





##### 3.1.1 LIMITS OF OUTPUT POWER MEASUREMENT

Control stations and mobile stations transmitting in the 758–768 MHz band and the 788–798 MHz band are limited to 30 watts ERP.



## 3.2 FREQUENCY STABILITY MEASUREMENT

### 3.2.1 LIMITS OF FREQUENCY STABILITY MEASUREMENT


The frequency stability of mobile, portable and control transmitters operating in the wideband segment must be 1.25 parts per million or better when AFC is locked to a base station, and 5 parts per million or better when AFC is not locked

### 3.2.2 TEST PROCEDURE

- Device is placed at the oven room. The oven room could control the temperatures and humidity. Power warm up is at least 15 min and power applied should perform before recording frequency error.
- EUT is connected the external power supply to control the DC input power. The test voltage range is from minimum to maximum working voltage. Each step shall be record the frequency error rate.
- The temperature range step is 10 degrees in this test items. All temperature levels shall be hold the  $\pm 0.5^{\circ}\text{C}$  during the measurement testing. The each temperature step shall be at least 0.5 hours, consider the EUT could be test under the stability condition.

**NOTE:** The frequency error was recorded frequency error from the communication simulator.



### 3.3 OCCUPIED BANDWIDTH MEASUREMENT

#### 3.3.1 LIMITS OF OCCUPIED BANDWIDTH MEASUREMENT

The width of a frequency band such that, below the lower and above the upper frequency limits, the mean powers emitted are each equal to a specified percentage 0.5 %of the total mean power of a given emission.

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### 3.4 EMISSION MASK MEASUREMENT

#### 3.4.1 LIMITS OF EMISSION MASK MEASUREMENT

LTE Band14:

According to FCC part 90.543(e) shall be tested the emission mask.

(e) For operations in the 758–768 MHz and the 788–798 MHz bands, the power of any emission outside the licensee's frequency band(s) of operation shall be attenuated below the transmitter power (P) within the licensed band(s) of operation, measured in watts, in accordance with the following:


- (1) On all frequencies between 769–775 MHz and 799–805 MHz, by a factor not less than  $76 + 10 \log (P)$  dB in a 6.25 kHz band segment, for base and fixed stations.
- (2) On all frequencies between 769–775 MHz and 799–805 MHz, by a factor not less than  $65 + 10 \log (P)$  dB in a 6.25 kHz band segment, for mobile and portable stations.
- (3) On any frequency between 775–788 MHz, above 805 MHz, and below 758 MHz, by at least  $43 + 10 \log (P)$  dB.
- (4) Compliance with the provisions of paragraphs (e)(1) and (2) of this section is based on the use of measurement instrumentation such that the reading taken with any resolution bandwidth setting should be adjusted to indicate spectral energy in a 6.25 kHz segment.
- (5) Compliance with the provisions of paragraph (e)(3) of this section is based on the use of measurement instrumentation employing a resolution bandwidth of 100 kHz or greater. However, in the 100 kHz bands immediately outside and adjacent to the frequency block, a resolution bandwidth of 30 kHz may be employed.

#### LTE Band26:

According to FCC part 90.691 shall be tested the emission mask. For any frequency removed from the EA licensee's frequency block by up to and including 37.5 kHz, the power of any emission shall be attenuated below the transmitter power (P) in watts by at least  $116 \log_{10}(f/6.1)$  decibels or  $50 + 10 \log_{10}(P)$  decibels or 80 decibels, whichever is the lesser attenuation, where f is the frequency removed from the center of the outer channel in the block in kilohertz and where f is greater than 12.5 kHz.

For any frequency removed from the EA licensee's frequency block greater than 37.5 kHz, the power of any emission shall be attenuated below the transmitter power (P) in watts by at least  $43 + 10 \log_{10}(P)$  decibels or 80 decibels, whichever is the lesser attenuation, where f is the frequency removed from the center of the outer channel in the block in kilohertz and where f is greater than 37.5 kHz.

- a) Connect the transmitter to the spectrum analyzer via coaxial cable while ensuring proper impedance matching.
- b) Tune the analyzer to the nominal center frequency of the emission bandwidth (EBW).
- c) Set the resolution bandwidth (RBW)  $\geq 1\%$  EBW in the 1MHz band immediately outside and adjacent to the band edge.
- d) Beyond the 1MHz band from the band edge, RBW=1MHz was used.
- e) Set the video bandwidth (VBW) to  $\geq 3 \times$  RBW.
- f) Select the average power (RMS) display detector.
- g) Set the number of measurement points to  $\geq 1001$ .
- h) Use auto-coupled sweep time.
- i) Perform the measurement over an interval of time when the transmission is continuous and at its maximum power level.
- j) The RF fundamental frequency should be excluded against the limit line in the operating frequency band and use RBW is 10KHz or 100KHz.
- k) Record the max trace plot into the test report.



#### 3.5.2 TEST PROCEDURE

- a. The EUT makes a phone call to the communication simulator. All measurements were done at middle operational frequency range.
- b. Measuring frequency range is from 9kHz up to a frequency including its 10<sup>th</sup> harmonic. 10dB attenuation pad is connected with spectrum. RBW=1MHz and VBW=3MHz is used for conducted emission measurement.

### 3.6 RADIATED EMISSION MEASUREMENT

#### 3.6.1 LIMITS OF RADIATED EMISSION MEASUREMENT

(1) The power of any emission outside a licensee's frequency block shall be attenuated below the transmitter power (P) by at least  $43 + 10 \log_{10}(P)$  dB. The limit of emission equal to  $-13\text{dBm}$

(2) For operations in the 763–775 MHz and 793–805 MHz bands, all emissions including harmonics in the band 1559–1610 MHz shall be limited to  $-70\text{ dBW/MHz}$  equivalent isotropically radiated power (EIRP) for wideband signals, and  $-80\text{ dBW}$  EIRP for discrete emissions of less than 700 Hz bandwidth. For the purpose of equipment authorization, a transmitter shall be tested with an antenna that is representative of the type that will be used with the equipment in normal operation.

#### 3.6.2 TEST PROCEDURES

- a. Substitution method is used for E.I.R.P measurement. In the semi-anechoic chamber, EUT placed on the 0.8m height of Turn Table, rotated the table around 360 degrees to search the maximum radiation power and receiver antenna shall be rotated vertical and horizontal polarization and moved height from 1m to 4m to find the maximum polar radiated power. The “Read Value” is the spectrum reading the maximum power value.
- b. The substitution horn antenna is substituted for EUT at the same position and signals generator export the CW signal to the substitution antenna via a TX cable. Rotated the Turn Table and moved receiving antenna to find the maximum radiation power. Adjust output power level of S.G to get a Value of spectrum reading equal to “Read Value” of step a. Record the power level of S.G
- c.  $\text{EIRP} = \text{Output power level of S.G} - \text{TX cable loss} + \text{Antenna gain of substitution horn}.$
- d. E.R.P power can be calculated form E.I.R.P power by subtracting the gain of dipole,  $\text{E.R.P power} = \text{E.I.P.R power} - 2.15\text{dBi}.$






#### <Below 30MHz>


