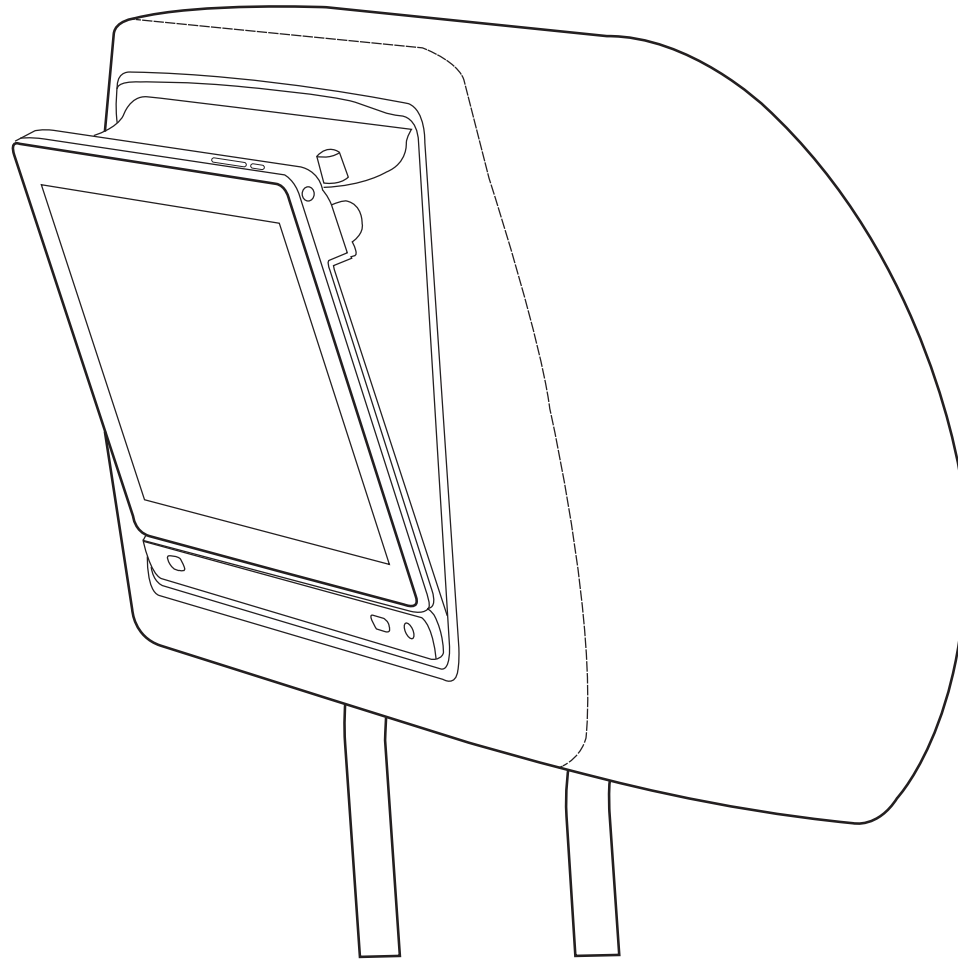


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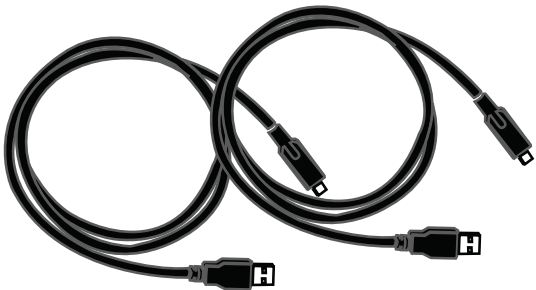

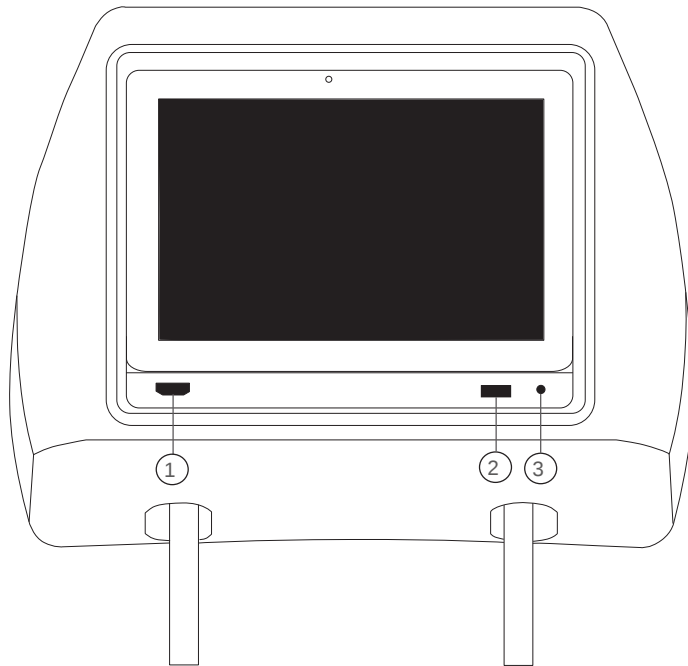

Chapter 2

Rear Seat Entertainment System Description

Vizualogic Headrest



1. HDMI Input

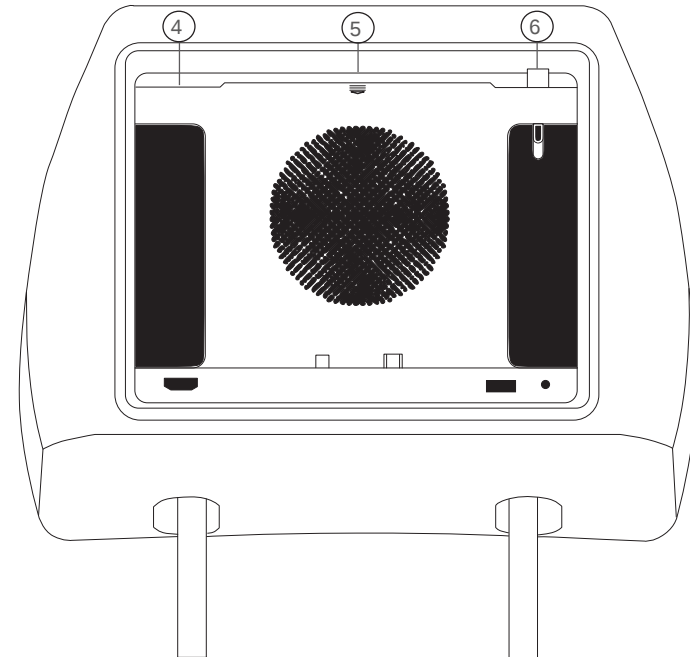
Plug in any standard Type A HDMI peripheral.

2. USB 2.0

Plug in any standard Type A USB device, not to exceed 2.0 amps.

3. Headphone Jack

Plug any 3.5mm headphones for audio play.



4. Eject Button

Press to eject the DVD.

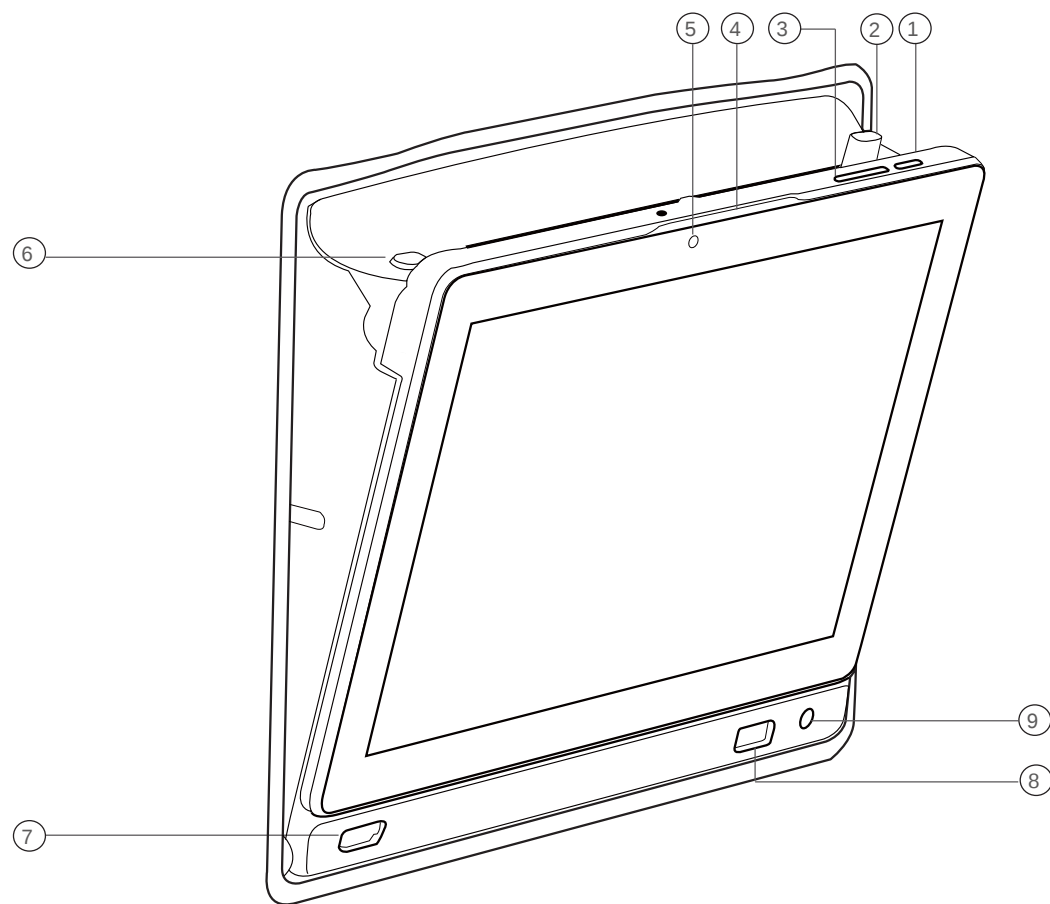
Note: Tablet must be powered and docked for eject button to work.

5. DVD Slot

Insert DVD with label facing the rear of the vehicle.

6. Tablet Release Button

When the tablet is docked, press the release button to unlock the tablet for removal.

DOCK AND UNDOCK THE TABLET.

1. To open the dock, use the pull tab, with 2 fingers to pull the tray forward. (Fig. 1)
2. Slide the tablet into the tray, insuring the tablet dock connectors are on the bottom. (Fig. 2)
3. Push the tablet down until the lock engages. (Fig. 2)

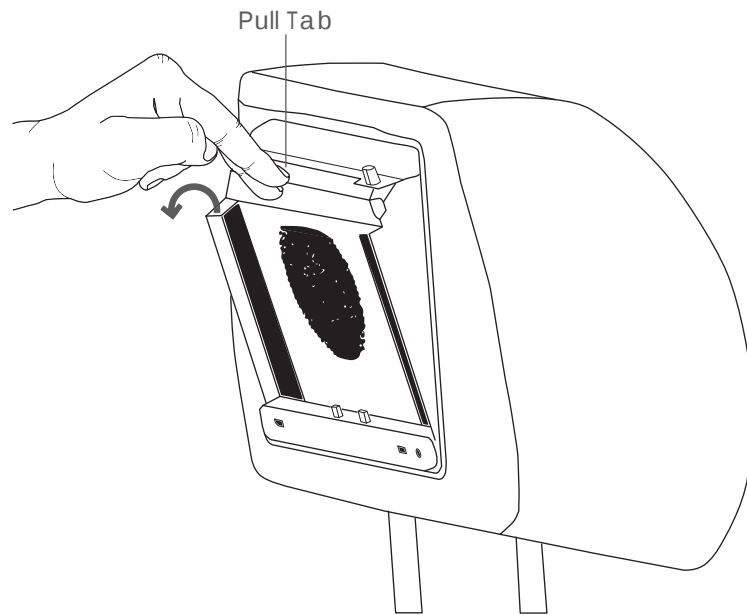

4. To open the dock, use the pull tab, with 2 fingers, pull the tray forward. (Fig. 3)
5. Push the tablet release button until the lock disengages. (Fig. 3)
6. Pull the tablet straight up from the dock tray. (Fig. 4)

RSE - How to Navigate the Home Screen

Tablet Docked Mode.

1. Navigation bar:

< Back: Return to previous screen

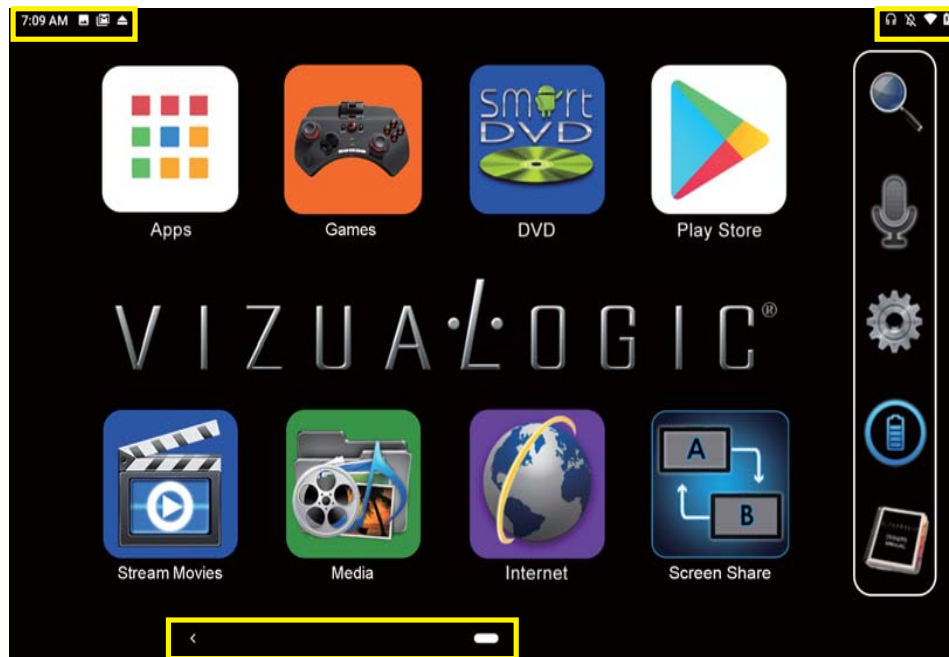
Home: Return to the main Home screen

2. Notification bar: Swipe down to see tablets notifications.

3. Status bar: time, battery status and current connections (Bluetooth, Wi-Fi, etc.)

Games Folder.

1. Press the app icon on the home screen. (Fig.5)
All the available apps should now be visible.
2. Find the app you wish to move.
3. Press and hold the app icon. (Fig.6)

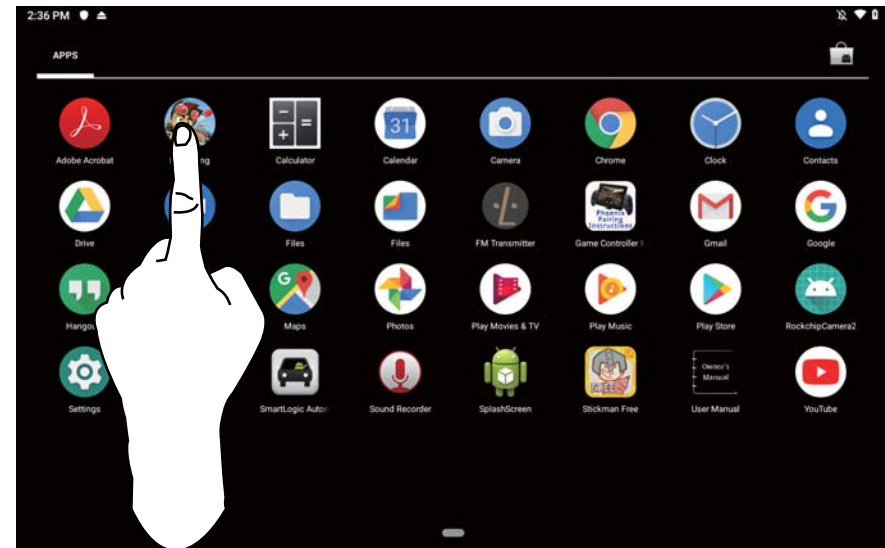

4. While your finger is holding down the icon, the home screen will appear. (Fig.7)
5. Move your finger over the Games icon and release your finger. (Fig.8)

The app will now be located in the Games folder.

Note: The folder can be filled with as many APPS until the screen is full. Stream Movies and Media are also folders where adding apps require repeating steps 2-5.

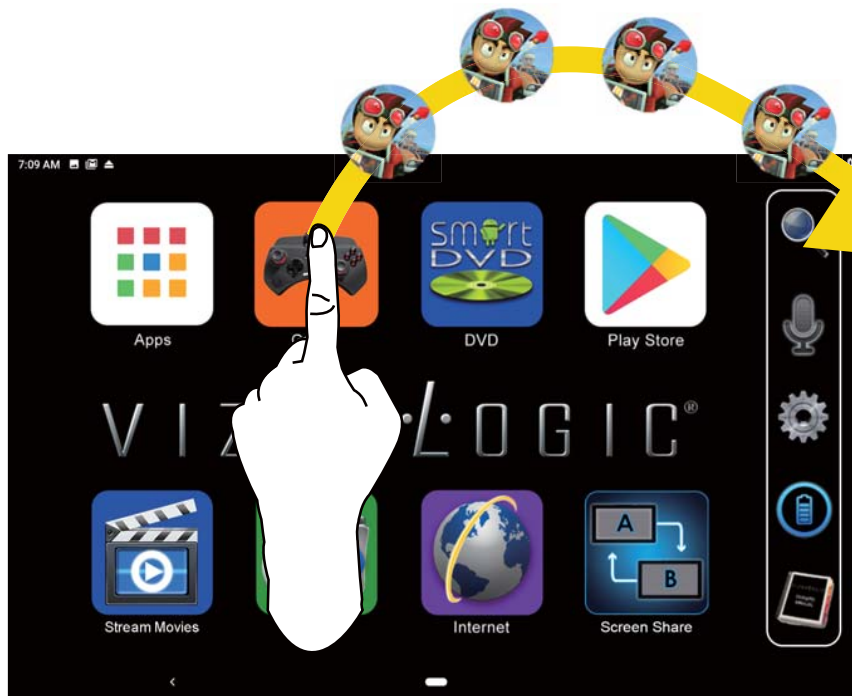

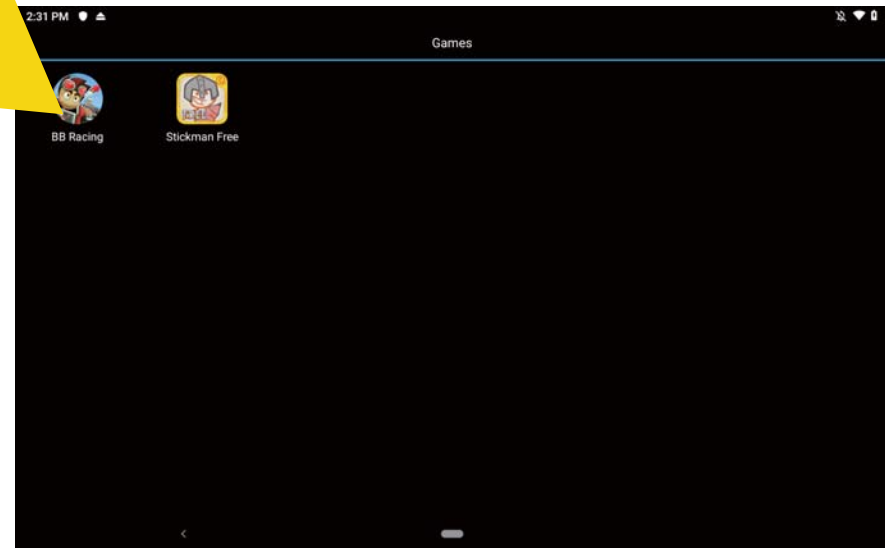

RSE - How to Play a DVD Movie

DVD PLAYER.

1. Insert the DVD with label facing the rear of the vehicle into the DVD slot located behind the tablet.
See page 23 for DVD slot.
2. Once the DVD is inserted, open the DVD app located on the main home screen. (Fig.9)
3. When “Ready” appears, DVD is ready to play.
4. Press the  icon to play the DVD. (Fig.10)

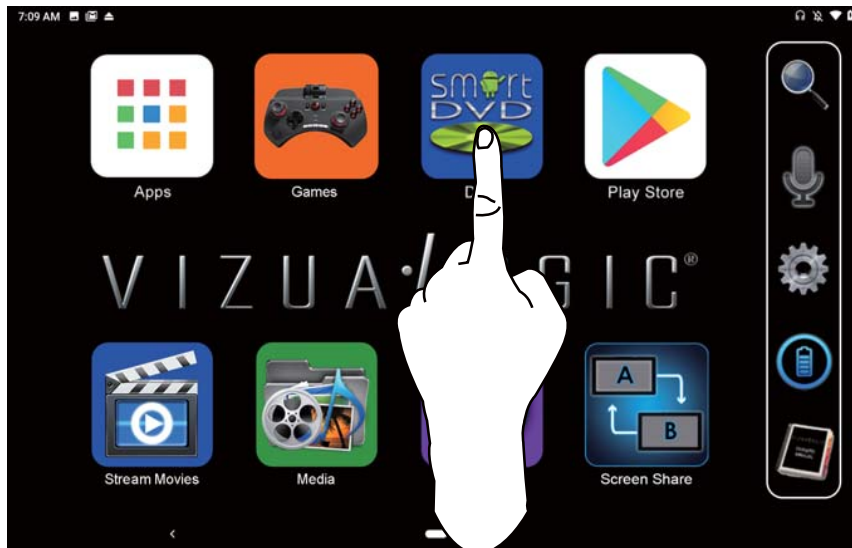

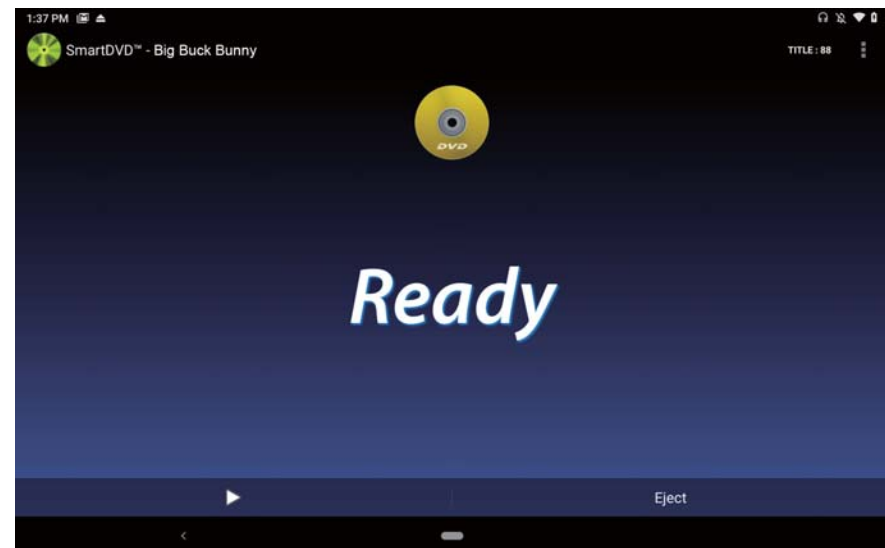

5. Press the exit DVD menu located at the top right corner, to show the DVD menu. (Fig.11)
6. Press the play icon on the DVD menu to play the DVD. (Fig.12)

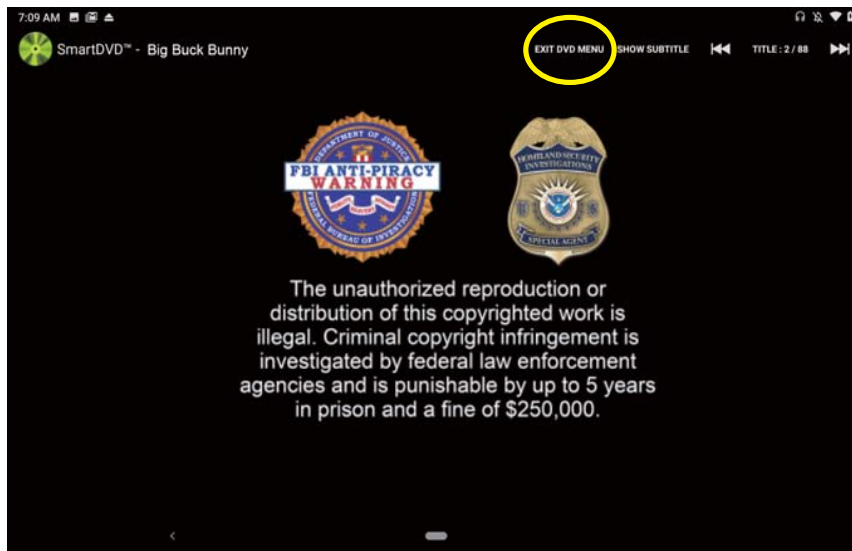

7. While the DVD is playing, the following functions can be controlled using the touch screen:

Slide bar: touch anywhere on the bar to advance the movie. (Fig.13)

Note: This function may not work on all DVD's.

 Forward Arrow: this allows to forward to the next DVD track. (Fig.13)

 Backward Arrow: this allows to go back to the previous DVD track. (Fig.13)

 Pause: Pause the DVD. (Fig.13)

 Stop: Stop the DVD. (Fig.13)

Eject button: Eject the DVD. (Fig.14)

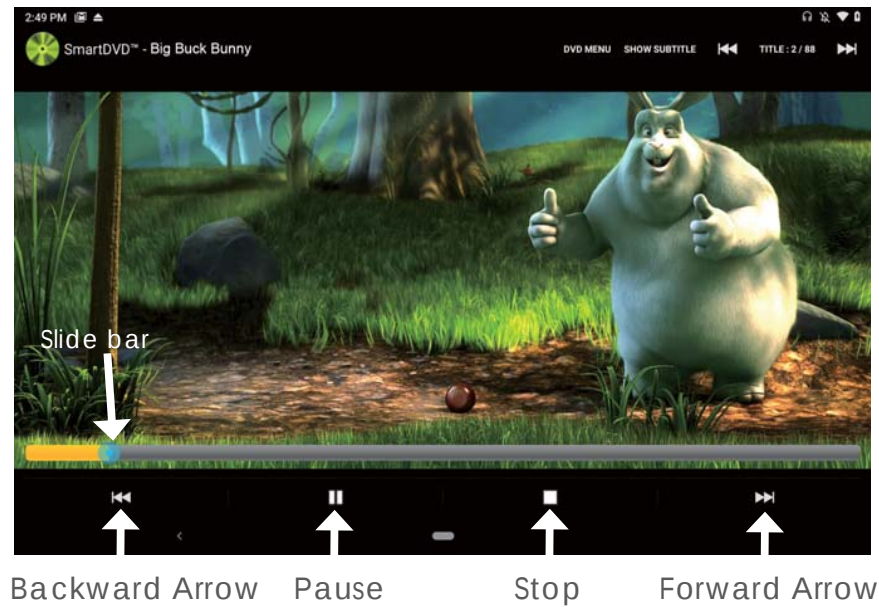

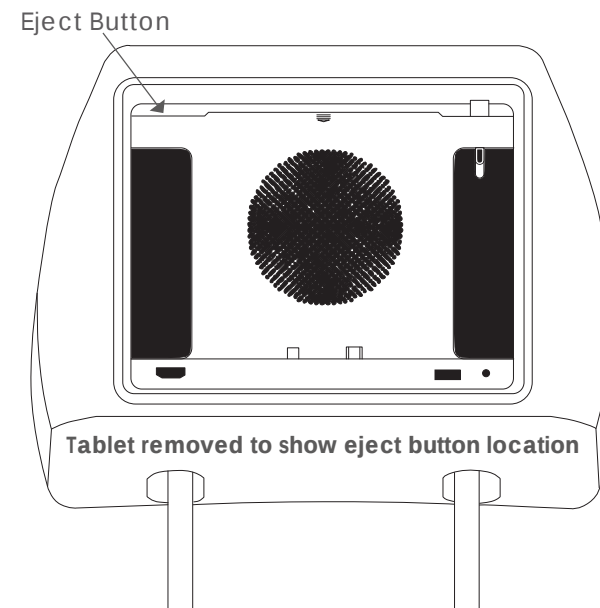

RSE - How to Setup DVD

DVD PREFERENCES MENU.

To access the menu, press the small 3 square dots located in the upper right corner. (Fig.15)

Note: Preferences menu can only be activated when the DVD is stopped.

Loudness Boost: increases the audio for SmartDVD. (FIG.16)

Touch the Loudness Boost to set the available loudness from 0 to +5db.

Note: Default is set to 0db.

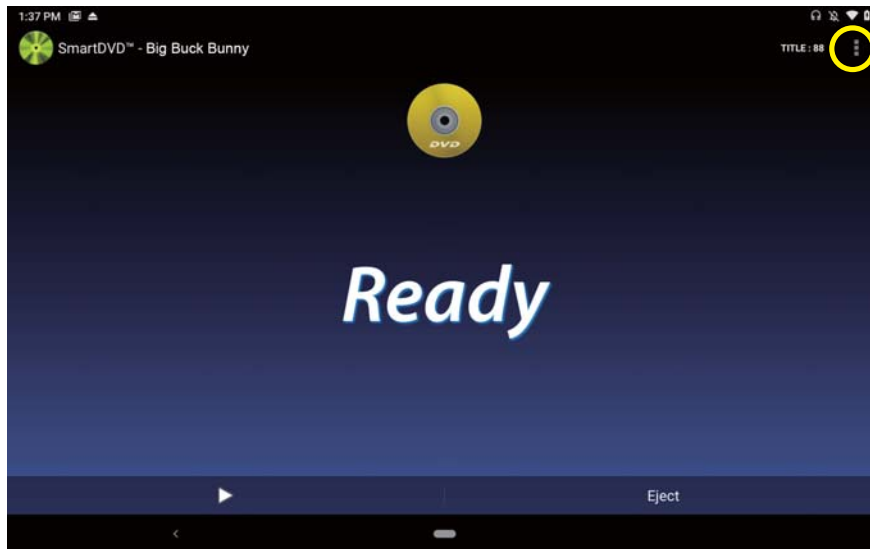

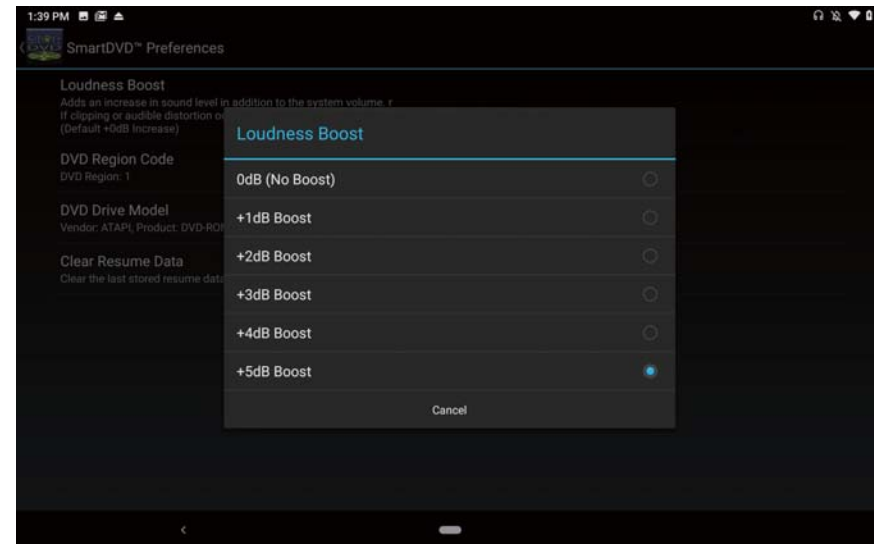


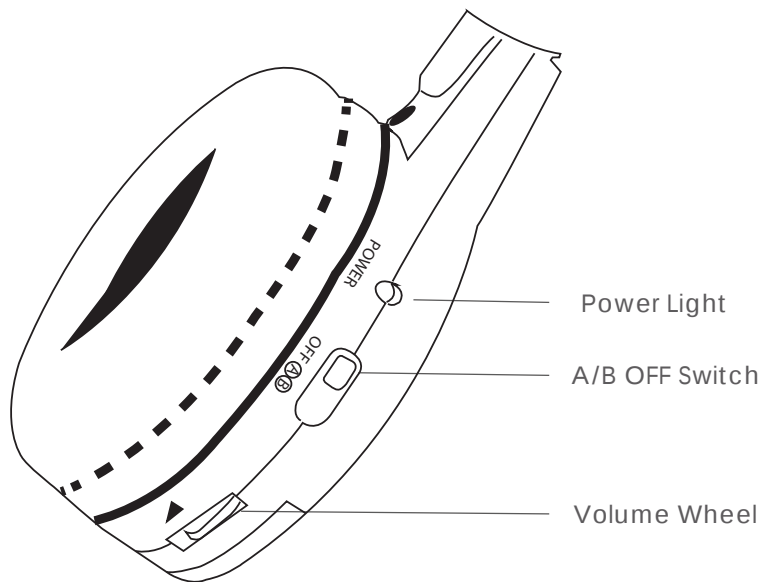

Chapter: 8

RSE - How to Use the Wireless Headphones

WIRELESS HEADPHONES

1. When the vehicle receives power, the tablets will display what channel the wireless headphones need to be set to.
 - a. Locate the A/B OFF switch on the wireless headphones.
 - b. If the tablet is displaying channel A, slide the switch to A.
 - c. If the tablet is displaying channel B, slide the switch to B.
2. To adjust the volume of the wireless headphones, simply move the volume control wheel clockwise to raise the volume and counter clockwise to lower the volume.



Chapter: 9

RSE - How to Use the Screen Share

SCREEN SHARING.

1. Each tablet has the ability to view its own source and the opposite tablet's source simply by pressing the Screen Share app located on the bottom right of the tablet's screen. (Fig.17)

Note: Only one tablet Screen Share app can be used at one time. While viewing the Source of the other tablet, no control over the other tablet's functions are available.

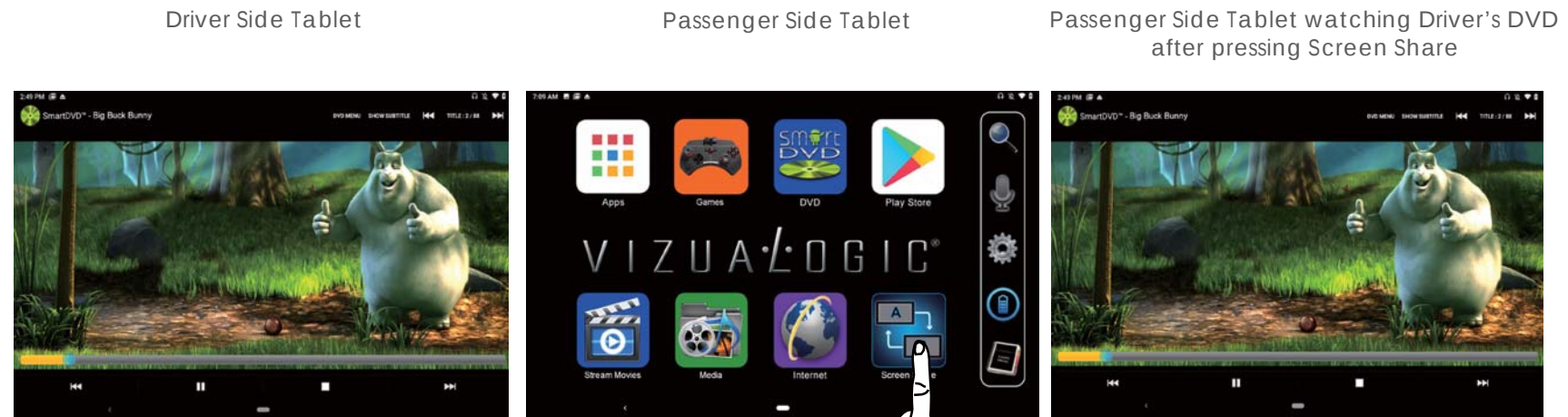

RSE - How to Use the FM Transmitter

FM TRANSMITTER.

1. To access the FM Transmitter, open the apps menu from the home screen. (Fig.18)
2. Press the FM Transmitter icon. (Fig.19)
3. To power on the FM Transmitter, press the Power icon, the icon should highlight green.(Fig.20)
4. Press the left or right arrows to adjust to the preferred frequency. (Fig.21)
5. To save the desired radio channel, press and hold 1 of the 6 preset icons. (Fig.22)
6. Adjust the vehicles radio to the same FM frequency.

Note: Only one tablet can use the FM Transmitter at a time.



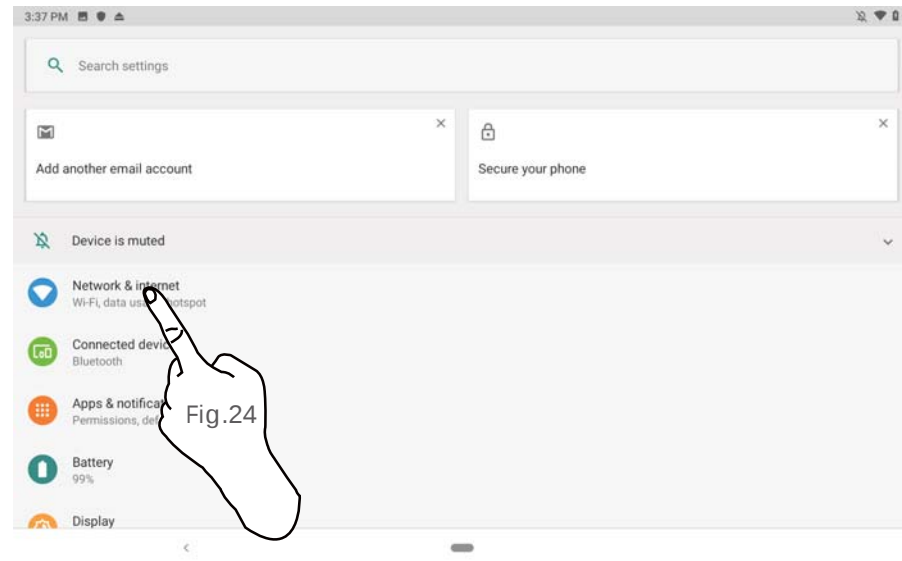

WI-FI.

Each tablet scans automatically for available Wi-Fi networks and connects to known networks when within range. Android provides several options for connecting to Wi-Fi where this section describes the most common.

1. Select the setting icon located on the home screen. (Fig.23)
2. Under Network & Internet in the settings menu, tap the icon. (Fig.24)
3. If Wi-Fi is set to OFF, tap the ON/OFF icon to activate it.

4. In the Wi-Fi control panel, select the network to connect to. (Fig.25)
5. Enter the password and tap Connect. (Fig.26)

Note: The Wi-Fi control panel displays the wireless networks within range, their signal strength, and any wireless networks the tablet has connected previously. If the tablet is connected to a Wi-Fi network, the name and signal strength are displayed.

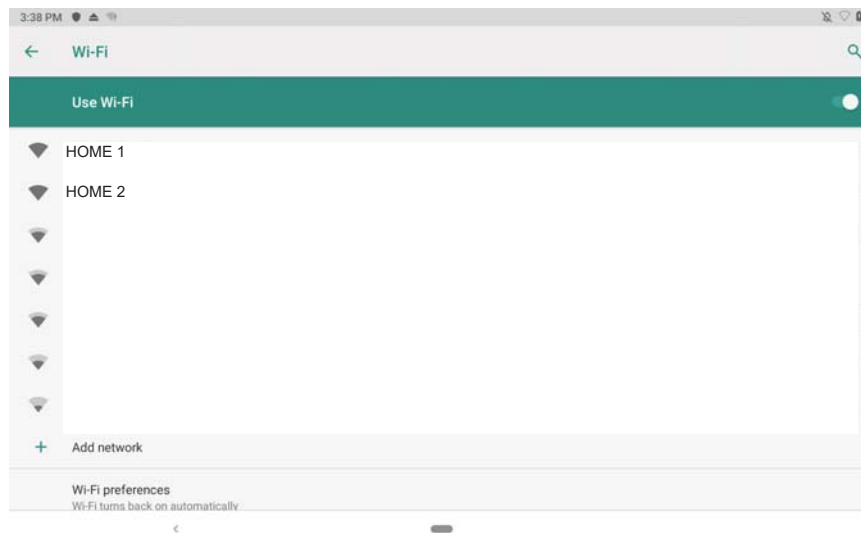

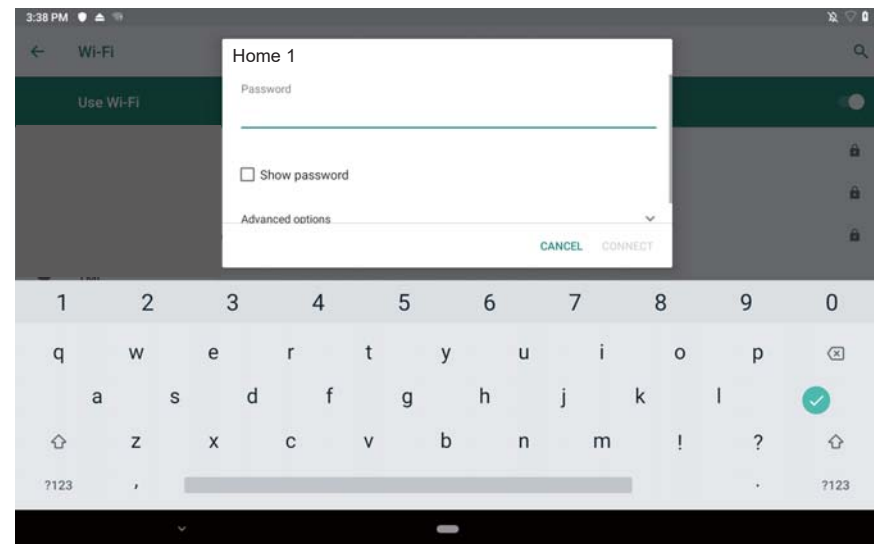

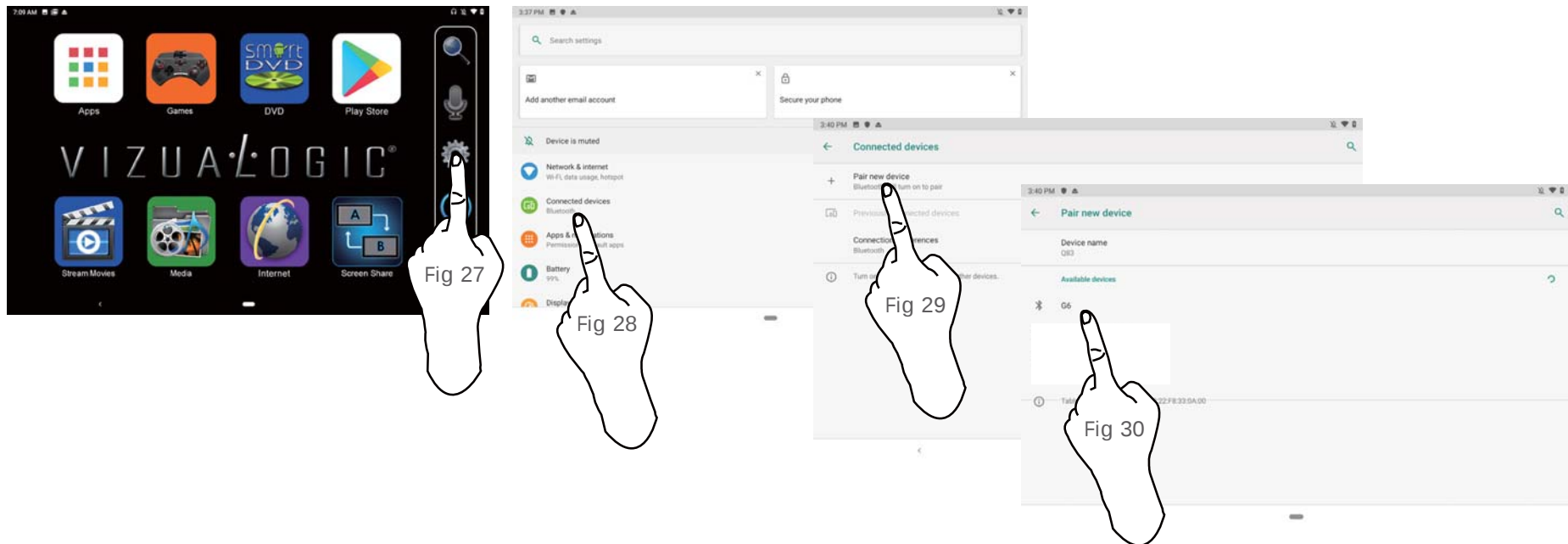
RSE - How to Connect to Bluetooth Devices

BLUETOOTH CONNECTION

1. To turn on the bluetooth, go to the home page.
2. Press the Settings icon. (Fig 27)
3. Press the Bluetooth icon. (Fig 28)
4. Press the ON/OFF icon to switch the bluetooth to on. (Fig 29)
5. Place the device into pairing mode.

Note: Follow the pairing device's instructions for pairing mode.

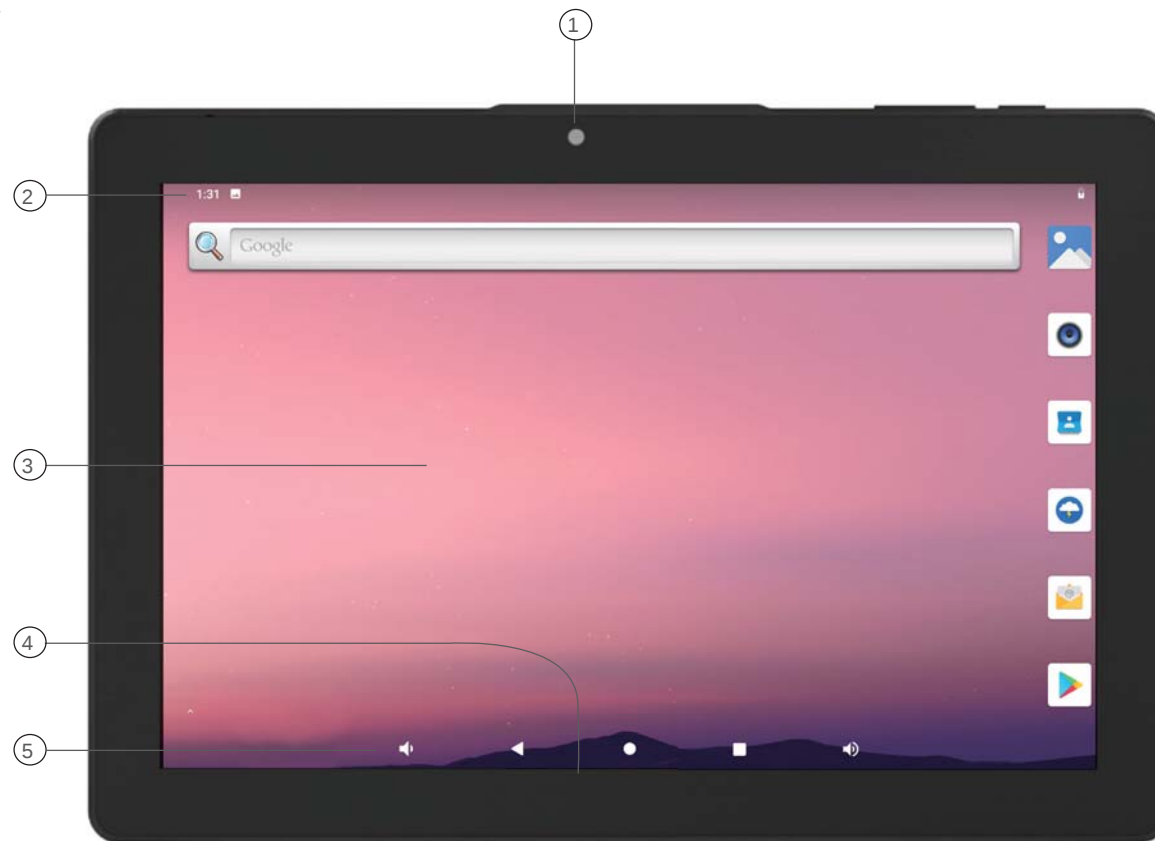
6. When the pairing device's name appears, select the name and wait for Connected to appear (Fig 30)

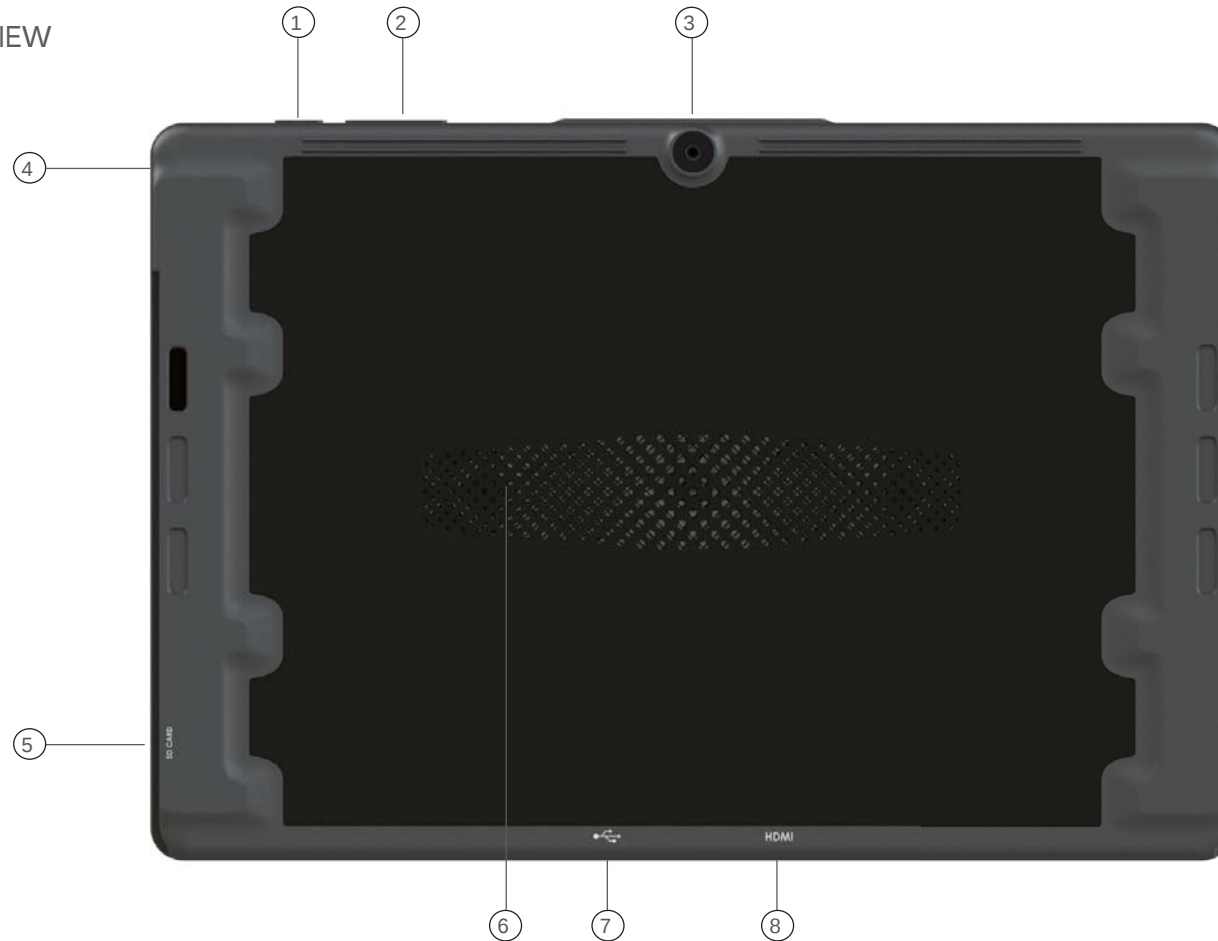

Tablet - Overview

POWER BUTTON

The power button will power the tablet on, off, or put the tablet into sleep mode.

Sleep mode is a power saving mode that disables certain functions; namely, the screen.

Your tablet will still play music, and remain ready to use with a simple press of the power button.

Power Your Tablet ON

- Press and hold the power button and wait for the screen to activate.

Put Your Tablet into SLEEP MODE

- Press the power button once to put the tablet into sleep mode.

Power Your Tablet OFF

- Press and hold the power button to turn the tablet completely off.

VOLUME BUTTON

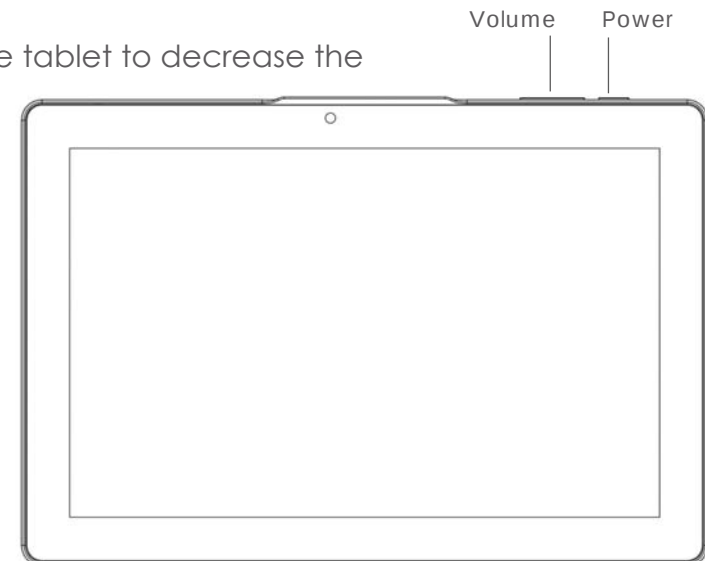
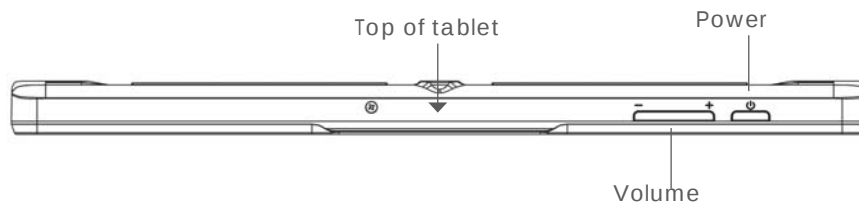
The volume button increases and decreases the volume of the speaker.

Turn Your Tablet's Volume UP

- Press the plus (+) icon located on the right top side of the tablet to increase the volume.

Turn Your Tablet's Volume DOWN

- Press the minus (-) icon located on the right top side of the tablet to decrease the volume.

MICRO SD CARD SLOT

Your tablet will accept a micro SD card up to 256GB.

Connecting a Micro SD Card

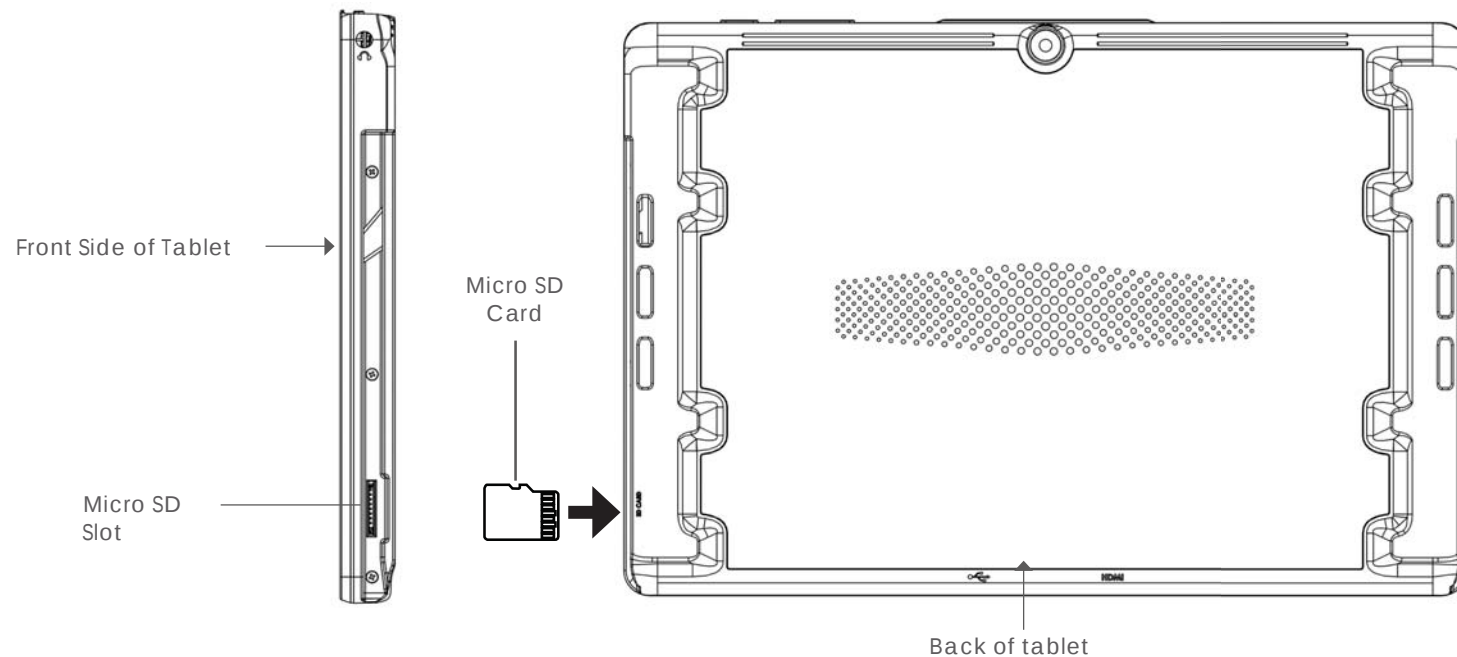
- Insert a micro SD card into the Micro SD card slot located on the left bottom corner.
- The micro SD card will be detected automatically and a notification will appear at the top of the screen in the notification area indicating that it is ready to use.

Accessing the Micro SD Card

- To view your files on the micro SD card, swipe down from the top of the screen and press **Explore**. This will open the file browser and the contents of the card.

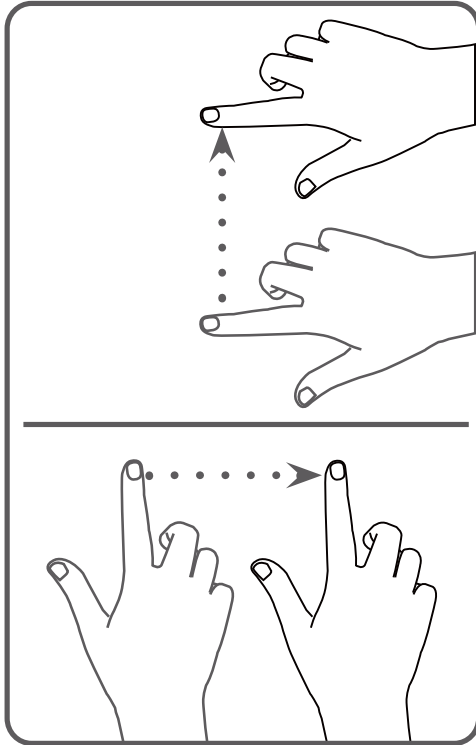
Unmount the Micro SD Card

- To safely unmount the micro SD card, swipe down from the top of the screen and press **Eject**. It is now safe to remove the micro SD card from the tablet.



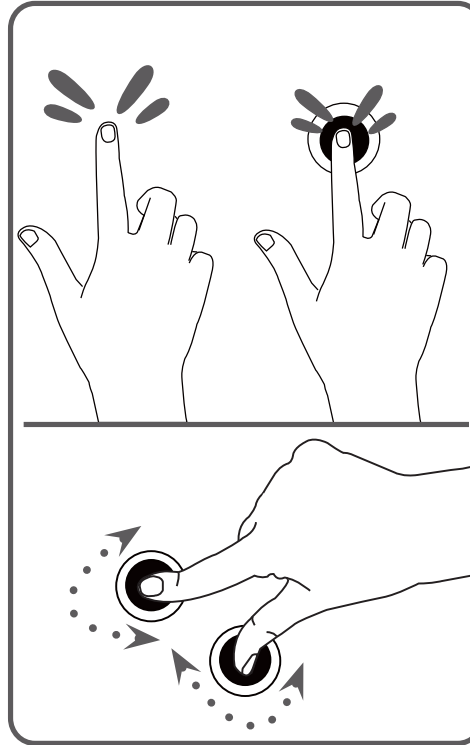
GESTURE CONTROL

The screen on your Omni 8 tablet is capable of accepting up to five points of contact at once. By using these simple hand gestures, you can interact with the tablet and its various functions.



Swipe

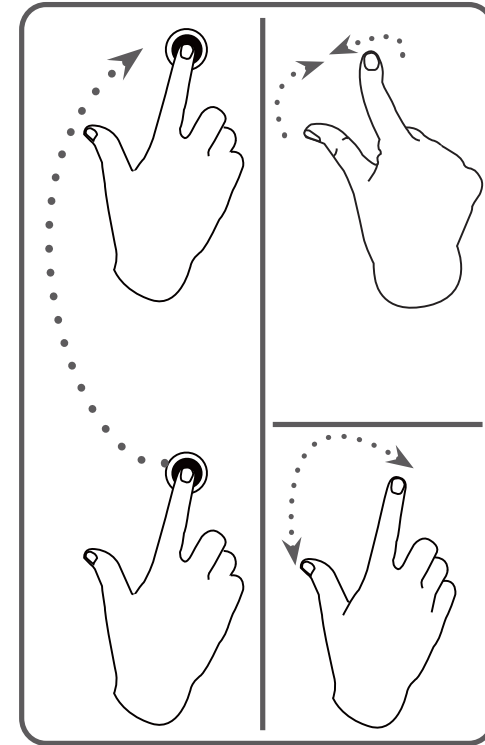
Touch and drag your finger in any direction on the screen.



Tap / Hold / Rotate

Briefly press the screen to select an icon, item, or APP. Press and hold to bring up menus or other options.

Hold and turn two fingers to rotate things like pictures and games.



Hold & Drag

Touch and hold any item on the screen, such as an APP., to move it.

Zoom In / Zoom Out

Touch the screen with two fingers and pinch in or out. In some cases, you can also zoom in and out by quickly tapping the screen twice.

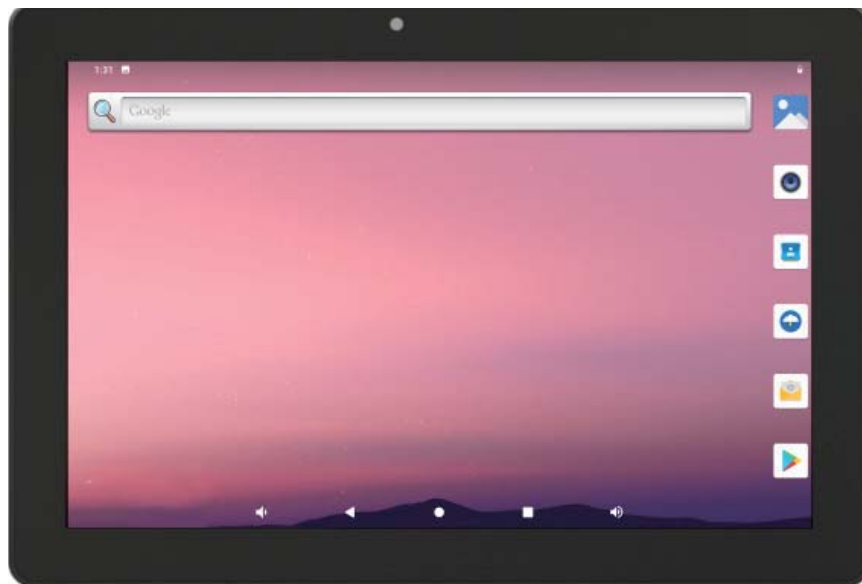

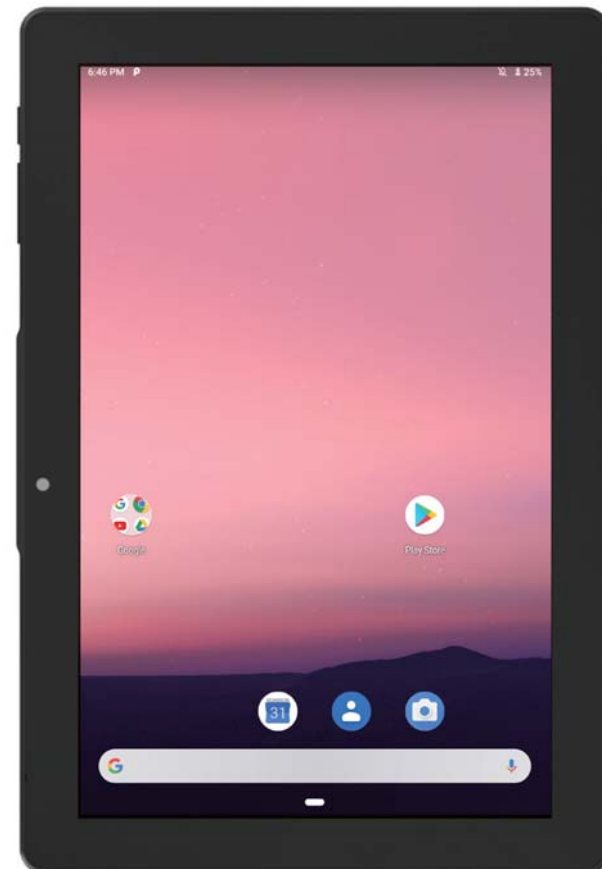
SCREEN ORIENTATION

Your tablet will automatically adjust from portrait to landscape mode as you rotate the tablet. You can disable this feature by dragging the **Quick Settings** tab down from the top right of the screen and pressing **Auto-Rotate**.

ANDROID OS UPDATES

Over the air updates (OTA) for the operating system contain improvements such as fixes, security enhancements, and other new features to improve your user experience. It is recommended to check for updates regularly and run the most current version of the software.

Check for Updates

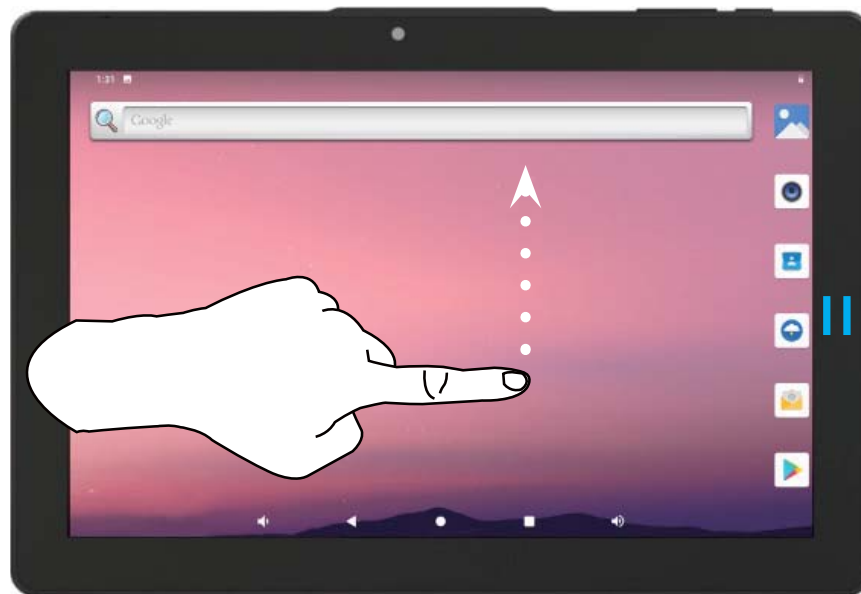

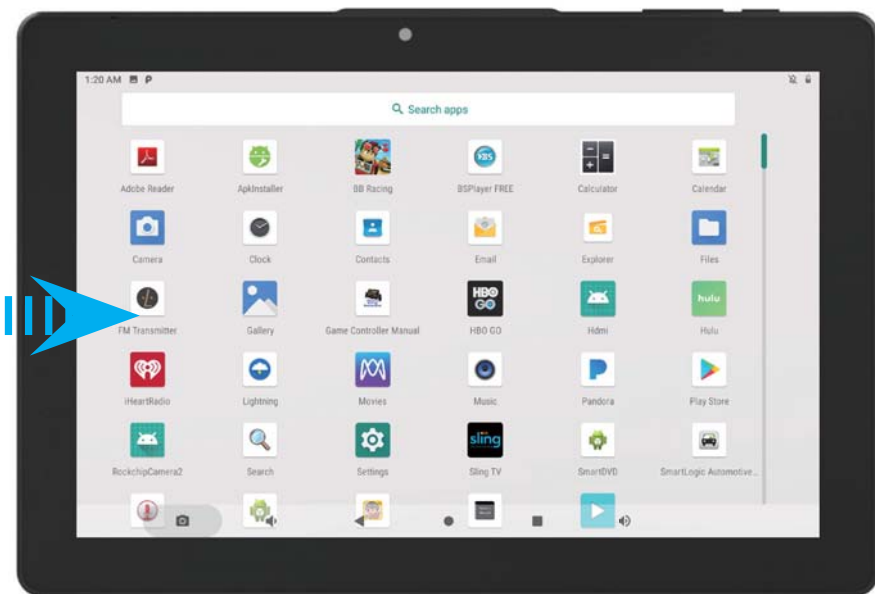
ADD apps

Tablet - Downloading apps to your Device

DOWNLOAD apps FROM GOOGLE PLAY STORE

1. Open Google Play.
 - On your tablet, use the Play Store app.
 - Applicable fees may apply.
2. Find an app you're looking for.
3. When you pick an app, press install.

Moving apps on the Home Screen

- Press and hold any app on the screen, then drag it to a new location. Remove your finger.

Grouping APPS Together

- Press and hold any app on the screen; then drag it on top of another app. Remove your finger.

Removing an app or Widget from the Home Screen

- Press and hold the app or Widget and drag it to "X Remove" at the top of the screen.

Deleting apps from Your Tablet

- Press and hold the app icon of the app you want to delete. When the fly-out menu appears, press Additional Info and press the button marked "Uninstall" to delete it from your tablet.

PICTURES, VIDEO & GALLERY

Your tablet is equipped with front and rear facing cameras for capturing images and video.

Taking Pictures

- Press the  icon from the apps menu or Home Screen.
- When you are ready, press  to capture the image.
- After taking a photo, a small thumbnail of the image will appear in the corner of the camera view. Press the thumbnail to view the image gallery.

Taking Video

The camera takes still images by default, and must switch modes to take video.

- While in camera mode, swipe right from the left part of the screen and select **Video**.
- When you are ready, press  to begin recording video. Press  again to stop recording.

Camera Functions & Options

- Press  to access the following options for the camera; use front/rear camera, overlay grid, set 0/3/10second timer.
- After swiping right, press  to adjust camera resolution and other settings.
