Basic Beacon

Step 1: Service providers apply to the cloud (data servers, for example, the "Wechat Background" above).

The data server generates an IBeaconId, maps it to the service provided by the service provider, and then tells the service provider the IBeaconId;

The second step: the service provider sets the IBeaconId on the first step to the IBeacon device, allowing the IBeacon device to broadcast.

The IBeaconId;

The third step: the user opens the corresponding APP in the signal range of the IBeacon device, and APP gets the IBeaconId;

The fourth step: APP takes the corresponding services from the data server through the IBeaconId obtained in the third step, and shows it in the APP world.

Surface, that is, all kinds of information pushed by the user.
