



Tx & Rx



Install the Battery

1. Remove the battery compartment by pressing the batt.box button.
2. Insert 4 fully-charged AAA batteries and make sure all the batteries contact well, with the correct polarity.
3. Put on the battery compartment.

Power on

1. Connect everything.
 - Make sure the batteries are fully charged.
 - Make sure the receiver is off.
2. Move the power switch on its position.
3. Connect the power supply to receiver. LED on receiver should be solid to indicate that it is connected.

Binding

1. Ensure all the instruments are connected with power.
2. Turn on both transmitter and receiver. Press the Bind button on each instrument to activate the Bind mode. LED should flash quickly when binding and stop when done.

Power off

1. Turn the switch off on each instrument.
2. Disconnect the power resource off from each instrument.
 - Ensure the power disconnected when usage unavailable.
