



QUICKSTART GUIDE:

WHOA! That's a shiny lookin' new thing you've got right there. Looks like it's a new Dragon, no wait, maybe it's a Hornet! Oh man, that's pretty neat.


Well, you probably want to know you can use it, right? Right. Let's get started!

Creating and Signing-In to your Account:

(recommended method) Create a Pebblebee account using your email address. After entering your information, tap Sign Up in the upper corner to finish.


Login with your existing Facebook or Twitter account. (Note: If you need to reset your password, this is done directly through Facebook.com or Twitter.com).


Forgot Password takes you to a link to reset your account password.

Charging your device:

Dragon

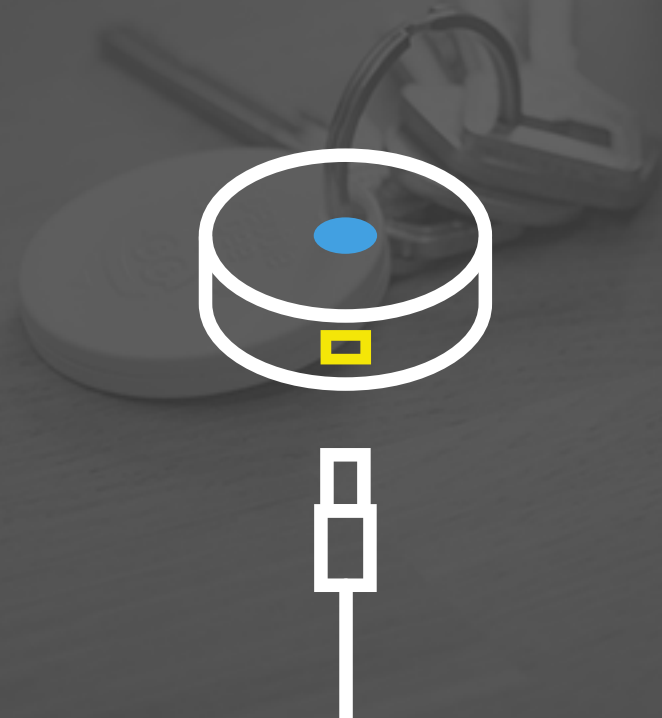
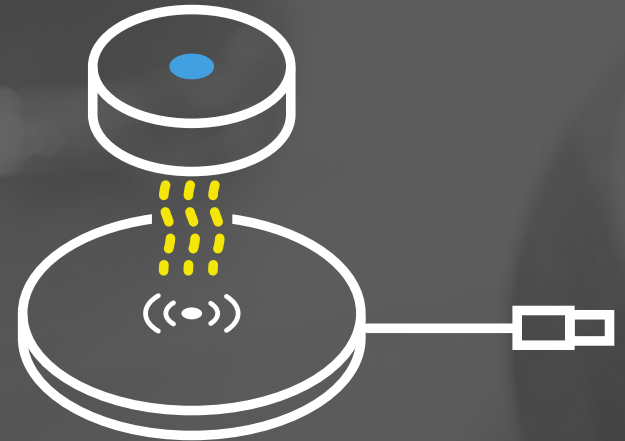
Your Dragon comes with a Qi Charging Dock for wireless charges your Dragon. Simply place the dragon on the dock. The light on the Dragon should illuminate indicating it is in charge mode.

The device charges in about 2.5 hours.

Hornet

The Hornet has a mini usb port on the device. Plug your bundled USB directly into the Hornet and plug the USB into any USB port.

The device charges in about 2.5 hours.



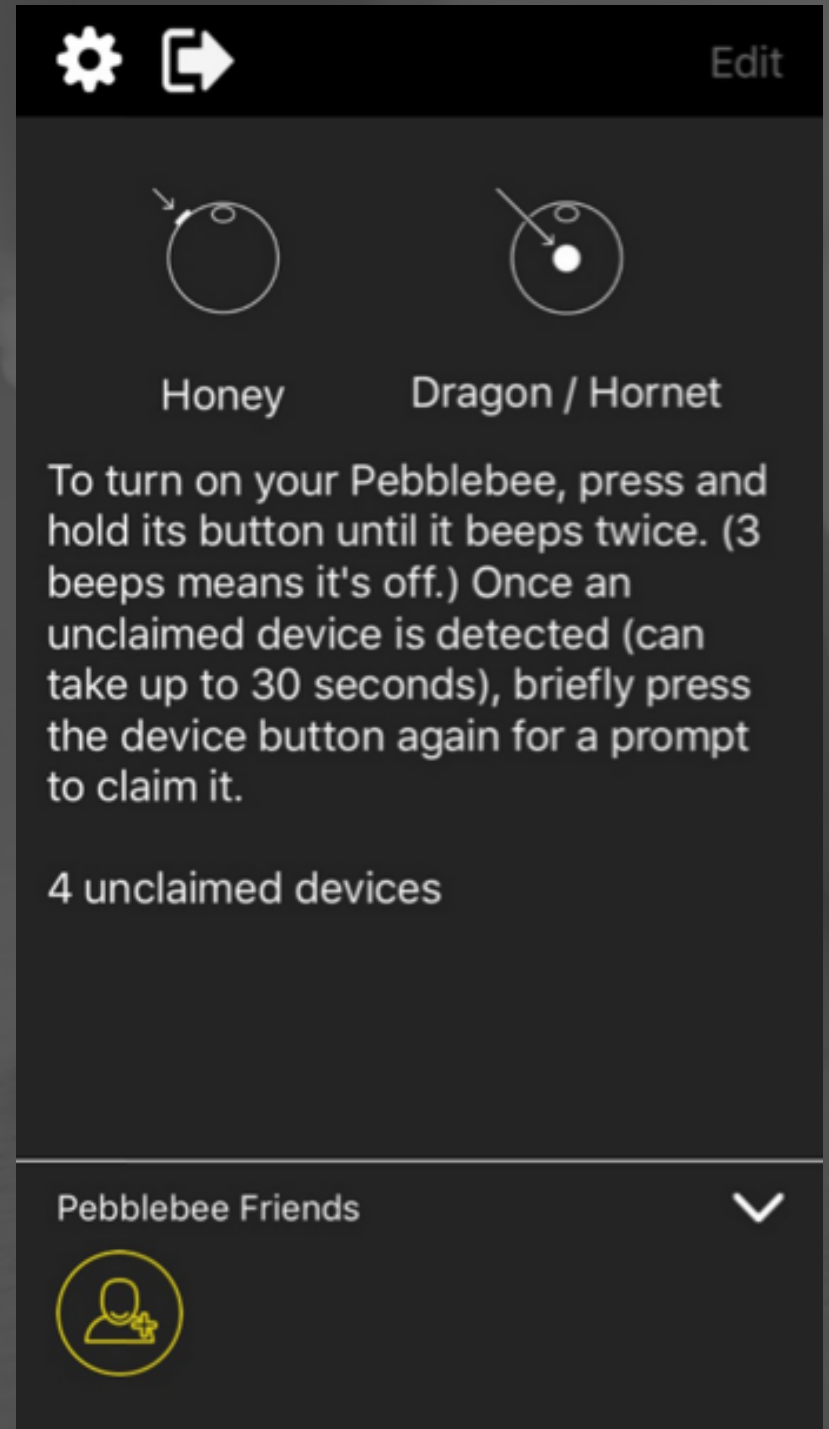
Claiming your device:

Make sure your device is turned on!

Download and open up the freshly updated Pebblebee App! You can get the app via the App Store. (If you already have the Pebblebee App, make sure it's up to date!)

If you've never used a Pebblebee device before, you should see a screen that looks a little something like the image on the right.

Push the button on your device.

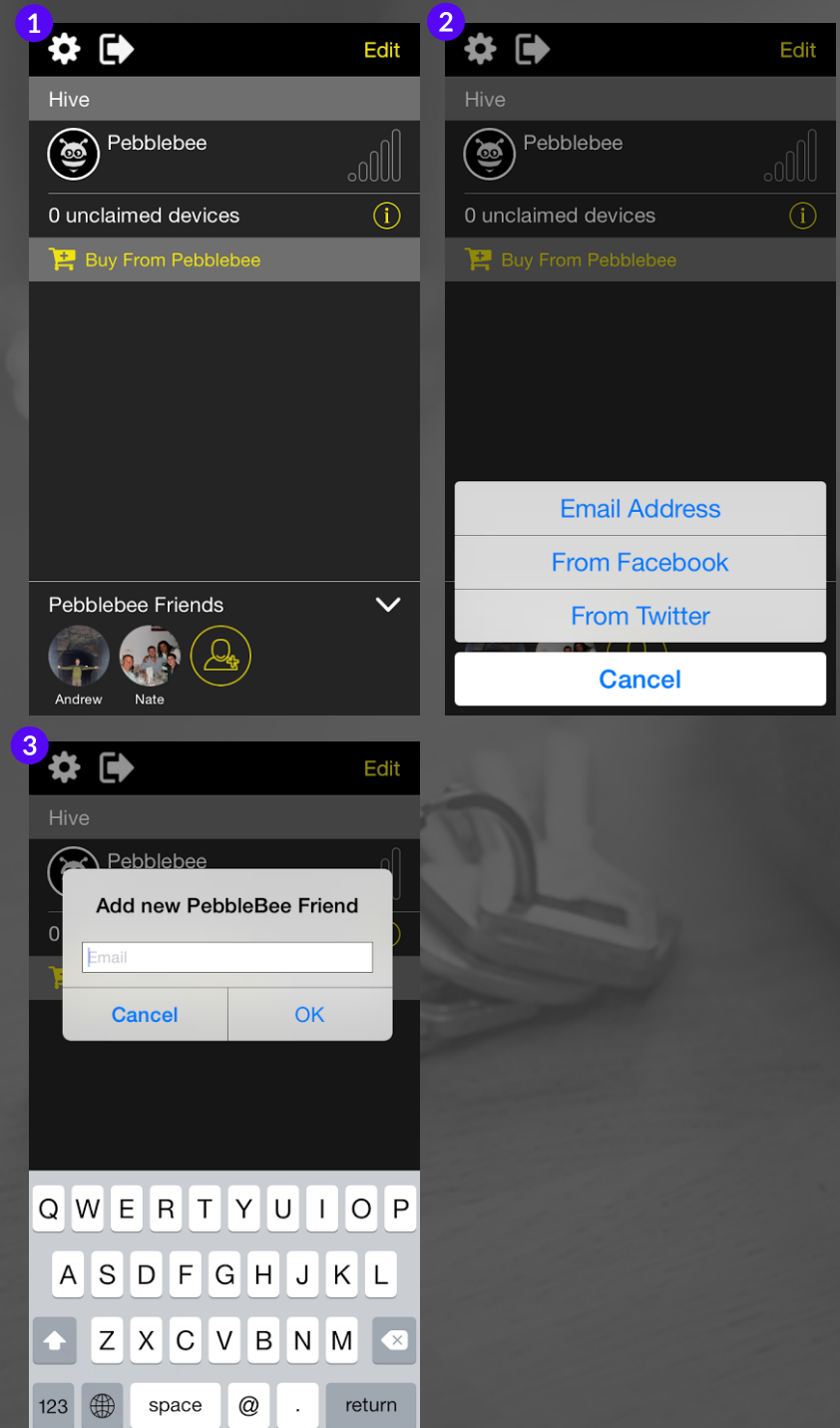


Sharing:

- Sharing allows friends and family to access your Honey's features without granting full access to edit and change settings.
- Friends can be added by email or through Facebook

1. From the Hive, tap on the add friends icon on the bottom
2. Tap add friend, then choose how you would like to add them*
3. If they have not downloaded the app and created an account, you can then invite them to do so. If they have, they will be added to your list
4. On device page, tap the friends icon to manage sharing for that device.
5. Choose which friends to add to the device

Personalize Device:



Get to this screen by tapping Pebblebee in the top header of the details screen.

Tap on the circle to add a picture for your Pebblebee.

Name and describe your Pebblebee as will be seen in the Hive.

Calibrate the Honey's temperature gauge to track how hot or cold it becomes.

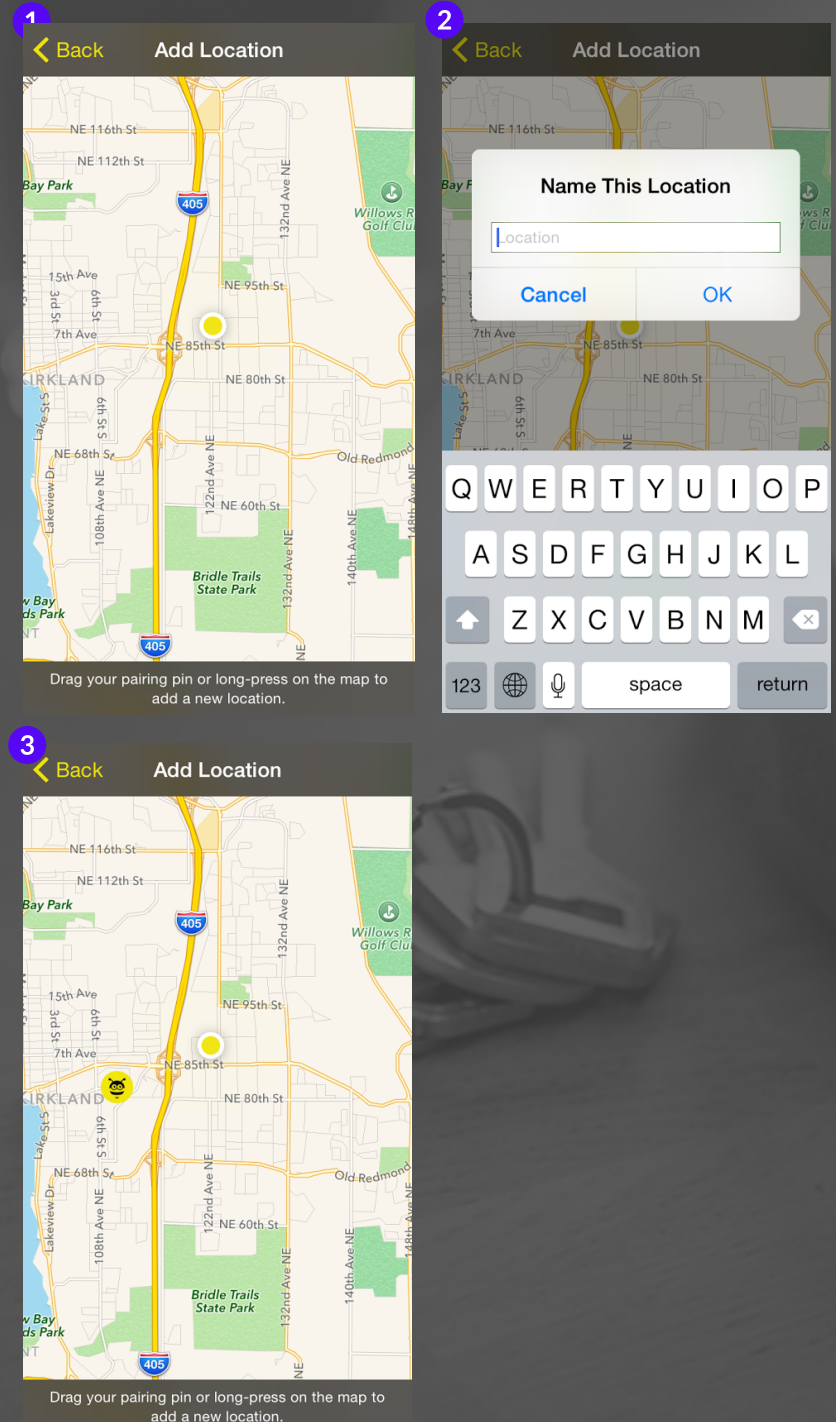

Location Pairing:

1. From the Device page, go to device settings. Select Location Pairing.
2. Tap Add Locations to pull up the map and create new zones
3. Long press on the map to create a new pin, or drag an existing pin to a different location*
4. Once created, choose which zones you would like Range Alerts to be active in

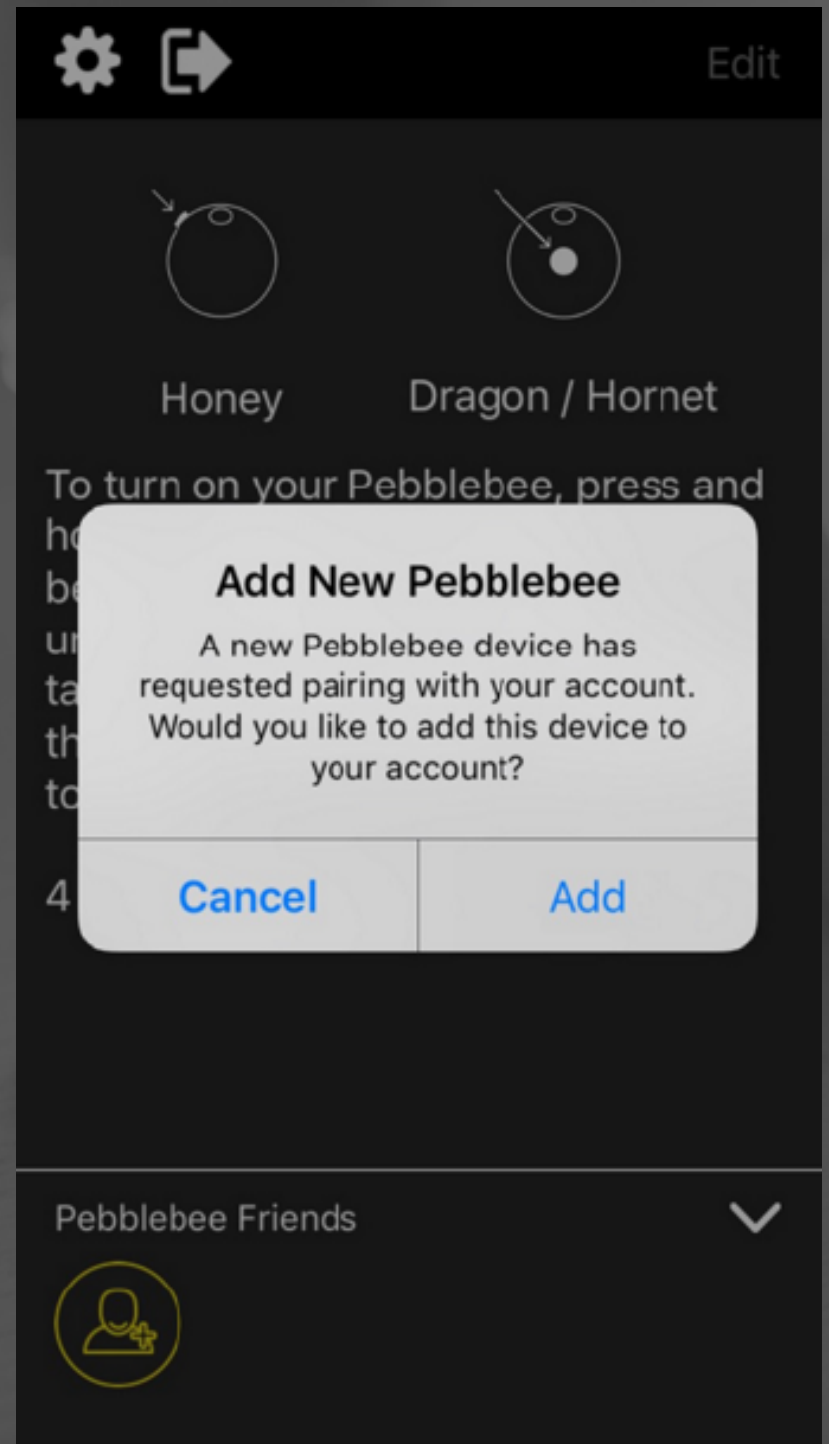


Step 4:

Tap the Add button to claim your device!

Step 5:

Once the device has been claimed, you should be taken to The Hive Screen where you devices are organized.



The Detail Screen:

1

Edit

Tap on "Pebblebee" to add a photo and change the name.

2

Locate

Shows a Pin on a Google map indicating the last detected position.

3

Device Settings

Manage range alerts, location pairing, multi-function button, power saving mode, and reporting a lost device.

4

Social

Shared devices are ideal for tracking items together. When you share with other people, your device will appear in their app just as it does in yours. Shared users cannot add, delete, or edit the device.

5

Temperature

Tapping on the thermometer will toggle between celsius to fahrenheit.

6

Beep

Command Pebblebee to sound its alarm.

7

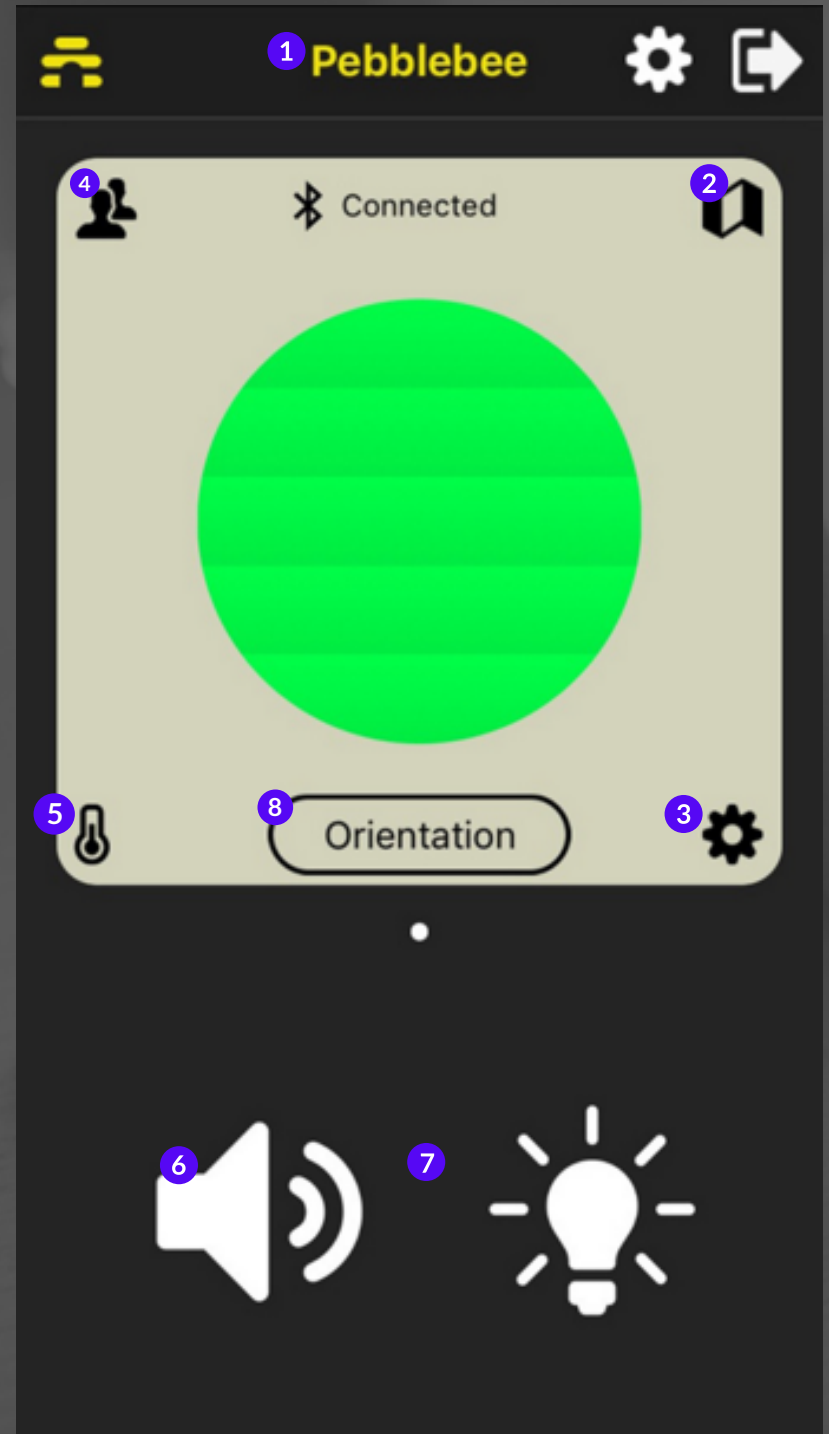
Flash

Command Pebblebee LED to light up.

8

Orientation

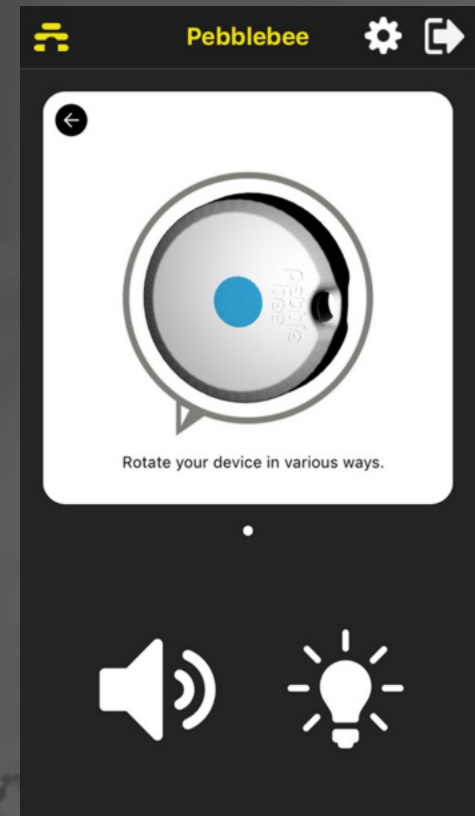
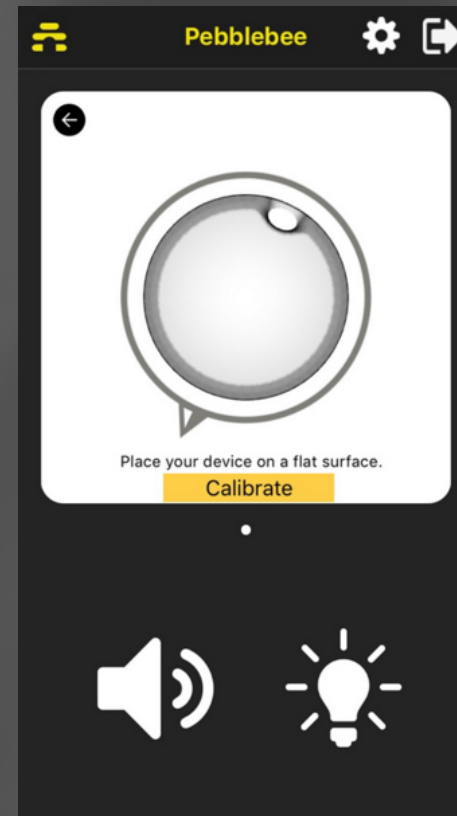
Enter calibration mode and access the dragon/hornet orientation features. Note: If you only want to use tracking features, this mode is optional.



Orientation:

Place your device on a flat surface, and then tap the yellow calibrate button. It may not look like it's doing much, but before you know it the screen will change to a second calibration screen.

Now that your device has entered the second phase of calibration, start twirling your device around in any which way. Sometimes we flip it like a coin, but we must strongly caution you to only do this over a cushioned surface like a bed, or a shag carpet from the 70's.



The Hive Screen:

1

Profile Settings

Edit your user profile by changing your username, password or profile picture.

2

Signout

Exit current account to allow another user to log in. Signing out will prevent certain features like Find Phone from working.

3

Edit Hive

Allows you to change the position of your Honey, or unclaim devices.

4

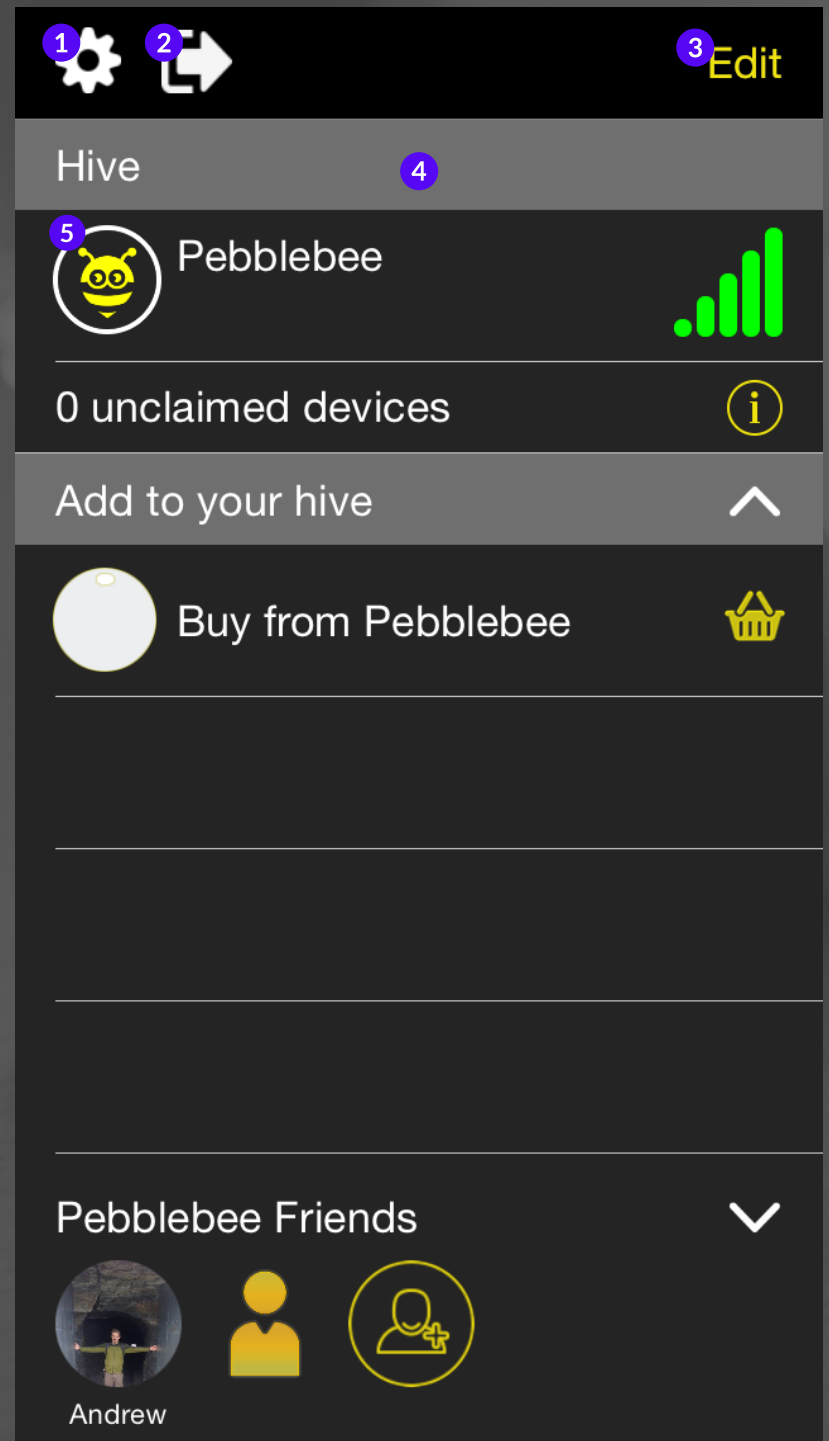
Refresh

drag your finger down the screen to refresh the Hive.

5

Details View

Tap the newly added device. This should take you to the Details page.
