



## Night Vision Monocular (BFT21B) - Instruction Manual

### Side interface



1. ON/OFF switch
2. USB port
3. Micro SD card slot

### Button



1. View/Play
2. photo/video
3. reduce brightness/Previous
4. Increase brightness/Next
5. Short press to switch between photo/video mode, Long press to open the menu or cancel/back
6. Adjust IR Led brightness (OFF-1-2-3-4)/ OK

### WIFI connection

1. After power on camera, long press "M" button to enter menu, select WIFI option, press "IR"/"OK" button to enter WIFI option (turn ON WIFI) and the screen would show "waiting for WIFI connection"
2. In your mobile phone, turn ON WIFI and search "Wifi-cam" and click connect to the camera WIFI network. If it is your first time to connect, you will ask to input password: 12345678. If the phone is successfully connected to the camera, the LCD of camera will shows "wifi connected"
3. Download and install the iSmart DV app from the Google Play Store or Apple App store. Launch the app to operate the camera via WIFI, you are now ready to stream in real time and capture through the app.
