Safety Precautions:

Main button functions:

Power button: Turn lights on/off.

Time button: 15 minutes/30 minutes/45 minutes/60 minutes

Key mode: Sensor mode/sensor light control/constant light mode

Brighten+/-: Adjust device brightness.

Switch color button: Adjust light color.

Remote control: Aim at the device's receiving window (recommended distance: 1-3 meters)
