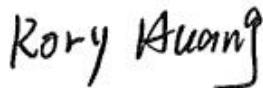

### **5.1. Evaluation Results (Evaluation)**

#### **5.1.1. Antenna Requirement**

Test Requirement:

Refer to 47 CFR Part 15.203, an intentional radiator shall be designed to ensure that no antenna other than that furnished by the responsible party shall be used with the device. The use of a permanently attached antenna or of an antenna that uses a unique coupling to the intentional radiator shall be considered sufficient to comply with the provisions of this section.

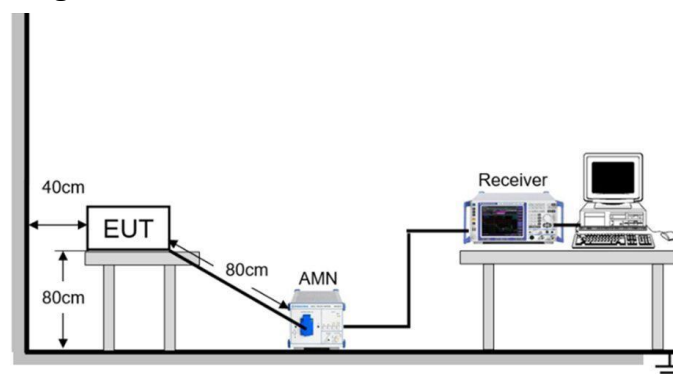

The EUT was placed on a platform of nominal size, 1 m by 1.5 m, raised 80 cm above the conducting ground plane. The vertical conducting plane was located 40 cm to the rear of the EUT. All other surfaces of EUT were at least 80 cm from any other grounded conducting surface.</li> <li>3. The EUT and simulators are connected to the main power through a line impedances stabilization network (LISN). 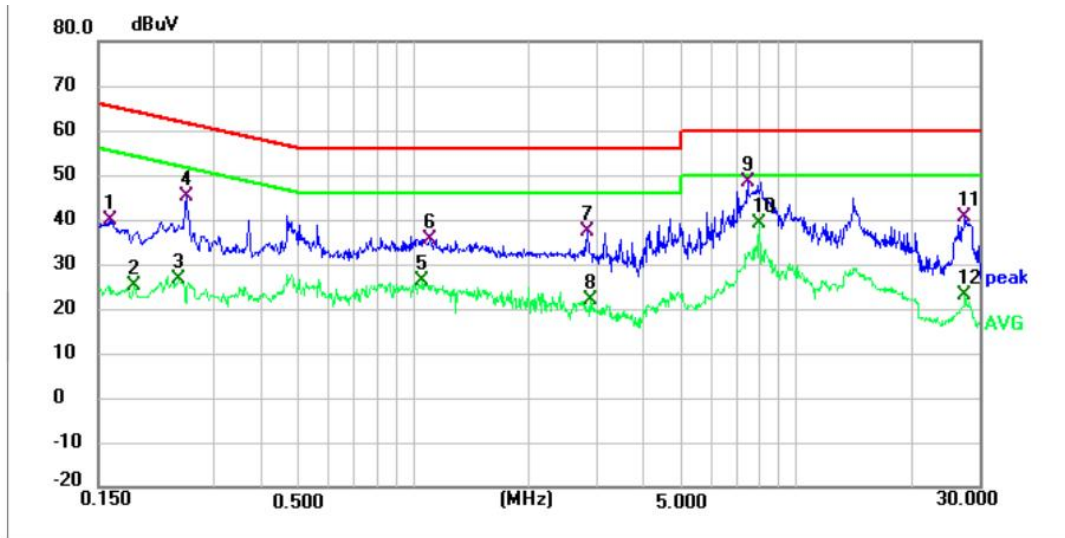

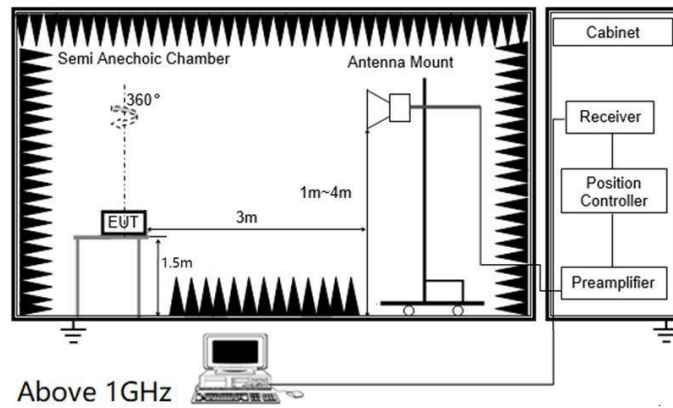

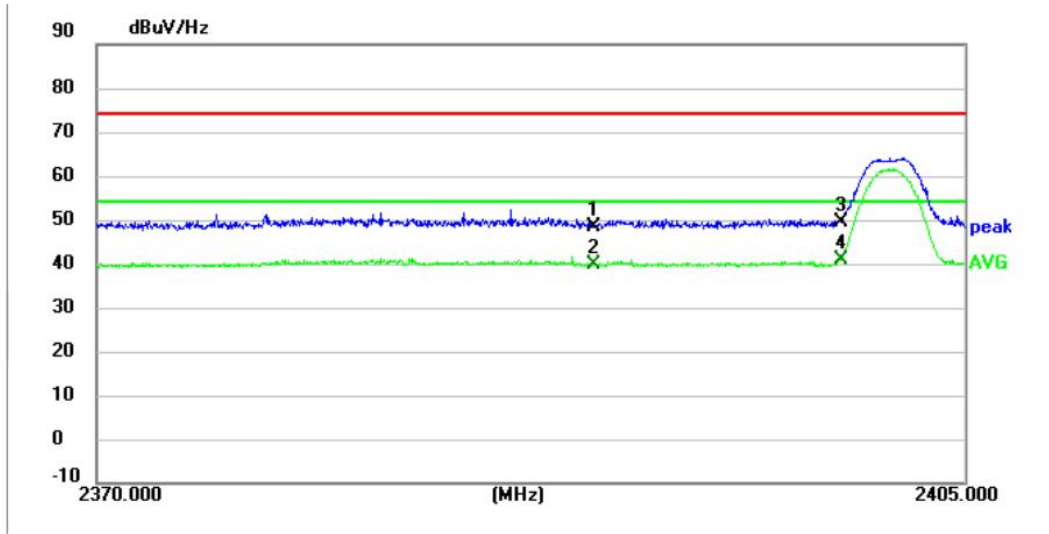

Mode1 / Polarization: Horizontal / CH: L



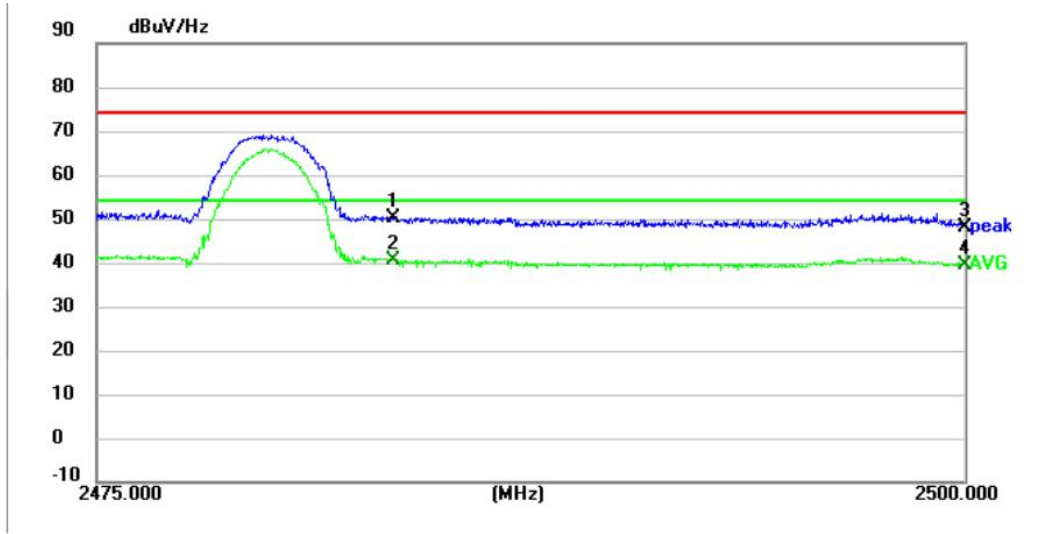
