



CAR CHASSIS




REMOTE CONTROL


2. Turn the screw on the remote control clockwise to open the battery cover.



3. Insert two 1.5V AA batteries (no battery available)







4. Turn on the switch and make music. Four wheels will light


MANIPULATION OF THE INSTRUCTIONS
