


Boom Bluetooth Earbuds

Instruction Manual

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS:

- Keep out of reach of children.
- Do not attempt to repair. Seek professional consultation if the headphones aren't working properly.
- Do not insert objects into ports that are not USB cables.
- Do not charge and use device at the same time.
- Keep away from flame, water, or out of extreme temperatures.

Bluetooth Mode:

1. To Power On: Press and hold the multi-function button for 3 seconds until the LED begins flashing blue.
2. Power Off: Press and hold the multi-function button for 3 seconds, the LED indicator will flash red/blue then it will become solid red, and finally the LED will turn off-indicating the Boom has been shut off.
3. The LED indicator will flash from blue to red when not in use and entering standby mode. This will turn the device off to conserve power.

Bluetooth Pairing:

1. Press and hold the multi-function button for 6 seconds. The LED indicator will flash blue and red indicating the device has entered pairing mode.
2. Activate the Bluetooth function on your mobile device and select "Boom" from the listed devices.

Answering Calls:

1. Short press the multi-function button to answer an incoming call after bluetooth pairing has been successful.
2. During a call short press the multi-function button again to end the call.
3. To call back a number previously dialed, short press the multi-function button 2 times to redial the last active caller's number.

Charging the Boom:

- Insert the Micro-USB charging cable into the charging port and connect the opposite end into a Computer USB port or an AC wall adapter.
- The LED indicator will light red while charging, and become blue when fully charged.

Volume Up or Previous Track:

- Short press "+" to increase the volume
- Press and hold "+" to go to the previous track

Volume Down or Next Track:

- Short press "-" to decrease the volume
- Press and hold "-" to go to the next track
