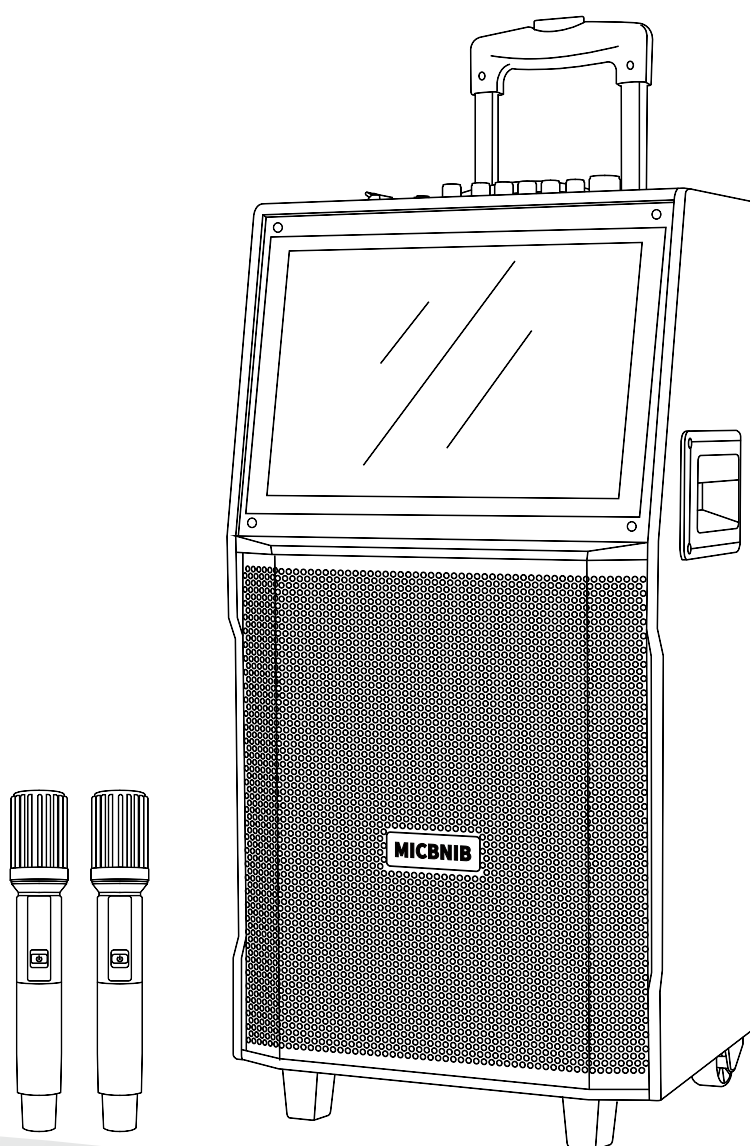

Warnings and Precautions

Maintenance and Care

Proper maintenance and care of the battery in your Machine Speaker are essential for ensuring optimal performance and longevity. Follow these guidelines to maximize battery life and keep your device operating smoothly:

Initial Charging: When you first receive the product, it's recommended to fully charge the battery before using it for the first time. Connect the device to a power source using the provided charger and let it charge until the battery is at 100%.

Regular Charging: To maintain battery health, avoid letting the battery completely drain before recharging. It's beneficial to charge your device when the battery level drops to around 20-30%. Frequent shallow charge cycles are better for battery longevity than deep discharge cycles.

Charging Environment: Charge your device in a cool, dry, and well-ventilated area. Avoid exposing it to extreme temperatures, as high temperatures can accelerate battery degradation. Charging your device in a hot environment can lead to reduced battery life over time.

Use Official Accessories: Always use the charger and accessories provided by the manufacturer. Using third-party chargers or cables might not provide the appropriate voltage or current, potentially damaging the battery.

Avoid Overcharging: Once the battery is fully charged, disconnect it from the charger. Leaving your device plugged in after reaching 100% can lead to slight overcharging, which can impact battery health over time.

Long-Term Storage: If it is not used for a long time, it should be fully charged before being placed. Store the device in a cool, dry place, away from direct sunlight and extreme temperatures.

Power Line Protection: Power line should not be stepped, squeezed or dragged.

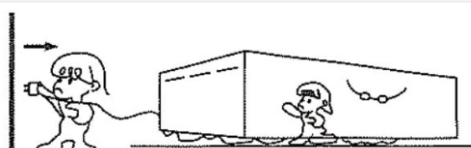
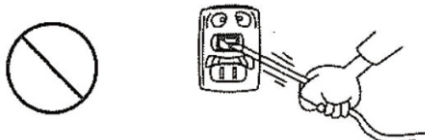
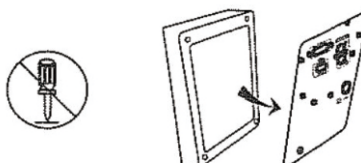
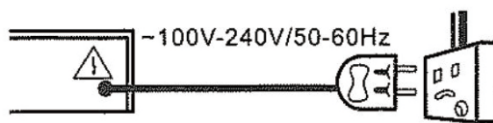
Non-use Period: If you do not use this product for a long time, please turn off the power and unplug the power supply.

The Speaker Top: Don't place objects like vase or container filled with liquid. Please maintain air ventilation to dissipate heat.

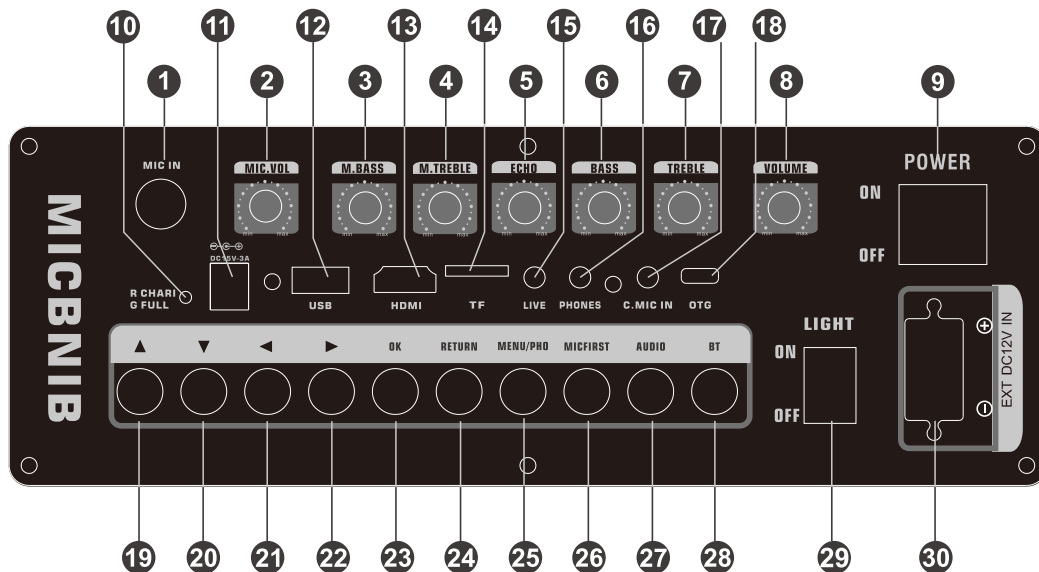
Don't use low power voltage regulating and regulated power supply, to avoid burning down the product or the regulated power supply.

- ① MIC IN GUITAR: Wired microphone input.
- ② MIC.VOL: Adjust the microphone volume. Turn right to increase the volume.
- ③ M.BASS: Adjust the bass of the microphone. Turn right to increase the bass.
- ④ M.TREBLE: Adjust the treble of the microphone. Turn right to increase the treble.
- ⑤ ECHO: Fine-tune the reverb effect of the microphone.
- ⑥ BASS: Modify the bass of the music. Turn right to enhance the bass.
- ⑦ TREBLE: Modify the treble of the music. Turn right to enhance the treble.
- ⑧ VOLUME: Adjust music volume. Turn right to increase the volume.
- ⑨ POWER: Power on; ○: Power off.
- ⑩ Charging Indicator Light: Red: Charging; Green: Fully charged.
- ⑪ DC15V-3A charging
- ⑫ USB: USB input (supports up to 512GB USB drives).
- ⑬ HDMI 1: Mirror speaker screen to TV.
- ⑭ TF CARD: Input for TF cards.
- ⑮ LIVE (TRRS Interface): Used for live streaming.
- ⑯ PHONES: Input for monitoring headphones.
- ⑰ C.MIC IN : Input for condenser microphones.
- ⑱ OTG: Designed for live streaming.
- ⑲ ▲: Up arrow.
- ⑳ ▼: Down arrow.
- ㉑ ◀: Left arrow
- ㉒ ▶: Right arrow.
- ㉓ OK: Confirm selection.
- ㉔ RETURN: Go back to the previous step.
- ㉕ MENU/PHO : Short press is menu on the screen, Long press is the mute function
- ㉖ MICFIRST: Microphone priority. In karaoke mode, music stops when singing.
- ㉗ AUDIO: Accompaniment/original vocals (USB music input only).
- ㉘ BT: Press to enable Bluetooth on the speaker.
- ㉙ Light switch: Power on; ○: Power off.
- ㉚ DC 12V IN: Input for external battery.

- ❶ Mixer: Adjust echo mode.
- ❷ Mute: Turn off the sound.
- ❸ Sound Effect.
- ❹ Prev: Previous song.
- ❺ Next: Next song.
- ❻ Vol-: Decrease volume.
- ❼ Vol+: Increase volume.
- ❽ Menu.
- ❾ Media: Switch between current mode and Bluetooth, USB, TF card modes.

Common problems and solutions

Q: Speaker sound distortion.

S: Some Settings are set too high, adjust panel GAIN to the left to reduce the volume; Adjust the panel BASS/MIDDLE/TREBLE to the left to reduce the volume of the input device.

Q: There is noise in the sound of the speaker.

S: Connection error or other input device problem, confirm whether the connection is strong, or use another connection wire; Do not connect 220V AC to all devices during live recording. 3.5MM connector internal recording live line do not fall to the ground; Check whether there are interference sources around the device, such as routers, LED lights, and induction stoves. Keep away from interference sources.

Q: Bluetooth volume is down!

S: Check whether the volume of the mobile phone or the Bluetooth volume of the device is turned on, whether the version of the music played is faulty, check whether the Bluetooth connection of the device is ignored, and restart the mobile phone or Bluetooth player to reconnect the device.

Q: The speaker makes a slight popping sound when the power is turned on or off.

S: Turn off the GAIN volume knobs of each channel. Before turning on the power supply of the speaker, connect the input device, turn on the power supply of the input device, and then turn on the power switch of the speaker.

Q: Is the adapter for this speaker universal?

S: The adapter of this speaker is a dedicated adapter, and the use of other adapters of the same specifications may cause noise.

Q: Can the battery pack of this speaker be used universally?

S: The battery pack of this speaker is a special battery pack, and the battery pack has a built-in protection board dedicated to this speaker. You need to purchase the original special battery pack of this speaker.
