Installing the SIM Cards and the Battery

A SIM card carries useful information, including your mobile phone number, PIN (Personal Identification Number), PIN2, PUK (PIN Unlocking Key), PUK2 (PIN2 Unlocking Key), IMSI (International Mobile Subscriber Identity), network information, contacts data, and short messages data.

Installation

- ◆ Hold the End key for a while to power off the mobile phone.
- ◆ Take the back cover above the battery away.
- ◆ Take the battery away.
- ◆ Insert the SIM card into the SIM card slot lightly with the corner cutting of the card aligning to the notch of the slot and the gold plate of the card facing down, till the SIM card cannot be further pushed in.
- ◆ With the metallic contacts of the battery facing the metallic contacts in the battery slot, press the battery down until it locks into place.

Installing T-Flash Card

The T-Flash card is a pluggable mobile storage card inside the mobile phone.

To install the T-Flash card, open its latch, place its indented side downward, insert the card into the card slot, and then close the latch.

To remove the T-flash card, open its latch and slightly take the card out. And then close the latch.

Using the Menus

Phonebook

This feature can view and manage the telephone number information in the machine and in the SIM card.

Messages

Through this function, you can create, read or send new SMS

Note: If the short message memory is full, a blinking SMS icon appears on the top of the screen. To normally receive short messages, you need to delete some of the existing short messages.

Multimedia

- ◆ **Camera:** In the options of camera interface, you may set image viewer, camcorder, effect, settings.
- ◆ **DV:** Use this function to play camera.
- ◆ **Audio:** Use this function to play audio files.
- ◆ **Video:** You can play recorded or saved video files. When playing videos, you can freely switch, pause, play in full screen, etc.
- ◆ **Image:** View all pictures on your phone, allowing you to browse, delete, and send pictures, etc
- ◆ **Recorder:** To shoot a video, press the OK key to start recording, and you can choose to pause and save the recorded video. The submenu implements recording related settings.
- ◆ **File manager:** The phone supports the memory card. The capacity of the memory-card is selectable. You can use the file manager to conveniently manage various directories and files

on the memory card.

Settings

- ◆ **Scenario mode:** You may customize the profiles and activate any profile in order to use a specific function.
- **Call center:** Record the received calls, check the phone number, call time, and duration of the dialed calls.

◆ Phone settings:

- **Date and Time:** set the date format, the time format, and default time of the location.

***Note:** If you remove the battery from the mobile phone or if the battery energy was exhausted a long time ago, you may need to reset the date and time when re-inserting the battery or powering on the mobile phone after recharging.*

- **Language:** Select the display language and writing language for the mobile phone.
- **Shortcut settings:** Select preferred input Shortcut.
- **Auto power on/off:** Customize the on/off time, and the phone will switch on/off according to the defined time.
- **power management:** You'll be able to see how much battery you have left
- **Restore factory settings:** Use this function to restore factory settings. The preset password is 1122.

- ◆ **Display:** Users can access this item to set Wallpaper, Idle display, Contrast, Backlight and Auto keypad lock etc.

◆ Security:

- **Phone locked:** The function enables you to lock/unlock the phone. Entering password to switch on or off the phone. Password is required when the phone is locked.

- **Modify the cellphone password:** You can change your password.
- **Fixed dialing:** When you turn on fixed dialing, you can only dial numbers from stored fixed dialing lists. The fixed number sheet is stored in the SIM card
- **Blacklist:** You can set the contacts to blacklist, stop this contact calls, or information.
- ◆ **Call settings:**
 - **call forwarding:** You can forward incoming calls to other phone numbers.
 - **call waiting :** When the user's phone is on a call and a third user calls in, one party can be retained to talk to the other party
 - **Call Restrictions:** You can set call restrictions.
- ◆ **Family dialing:** When you activated the function, in standby mode, you can long press the key 1.2.3.4.5.6.7.8.9 to call coressponding number.
- ◆ **Connections:** Choose your network connection
- ◆ **Keyboard light settings:** You can turn the keyboard light on or off

Tools

- ◆ **Alarm:** You can set three alarms through this function
- ◆ **Calendar:** Once you enter this menu, there is a monthly-view calendar for you to keep track of important appointments, etc. Days with events entered will be marked.
- ◆ **Voice King:** You'll be able to turn voice dialing on and off
- ◆ **Calculator:** You can calculate in this function.

◆ **SOS:**

➤ **SOS number list:** Enter the number you need as your emergency number.

➤ **SOS message settings:** You can edit emergency messages.

➤ **Help:**SOS help info.

◆ **Power bank:** You will be able to turn the power bank function on or off
