


INTRODUCTION

The new M300 represents the next evolution of Vuzix Smart Glasses design specifically for enterprise use, providing easy access to information, data collection and more. Improve existing workflows and open new opportunities in industrial, medical, retail, supply chain, remote help desk, and other aspects of your business. The new M300 design is born from real world user feedback and industry requirements culminating from over 2 years of productive use of the workhorse Vuzix M100 Smart Glasses predecessor.

Device Diagram




HARDWARE SETUP

Before Using the M300


The M300 battery pack should be fully charged and the unit assembled prior to first time use, see the Assembly and Charging sections below for further detail.



Assembly



To assemble the M300, first mount the main unit and battery pod to the frame by sliding into the c-channel mounting clips. Then, simply connect the power cable to the main unit and battery, as illustrated below.



Charging

To charge the M300, connect the included Micro-USB cable to the battery pod via the port on the rear of the battery. The battery can be connected to the main unit while charging, but that is not required.

Left or Right Eye?

The M300 mounting system is ambidextrous; the battery and main unit can be swapped on the frame, for those who may be left eye dominant or simply prefer to have the unit mounted on the left side. The display with rotate to the proper orientation automatically when mounted to the left side of the frame.

Display Adjustment

The display of the M300 can be rotated on two separate axes, as indicated in the diagram below. In addition, the entire main unit can be rotated on the temple mount of degrees.

Power Button Behavior

To power on the M300, press the power button on the side of the device for 3 seconds.

To power off the M300, either press the power button for 3 seconds and confirm the power off dialogues, or press and hold the power button for a full 10 seconds to force a shutdown.

A short press on the power button will turn on/off the display.

Additional power behavior:

Plugging in a Micro-USB cable connected to a power source to the battery pod will power on the device if the device is off.

Pressing power button for 3 seconds without the battery pod connected will turn on the M300, though the internal battery in the main unit is not designed to power the unit for an extended period of time and is only intended for hot swapping of the battery.

Hot Swapping of Battery

The battery pod of the M300 can be hot swapped by disconnecting M300 power cable the battery and connecting another charged battery. The internal battery in the main unit will maintain power and connectivity on the M300 for approximately 60 seconds, at which point the device will put itself to sleep to prevent data loss. The display will power off during the swap, but the device will stay running. For instructions on how to connect/disconnect the battery, refer to Assembly section of this manual.

User Interface Controls

The M300 supports a variety of methods to control the device, including the standard buttons, a touchpad, as well as a sophisticated voice control engine.

Buttons

The buttons are intended as a basic interface navigation method, allowing the user to navigate through menus and make selections. The two front-most buttons will perform a forward/back function, and the rear most button will perform a select action. A long press on the front button will bring up a context menu for the current selection, and a long press on the center button will exit back to the home screen.



Touchpad

The M300 features a two-axis swipe pad with tap gestures. The touchpad can be used to navigate through menus with side-to-side as well as up-and-down swipe gestures, and selections can be made with a tap gesture on the touchpad.

Voice Navigation

The M300 features a sophisticated voice control engine, supporting a variety of languages.

M300 Software

The M300 is running a Vuzix custom build of Android 6.0 Marshmallow. Our Android OS can be updated Over the Air, via our System File Manager, and for more experienced users, via ADB (Android Debug Bridge).

TROUBLESHOOTING

The M300 will not power on

If the M300 will not power on despite the battery pod being fully charged, first disconnect both ends of the M300 power cable, press and hold the power button for a full 10 seconds to ensure that the device is in fact fully shut down, then reconnect the cable to the battery pod and main unit and attempt to power on the device again.

If the M300 will still not power on after attempting the above, please contact Vuzix Customer Support for additional troubleshooting.
