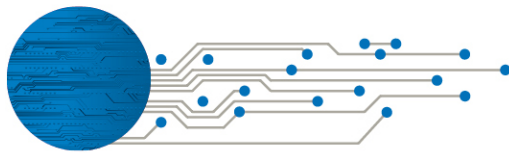

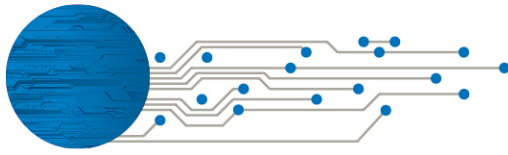
To Whom It May Concern:

Pursuant to Section 15.212(a)(1) of the FCC rules, the Applicant, request for single modular approval, compliance with the requirements are addressed below.

Single Modular Approval Requirements	Justification
(i) The radio elements of the modular transmitter must have their own shielding. The physical crystal and tuning capacitors may be located external to the shielded radio elements.	The module has no shielding case. Any host device using this limited modular approved radio shall be tested for compliance with transmitter spurious radiated emission limits
(ii) The modular transmitter must have buffered modulation/data inputs (if such inputs are provided) to ensure that the module will comply with part 15 requirements under conditions of excessive data rates or over-modulation.	All modulation and data input (s) are buffered
(iii) The modular transmitter must have its own power supply regulation.	The BLE chip has its own embedded power management circuit, support wide power supply voltage 1.71V to 3.8V
(iv) The modular transmitter must comply with the antenna and transmission system requirements of §§ 15.203, 15.204(b) and 15.204(c). The antenna must either be permanently attached or employ a “unique” antenna coupler (at all connections between the module and the antenna, including the cable). The “professional installation” provision of §	The module has an on-board PCB antenna



<p>15.203 is not applicable to modules but can apply to limited modular approvals under paragraph (b) of this section.</p>	
<p>(v) The modular transmitter must be tested in a stand-alone configuration, <i>i.e.</i>, the module must not be inside another device during testing for compliance with part 15 requirements. Unless the transmitter module will be battery powered, it must comply with the AC line conducted requirements found in § 15.207. AC or DC power lines and data input/output lines connected to the module must not contain ferrites, unless they will be marketed with the module (see § 15.27(a)). The length of these lines shall be the length typical of actual use or, if that length is unknown, at least 10 centimeters to insure that there is no coupling between the case of the module and supporting equipment. Any accessories, peripherals, or support equipment connected to the module during testing shall be unmodified and commercially available (see § 15.31(i)).</p>	<p>The modular transmitter was tested in a stand-alone configuration and it is complied with the AC line conducted requirement</p>
<p>(vi) The modular transmitter must be equipped with either a permanently affixed label or must be capable of electronically displaying its FCC identification number.</p> <p>(A) If using a permanently affixed label, the modular transmitter must be labeled with its own FCC identification number, and, if the FCC identification number is not visible when the module is installed inside another device, then the outside of the device into which the module is installed must also display a label referring to the enclosed module. This exterior label can use wording such as the following: “Contains Transmitter Module FCC ID: XYZMODEL1” or “Contains FCC ID: XYZMODEL1.” Any similar wording that expresses the same meaning may be used. The Grantee may either provide such a label, an example of which must be included in the application for equipment authorization, or, must provide adequate instructions along with the module</p>	<p>The module will be equipped with a permanently affixed label.</p> <p>The module is installed inside another device and outside of the device, into which the module is installed, will be labelled with all necessary “contains” wording and FCC/IC numbers</p>

In the latter case, a copy of these instructions must be included in the application for equipment authorization.</p> <p>(B) If the modular transmitter uses an electronic display of the FCC identification number, the information must be readily accessible and visible on the modular transmitter or on the device in which it is installed. If the module is installed inside another device, then the outside of the device into which the module is installed must display a label referring to the enclosed module. This exterior label can use wording such as the following: "Contains FCC certified transmitter module(s)." Any similar wording that expresses the same meaning may be used. The user manual must include instructions on how to access the electronic display. A copy of these instructions must be included in the application for equipment authorization.</p>	
<p>(vii) The modular transmitter must comply with any specific rules or operating requirements that ordinarily apply to a complete transmitter and the manufacturer must provide adequate instructions along with the module to explain any such requirements. A copy of these instructions must be included in the application for equipment authorization.</p>	Yes, refer to the user manual
<p>(viii) The modular transmitter must comply with any applicable RF exposure requirements in its final configuration.</p>	Yes, refer to the RF exposure evaluation test report
