2.0 General Description

2.1 Product Description

The equipment under test (EUT) is a BT+2.4G wireless module with Bluetooth and 2.4G transmitter functions operating in 2402-2480MHz. The EUT is powered by DC 3.3V battery. For more detail information pls. refer to the user manual.

Antenna Type: Integral antenna

Antenna Gain: 0 dBi

Modulation Type: GFSK

2.2 Related Submittal(s) Grants

This is an application for certification of transceiver for the BT+2.4G wireless module which has 2.4G transmitter function. The Bluetooth transmitter function was reported in the test report: 181205003SZN-001.

2.3 Test Methodology

Radiated emission measurements were performed according to the procedures in ANSI C63.10 (2013) and KDB 558074 v05r02. Radiated emission measurement was performed in semi-anechoic chamber. For radiated emission measurement, preliminary scans were performed in the semi-anechoic chamber only to determine the worst case modes. All radiated tests were performed at an antenna to EUT distance of 3 meters, unless stated otherwise in the "**Justification Section**" of this Application.

2.4 Test Facility

The Semi-anechoic chamber used to collect the radiated data is **Intertek Testing Services Shenzhen Ltd. Longhua Branch** and located at 101, 201, Building B, No. 308 Wuhe Avenue, Zhangkengjing Community, GuanHu Subdistrict, LongHua District, Shenzhen. This test facility and site measurement data have been fully placed on file with File Number: CN1188.

3.0 System Test Configuration

3.1 Justification

The system was configured for testing in a typical fashion (as a customer would normally use it), and in the confines as outlined in ANSI C63.10 (2013).

The EUT was powered by DC battery during the test, only the worst data was reported in this report.

For maximizing emissions below 30 MHz, the EUT was rotated through 360°, the centre of the loop antenna was placed 1 meter above the ground, and the antenna polarization was changed. For maximizing emissions, the EUT was rotated through 360°, the antenna height was varied from 1 meter to 4 meters above the ground plane, and the antenna polarization was changed. This step by step procedure for maximizing emissions led to the data reported in Section 4.

The unit was operated standalone and placed at the center of table.

The equipment under test (EUT) was configured for testing in a typical fashion (as a customer would normally use it). The EUT was placed on a turn table, which enabled the engineer to maximize emissions through its placement in the three orthogonal axes.

There was no special software to exercise the device.

3.4 Equipment Modification

Any modifications installed previous to testing by Shenzhen Honeycomb Technologies Company Limited will be incorporated in each production model sold / leased in the United States.

4.0 Test Results

Data is included worst-case configuration (the configuration which resulted in the highest emission levels).

4.1 Radiated Test Results

A sample calculation, configuration photographs and data tables of the emissions are included.

4.1.1 Field Strength Calculation

The field strength is calculated by adding the reading on the Spectrum Analyzer to the factors associated with preamplifiers (if any), antennas, cables, pulse desensitization and average factors (when specified limit is in average and measurements are made with peak detectors). A sample calculation is included below.

$$FS = RA + AF + CF - AG + PD + AV$$

Where

- FS = Field Strength in dB μ V/m
- RA = Receiver Amplitude (including preamplifier) in dB μ V
- CF = Cable Attenuation Factor in dB
- AF = Antenna Factor in dB
- AG = Amplifier Gain in dB
- PD = Pulse Desensitization in dB
- AV = Average Factor in -dB

In the radiated emission table which follows, the reading shown on the data table may reflect the preamplifier gain. An example of the calculations, where the reading does not reflect the preamplifier gain, follows:

$$FS = RA + AF + CF - AG + PD + AV$$

Assume a receiver reading of 62.0 dB μ V is obtained. The antenna factor of 7.4 dB and cable factor of 1.6 dB is added. The amplifier gain of 29 dB is subtracted. The pulse desensitization factor of the spectrum analyzer was 0 dB, and the resultant average factor was -10 dB. The net field strength for comparison to the appropriate emission limit is 32 dB μ V/m. This value in dB μ V/m was converted to its corresponding level in μ V/m.

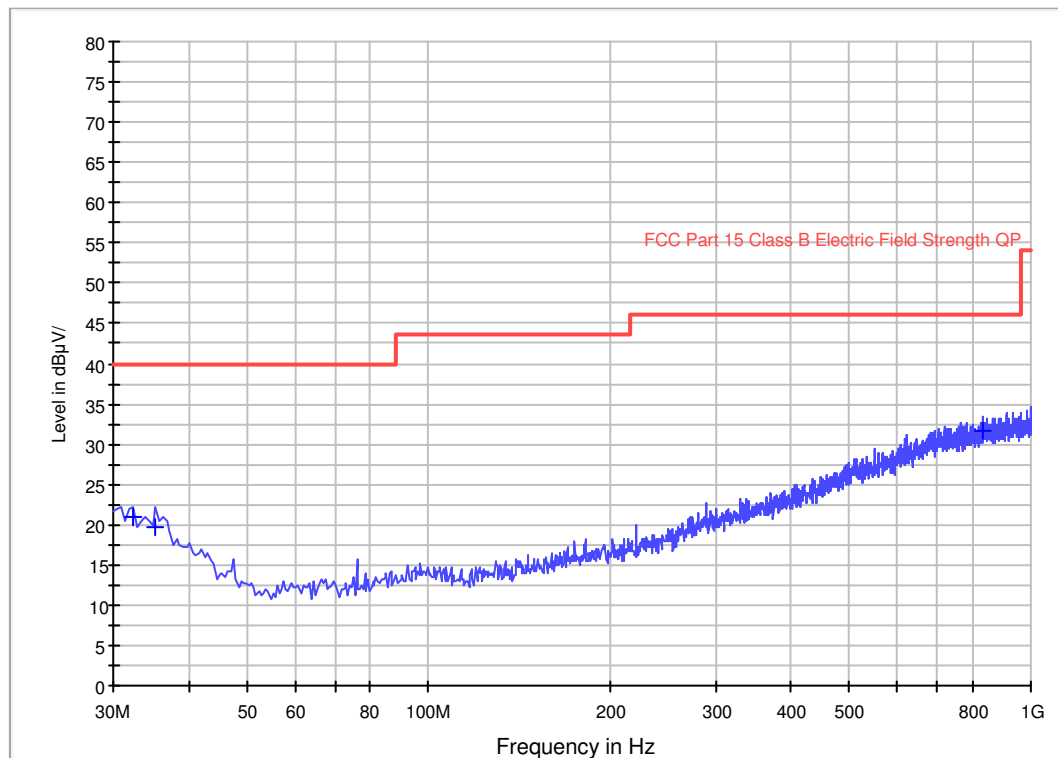

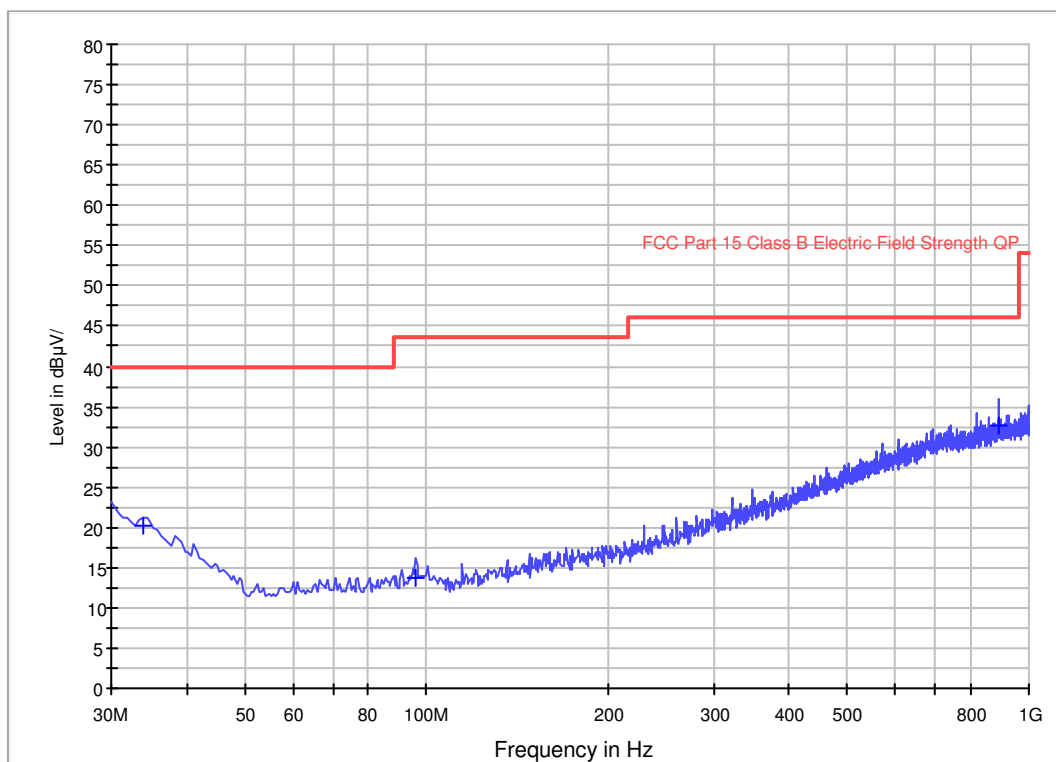

4.2 Peak Power

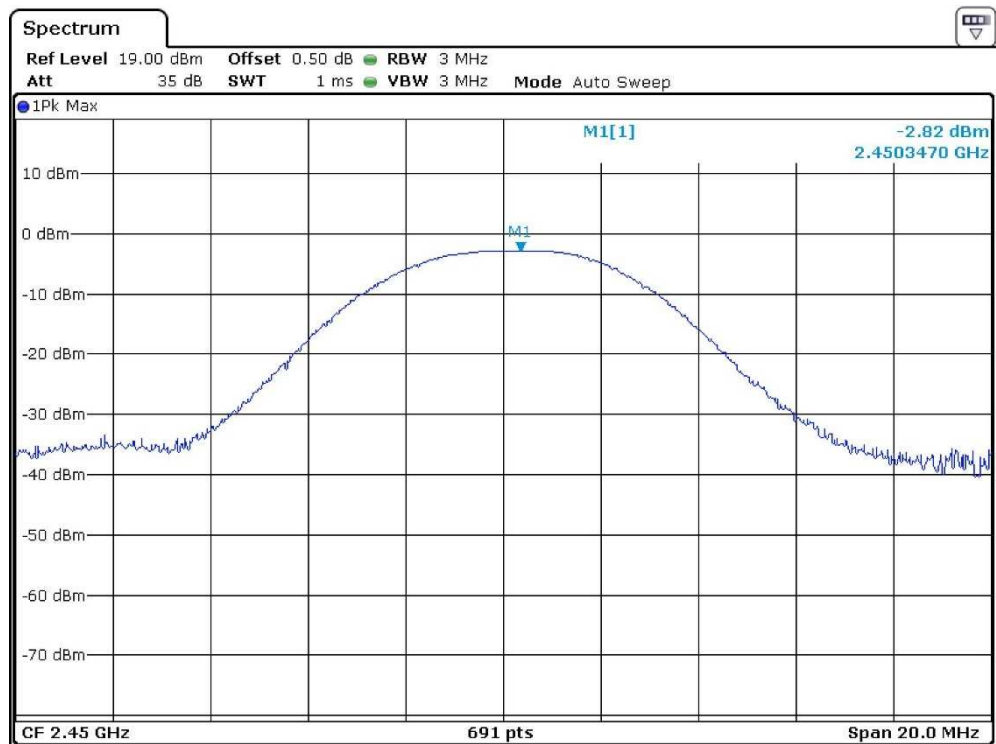
The antenna power of the EUT was connected to the input of a broadband peak RF power meter. Power was read directly and cable loss correction was added to the reading to obtain power at the EUT antenna terminals.

For antennas with gains of 6 dBi or less, maximum allowed Transmitter output is 1 watt (+30 dBm).

4.2 6dB Bandwidth

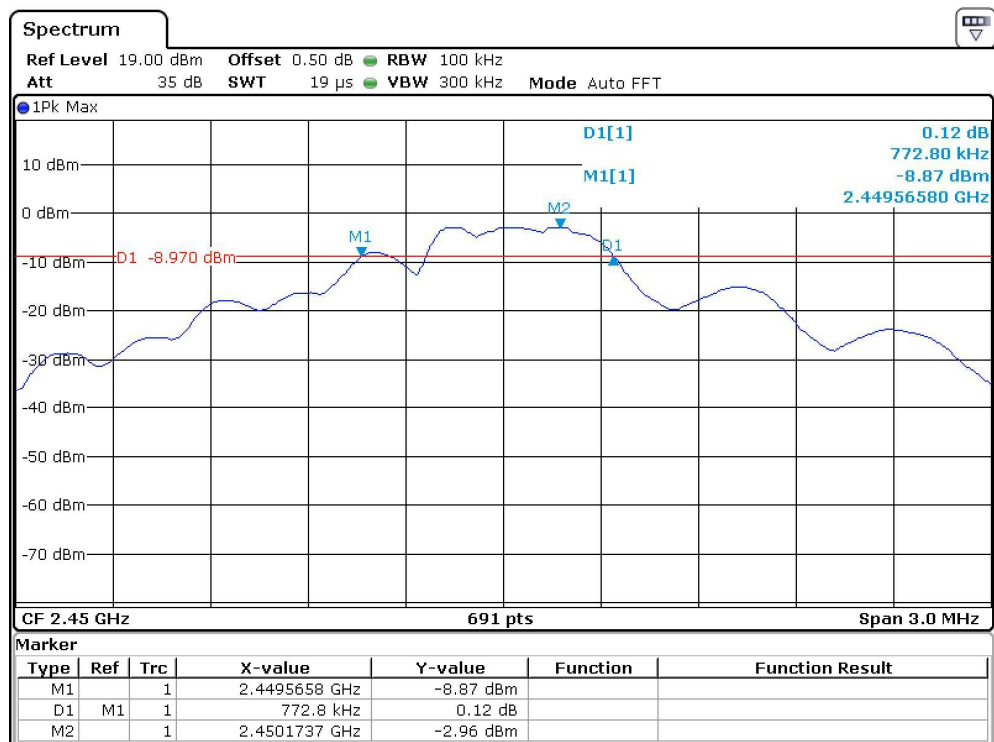
Minimum 6dB RF Bandwidth, FCC Rule 15.247(a) (2):

The antenna port of the EUT was connected to the input of a spectrum analyzer. Analyzer RBW was set to 100 KHz according to FCC KDB 558074 D01 v05r02. For each RF output channel investigated, the spectrum analyzer center frequency was set to the channel carrier. A PEAK output reading was taken, a DISPLAY line was drawn 6 dB lower than PEAK level. The 6dB bandwidth was determined from where the channel output spectrum intersected the display line.

Limit: The 6 dB Bandwidth is at least 500 kHz.

4.4 Power Density

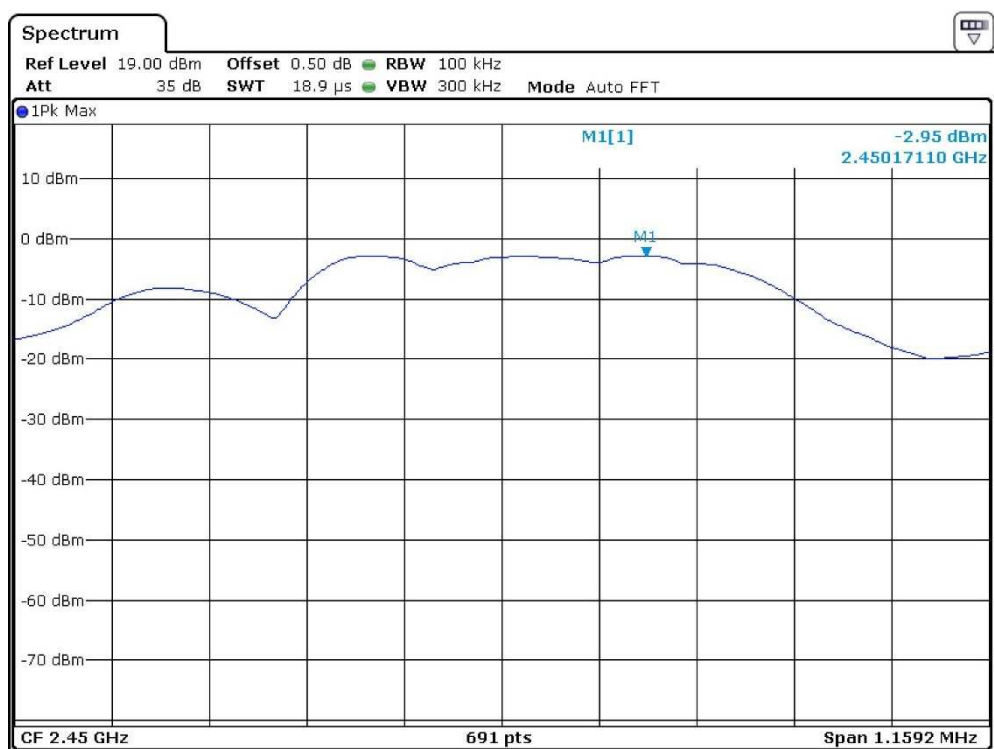
Maximum Power Density Reading, FCC Rule 15.247(e).

The Measurement Procedure PKPSD was set according to the FCC KDB 558074 D01 v05r02.

Antenna output of the EUT was coupled directly to spectrum analyzer; if an external attenuator and/or cable was used, these losses are compensated for with the analyzer OFFSET function.

Limit: The Power Density does not exceed 8dBm/ 3 kHz.

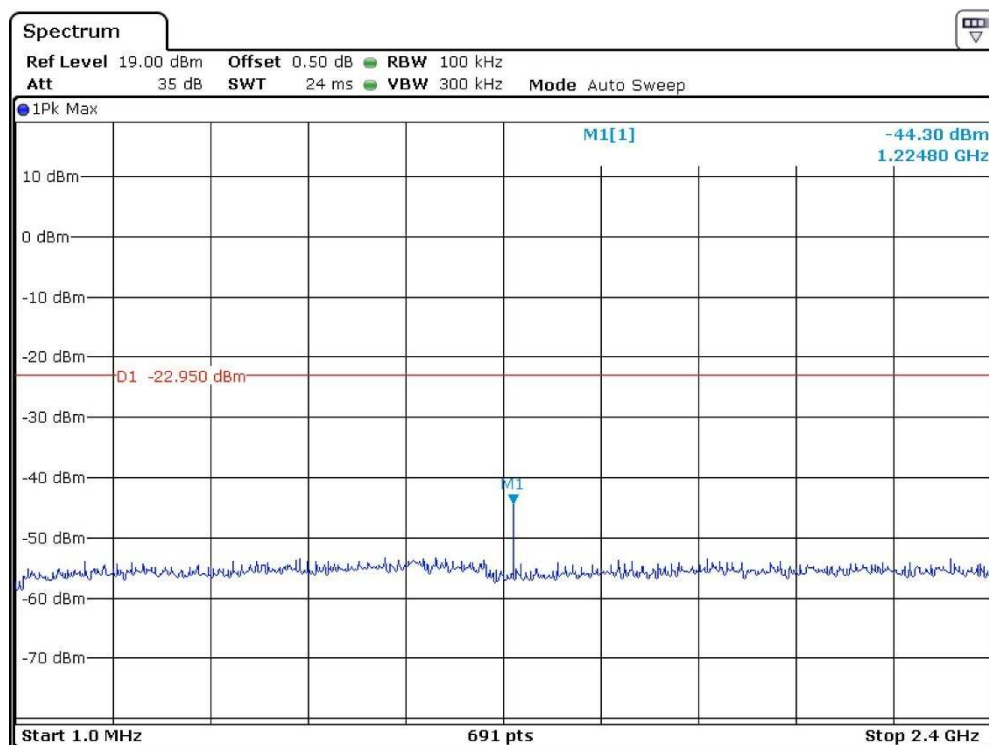
4.5 Out of Band Conducted Emissions

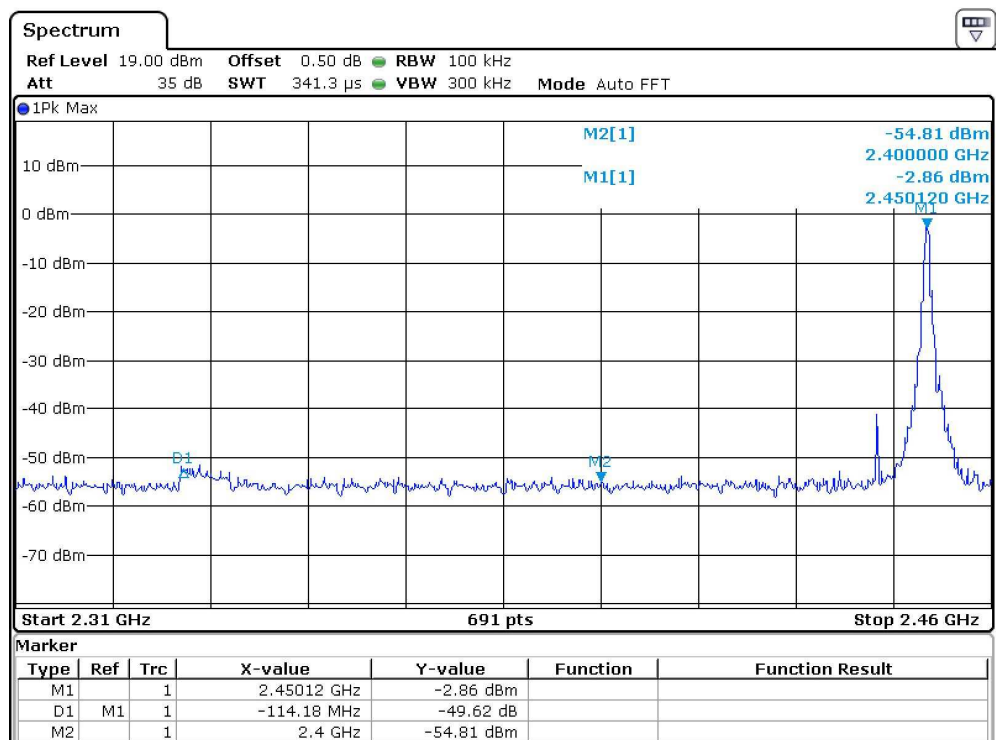
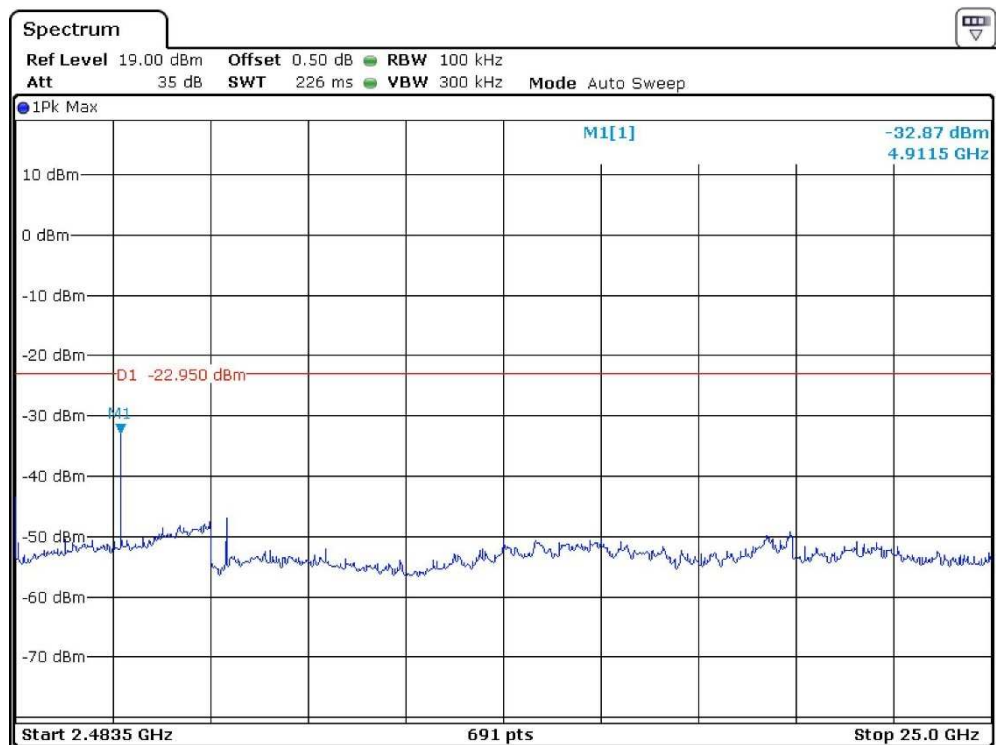
In any 100 kHz bandwidth outside the EUT passband, the RF power produced by the modulation products of the spreading sequence, the information sequence, and the carrier frequency shall be at least 20dB below that of the maximum in-band 100 kHz emission, or else shall meet the general limits for radiated emissions at frequencies outside the passband, whichever results in lower attenuation. The Measurement Procedure was set according to the FCC KDB 558074 D01 v05r02.

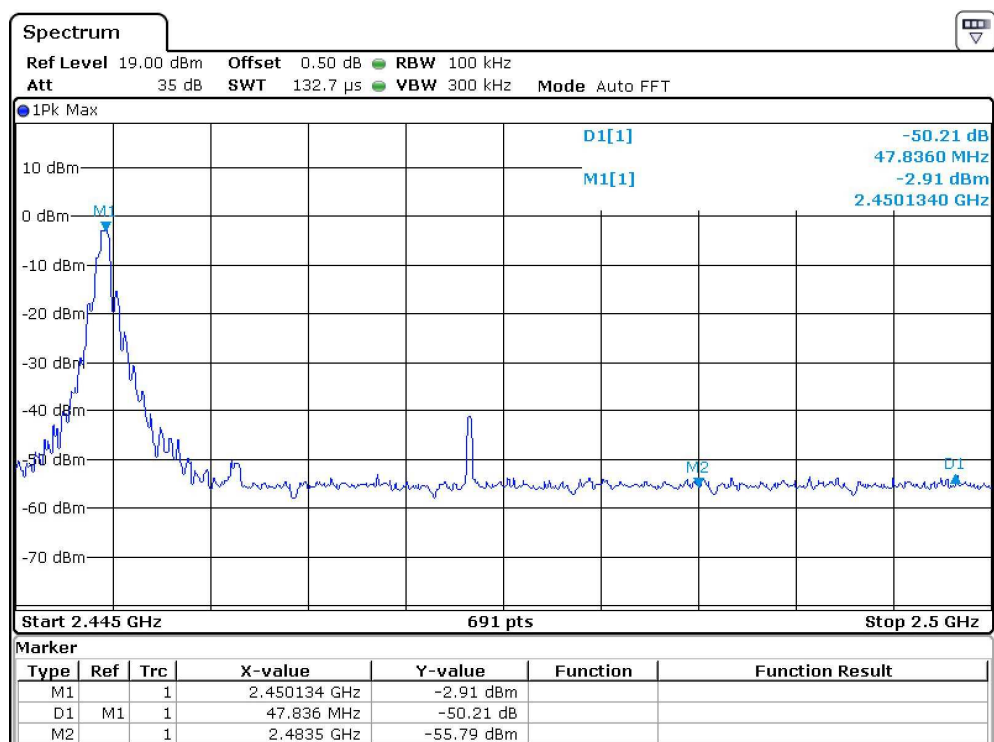
All other types of emissions from the EUT shall meet the general limits for radiated frequencies outside the passband.

The test plots showed all spurious emission and up to the tenth harmonic were measured and they were found to be at least 20 dB below the highest level of the desired power in the passband.

Reference Level: -2.95dBm







4.6 Out of Band Radiated Emissions

Out of Band Radiated Emissions (for emissions in 4.4 above that are less than 20dB below carrier), FCC Rule 15.247(d).

For out of band emissions that are close to or that exceed the 20dB attenuation requirement described in the specification, radiated measurements were performed at a 3m separation distance to determine whether these emissions complied with the general radiated emission requirement.

4.7 Duty Cycle

Transmitter Duty Cycle Calculation and Measurements, FCC Rule 15.35(b), (c).

The EUT antenna output port was connected to the input of the spectrum analyzer. The analyzer center frequency was set to EUT RF channel carrier. The SWEPT function on the analyzer was set to ZERO SPAN. The Transmitter ON time was determined from the resultant time-amplitude display:

9.1 Discussion of Pulse Desensitization

The determination of pulse desensitivity was made in accordance with Hewlett Packard Application Note 150-2, Spectrum Analysis ... Pulsed RF.

Pulse desensitivity is not applicable for this device since the transmitter transmits the RF signal continuously.

9.2 Emissions Test Procedures

The following is a description of the test procedure used by Intertek Testing Services in the measurements of transmitters operating under Part 15, Subpart C rules.

The test set-up and procedures described below are designed to meet the requirements of ANSI C63.10: 2013.

The transmitting equipment under test (EUT) is placed on a styrene turntable which is four feet in diameter, up to 1GHz 0.8m and above 1GHz 1.5m in height above the ground plane. During the radiated emissions test, the turntable is rotated and any cables leaving the EUT are manipulated to find the configuration resulting in maximum emissions. The EUT is adjust through all three orthogonal axes to obtain maximum emission levels. The antenna height and polarization are varied during the testing to search for maximum signal levels.

Detector function for radiated emissions is in peak mode. Average readings, when required, are taken by measuring the duty cycle of the equipment under test and subtracting the corresponding amount in dB from the measured peak readings. A detailed description for the calculation of the average factor can be found in section 9.2.

The frequency range scanned is from the lowest radio frequency signal generated in the device which is greater than 9 kHz to the tenth harmonic of the highest fundamental frequency or 40 GHz, whichever is lower. For line conducted emissions, the range scanned is 150 kHz to 30 MHz with RBW 9KHz used.
