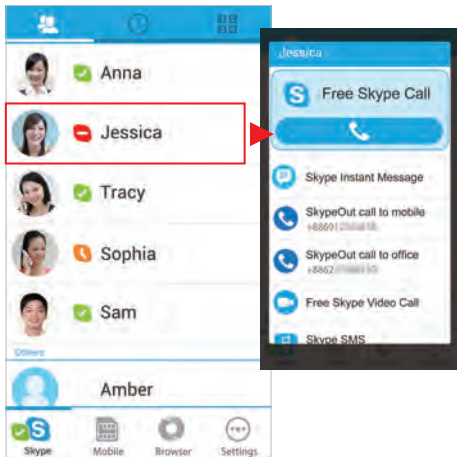


3. Making Skype Calls

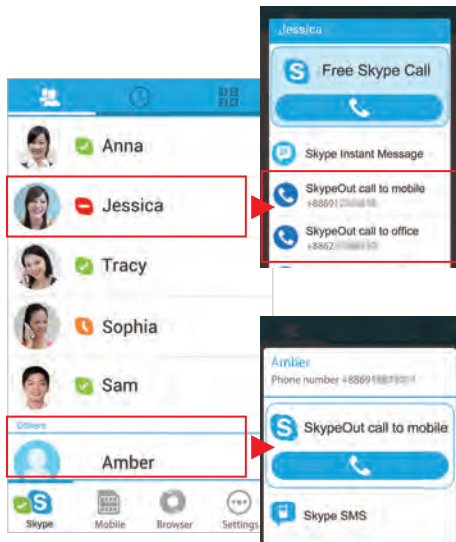
- Free Skype to Skype Calls/
- Free Instant Message/
- Free Video Calls

Tap a contact's name from the list, and choose "Free Skype Call" to talk on Skype for free, or choose "Skype Instant Message" to send message on Skype, or choose "Free Skype Video Call" to make a video call.



4. Skype Out Calls

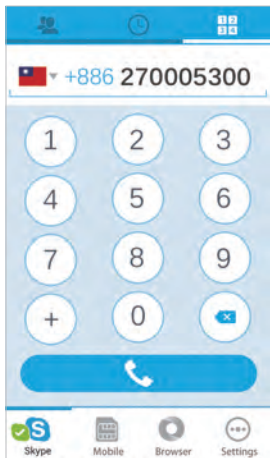
You can use your Skype credit to place landline/mobile calls via "SkypeOut call to phone", or send SMS via "Skype SMS".



Making a Skype call with dial pad

1. Tap  and choose .

2. Dial the phone number, and tap  to call out.



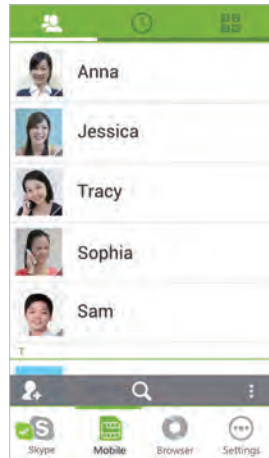
| SIM Calls

You can dial a number directly, or use a number from your contact list/call history.

2. Tap the contact you want to call, and choose a phone number to call.



Making a SIM call with dial pad

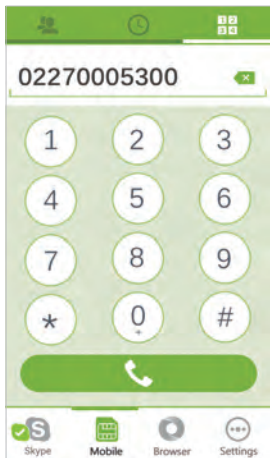
1. Tap

Safty Precautions and Warranty Information

- Do not use the phone while you are driving. Do not place the phone by your neck when using mobile-related functions, it is recommended that you use the speaker instead.
- Do not place magnetic storage media near your phone. Radiation from the phone may erase the information stored on them.
- Keep your device and related accessories away from children. Overuse of the device may impair your vision.
 - (1) Take a 10 minutes break for every 30 minutes of use.
 - (2) Do not expose the screen to children under 2 years of age. Children over the age of 2 should not be exposed to the screen for more than one hour per day.
- Mobile phones can interfere with the functioning of medical devices such as hearing aids or pacemakers. People having active medical implants should keep their cell phones at least 15 cm away from the implant.
- Permanent hearing loss may occur if you use earphones or headphones at high volume.
- Use a wireless hands-free system (headphone/ headset) with a low power Bluetooth emitter.
- Use only original batteries and charging devices.
- Attempts to change the battery inappropriately may result in explosive behavior. Do not disassemble, cut, flatten, or expose the battery in areas over 60 degrees celsius (140 fahrenheit). Follow your local battery disposal guidelines appropriately.

- Please back up your important data regularly and store them accordingly. Linktel is not liable for any call failures or loss of data due to mis-operation, poor signal or power outage, etc.
- Do not leave your device in places with flammable gas such as a petrol pumps.
- The temperature recommended for using the device is 5-35°C.
- Do not touch the charger, power cable or socket with wet hands. This may cause an electric shock.
- Do not dismantle the device or accessories otherwise, manufacturer is not liable to pay for damages as the device and accessories are not covered by warranty.
