


Media Change Notifications


1. Press [SETUP] > [Display] > [Media Change notifications].



2. Select the desired items.
 - [Display Media Change notifications]: Non-media playback screen, media information will be displayed briefly when the playback content changes automatically.

Extend Rear Camera Use

1. Press [SETUP] > [Display] > [Extend rear camera use].




2. Select the desired items.
 - [Extend rear camera use]: The rear camera view is displayed regardless of gear. When the vehicle exceeds a predetermined factory-set speed, the rear camera display turns off.

Reset

Resets the display settings to factory default.

1. Press [SETUP] > [Display] > [Reset].



2. Press [Yes].

What is Android Auto/Apple CarPlay?

Securely access your smartphone while driving. Various functions of your smartphone are displayed on and operable from the screen of the media device (e.g. navigation, making a call, listening to music etc.).

When connected, an Android Auto/Apple CarPlay icon appears on the screen. Available functions and operations may differ depending on the company model.

- Android Auto is a registered trademark of Google Inc.
- Apple CarPlay is a registered trademark of Apple Inc.
- Android Auto and Apple CarPlay are unavailable if the phone OS is not the latest version or if the phone cannot be recognized due to a shutdown caused by a failure or defect in the device itself.
- Your phone may not be recognised if its battery is low. Charge your phone then try again.
- If your phone is shut down due to a defect in the device itself, reset your phone and try again.
- If the USB cable of the Android Auto/Apple CarPlay device is repeatedly disconnected and reconnected in a short period of time, the phone may malfunction. This can also cause a device failure.
- The device recognition time may differ depending on the device type and firmware/OS version.
- Using the USB cable that came with the phone is recommended. (Using a non-genuine product may cause noise or malfunction.)
- Normal operations cannot be guaranteed if the phone is arbitrarily manipulated while Android Auto/Apple CarPlay is active.
- Apple CarPlay can be run while making a call via Bluetooth.
- Android Auto or Apple CarPlay may not operate normally due to mobile phone issues.
- Carrier charges may apply when using Android Auto or Apple CarPlay.
- Some features may not operate normally according to the version of iOS and Android.
- The following problems may occur due to phone-related issues:

[Android Auto]

- Intermittent black screens appear when entering Android Auto.
- Differentiation of phones that support Android Auto and those which do not, may not be possible.
- Black screens appear in some areas of the screen due to app errors.

[Apple CarPlay]

- Intermittent black screens appear when entering Apple CarPlay.
- Black screens appear in some areas of the screen due to app errors when navigating between screens in Apple CarPlay.
- The sound output of a call may be cut upon disconnecting Apple CarPlay during a call via Apple CarPlay.
- If services do not work properly due to problems similar to the specified above, check your phone, and if necessary, reconnect your phone after restarting.

Using Android Auto or Apple CarPlay

1. Make sure only genuine USB cables are used that were provided by the mobile phone's manufacturer.
2. Enter [Android Auto] or [Apple CarPlay] from the Home screen.
3. Now the features such as navigation, music and phone are ready to be used.

NOTICE

- Before connecting your mobile phone, check whether Android Auto or Apple CarPlay is activated in the [Phone connection] menu.
- After connecting the mobile phone, the phone has to be unlocked and the disclaimers on the phone have to be accepted in order to launch Android Auto or Apple CarPlay.
- The screens and features displayed on the infotainment System correspond to the screens and features provided by Google or Apple. They are subject to change according to the policy of the respective company.

NOTICE-Android Auto

- Bluetooth media features will be disabled when Android Auto is activated. After removing the USB cable, these features will be available again.
- If Android Auto is not activated even after a successful connection, follow these steps:
 - Check whether an error occurred on the phone.
 - Check whether Android Auto has been closed on the phone.
 - Check whether Android Auto is activated in the [Phone connection] menu.
- If Android Auto does not work normally even after a reconnection has been made, visit the Google website <http://support.google.com/androidauto>.

- Bluetooth phone/media features will be disabled when Apple CarPlay is activated. After removing the USB cable, these features will be available again.

 - Check whether Apple CarPlay is disabled in the iPhones application settings.
 - Check whether Apple CarPlay is activated in the [Phone projection] menu.


Using Rear Camera (If Equipped)

About Rear Camera

- Rear camera is a feature for the customers who select option.
- The rear camera provides a view of the rear of the vehicle, when reversing.
- When the shift lever is placed in R with the vehicle's ignition turned on, rear camera will operate.
- If you change the shift lever location from R to another position than P, the rear camera stay turned on. But the rear screen will be remained until you enter the hard key or drive at a speed of 10 km/h or more. (Only if the option to keep rear camera view is supported.)
- On the rear camera screen, the guide line for parking is displayed, moving depending on the direction of the steering wheel.

Turning on the rear camera

When the vehicle is started, put the transmission lever to R position.



Note

The rear camera has a wide angle lens to provide a wide view, so the distance shown on the screen differs from the actual distance. For your safety, always check the rear, left and right views when reversing.

About DRV (Driving Rear View)

This function allows you to view the rear of the vehicle while driving through the rear camera mounted on the vehicle.

Operating DRV


After turning on the engine, put the lever of the transmission in the N or D position and press [Camera switch] to start DRV.


Note

If you drive at about 10 km/h or more during DRV operation, DRV is turned off. At this state, even if you drive at less than about 10 km/h, DRV is remained at OFF state.

About PDW (Parking Distance Warning) (If equipped)


This function displays you a warning when an object is detected around the vehicle.





- To set brightness or contrast, touch the PDW area on the screen and press  when it is displayed. It goes to the brightness / contrast setting mode. You can set the brightness or contrast.
- If there is no control for a while, it goes back to the PDW mode automatically.

About Trailer View Mode (If equipped)

It shows you the view from each other camera.





- To switch the view to the other camera's, touch the camera view area on the screen and press [] when it is displayed. It is switched to the view from the other camera.
- If there is no control for a while, [] disappears from the screen automatically.

SVM (Surround View Monitor) (If equipped)

- SVM (Surround View Monitor) is an option that is provided to the customers who selected the option.
- Through the 4 cameras installed on the vehicle, it can view front, back, left and right side.
- While vehicle is started, if gear is put to R position, it automatically starts SVM (Surround View Monitor).
- If gear is changed from R to P position, SVM (Surround View Monitor) operation stops.

When driving your vehicle, be sure to keep the volume of the unit low enough to allow you to hear sounds coming from the outside.

General Information

About USB

- Take precautions regarding static electricity when connecting/disconnecting external USB devices.
- Encoded MP3 Players will not be recognised when connected as an external device.
- When connecting an external USB device, the device may not properly recognise the USB in some states.
- USB devices formatted as FAT16/32, exFAT or NTFS are supported.

Before thinking there is a product defect

1. Errors which occur during the operation or installation of the device may be mistaken as a malfunction of the actual device.
2. If you are having problems with the device, try the suggestions listed below.
3. If the problems persist, contact your authorised Hyundai Motors dealer.

Problem: There are small red, blue, or green dots on the screen.

Possible Cause: Because the LCD is manufactured with technology requiring high point density, a pixel or lighting deficiency may occur within 0.01% of total pixels.

Problem: The sound or image is not working.

Possible Cause:

- Has the Switch for the vehicle been turned to [ACC] or [ON]?
- Has the SYSTEM been turned OFF?

Problem: The screen is being displayed but sound is not working.

Possible Cause:

- Has the volume been set to a low level?
- Has the volume been muted?

Problem: When the power is turned on, the corners of the screen are dark.

Possible Cause:

- The display appearing somewhat dark after prolonged periods of use is normal with LCD panels. It is not a malfunction.
- If the screen is very dark, contact your nearest dealer for assistance.

Problem: Sound is working from only one speaker.

Possible Cause: Are the positions of Fader or Balance sound controls adjusted to only one side?

Problem: When turning power on, the most recent mode screen is not displayed.

Possible Cause:

- Within modes that play files by reading external sources, such as discs, USB, or Bluetooth® streaming mode, the most recently played mode screen prior to turning off power may not properly load.
- If there is no disc or the corresponding device is not connected, the mode operated prior to the most recent mode will operate.
- If the previous mode still cannot be properly played, the mode operated prior to that will operate.

Troubleshooting

Problem: The power does not turn on.

- Possible Cause: The fuse is disconnected.
- Countermeasure:
 - Replace with a suitable fuse.
 - If the fuse is disconnected again, please contact your dealer.
- Possible Cause : Device is not properly connected.
- Countermeasure: Check to see that the device has been properly connected.

Problem: The system does not play.

- Possible Cause: The vehicle battery is low.
- Countermeasure: Charge the battery if the problem persists, contact your point of purchase or service center.

Problem: Sound does not work.

- Possible Cause: The volume level is set to the lowest level.
- Countermeasure: Adjust the volume level.
- Possible Cause: The connection is not proper.
- Countermeasure: Check to see that the device has been properly connected.
- Possible Cause: The device is currently fast-forwarding, rewinding, scanning, or playing in slow mode.
- Countermeasure: The sound will not work when the device is fast-forwarding, rewinding, scanning, or playing in slow mode.

Problem: The image colour/tone quality is low.

- Possible Cause : The brightness, saturation, and contrast levels are not set properly.
- Countermeasure: Properly adjust the brightness, saturation, and contrast levels through Display Setup.

Problem: The USB does not work.

- Possible Cause: USB memory is damaged.
- Countermeasure: Please use after formatting the USB into FAT16/32, exFAT or NTFS format.
- Possible Cause: USB memory has been contaminated.
- Countermeasure: Remove any foreign substances on the contact surface of the USB memory and media terminal.
- Possible Cause: A separately purchased USB HUB is being used.
- Countermeasure: Directly connect the USB memory with the media terminal on the vehicle.

- Possible Cause: A USB extension cable is being used.
- Countermeasure: Directly connect the USB memory with the media terminal on the vehicle.

- Possible Cause: A USB which is not a Metal Cover Type USB Memory is being used.
- Countermeasure: Use standard USB Memory.

- Possible Cause: An HDD type, CF, SD Memory is being used.
- Countermeasure: Use standard USB Memory.

- Possible Cause: There are no music files which can be played.
- Countermeasure: Only MP3, WMA, OGG, FLAC and WAV file formats are supported.
Please use only the supported music file formats.

Preamble

The licenses for most software are designed to take away your freedom to share and change it. By contrast, the GNU General Public Licenses are intended to guarantee your freedom to share and change free software--to make sure the software is free for all its users.

This license, the Lesser General Public License, applies to some specially designated software packages--typically libraries--of the Free Software Foundation and other authors who decide to use it. You can use it too, but we suggest you first think carefully about whether this license or the ordinary General Public License is the better strategy to use in any particular case, based on the explanations below.

When we speak of free software, we are referring to freedom of use, not price. Our General Public Licenses are designed to make sure that you have the freedom to distribute copies of free software (and charge for this service if you wish); that you receive source code or can get it

if you want it; that you can change the software and use pieces of it in new free programs; and that you are informed that you can do these things.
