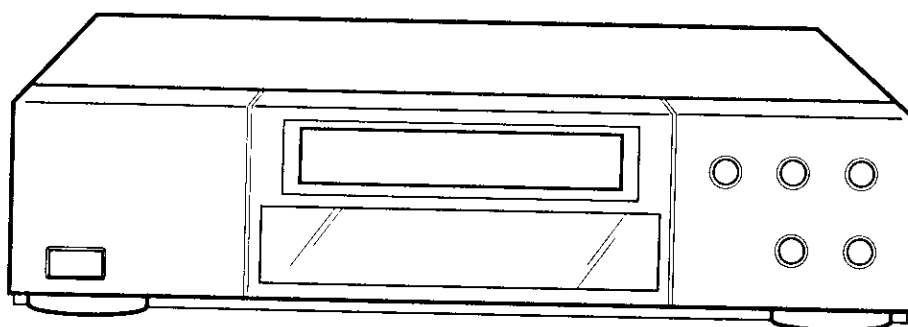
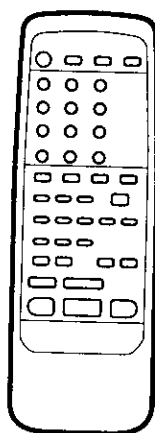

Before operating the unit, please read this manual thoroughly.

IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDS

1. READ INSTRUCTIONS

All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the unit is operated.

2. RETAIN INSTRUCTIONS

The safety and operating instructions should be retained for future reference.

3. HEED WARNINGS

All warnings on the unit and in the operating instructions should be adhered to.

4. FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS

All operating and use instructions should be followed.

5. CLEANING

Unplug this unit from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.

6. ATTACHMENTS

Do not use attachments not recommended by the unit's manufacturer as they may cause hazards.

7. WATER AND MOISTURE

Do not use this unit near water. For example, near a bathtub, washbowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool.

8. ACCESSORIES

Do not place this unit on an unstable cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table. The unit may fall, causing serious injury, and serious damage to the unit. Use only with a cart, stand, tripod, bracket, or table recommended by the manufacturer.

- 8A. An appliance and cart combination should be moved with care. Quick stops, excessive force, and uneven surfaces may cause the appliance and cart combination to overturn.



9. VENTILATION

Slots and openings in the cabinet and in the back or bottom are provided for ventilation, to ensure reliable operation of the unit, and to protect it from overheating. These openings must not be blocked or covered. The openings should never be blocked by placing the unit on a bed, sofa, rug, or other similar surface. This unit should never be placed near or over a radiator or heat source. This unit should not be placed in a built-in installation such as a bookcase or rack unless proper ventilation is provided or the manufacturer's instructions have been adhered to.

10. POWER SOURCES

This unit should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the rating plate. If you are not sure of the type of power supply to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company. For units intended to operate from battery power, or other sources, refer to the operating instructions.

11. GROUNDING OR POLARIZATION

This unit is equipped with a polarized alternating-current line plug (a plug having one blade wider than the other). This plug will fit into the power outlet only one way. This is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug fully into the outlet, try reversing the plug. If the plug should still fail to fit, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the polarized plug. If your unit is equipped with a 3-wire grounding-type plug, a plug having a third (grounding) pin, this plug will only fit into a grounding-type power outlet. This too, is a safety feature. If you are unable to insert the plug into the outlet, contact your electrician to replace your obsolete outlet. Do not defeat the safety purpose of the grounding-type plug.

12. POWER-CORD PROTECTION

Power-supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plugs, convenience receptacles, and the point where they exit from the appliance.

13. LIGHTNING

To protect your unit from a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the unit due to lightning and power line surges.

14. POWER LINES

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. When installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits, as contact with them might be fatal.



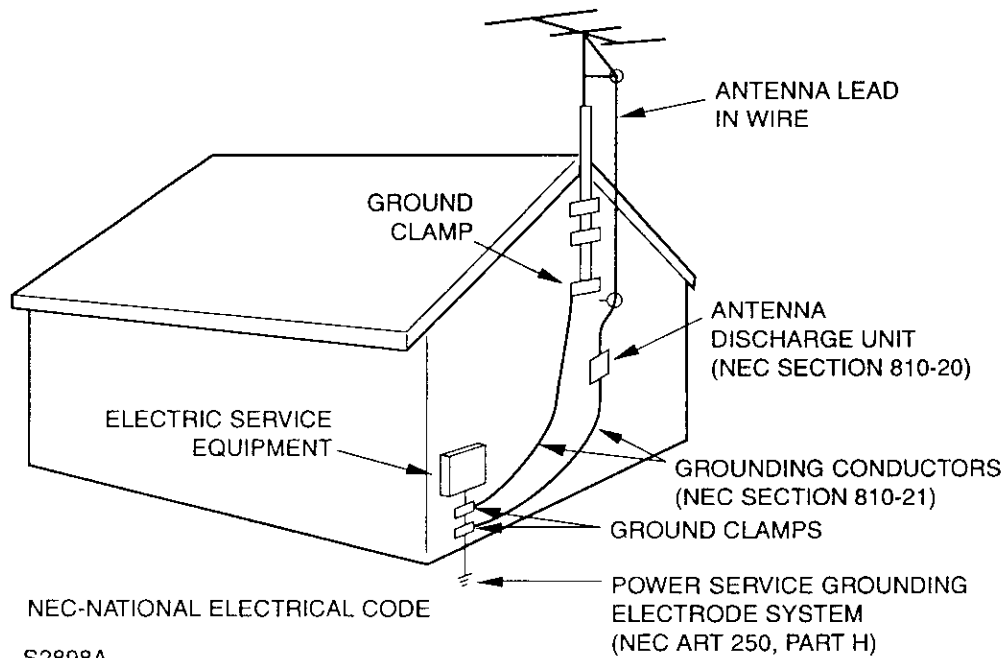
30. DISC

Do not use a cracked, deformed, or repaired disc. These discs are easily broken and may cause serious personal injury and product malfunction.

31. NOTE TO CATV SYSTEM INSTALLER

This reminder is provided to call the CATV system installer's attention to Article 820-40 of the NEC that provides guidelines for proper grounding and, in particular, specifies that the cable ground shall be connected to the grounding system of the building, as close to the point of cable entry as practical.

NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE**



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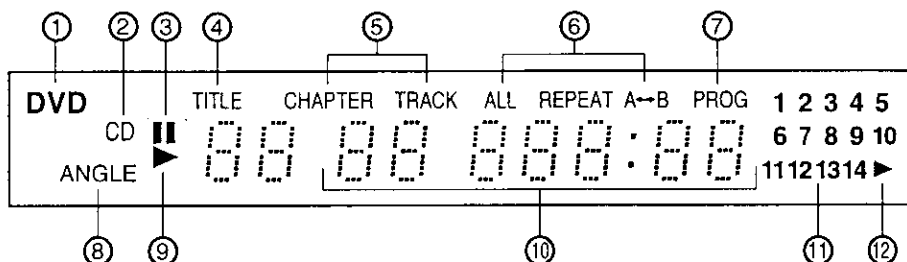

Remote Control

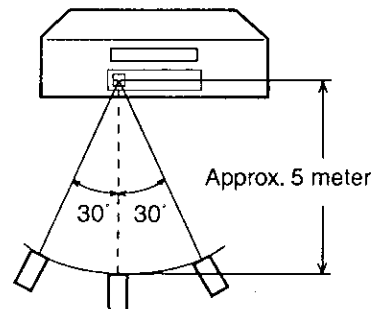
Inserting Batteries

- 1 Remove the cover by pressing down and sliding.
- 2 Insert two AAA batteries as shown.
- 3 Replace the cover.



Operation

- Aim the remote control at remote sensor and press control buttons to operate.
- Operate the remote control within 30° angle on either side of the remote sensor, up to a distance of Approx. 5 meter.



Note:

- Do not leave the remote control unit exposed to direct sunlight or in hot or humid places.
- The remote control unit uses infrared beams to transmit signals so sunlight or fluorescent light on the remote sensor may shorten operating distance.
- Incorrect use of batteries may cause them to leak or burst. Read the battery warnings and use the batteries properly.
- Do not mix old and new batteries.
- Remove batteries if the remote control will not be operated for an extended period of time.

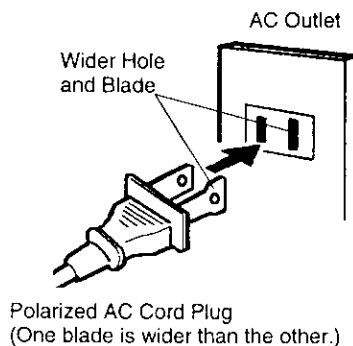
Power Source

TO USE AC POWER SOURCE

Use the AC polarized line cord provided for operation on AC. Insert the AC cord plug into a standard 120V 60Hz polarized AC outlet.

NOTES:

- Never connect the AC line cord plug to other than the specified voltage (120V 60Hz). Use the attached power cord only.
- If the polarized AC cord does not fit into a non-polarized AC outlet, do not attempt to file or cut the blade. It is the user's responsibility to have an electrician replace the obsolete outlet.
- If you cause a static discharge when touching the unit, and the unit fails to function, simply unplug the unit, from the AC outlet, wait a few minutes, and plug it back in. The unit should return to normal operation.

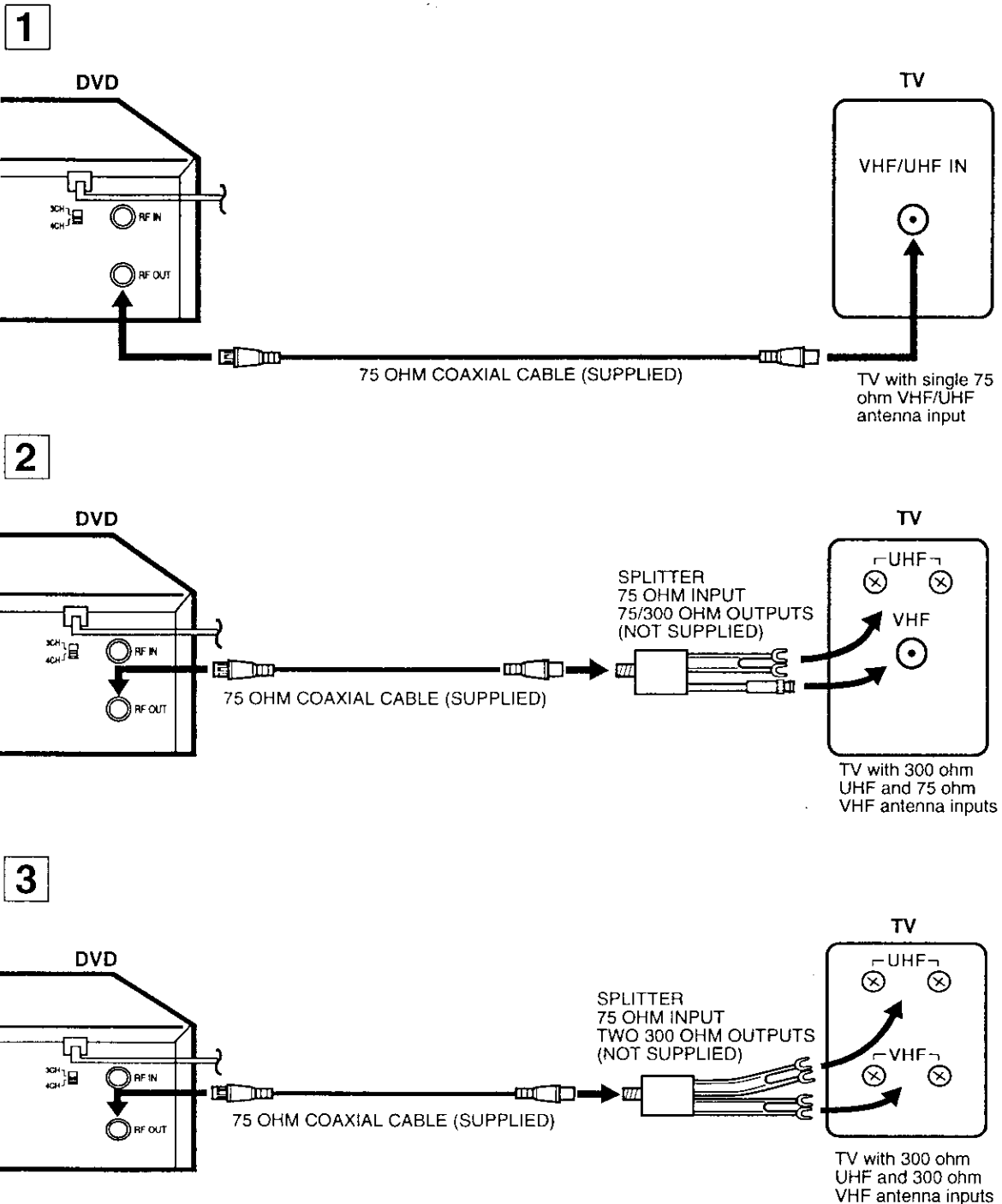


Connections

DVD TO TV CONNECTION

After you have connected the antenna to the DVD (see page 12), you must connect the DVD to the TV. Below are 3 common methods of connecting your DVD to a TV. Find the type of TV you are using and follow the connection diagram.

This DVD has a single 75 ohm output for connection to a TV. If your TV has separate VHF and UHF antenna inputs (numbers 2 and 3 below), use a splitter to connect the DVD to the TV for VHF and UHF reception.



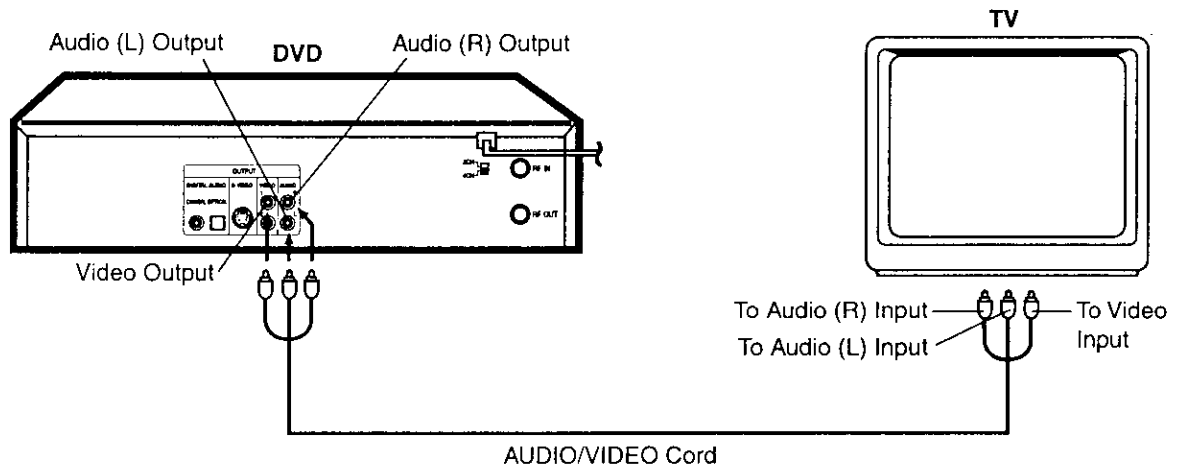
Audio/Video Connections

This section describes how to connect up the unit for playback. You cannot connect the unit to a TV without video input connector.

Before making connections be sure to turn off the power of each unit.

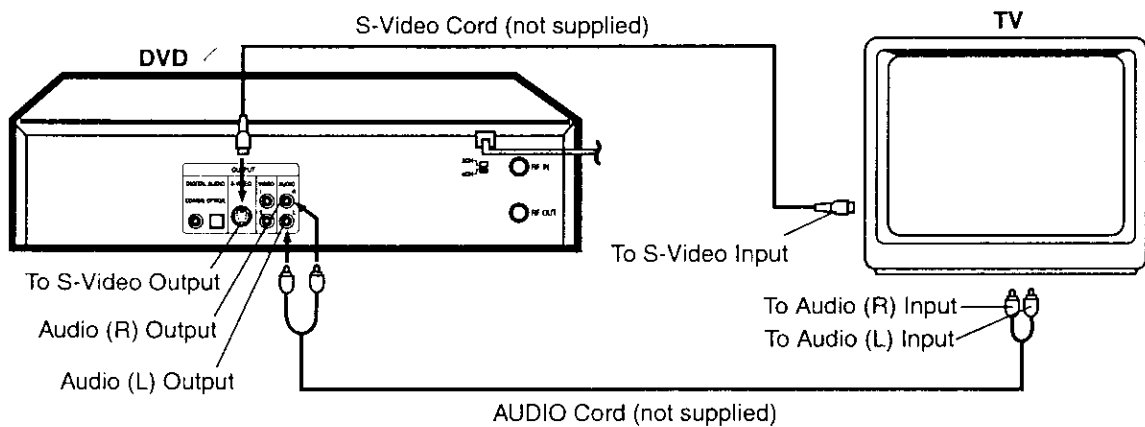
Using TV with Audio/Video Input

You need the AUDIO/VIDEO Cord for connection.



Using TV with S-Video Input

You need the S-Video Cord and AUDIO Cord for connection.



Disc

The unit detects whether the disc loaded is a DVD disc or Audio CD and automatically sets the mode.

Compatible with DVD disc recorded in NTSC system and in PAL system

- To play back disc in either NTSC or PAL system, use a Multi-system TV.
- Do not use PAL TV to play back NTSC disc.
- Do not use NTSC TV to play back PAL disc.

Disc Notes

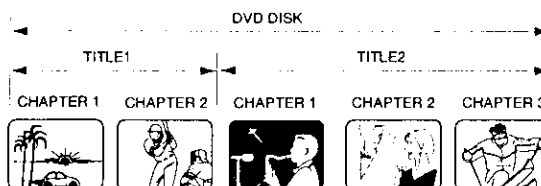
Do not play DVD-ROM, CD-ROM, CD-R, CDV, CD-G and Photo CD to prevent accidental erasure of prerecorded material.

This unit applies to DVD disc with Local number 1 only. Other local number discs cannot be played with this unit.

Title/Chapter/Track

Title

When two or more movies are recorded on a disc, the disc is divided into two or more sections. Each of section is "TITLE".



Chapter

One of the title can be subdivided into many sections. Each of section is "CHAPTER".

Track

An Audio CD has more than two songs. These songs are assigned to the tracks.



Removing Disc from Case

Be sure to hold the edge of disc. Do not touch the surface of the disc. Pick up the disc gently from the case.

- Do not scratch the disc.
- Do not make dirty on the surface of the disc.
- Do not stick a label or adhesive tape on the disc.
- Do not drop or bend the disc.

Storing Disc

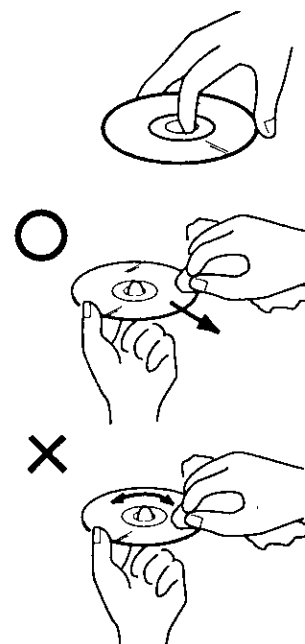
Insert the disc in the case to avoid risk of scratches, dirt or damage.

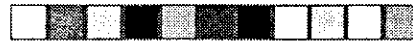
- Do not leave disc exposed to direct sunlight or in hot or humid places.

Cleaning Disc

Wipe the disc with clean, dry cloth from center to out.

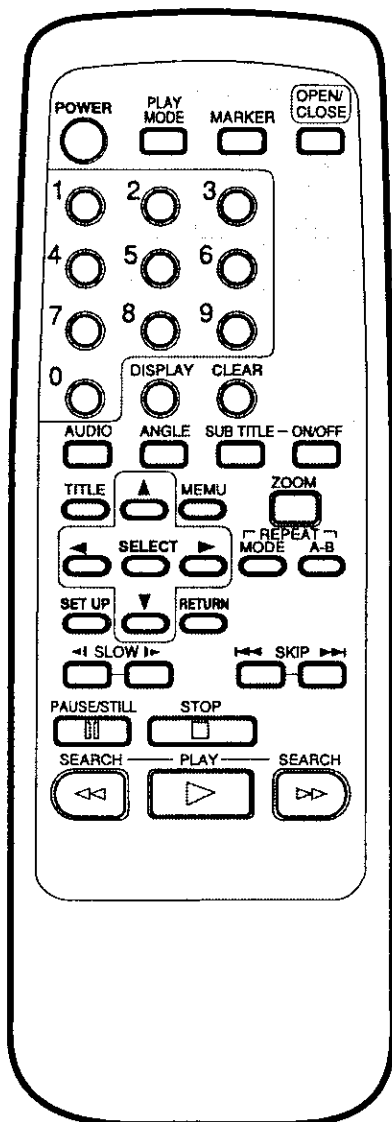
- Do not wipe the disc round.
- Do not use liquid or aerosol cleaners.





Setting Setup Language

The setup language can be selected.



Preparation

- Insert the AC cord plug into a standard 120V 60Hz polarized AC outlet.
Note: When connecting to the other equipment, unplug the unit from the AC outlet.
- Make sure that your DVD is connected properly to the TV.
- Press **POWER** on the unit or on the remote control to turn on the DVD.
- Turn on the TV and set TV's TV/VIDEO selector to VIDEO.
(If the DVD is connected with RF cable to the TV, set the 3 or 4 channel selector to CH 3 or 4, and the TV channel also must be set to CH 3 or 4 to be corresponded with DVD.)
- When using an amplifier, switch on the amplifier.

Special Playback

Fast Forward Playback

Press and hold  during normal playback.

- Normal playback is resumed when the button is released.

Review Playback

Press and hold  during normal playback.

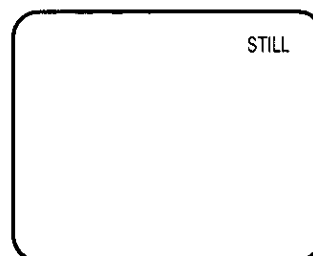
- Normal playback is resumed when the button is released.

At first the speed of Fast Forward or Review Playback is low, and change to high after 5 seconds.

Still Playback

Press **PAUSE/STILL** during normal playback to pause playback.

To resume normal playback press **PLAY**.



Frame Advance

Press **PAUSE/STILL** during still playback. One frame is advanced when you press **PAUSE/STILL** once.

To resume normal playback press **PLAY**.

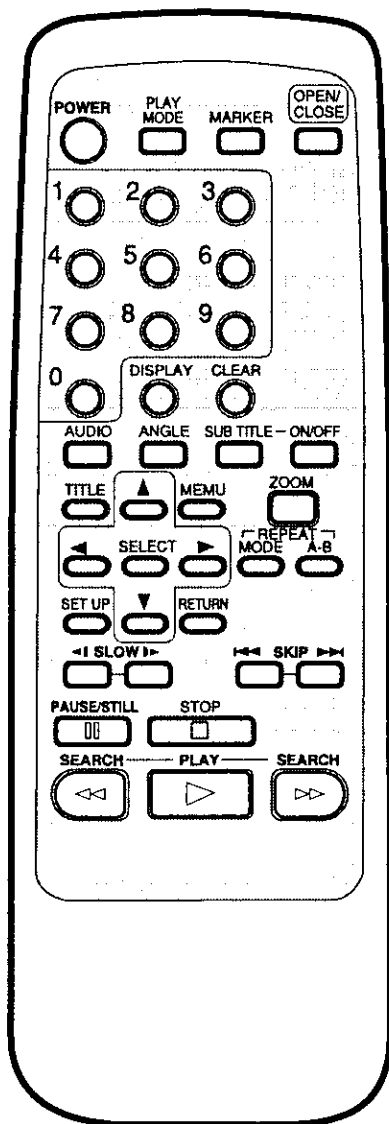
Slow-motion Playback

Press **SLOW(◀)** Reverse or **SLOW(▶)** Forward during normal playback or still playback.

- To resume normal playback, press **PLAY**.
- To resume the still playback, press **PAUSE/STILL**.

Locating a chapter

Press **SKIP(▶▶)** Forward or **SKIP(◀◀)** Reverse during playback to locate a chapter that you want to watch. Each time you press the button, a chapter is skipped.





Repeat Playback

Title, Chapter, Track Playback

Press **REPEAT MODE** during playback.
Each time you press the button, the on-screen display changes as below.

Repeat Chapter	Repeat Title	Standard Playback

Audio CD

To resume normal playback
Press **REPEAT MODE** several times until "STANDARD PLAYBACK" appears.

A-B Repeat Playback

Use the title, chapter and time recorded on disc to locate the desired point to play back.

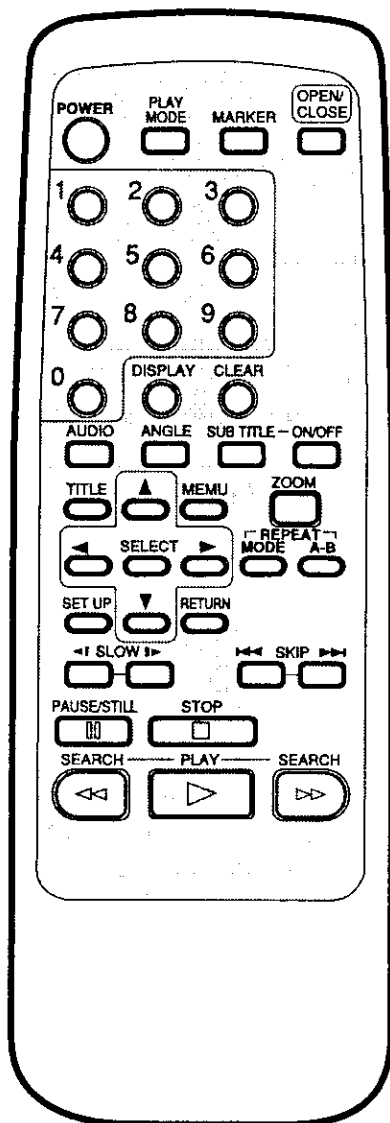
- 1 Press **REPEAT A-B** during playback.
The start point is selected.

A-

- 2 Press **REPEAT A-B** again.
The end point is selected. Playback starts at the point where you selected. Playback stops at the end point and returns to Point A automatically. Then start again.

A-B REPEAT

To resume normal playback press **REPEAT A-B** again.
"STANDARD PLAYBACK" appears on the screen.



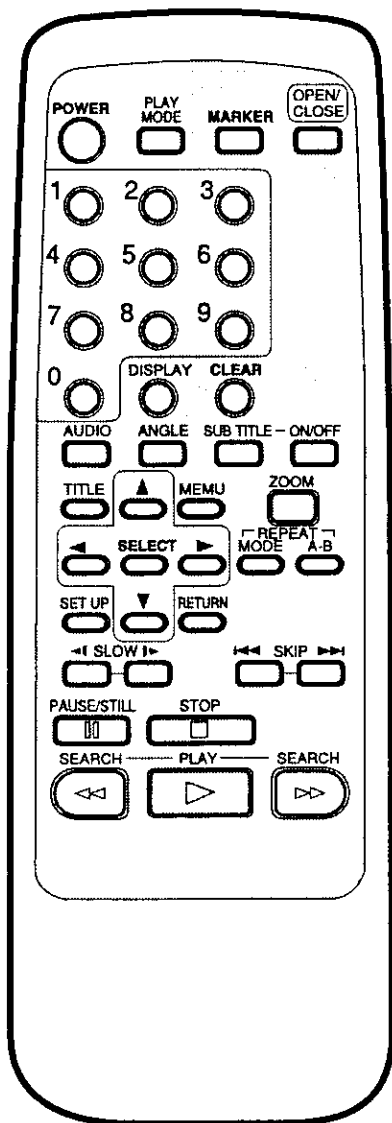
Note:

- Some discs may not work the repeat operation.
- A-B repeat can function within only a chapter.
- In A-B repeat mode subtitle near point A or B may not appear.



Marking Desired Scenes

The unit stores the points where you want to watch again. You can resume playback from the scene.

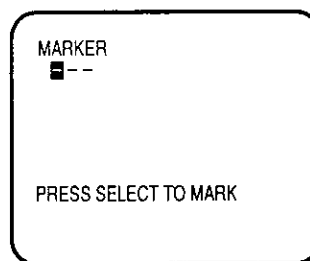


Note:

- Some discs may not work this operation.
- The marking is canceled when you open the disc tray or turn the power off.

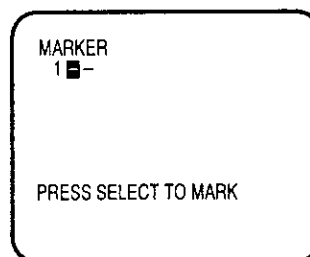
Marking the Scenes

- 1 Press **MARKER** during playback.



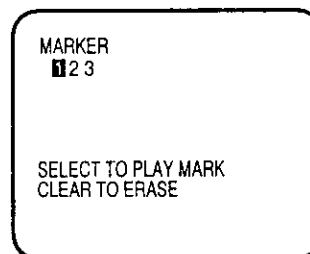
- 2 Press **SELECT** during playback at the desired scene.

- Up to 3 scenes can be selected.

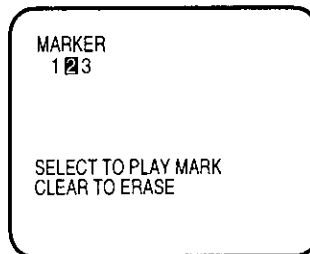


Returning to the Scenes

- 1 Press **MARKER** during playback.



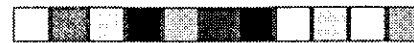
- 2 Press or to select the INDEX number.

Playback starts from the marked scene.

To Cancel the Mark

- 1 Press **MARKER**.
- 2 Press or to select the index number.
- 3 Press **CLEAR**.



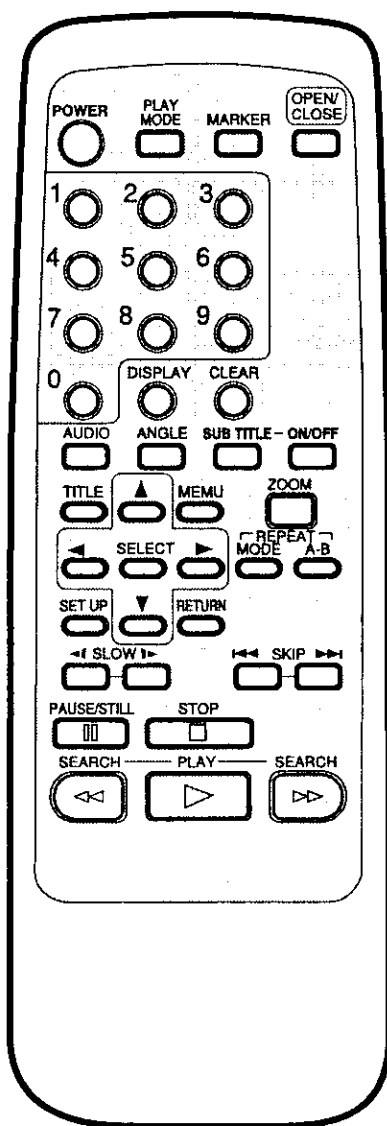
Subtitle

Turning the Subtitle On and Off

When playing back a disc recorded subtitles, you can turn the subtitle on and off.

Press **SUB TITLE** during playback. Then press **ON/OFF** to select ON or OFF Subtitles appear on the screen.

SUBTITLE: 1 ON





Changing the subtitle language

You can select language when playing back the disc recorded multi-lingual subtitles.

- 1 Press **SUB TITLE** during playback.

SUBTITLE: 1 ON

- 2 Press  or  until the desired language is selected.

SUBTITLE: 2 ON

- 3 Press **SUB TITLE** to make display disappear.

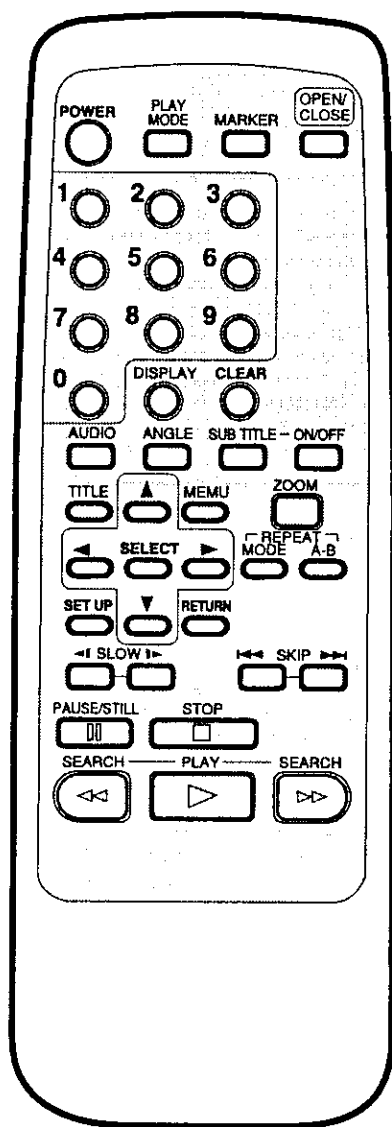
Note:

- If desired language is not selected after pressing the button several times, the language is not recorded on the disc.
- Changing subtitle language is canceled when you open the disc tray or turn the power off.



Rating Level Setting

The specified discs are not suitable for children. Such discs can be limited to play back with the unit.



1 Press **SETUP** in the stop mode.

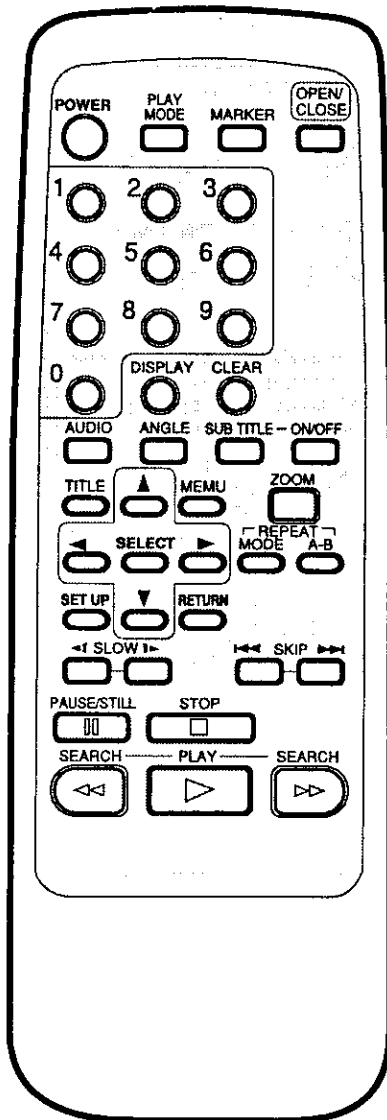
Setting is finished and the **SETUP** screen appears. The rating is locked and the setting cannot be changed unless you enter the correct password.

Note:

- If the each setup(P.29~36) has been completed, the unit can always be worked under the same conditions (especially with DVD discs). The each setup will be retained in the memory if you turn the power off.
- Depending on the discs, the unit cannot limit playback.

Setting Audio Soundtrack Language

The same audio soundtrack language can always be selected even if you replace the disc or turn the power off.

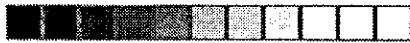

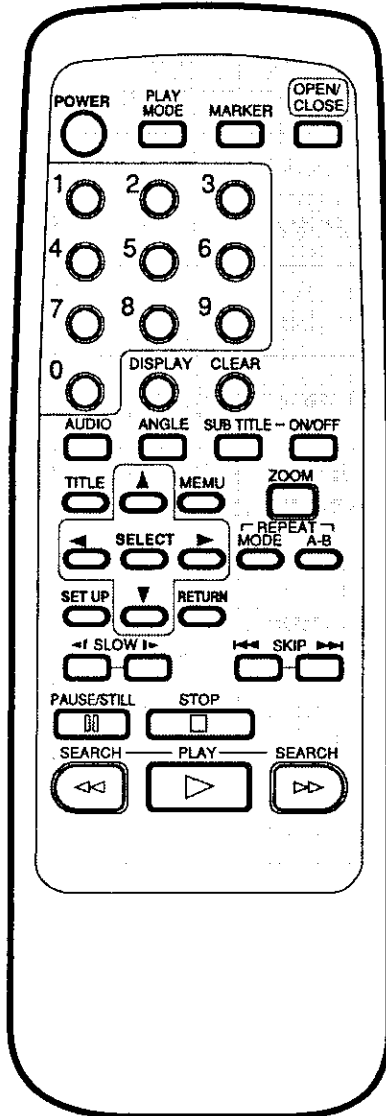

Select this mode when connecting to wide-screen TV. Wide picture is displayed in the full size.

Features

The followings are the guide of the DVD.

The DVD disc has much more capacity, but the size is the same as the audio CD disc. Picture/Audio quality of the DVD exceeds other software. Picture quality is higher than Super VHS. Audio quality is higher than audio CD. The DVD also has special options; audio language selection, subtitle language selection or multi-angle, etc. The DVD PLAYER can play back audio CDs.

High Quality Picture

Horizontal Resolution

More than 500 lines. It exceeds Super VHS (400 lines) or Laser Disc (430 lines) in resolution.

S-Video Jack

It separates the color and luminance signals before transmitting to the TV to gain a sharper picture.

Compatible with a wide range of DVD audio output

Optical Digital Audio Jack/Coaxial Digital Audio Jack

- When the component with a built-in Dolby Digital decoder is connected, Dolby Digital sound can produce the effect of being in a movie theater or a concert hall.
- Surround standard different from Dolby Digital. This format is already in use in many theaters. By connecting this unit to a DTS decoder or an AV amplifier with a built-in DTS decoder, the DTS audio of DVD discs recorded in this format can be enjoyed. 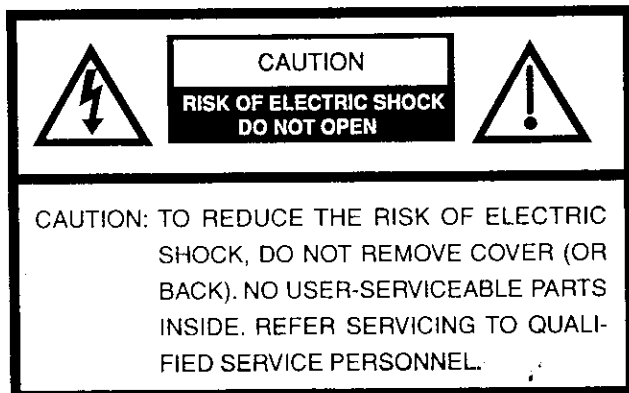

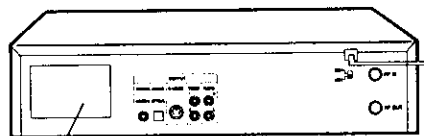
