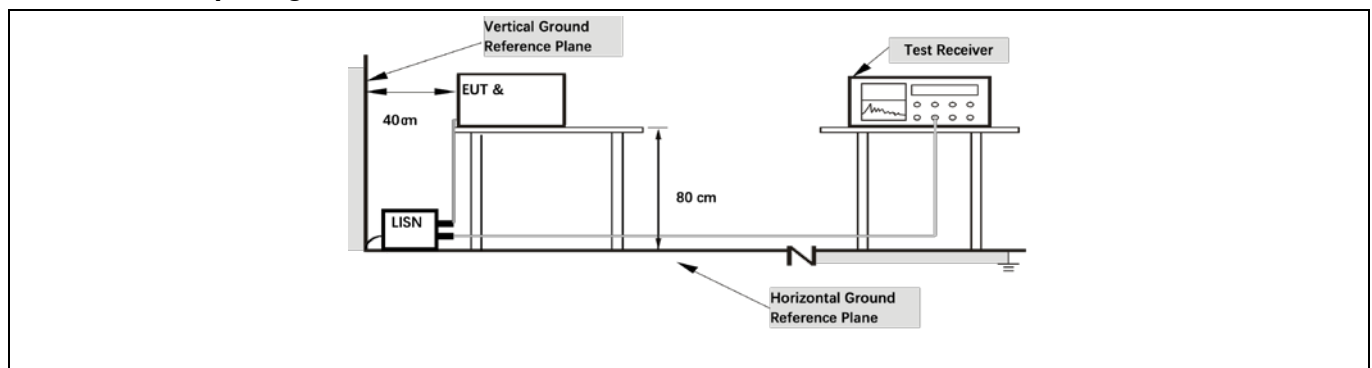

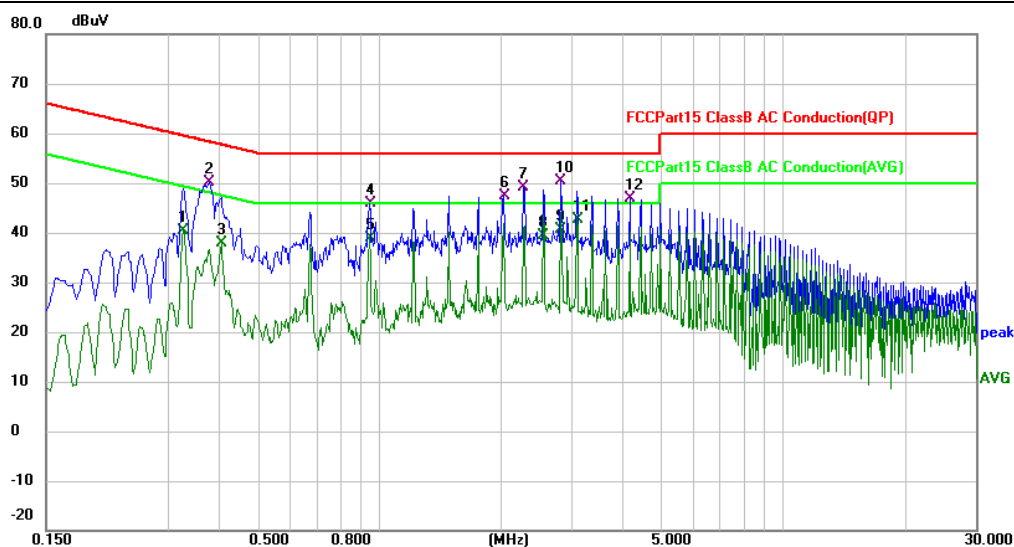

#### 6.1.2 Test Setup Diagram:



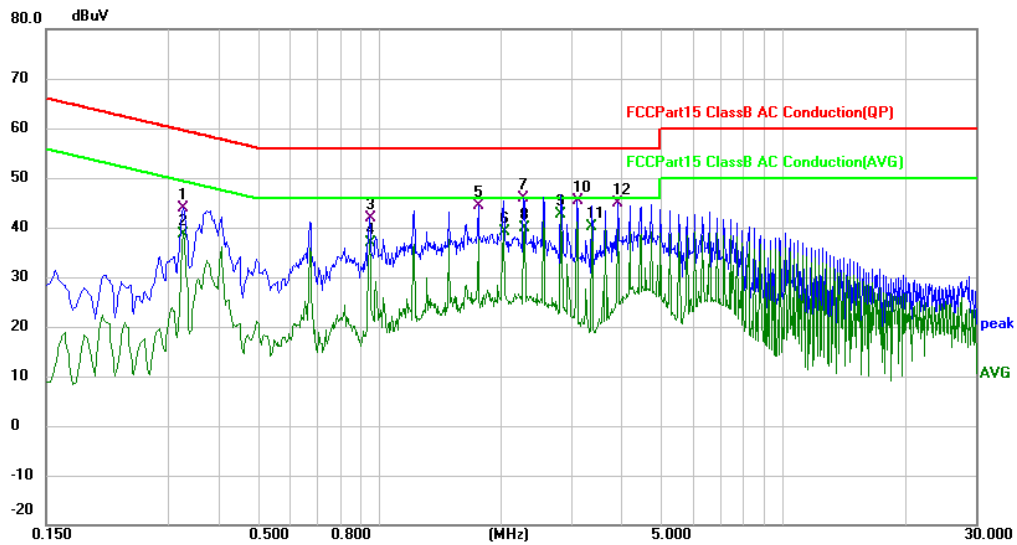

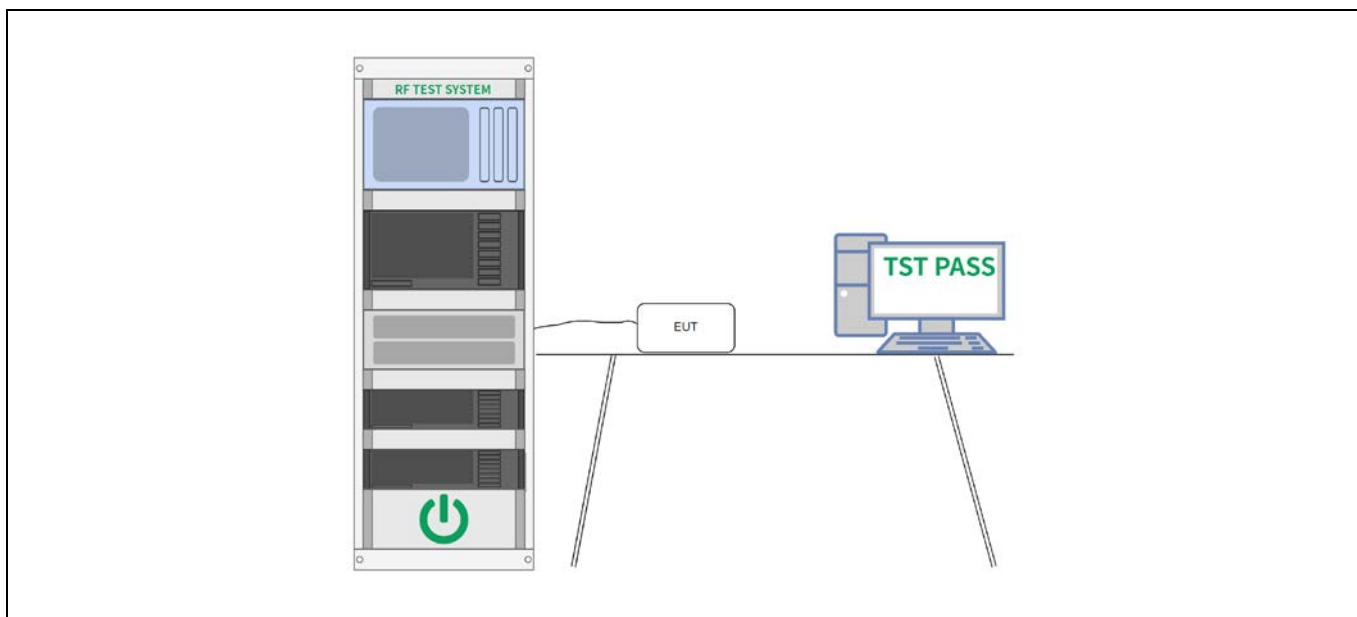

### 6.2.2 Test Setup Diagram:



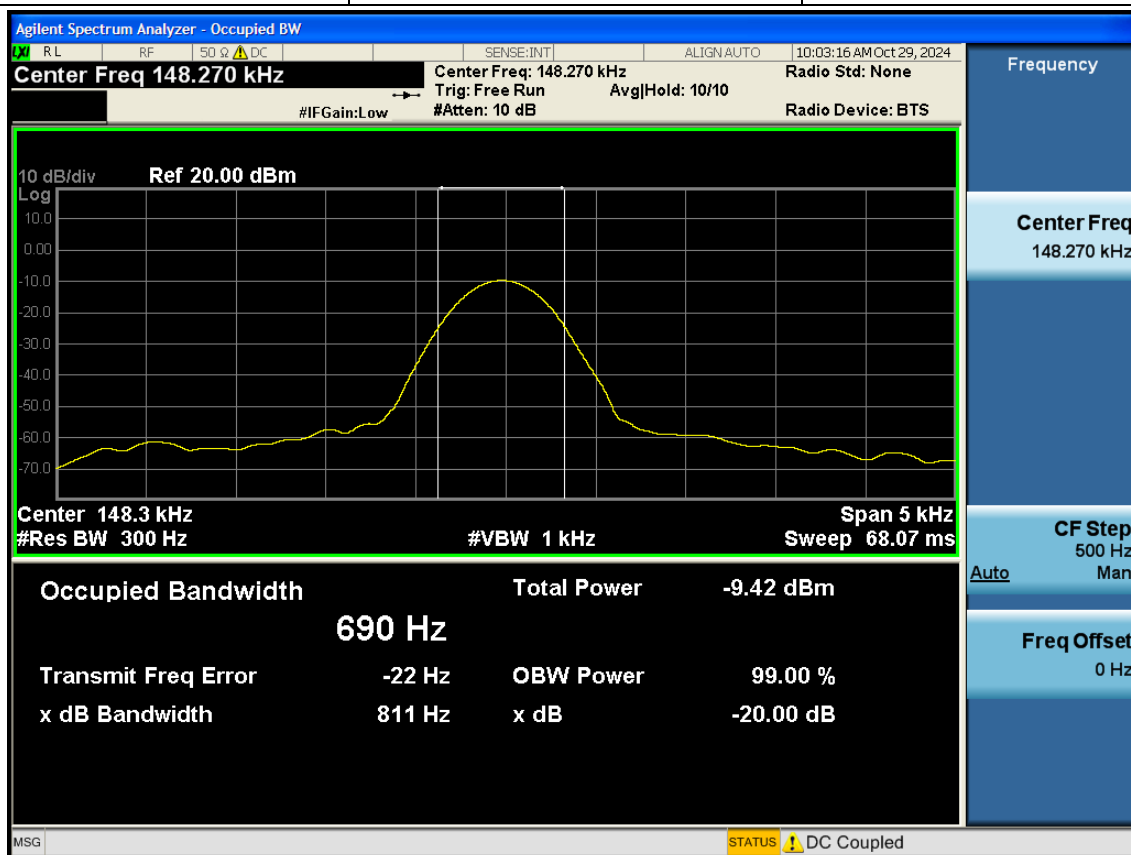

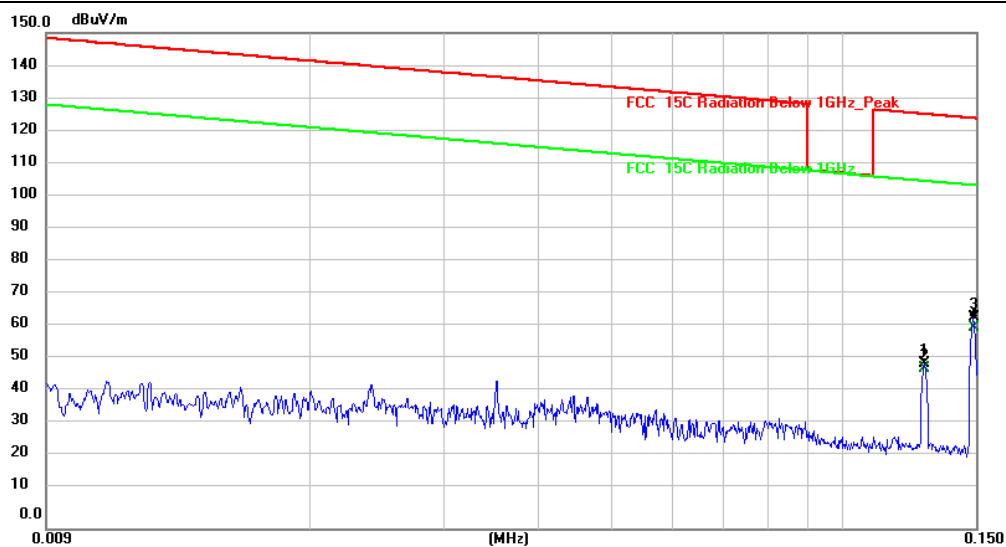

#### 6.3.2 Test Setup Diagram:



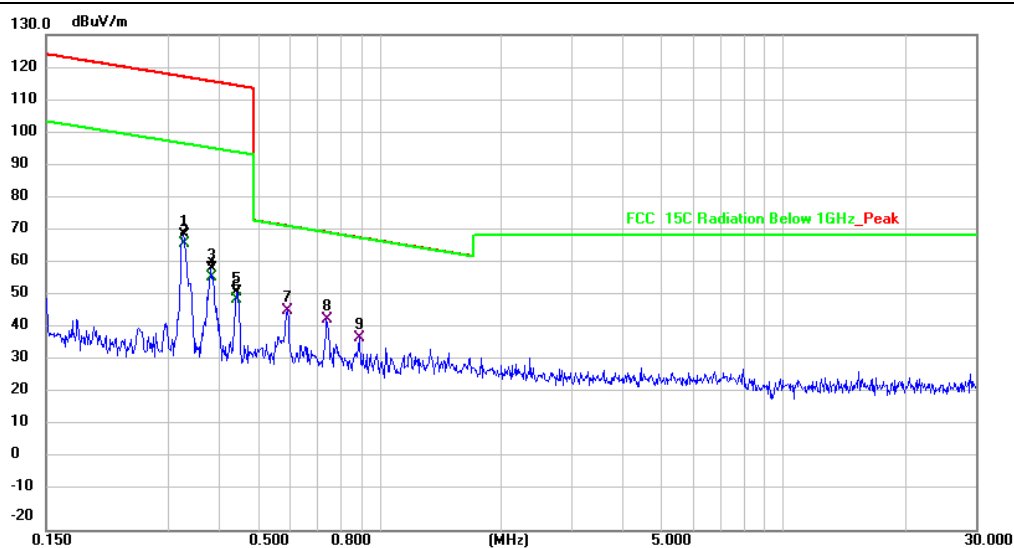

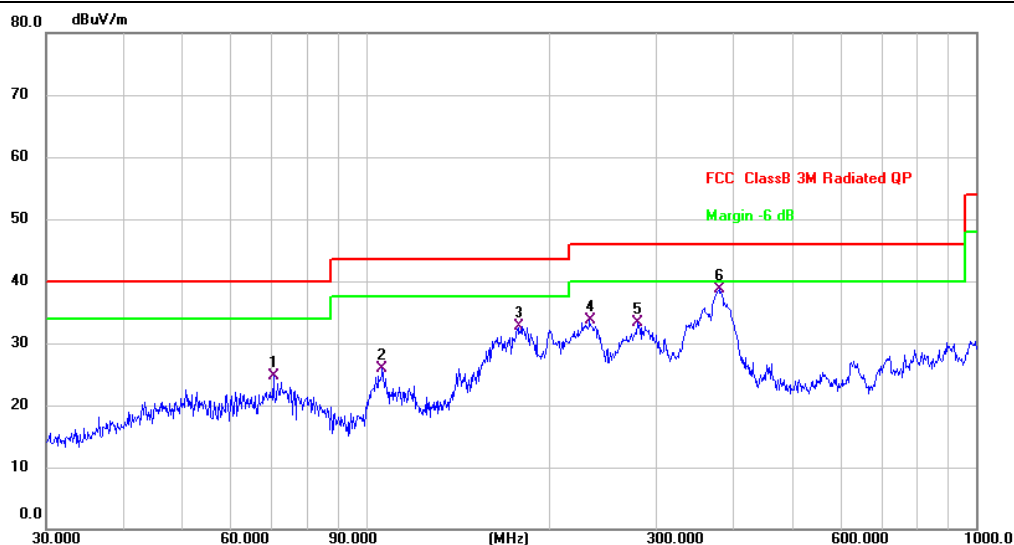

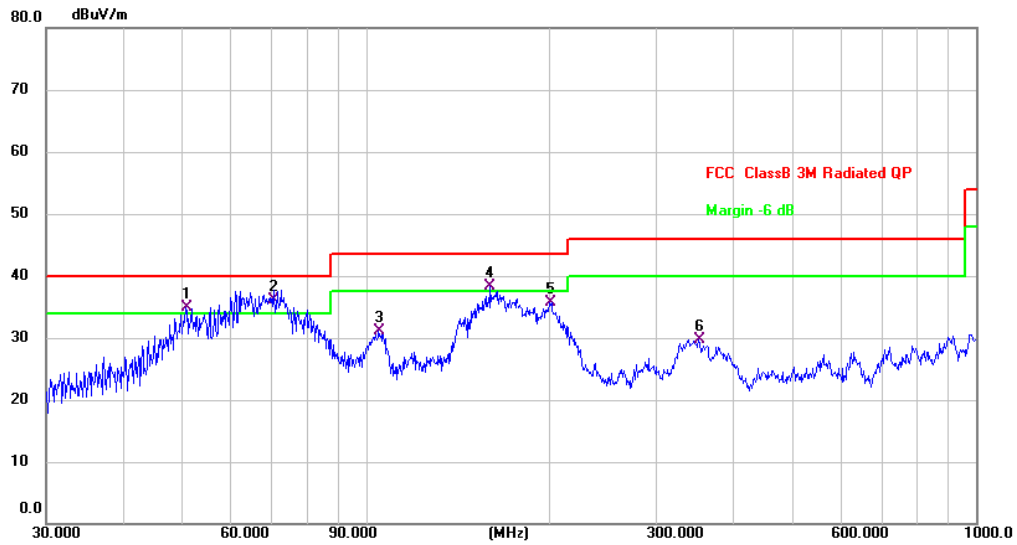
