- Before each usage or assembly, inspect unit for damaged hardware, loose joints, missing parts or sharp edges. NEVER use this product if there are any loose or missing fasteners, loose joints, broken parts, or torn mesh/fabric. Check before assembly and periodically during use. - **DO NOT** place bassinet near a window where cords from blinds or drapes may strangle a child. Child may fall out of window.

# Bassinet Assembly





**Note:** You may need the help of another adult to help steady all parts for assembly.


- Insert wood dowels into left (with power cord connector) and right legs as shown above.
- Note the orientation of the Center Leg Connector before assembling. The open portion of the indentation should face up.
- Insert Left and Right Legs into Center Leg Connector to create Frame Leg 1.




- 1 Lay assembled Frame Leg 1 flat onto floor.
- Line up the first metal cross bar with the shape of the indentation. The "Facing Inward" sticker should face inward.
- 2 Insert (4) M6 x 16mm bolts and hand-tighten so that the assembled Leg has a little room to wiggle.
- Repeat for remaining metal cross bar. Ensure all bolts are mostly screwed in, but not tight. They will be fully tightened later.

- Insert wood dowels into left and right legs as shown above.
- Note the orientation of the Center Leg Connector before assembling. The open portion of the indentation should face up.
- Insert Left and Right Legs into Center Leg Connector to create Frame Leg 2.



- ① Lay assembled Frame Leg 2 onto floor.
- ② Flip over Frame Leg 1 from step 2 so that metal cross bars are facing down.
- Line up the metal cross bars on Frame Leg 1 with the shapes of the indentations in Frame Leg 2.
- ③ Insert (4) M6 x 16mm bolts and hand-tighten so that the assembled Leg has a little room to wiggle.
- Repeat for remaining metal cross bar. Ensure all bolts are mostly screwed in but not tight, they will be fully tightened in the next step.

# Bassinet Assembly

Once Leg Frame is assembled, use the included Allen key to fully tighten all 16 bolts (4 per leg) holding the Legs to the Center Leg Connectors- **DO NOT OVERTIGHTEN**



While tightening the Leg Bolts, make sure the Legs align with the Center Leg Connector. Small gaps between parts are OK. See below examples:




- While ensuring that each leg is aligned with the Center Leg Connectors, tighten all bolts holding Leg Frame together. Small gaps between parts are OK. There are 16 bolts in total-4 per leg. **Do not overtighten.**

Note: Ensure the Wooden Left Leg (with Power Cord Connector) is located at the front of the bassinet.

- Place the bassinet on a flat surface with the bottom cross tubes facing up.
- Align the fully assembled base to the bassinet cross tubes, noting the location of the bolt holes.
- Insert the M6 bolt to the cross bar and tighten with the allen key included. ①
- Insert the other M6 bolt and tighten with the allen key included. ②
- Repeat on the other side. ③ ④
- Check to be sure the support is secure.



# Bassinet Assembly




- Place the Mattress Support board into the bassinet. (Optional)
- When using Mattress Support board, tuck any excess fabric material down underneath board.

NOTE: If needed, remove the Mattress Support Board to increase Autoglide speed.

## Choose a sheet option

- Choose either the Knit Sheet or the PureAir 3D Mesh Sheet
- Place the sheet over the mattress pad.
- Place the mattress pad with sheet into the bassinet.




# Installing Module



1

- Identify the front of the bassinet, the front has the power cord connector on the inside of the leg.
- Insert the USB Type C wire into the bottom clip as shown. **1**
- Connect the USB Type C wire to the back side of the module and ensure it is fastened in place. **2** **3**
- Locate the locking cleat on the FRONT INSIDE of the bassinet. It is hidden under the fabric covering. **4**
- With the buttons facing outward **4**, lower the module down onto the front wall of the bassinet. **5** Ensure the locking clip on the module clicks onto the locking cleat and is securely in place.
- The module should be centered at the front of the bassinet. When centered the seam in the fabric will be visible through the locking clip on the module. **6**


# Wire Connection Assembly



1

- If any excess wire remains between the module and the fabric wall of the bassinet, pull down on wire under bassinet to remove the slack near the module. In the next step you will use the included Velcro Strap to affix extra wire to metal frame under bassinet.



- Locate Plug 1 underneath the bassinet and insert it into the auto glide connector. **1**

- Locate Plug 2 and insert it into the top connection point found on the inside of the front left wooden leg. **2**

- Use the Velcro Strap to secure wires to the front bar. (Ensure the wires still have enough space to allow auto glide to move left and right). **3**




- Locate the Power Cord. Insert it to the bottom plug of the Wooden Left Leg.

- Once all plugs are fully connected, locate the nearest wall socket to connect the power.
- When fully charged the green light on the Autoglide assembly will blink.

# Music Module Operation



With Stay-Flat™ Autoglide Technology

Press Auto-Glide button  to start 60 minutes cycle of auto glide. Press again to stop Auto-Glide

Note: Auto-Glide speed can be adjusted with PLUS/MINUS buttons on the “top-left” of the music module.

Activate bassinet light by pressing LIGHT button  on the top of the music module.

NOTE: Light will stay on 60 minutes cycles, unless button pressed before 60 minutes are up.

Press MUSIC button  on top of the music module to activate MUSIC.

Press button multiple times to cycle through eight (8) music melodies & white noise.

Volume can be adjusted with PLUS/MINUS buttons on the “top-right” of the music module.

Press Reset button  causes the device to reset; Indicator shows green when on.

Press Cry Detection button turns on  Cry Detection; Indicator shows green when on.
