




## Wearing Your LifeEar® STREAM

1 Hold onto receiver.


2 Place tip in entrance of ear canal.




3 Place behind ear.



## Program Settings


- 1 Automatic: all frequencies emphasized—up to XX dB.
- 2 Quiet: all frequencies emphasized—up to XX dB.\*
- 3 Conversation: speech frequencies emphasized—up to XX dB.\*
- 4 Automatic: high-frequencies emphasized—up to XX dB.
- 5 Quiet: High-frequencies emphasized—up to XX dB.



## Replacing Tubing and Tips

**Tubing:** Rotate tubing 90° and slide off. Push new tubing on.

**Tip:** Pull tip off tubing. Push new tip on until flush with end of tubing.
