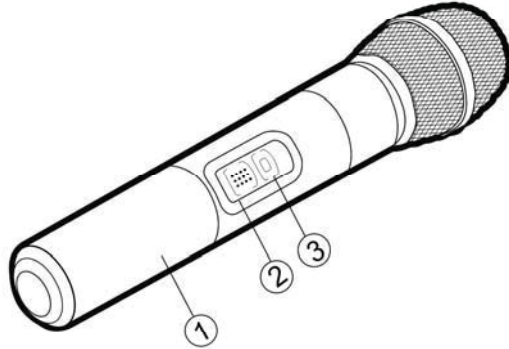


Wireless Microphone Instruction Manual

User Manual:

1.Battery Cabinet

Before using ,please insert battery 2xAA into the battery cabinet according +/- shown in the wireless microphone .
When not using , please take out the battery form the battery cabinet .

2.Switch Button

Push up the switch button to turn on the wireless microphone, then the LED indicator would be flash.
Push down the switch button to turn off the wireless microphone .

3.LED Indicator

When turn on the wireless microphone, the LED Indicator would be flash.
When the LED indicator be red, the batteries become flat , please replay new batteries.
