
## Before you begin

Read all instructions thoroughly before beginning set up.


- Select a level site clear of rocks, branches, and other hard or sharp objects, to set up your shelter.

## WARNING: Keep clear of overhead power lines.


- Do not set up your shelter under trees because of potential lightning strikes or falling tree limbs in inclement weather.
- Secure with all stakes and guylines provided to prevent property damage or personal injury.
- Two people can easily setup this shelter in minutes.

## TO OPERATE LIGHT

Firstly, add 4-D batteries to compartment on canopy frame and 1 Lithium CR2032H battery to the remote.

### DIRECT FROM HUB

- Press button for High, Medium, and Low settings

- Press button for High, Medium, and Low settings

### PARTIALLY EXTEND FRAME


Use 2 people, pulling from opposite corners.

### FULLY EXTEND FRAME


Use two people pulling from opposite corners.


### DRAPE VENT CAP OVER HUB


Making sure the canopy is tucked under the 4 corners of the vent cap.

### SECURE CANOPY TO FRAME WITH HOOK AND LOOP FASTENERS


Making sure fabric pads are under supports.

### STAKE SHELTER FEET AND GUYLINES AT 45° ANGLE


Adjust guylines as needed using sliders.







### Storing the Shelter

- Remove stakes and place in their storage bag.
- All stakes must be placed into stake bag before being placed into main carry bag to prevent damage to the tent fabric.
- Store in a clean, dry area.

### IMPORTANT FACTS:

- Never store shelter, even for a short period of time, without drying it thoroughly and brushing off caked dirt. Do not pack stakes inside your shelter. Use a separate storage bag.
- STAKES SHOULD BE REMOVED BY PULLING ON THE STAKE ITSELF. NEVER PULL ON THE SHELTER TO REMOVE STAKE.
- Do not leave your shelter set-up for weeks at a time. Be aware that exposure to ultraviolet rays from the sun can seriously damage material and/or cause it to become discolored.

### WARNING: Keep all flame and heat sources away from this shelter fabric.

This shelter meets the flammability requirements of CPAI-84. The fabric may burn if left in continuous contact with any flame source. The application of any foreign substance to the fabric may render the flame-resistant properties ineffective.

## BATTERIES REPLACEMENT:


1. Press button to release the battery compartment.

3. Close the lighting compartment by sliding the cover over the base until it locks securely into place.

Rotate battery cover by 90 degrees counterclockwise




Open battery cover,take out old battery
