




- · Disconnect power before installation

Installation: (See diagram)





- · Disconnect power before installation

Operation:

- Unlock/disengage winch clutch
- · Pull out winch wire/rope about 5 ft
- Lock/engage winch clutch
- Press the button, now you may operate winch (Power In or Out)
- · Turn off power when not use
