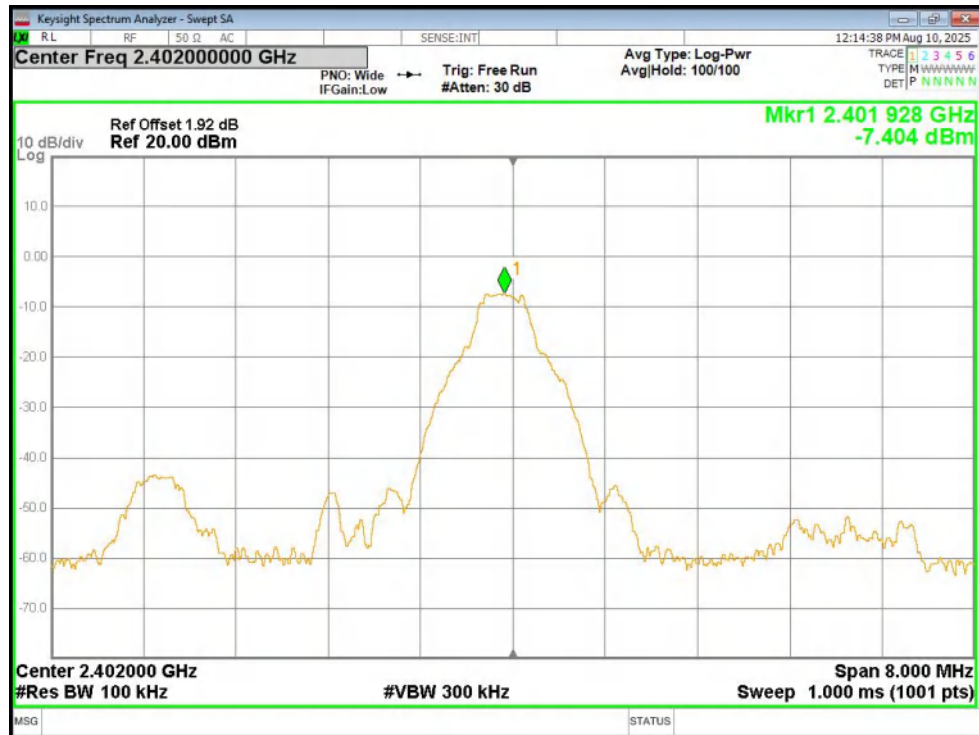

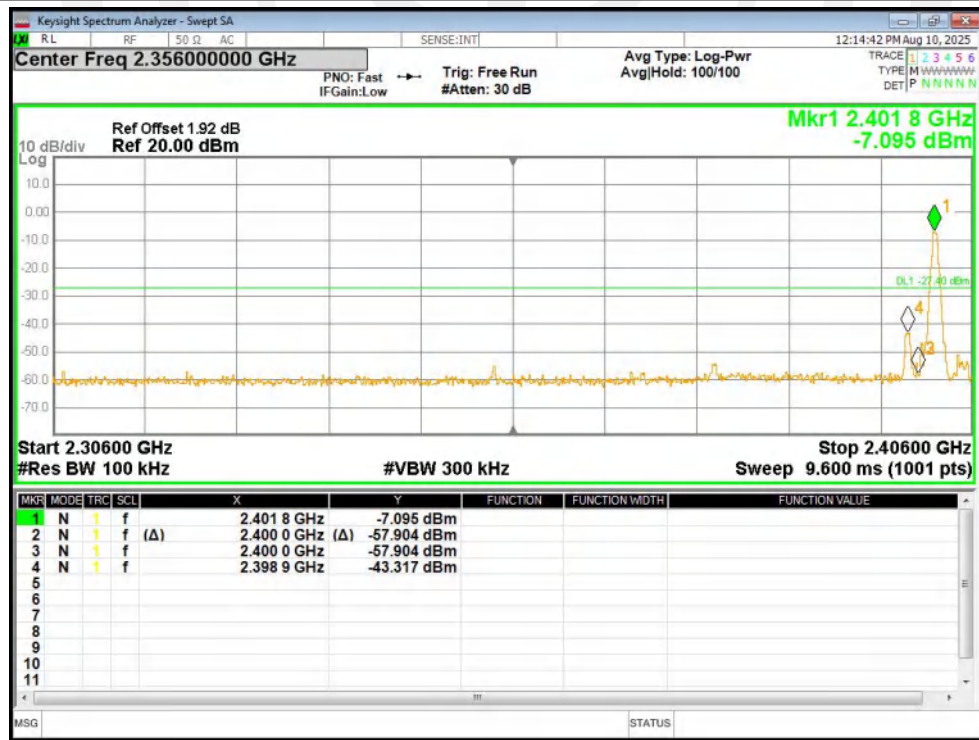

Band Edge NVNT 1-DH5 2402MHz Ant1 No-Hopping Ref



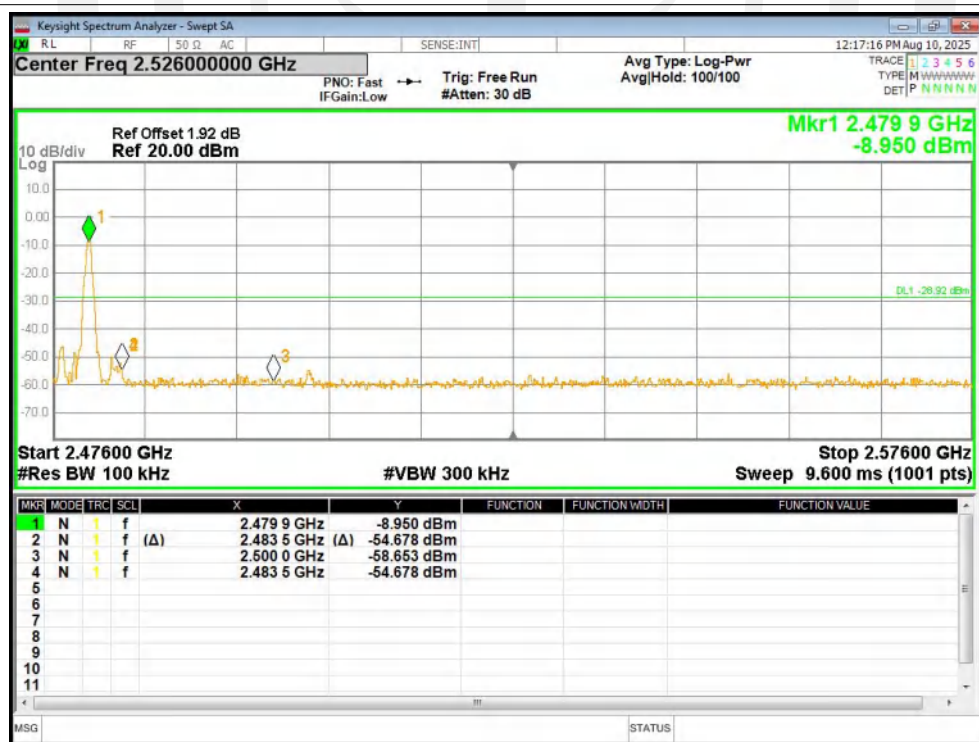
Band Edge NVNT 1-DH5 2402MHz Ant1 No-Hopping Emission



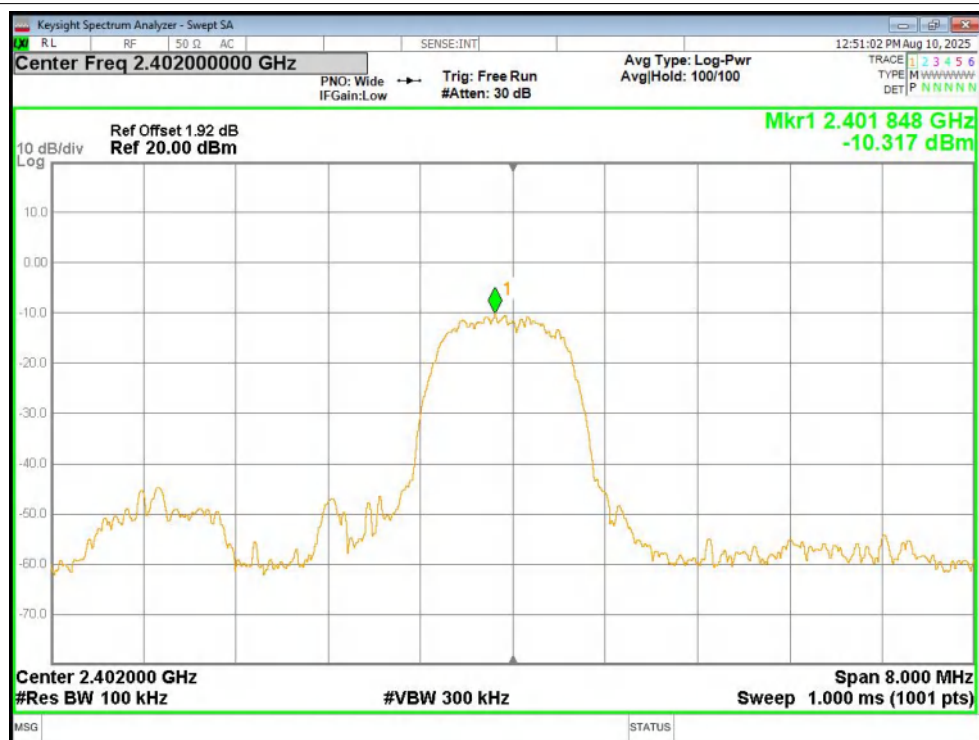

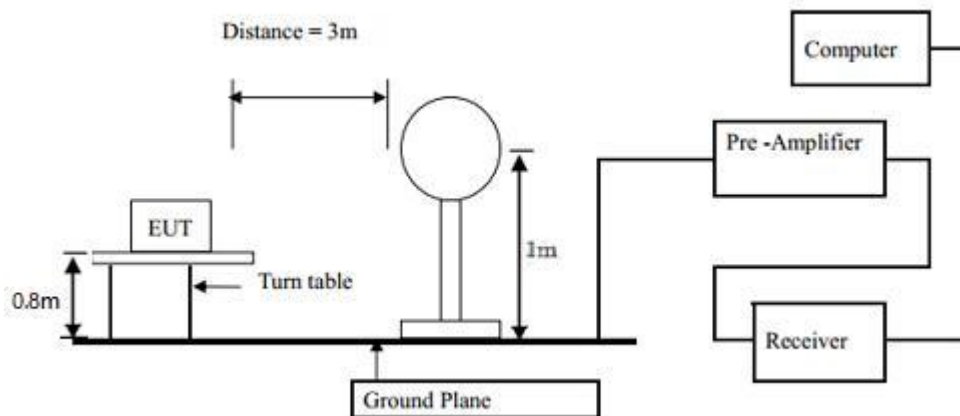

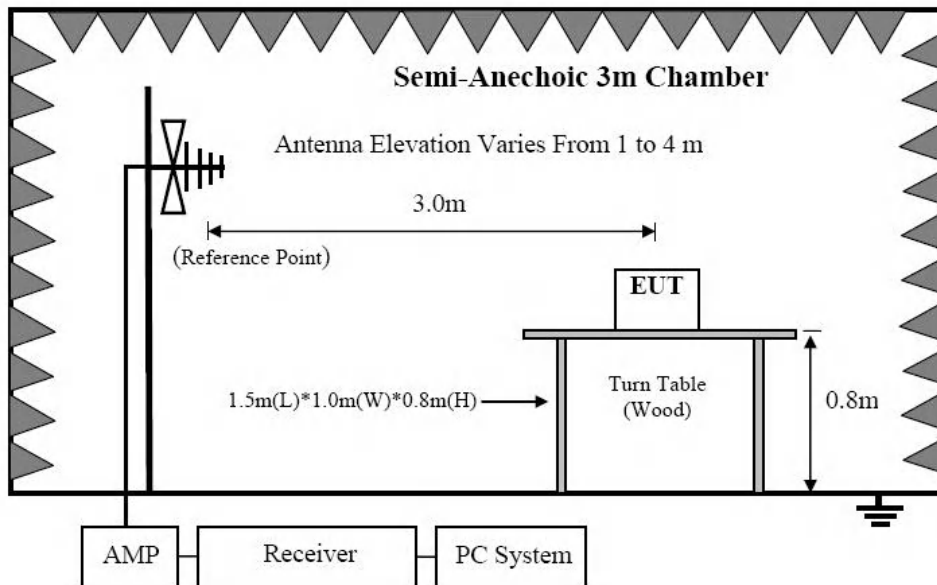

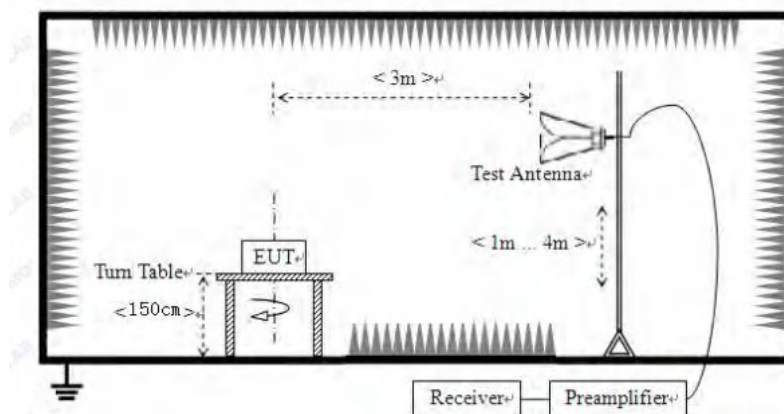
9.2.1 In 3m Anechoic Chamber Test Setup Diagram for below 30MHz

9.3. Test Procedure

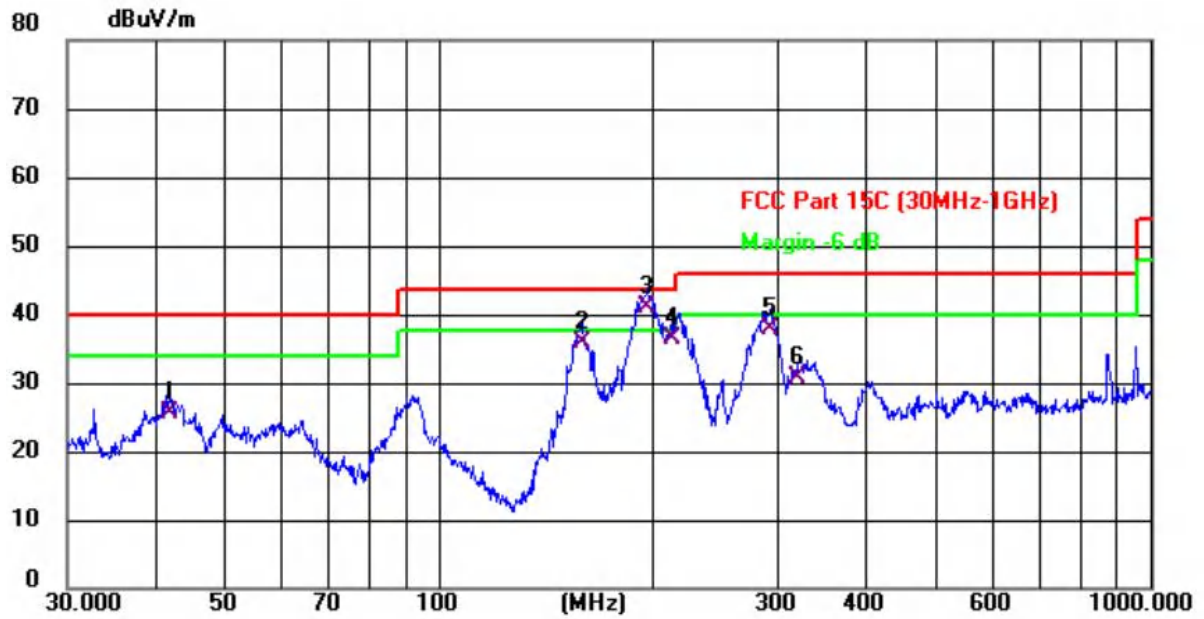
- (1) EUT was placed on a non-metallic table, 80 cm above the ground plane inside a semi-anechoic chamber.
- (2) Setup EUT and simulator
- (3) Test antenna was located 3m from the EUT on an adjustable mast. Below pre-scan procedure was first performed in order to find prominent radiated emissions.
 - (a) Change work frequency or channel of device if practicable.
 - (b) Change modulation type of device if practicable.
 - (c) Rotated EUT through three orthogonal axes to determine the attitude of EUT arrangement produces highest emissions
- (4) Spectrum frequency from 9KHz to 25GHz (tenth harmonic of fundamental frequency) was investigated
- (5) For final emissions measurements at each frequency of interest, the EUT were rotated and the antenna height was varied between 1m and 4m in order to maximize the emission. Measurements in both horizontal and vertical polarities were made and the data was recorded. In order to find the maximum emission, the relative positions of equipments and all of the interface cables were changed according to ANSI C63.10:2013 on Radiated Emission test.
- (6) For emissions above 1GHz, both Peak and Average level were measured with Spectrum Analyzer, and the RBW is set at 1MHz, VBW is set at 3MHz for Peak measure; RBW is set at 1MHz, VBW is set at 10Hz for Average measure.

9.4. Test Results

The amplitude of spurious emissions which are attenuated by more than 20dB below the permissible value has no need to be reported.

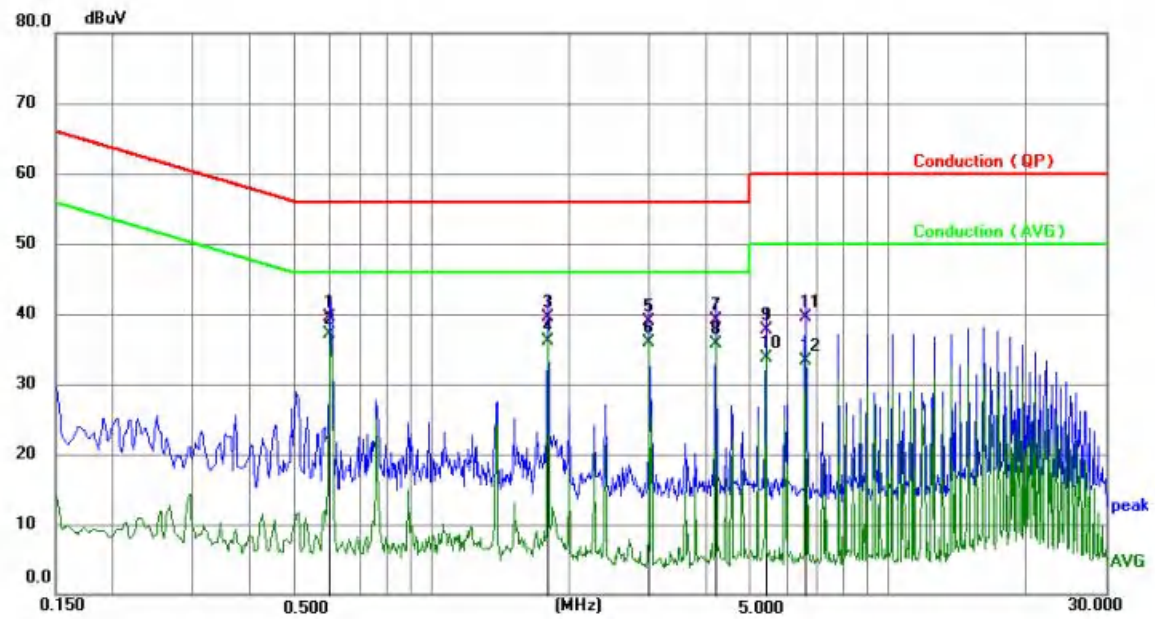
11.3. Test Procedure

- (1) The EUT was placed on a non-metallic table, 80cm above the ground plane.
- (2) Setup the EUT and simulator as shown in 10.1
- (3) The EUT Power connected to the power mains through a power adapter and a line impedance stabilization network (L.I.S.N1). The other peripheral devices power cord connected to the power mains through a line impedance stabilization network (L.I.S.N2), this provided a 50-ohm coupling impedance for the EUT (Please refer to the block diagram of the test setup and photographs). Both sides of power line were checked for maximum conducted interference. In order to find the maximum emission, the relative positions of equipments and all of the interface cables were changed according to ANSI C63.10:2013on conducted Emission test.
- (4) The bandwidth of test receiver is set at 10KHz.
- (5) The frequency range from 150 KHz to 30MHz is checked.

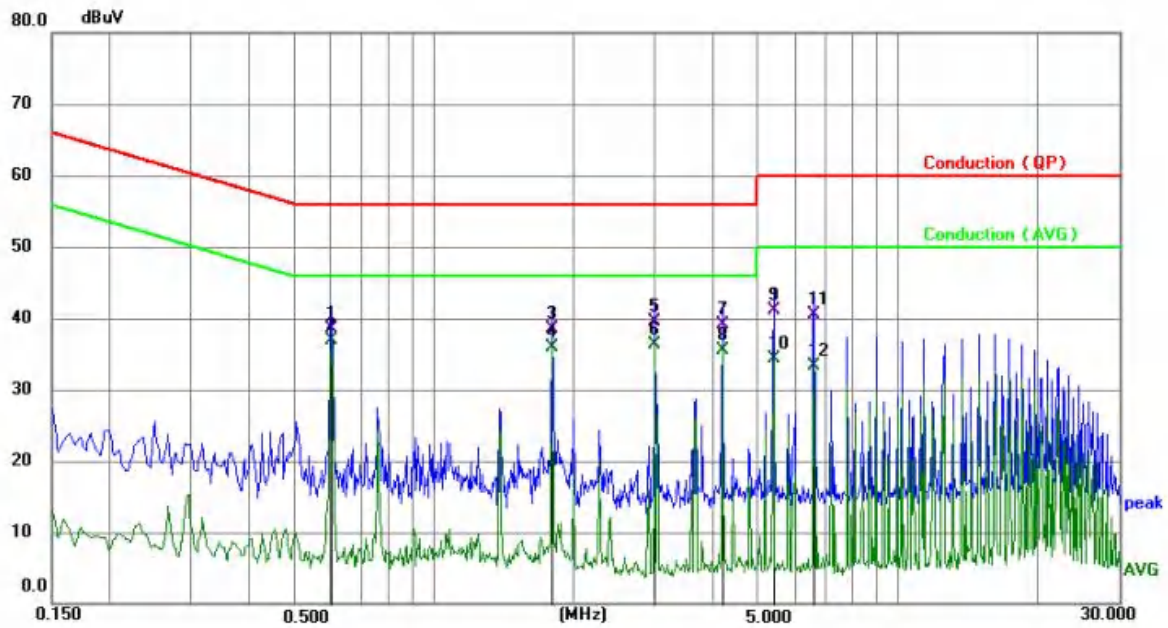

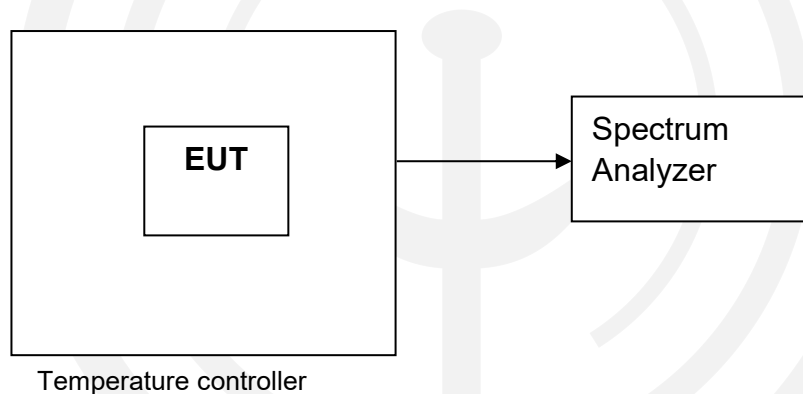

Regulation RSS-Gen If the frequency stability of the licence-exempt radio apparatus is not specified in the applicable RSS, the fundamental emissions of the radio apparatus should be kept within at least the central 80% of its permitted operating frequency band in order to minimize the possibility of out-of-band operation. In addition, its occupied bandwidth shall be entirely outside the restricted bands and the prohibited TV bands of 54-72 MHz, 76-88 MHz, 174-216 MHz, and 470-602 MHz, unless otherwise indicated.

13. Antenna Requirements

13.1. Limit

And according to FCC 47 CFR Section 15.247 (b), if transmitting antennas of directional gain greater than 6dBi are used, the power shall be reduced by the amount in dB that the directional gain of the antenna exceeds 6dBi.
