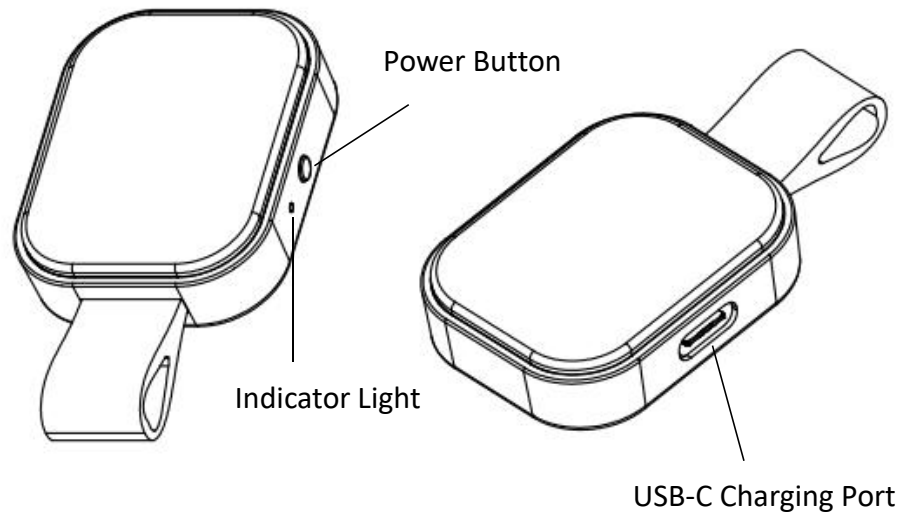


Getting Started

Please fully charge the Qulio Finder Tag 100% before using it for the first time.

Setting Up Your Device

Compatibility

The Qulio Finder Tag is only compatible with iOS 14.5 or later and

requires Two-Factor Authentication to be turned on. If you're not using two-factor authentication for your Apple ID, you can turn on this feature with the following instructions:

1. Turn on Two-Factor Authentication for your Apple ID:
 - On your iPhone: Go to Settings > your name > Sign-In & Security. Tap Turn on Two-Factor Authentication. Then tap Continue and follow the onscreen instructions.
 - On your Mac: Choose Apple menu > System Settings, then click your name (or Apple ID). Click Sign-In & Security. Next to Two-Factor Authentication, click Turn On and follow the onscreen instructions.
 - On the web: Go to appleid.apple.com and sign in with your Apple ID. Answer your security questions, then tap Continue. Tap Continue when you see a prompt to update account security. Then tap Update Account Security and follow the onscreen instructions.
2. Turn on Find My.
 - A. Go to Settings.
 - B. Tap your name, then tap Find My.
 - C. Tap Find My iPhone and turn on Find My iPhone.
3. Turn on Bluetooth.
4. Connect to a stable Wi-Fi or cellular network.
5. Turn on Location Services:
 - Go to Settings > Privacy & Security > Location Services> Turn on Location Services.

Getting Started

Turn on

Shortly press the Qulio Finder Tag power button one time, and a beep will indicate that it has been turned on.

Turn off

To turn off the Qulio Finder Tag, short press the power button two

times, then press and hold the button until you hear a beeping sound. This will indicate that the device has been turned off. If your Qulio Finder Tag has not been paired within 10 minutes, you will hear a beep indicating that it has been turned off. To continue pairing your tag, please turn it on again.

Factory reset

To factory reset the Qulio Finder Tag, press the power button 4 times, then press and hold until you hear a beep sound. This will indicate that the factory reset has been completed.

Pairing Your Qulio Finder Tag

1. Ensure your iPhone is set up (see “Setting Up Your iPhone” above) and your Qulio Finder Tag is turned on.
2. Open the Find My app.
3. Short feat the power button two times, and a beep will indicate that the Qulio Finder Tag is ready for pairing.
3. In the Items tab, tap Add New Item.
4. Tap Other Supported Item (your iPhone will search for your Qulio Finder Tag).
5. Once your Qulio Finder Tag is detected, tap Connect.
6. Follow the onscreen steps to name and register it with your Apple ID.
7. Ensure your Qulio Finder Tag appears in Items. If not, forget the device, perform a factory reset on the Qulio Finder Tag (see” Getting Started > Factory reset” above), and then reconnect.

•Please do not leave the Find My app while pairing the Qulio Finder Tag.

Locating Your Qulio Finder Tag

Locate your Qulio Finder Tag

Confirm the location of your Qulio Finder Tag via the Map app.

1. Open the Find My app.
2. Tap the Items tab.
3. Select your Qulio Finder Tag from the Items list.
4. Tap Directions to open the location of your Qulio Finder Tag and get directions in the Maps app.

Play sound alert

1. Open the Find My app.
2. Tap the Items tab.
3. Select your Qulio Finder Tag from the Items list and tap Play Sound*.

*The sound alert will only play if your iPhone is connected to a network and your Qulio Finder Tag is within Bluetooth range of your iPhone (approx. 160f/50m).

Set up Notify When Left Behind

If your Qulio Finder Tag is out of Bluetooth range of your iPhone for a while, you will receive a notification that it has been lost (if you set up a name, the name will be displayed; otherwise, it will show the Qulio Finder Tag).

1. Open the Find My app.
2. Tap the Items tab.
3. Select your Qulio Finder Tag in the Items list and scroll down.
4. Under Notifications, tap Notify When Left Behind and turn it on.

– If your Qulio Finder Tag is not in Bluetooth range of your iPhone for some time, you will receive a notification that you may have lost your Qulio Finder Tag (if you set up a name, the name will be displayed. Otherwise, it will show the Qulio Finder Tag).

Enable Notify When Found

1. Open the Find My app.

2. If the Qulio Finder Tag cannot be located, you will see "No location found" below the device name. Under Notifications, turn on Notify When Found. You will receive a notification when the device is found.

[Important] Please check your device's notification settings to ensure the Find My app's notifications are turned on.

Mark your Qulio Finder Tag as lost

1. Open the Find My app.
2. Tap the Items tab.
3. Select your Qulio Finder Tag in the Items list and scroll down.
4. Ensure Notify When Left Behind is turned on.
5. Under Lost Mode, tap Enable, then tap Continue.
6. Enter your phone number/email address so that the finder of your Qulio Finder Tag can contact you, then tap Activate.

Changing the Name of Your Qulio Finder Tag

1. Open the Find My app and tap the Items tab.
2. Select your Qulio Finder Tag in the Items list.
3. Scroll down and tap Rename Item.
4. Select a name from the list or select a Custom Name.
5. For Custom Name, input a name and select an emoji.
6. Tap Done.

Removing Your Qulio Finder Tag

Removing your Qulio Finder Tag from your Apple ID will allow another person to activate and use it.

1. Ensure your Qulio Finder Tag is connected to your iPhone*.
2. Open the Find My app.
3. In the Items tab, tap the Qulio Finder Tag
4. Tap Remove item, tap Remove and confirm to remove.

*If not connected when removing your Qulio Finder Tag from your Apple ID, it will no longer be discoverable. You will need to

perform a factory reset before creating a new connection (see "Getting Started > Factory Reset" above).

Unwanted Tracking Notification

Suppose your Qulio Finder Tag is separated from your iPhone and is detected moving with another person with an Apple device over time. In that case, that person will receive a tracking alert message.

Charging your Qulio Finder Tag

Charge the Qulio Finder Tag with a wireless charger (Note: the charger is not included). During Charging, the status light will be orange. When fully charged, the status will turn green. You should fully charge your Qulio Finder Tag once every four months.

Apple's Find My network provides an easy, secure way to locate compatible personal items using the Find My app on your iPhone, iPad, or Mac, or the Find Items app on your Apple Watch.

To use Apple's Find My app to locate the item, the latest version of iOS, iPadOS, or macOS is recommended. The Find Items app on Apple Watch requires the latest version of the watchOS.
