4.1. Conducted Output Power

(a) The effective radiated power and antenna height for base stations may not exceed 1 kilowatt (30 dBw) and 304 m. (1,000 ft.) above average terrain (AAT), respectively, or the equivalent thereof as determined from the Table. TEST PROCEDURE

- For Conducted output Power
 1. The transmitter output port was connected to base station.
 2. The RF output of EUT was connected to the power meter by RF cable and attenuator, the path loss was compensated to the results for each measurement.
 3. Set EUT at maximum power through base station.
 4. Select lowest, middle, and highest channels for each band and different modulation.
 5. Measure the maximum PK burst power and maximum Avg. burst power.

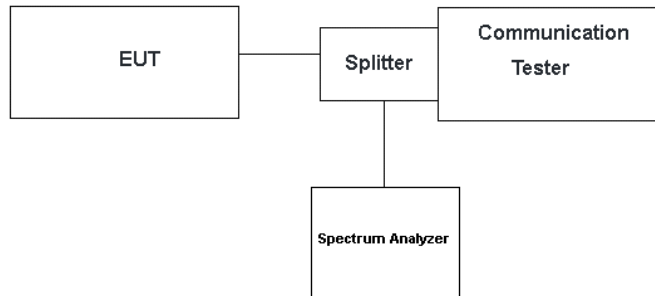

TEST PROCEDURE

- For Peak-to-Average Ratio
 1. The testing follows FCC KDB 971168 v02r02 Section 5.7.1.
 2. The EUT was connected to spectrum and communication tester via a splitter
 3. Set the CCDF (Complementary Cumulative Distribution Function) option in spectrum analyzer.
 4. The highest RF powers were measured and recorded the maximum PAPR level associated with a probability of 0.1 %.
 6. Record the deviation as Peak to Average Ratio.

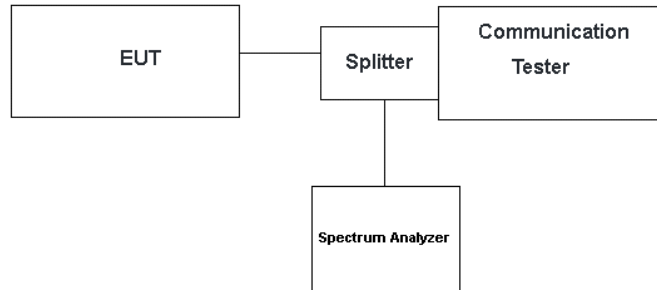

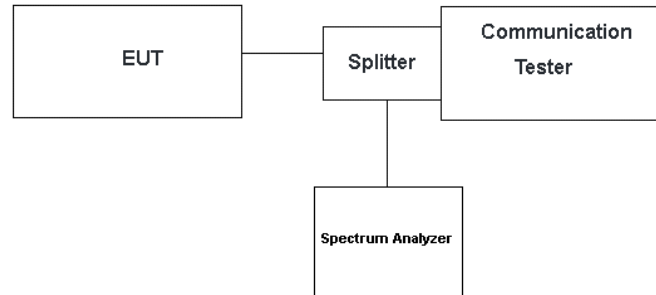


4.4. Out of band emission at antenna terminals

FDD Band 26: The power of any emission outside of the authorized operating frequency ranges must be attenuated below the transmitting power (P) by a factor of at least $43 + 10 \log(P)$ dB.

The specification that emissions shall be attenuated below the transmitter power (P) by at least $43 + 10 \log(P)$ dB, translates in the relevant power range (1 to 0.001 W) to -13 dBm. At 1 W the specified minimum attenuation becomes 43 dB and relative to a 30 dBm (1 W) carrier becomes a limit of -13 dBm. At 0.001 W (0 dBm) the minimum attenuation is 13 dB, which again yields a limit of -13 dBm. In this way a translation of the specification from relative to absolute terms is carried out.

1. The RF output of the transceiver was connected to a spectrum analyzer through appropriate attenuation.
2. The resolution bandwidth of the spectrum analyzer was set at 1MHz; sufficient scans were taken to show the out of band Emissions if any up to 10th harmonic.
3. For the out of band: Set the RBW = 1MHz VBW ≥ 3 times RBW, Start=30MHz, Stop= 10th harmonic.

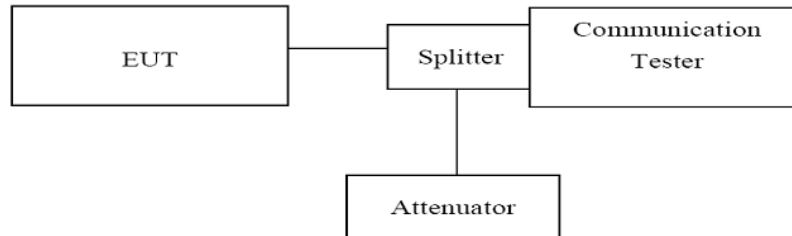


4.5. Receiver Spurious Emissions at Antenna Terminal

4.6. Band Edge compliance

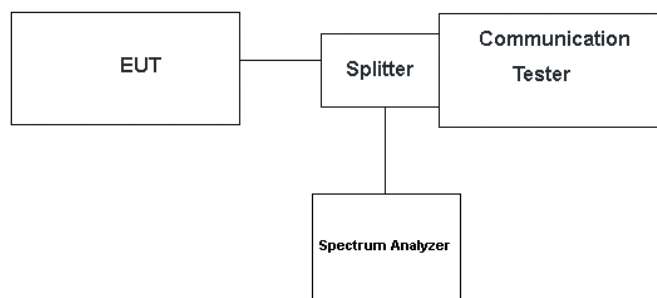
The specification that emissions shall be attenuated below the transmitter power (P) by at least $43 + 10 \log(P)$ dB, translates in the relevant power range (1 to 0.001 W) to -13 dBm. At 1 W the specified minimum attenuation becomes 43 dB and relative to a 30 dBm (1 W) carrier becomes a limit of -13 dBm. At 0.001 W (0 dBm) the minimum attenuation is 13 dB, which again yields a limit of -13 dBm. In this way a translation of the specification from relative to absolute terms is carried out.

Part 90.691 (a) Out of band emission requirement shall apply only to the “outer” channels included in an EA license and to spectrum adjacent to interior channels used by incumbent licensees. The emission limits are as follows:

(1) For any frequency removed from the EA licensee's frequency block by up to and including 37.5 kHz, the power of any emission shall be attenuated below the transmitter power (P) in watts by at least $116 \log_{10}(f/6.1)$ decibels or $50 + 10 \log_{10}(P)$ decibels or 80 decibels, whichever is the lesser attenuation, where f is the frequency removed from the center of the outer channel in the block in kilohertz and where f is greater than 12.5 kHz.

(2) For any frequency removed from the EA licensee's frequency block greater than 37.5 kHz, the power of any emission shall be attenuated below the transmitter power (P) in watts by at least $43 + 10 \log_{10}(P)$ decibels or 80 decibels, whichever is the lesser attenuation, where f is the frequency removed from the center of the outer channel in the block in kilohertz and where f is greater than 37.5 kHz.

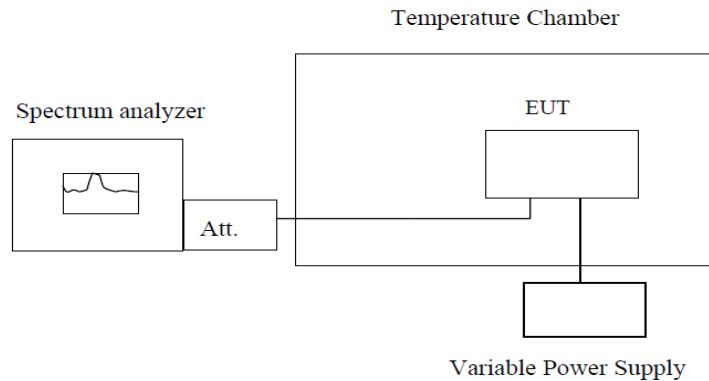

2. RF output was connected to a frequency counter or spectrum analyzer via feed through attenuators.
3. The EUT was placed inside the temperature chamber.
4. Set the spectrum analyzer RBW low enough to obtain the desired frequency resolution and measure EUT 25°C operating frequency as reference frequency.
5. Turn EUT off and set the chamber temperature to -5°C. After the temperature stabilized for approximately 30 minutes recorded the frequency.
6. Repeat step measure with 10°C increased per stage until the highest temperature of +30°C reached.
7. Reduce the input voltage to specified extreme voltage variation (+/- 10%) and endpoint, record the maximum frequency change.
