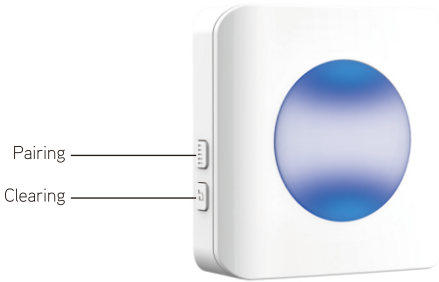




Signal Repeater

The signal repeater extends the range of communication between devices, supporting multiple transmitters.



Features:

- **Power Supply:** AC 100V to 240V
- **Working Range:** Up to 450 feet in open air.
- **Supported Transmitters:** Up to 20 devices.

LED Indicator Definitions:

- **Fast Blinking:** Pairing mode.
- **Blink 3 Times:** Resetting the device.
- **Solid Blue:** Signal forwarding.

Pairing Operation:

1. Short press the "Pairing button" to enter pairing mode (blue LED blinks).
2. Activate transmitters within 10 seconds to complete pairing. The device exits pairing mode automatically.

Reset Operation:

- Hold the "Clearing" button for 3 seconds to reset. The blue LED will blink 3 times.

Important Notes:

- Do not use two repeaters within the same range.
- Do not pair the same transmitter with two repeaters simultaneously.
