


# Get Started

2 Plug your F1 into power, the blue light will be on, and the F1 will turn on automatically.




\* Please prepare your own AV cable.


\* Switch the display interface, please restart F1

3 Connect a wired network or set up a wireless network in SetupWized


Wireless Network
