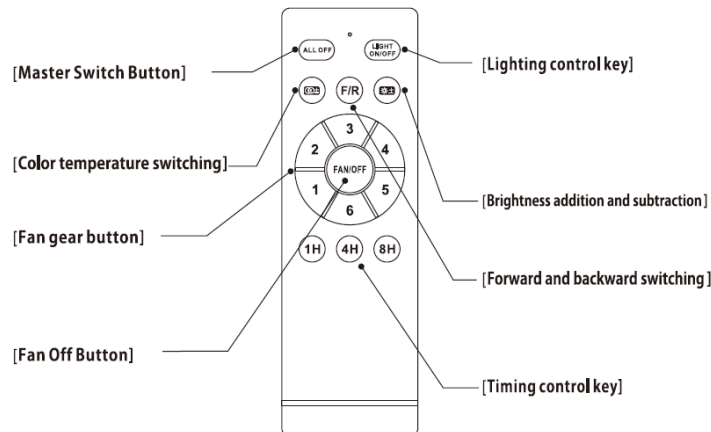


Remote Control MD-A150-FCC User Manual

1.Operation Instruction



- 1) Install 2 x1.5V AAA batteries. (To prevent damage to remote control, remove the battery if not used for a long time).
- 2) Code alignment: Power on and press the 1H+8H key for 5 seconds.
- 3) Clear code mode: Power on and long press the color temperature switch + brightness plus minus key for 5 seconds.

Note: Brightness plus or minus key: function description: After short press or long press to the maximum brightness, the brightness cannot be continue to increase, and the brightness begins to decrease until the minimum is cycled to a larger increase. Color temperature switch key: Neutral light/yellow light/white light 3 color cycle changes.

2.Warning Statements
