2 WALKIE TALKIES

SAFETY WARNINGS

- Adult supervision required.
- Walkie Talkies are not water resistant. Do not expose to liquids other than to a damp cloth.
- Do not ingest any items included in this set.
- Use this product only for its intended purpose. Do not use attachments of any kind.
- Inspect before every use. If product appears damaged in any manner, discontinue use and discard immediately.

BATTERY WARNINGS

- Do not mix old and new batteries.



Battery Installation



Step 1

Using a Phillips-head screwdriver, loosen the screw by turning it counterclockwise and remove the battery cover.


Step 2

Insert 4 AAA 1.5V batteries (not included) in the orientation shown in each walkie talkie.

Step 3

Replace the battery cover and screw by turning it clockwise.

Using Your Walkie Talkies



Step 1

Slide up the power switch on both walkie talkies to turn them on. The walkie talkies will flash while searching and turn solid on when connected.

Step 2

Press and hold the talk button while you speak. Release when you are finished speaking.
TIP: Only 1 person can talk at a time.

Step 3

Quickly press the talk button twice to ring the other walkie talkie.

TIP

- For best results, use the walkie talkies in open spaces that are clear of buildings and other obstacles.
