1.3 Symbols and signal words

DANGER!

Danger for children

Ensure that plastic bags, packaging, etc. are disposed of properly and are not within reach of babies and young children. Choking hazard! Ensure that children do not detach any small parts (e.g. knobs or the like) from the unit. They could swallow the pieces and choke! Never let children unattended use electrical devices.

**DANGER!****Electric shock caused by high voltages inside**

Operating conditions



This device has been designed for indoor use only. To prevent damage, never expose the device to any liquid or moisture. Avoid direct sunlight, heavy dirt, and strong vibrations.



NOTICE!

Power supply



Before connecting the device, ensure that the input voltage (AC outlet) matches the voltage rating of the device and that the AC outlet is protected by a residual current circuit breaker. Failure to do so could result in damage to the device and possibly injure the user. Unplug the device before electrical storms occur and when it is unused for long periods of time to reduce the risk of electric shock or fire.

- Controls for gain, volume, treble, mids, bass, FX and master volume
- Mini jack connections for AUX / line input and headphone output
- Bluetooth audio receiver for playing backing tracks
- Digital guitar tuner with LED display

4 Installation and starting up

Unpack and check carefully there is no transportation damage before using the unit. Keep the equipment packaging. To fully protect the product against vibration, dust and moisture during transportation or storage use the original packaging or your own packaging material suitable for transport or storage, respectively.

Create all connections while the device is off. Use the shortest possible high-quality cables for all connections. Take care when running the cables to prevent tripping hazards.



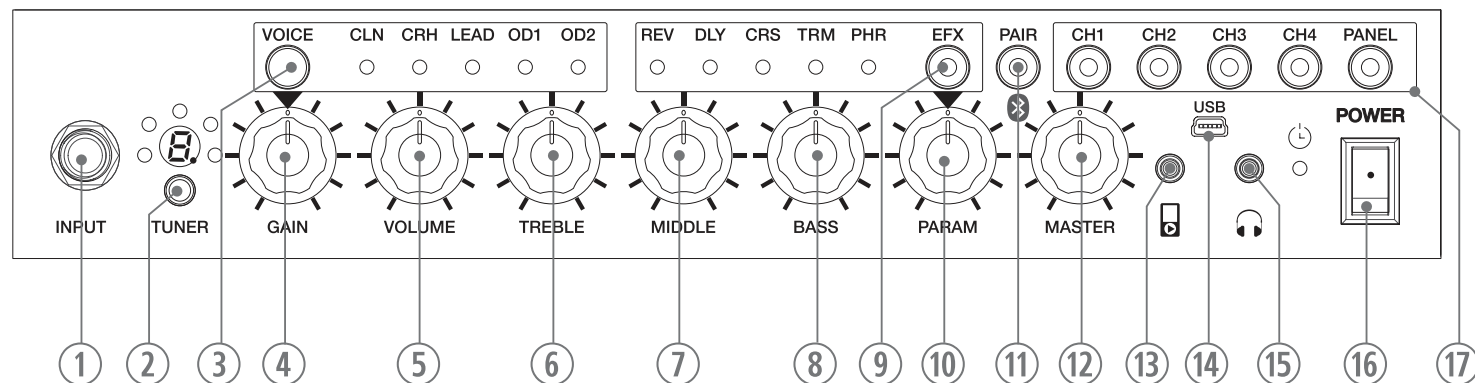
NOTICE!

Possible property damage by magnetic fields

Loudspeakers produce a static magnetic field. Therefore, maintain an appropriate distance to devices that can be adversely affected or damaged by an external magnetic field.


5 Connections and controls

Front panel



1	<p><i>[INPUT]</i></p> <p>1/4" jack socket to connect your instrument.</p>
2	<p><i>[TUNER]</i></p> <p>Button to turn the built-in tuner on or off. When switched on, the display above the button shows the note value of individually played notes. If the red and yellow LEDs light up to the left of the display, the string is tuned way too low. If only the yellow LED lights up, the string is tuned a little too low. If the red and yellow LEDs light up to the right of the display, the string is tuned way too high. If only the yellow LED lights up, the string is tuned a little too high. When the green LED lights up, the tuning of the string corresponds exactly to the displayed note value.</p>
3	<p><i>[VOICE]</i></p> <p>Button to activate the voicings CLN (clean), CRH (crunch), LEAD, OD1 (overdrive 1) and OD2 (overdrive 2). The LEDs to the right of the button indicate the activated voicing.</p>
4	<p><i>[GAIN]</i></p> <p>Input gain control.</p>
5	<p><i>[VOLUME]</i></p> <p>Control to adjust the volume of the instrument channel. In combination with active effects, <i>[VOLUME]</i> can be considered as a dry signal level control.</p>

6	<i>[TREBLE]</i> Treble control.
7	<i>[MIDDLE]</i> Mids control.
8	<i>[BASS]</i> Bass control.
9	<i>[EFX]</i> <p>Button to activate the effects REV (reverb), DLY, (delay), CRS (chorus), TRM (tremolo) and PHR (phaser). The LEDs to the left of the button indicate the activated effect.</p> <p>After activating the desired effect, 3 parameters can be set. To do so, hold <i>[EFX]</i> down until the LED in the button lights up red and thereby indicates that the first parameter can be set with <i>[PARAM]</i> . Press <i>[EFX]</i> again, this LED lights up green and thereby indicates that the second parameter can be set with <i>[PARAM]</i> . Press <i>[EFX]</i> again, this LED lights up blue and thereby indicates that the third parameter can be set with <i>[PARAM]</i> . Press <i>[EFX]</i> again to re-select the previous parameters. To exit these settings, hold <i>[EFX]</i> down until the LED in the button turns off.</p> <p>Please refer to the parameter matrix below for the details.</p>

10	<i>[PARAM]</i> Effect level control and control for various settings of the selected effect (see <i>[EFX]</i>). The effects are in parallel with the dry signal. Therefore <i>[PARAM]</i> can be considered as a wet signal level control.
11	<i>[PAIR]</i> Button for pairing or decoupling a Bluetooth device. Press the button. The blue LED in the button flashes, indicating that the device is ready for pairing. When establishing the connection via the Bluetooth device, search for “HB-20MFX GiT Amp” or “HB-40MFX GiT Amp”. When paired, the LED lights up constantly and you can play audio files via the device.
12	<i>[MASTER]</i> Control to adjust the overall volume.
13	 AUX input (3.5 mm jack socket) for connecting MP3 or CD players as well as mobile phones, tablets, etc.
14	<i>[USB]</i> Mini USB port through which the device can receive digital audio streams. Connect the device to the USB port of a computer using a suitable cable and select “MRX High Audio” as the audio output device. Of the controllers and buttons described here, only the <i>[MASTER]</i> control affects the USB signal.

Headphones output (3.5 mm mini phone socket).

When headphones are connected, the internal loudspeaker and the connection for external loudspeaker boxes are automatically muted.

16 [POWER]

Mains switch. Turns the device on and off.

If the device does not receive any signal for about 25 minutes at the [INPUT] socket, it will automatically turn to standby mode. The LED to the left of the switch then only glows. To turn the device on again, switch it off briefly with the [POWER] switch and then on again.

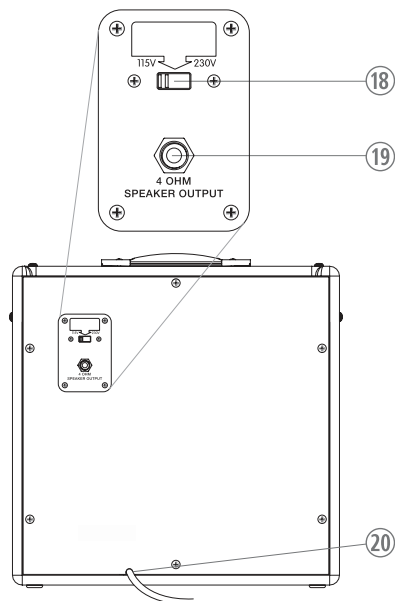
17 [CH1~4 | Panel]

The settings for VOICE, GAIN, VOLUME, TREBLE, MIDDLE, BASS, PARAM and EFX can be saved in the memory locations CH1 ~ 4. This means that four different sounds can be called up at the touch of a button.

To save the sound set with the aforementioned controls and buttons, press and hold the button for the desired memory location for one second. After releasing the button, it flashes briefly, indicating that saving has been successful. To activate the sounds stored under 1 – 4, briefly press the desired button, the LED of which then changes from red to green.

If you change one of the parameters mentioned while using a saved sound, the LED of the active memory location changes to red. The [PANEL] LED changes to green and shows that the sound set with the controls and buttons is active again. You can also press [PANEL] at any time to switch to the sound set with the knobs and buttons.

Rear panel



18 [115 V | 230 V]

Switch for setting the mains voltage available at the operating site. If the setting here deviates from the actual mains voltage, the device will be damaged or destroyed.

19 1/4" jack socket to connect external speaker boxes. The total impedance of the speakers connected here must not fall below 4 Ω . If this connection is used, the built-in loudspeaker is switched off.

20 Power cord.

8 Plug and connection assignment

Introduction

This chapter will help you select the right cables and plugs to connect your valuable equipment in such a way that a perfect sound experience is ensured.

Please note these advices, because especially in 'Sound & Light' caution is indicated: Even if a plug fits into the socket, an incorrect connection may result in a destroyed power amp, a short circuit or 'just' in poor transmission quality!

Balanced and unbalanced transmission

Unbalanced transmission is mainly used in semi-professional environment and in hifi use. Instrument cables with two conductors (one core plus shielding) are typical representatives of the unbalanced transmission. One conductor is ground and shielding while the signal is transmitted through the core.

Unbalanced transmission is susceptible to electromagnetic interference, especially at low levels, such as microphone signals and when using long cables.

In a professional environment, therefore, the balanced transmission is preferred, because this enables an undisturbed transmission of signals over long distances. In addition to the conductors 'Ground' and 'Signal', in a balanced transmission a second core is added. This also transfers the signal, but phase-shifted by 180°.

Since the interference affects both cores equally, by subtracting the phase-shifted signals, the interfering signal is completely neutralized. The result is a pure signal without any noise interference.
