Operation method

Power on/off

Long press for 3 seconds, red and blue alternate flashing to enter Wireless mode

Answer phone calls

When calling (blue light flashing), click the power button once to answer

End call

During a call, click the power button 1 to end the call

Play music

Click the power button 1 in standby mode

Pause music

Click on the power button 1 during music playback to pause playback

Music Size + -

Long press+increase volume, long press -decrease volume

Music Up and Down + -

Press once+Previous track Press once -Next track

Press the **M** key

Enter FM mode. TF card mode. Wireless mode
