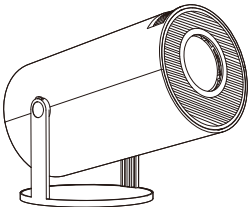

LED Projector

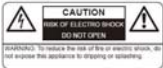

SAFETY INFORMATION

- Read Instructions**—Read safety and operating instructions should be read before the appliance is operated.
- Read Instructions**—The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.
- Read Warnings**—All warnings on the appliance and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.
- Water and Moisture**—Do not use the appliance near water (e.g., bath tub, sink, swimming pool or in wet places or tropical climates. Do not place objects that with liquids, such as vases, on top of the appliance. Do not expose the appliance to dripping or splashing.
- Setup**—The appliance should only be placed on a stable, flat surface. Do not let the appliance topple over or expose it to shock.
- Wall or Ceiling Mounting**—The appliance should be mounted to a wall or ceiling only as recommended by the manufacturer.
- Ventilation**—The appliance should be situated so that its location or position does not interfere with its proper ventilation. For example, the appliance should not be situated on a bed, sofa, rug, or similar surface that may block the ventilation openings or placed in a built-in installation, such as a bookcase or cabinet that may impede the flow of air through the ventilation openings. Ensure a minimum distance of 5 cm around the appliance for sufficient ventilation. Ensure that the ventilation is not impeded by covering the ventilation openings with items such as newspapers, tablecloths, curtains, etc.
- Heat**—The appliance should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other appliances (including amplifiers) that produce heat.
- Power Sources**—The appliance should be connected to a power supply only of the type described in the operating instructions or as marked on the appliance.
- Cables and Plugs**—The mains plug shall remain readily accessible. All cables should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the appliance.
- Cleaning**—The appliance should be cleaned only as recommended by the manufacturer. Clean by wiping with a dry and clean cloth. Do not use chemical cleaners or detergents. Always unplug the mains plug before cleaning the unit.
- Release Petards**—The power cord of the appliance should be unplugged from the outlet when left unused for a long period of time.
- Object and Liquid Entry**—Care should be taken so that objects do not fall and liquids are not spilled into the enclosure through openings.
- Damage Requiring Service**—The appliance should be serviced by qualified service personnel when:
 - The power supply cord or the plug has been damaged.
 - Objects have fallen, or liquid has been spilled, into the appliance.
 - The appliance has been exposed to rain.
 - The appliance does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance.
 - The appliance has been dropped, or the enclosure damaged.
- Servicing**—The user should not attempt to service the appliance beyond that described in the operating instructions. All other servicing should be referred to qualified service personnel.

- Open Fire**—Keep the appliance away from open fires. Do not place naked flame sources, such as lighted candles, on the appliance.
- Thunderstorm**—During a thunderstorm the mains plug should be unplugged.
- Safety Check**—After servicing the technician should conduct a safety check in order to ensure that the appliance is working properly and safely.
- Batteries**—Always place batteries in the correct polarisation into electrical components. Danger of explosion if battery is incorrectly recharged. Recharge only with the same or equivalent type. Do not mix old and new batteries. Take attention to the environmental aspects of battery disposal. Batteries should not be exposed to excessive heat such as sunlight, fire or fire risk. Remove batteries before disposing of the product.
- Volume Levels**—To prevent possible hearing damage, do not listen at high volume levels for long periods.

FURTHER NOTES ON THE DEVICE

Setting a safe volume level

Saving energy

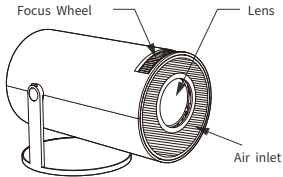
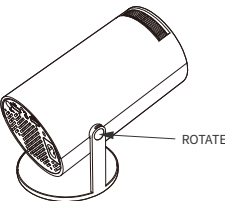
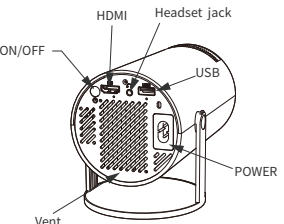
- If the unit is not used for a long period of time, it should be unplugged from the AC socket.

Unpacking

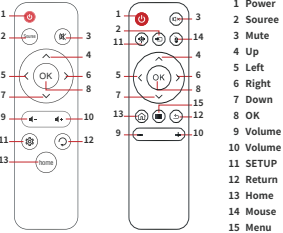
- Take out carefully the unit from the packing. Please keep the packing for further use.

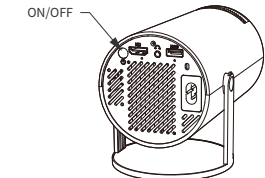


Remote Control



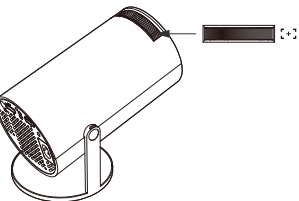
Power ON/OFF

Power On
Long press Power button on projector for 3 seconds.
Power Off
When the projector is powered-on, press and hold the power button on the projector or the remote control for 3s to power off.



Focus Adjustment

When projector is on, adjust sharpness by focus wheel on the back of projector.



Volume Control

To increase the volume, press the Volume Up button.
To decrease the volume, press the Volume Down button.

User Interface

After switched on projector ,the following UI will appear after 30s starting pictures flash.

2. Press OK button to confirm.

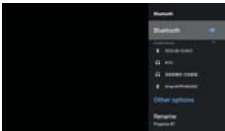
3. Select the file that you want to play, then press Play/Pause button to play the selected file.



Menu set up

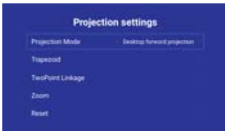
Select the SETE icon from the UI menu to go into the menu page setting.

1. BT Device Setting



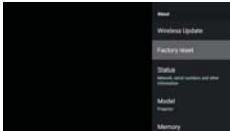
Bluetooth(OHDI), After selection, press OK to confirm.

Keystone(Reset), After selection, press OK to confirm.

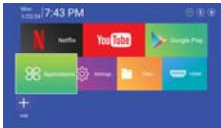
