## 5 SAR Evaluation

### 5.1 RF Exposure Compliance Requirement

#### 5.1.1 Standard Requirement

According to KDB447498D01 General RF Exposure Guidance v06

##### 4.3.1. Standalone SAR test exclusion considerations

Unless specifically required by the published RF exposure KDB procedures, standalone 1-g head or body and 10-g extremity SAR evaluation for general population exposure conditions, by measurement or numerical simulation, is not required when the corresponding SAR Exclusion Threshold condition, listed below, is satisfied.

#### 5.1.2 Limits

The 1-g and 10-g SAR test exclusion thresholds for 100 MHz to 6 GHz at test separation distances  $\leq 50$  mm are determined by:

$$[(\text{max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW}) / (\text{min. test separation distance, mm})] \cdot [\sqrt{f(\text{GHz})}] \leq 3.0 \text{ for 1-g SAR and } \leq 7.5 \text{ for 10-g extremity SAR, where}$$

$f(\text{GHz})$  is the RF channel transmit frequency in GHz

Power and distance are rounded to the nearest mW and mm before calculation<sup>17</sup>

The result is rounded to one decimal place for comparison

The test exclusions are applicable only when the minimum test separation distance is  $\leq 50$  mm and for transmission frequencies between 100 MHz and 6 GHz. When the minimum test separation distance is  $< 5$  mm, a distance of 5 mm is applied to determine SAR test exclusion

#### 5.1.3 EUT RF Exposure

The Max Conducted Peak Output Power is 1.41dBm in highest channel(2.402GHz);

The best case gain of the antenna is 1.7dBi.

$$\text{EIRP} = 1.41\text{dBm} + 1.7\text{dBi} = 3.11\text{dBm}$$

3.11dBm logarithmic terms convert to numeric result is nearly 2.05mW

According to the formula. calculate the EIRP test result:

$$[(\text{max. power of channel, including tune-up tolerance, mW}) / (\text{min. test separation distance, mm})] \cdot [\sqrt{f(\text{GHz})}]$$

$$\text{General RF Exposure} = (2.05\text{mW} / 5 \text{ mm}) \times \sqrt{2.402\text{GHz}} = 0.64 \quad ①$$
