Sony Electronics Inc. ("Sony") warrants this Product (including any accessories) against defects in material or workmanship as follows:

1. **LABOR:** For a period of one (1) year from the date of purchase, if this Product is determined to be defective, Sony will repair or replace the Product, at its option, at no charge, or pay the labor charges to any Sony authorized service facility. After the Warranty Period, you must pay for all labor charges.
2. **PARTS:** In addition, Sony will supply, at no charge, new or rebuilt replacements in exchange for defective parts for a period of one (1) year. After the warranty period, you must pay for all parts costs.
3. **ACCESSORIES:** Parts and labor for all accessories are for one (1) year.

To obtain warranty service, you must take the Product, or deliver the Product freight prepaid, in either its original packaging or packaging affording an equal degree of protection, to any authorized Sony service facility.

This warranty does not cover customer instruction, installation, set up adjustments or signal reception problems.

This warranty does not cover cosmetic damage or damage due to acts of God, accident, misuse, abuse, negligence, commercial use, or modification of, or to any part of the Product, including the antenna. This warranty does not cover damage due to improper operation or maintenance, connection to improper voltage supply, or attempted repair by anyone other than a facility authorized by Sony to service the Product. This warranty does not cover Products sold AS IS or WITH ALL FAULTS, or consumables (such as fuses or batteries). This warranty is valid only in the United States.

Proof of purchase in the form of a bill of sale or receipted invoice which is evidence that the unit is within the Warranty period must be presented to obtain warranty service.

This warranty is invalid if the factory applied serial number has been altered or removed from the Product.

REPAIR OR REPLACEMENT AS PROVIDED UNDER THIS WARRANTY IS THE EXCLUSIVE REMEDY OF THE CONSUMER. IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When using your telephone equipment, basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and injury to persons, including the following:

1. Read and understand all instructions.
2. Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the product.
3. Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
4. Do not use this product near water, for example, near a bath tub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement, or near a swimming pool.
5. Do not place this product on an unstable cart, stand, or table. The product may fall, causing serious damage to the product.

4. Exercise care in handling battery pack in order not to short the battery with conducting materials such as rings, bracelets, and keys. The battery or conductor may overheat and cause burns.
5. Charge the battery pack provided with or identified for use with this product only in accordance with the instructions and limitations specified in the instruction manual provided for this product.
6. Observe proper polarity orientation between the battery pack and battery charger.

INFORMATION FOR GENERAL TELEPHONES

1. This equipment complies with Part 68 of the FCC rules. On the bottom of this equipment is a label that contains, among other information, the FCC registration number and ringer equivalence number (REN) for this equipment. If requested, this information must be provided to the telephone company.
2. The applicable registration jack (connector) USOC-RJ11C is used for this equipment.
3. This equipment is designed to be connected to the telephone network or premises wiring using a compatible modular jack which is Part 68 compliant.
The FCC compliant telephone cord and modular plug is provided with this equipment.
4. The REN is used to determine the quantity of devices which may be connected to the telephone line. Excessive RENs on the telephone line may result in the devices not ringing in response to an incoming call. In most, but not all areas, the sum of the RENs should not exceed five (5.0). 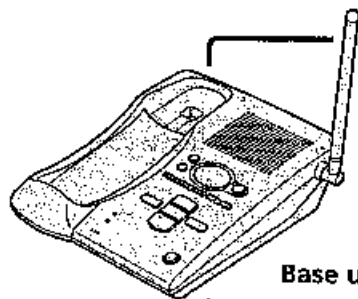

Read this first

Before you use your phone, you must first set it up. Here's a quick way to set up your phone: Steps 1, 2 and 3.

Step 1 (page 7)

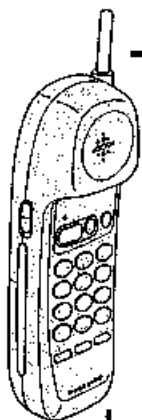
First, unpack the phone and the supplied accessories.



Base unit

Step 2 (pages 8 to 10)

Next, you need to do three things to set up the base unit, including finding the best location for the base unit.



Handset

Step 3 (pages 11 to 12)

Then, insert the battery pack into the handset and charge it for more than 10 hours.

That's it!

About the cordless telephone

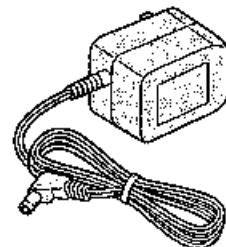
Each time you place the handset on the base unit, a random security code is automatically assigned between the base unit and the handset.

(The IN USE lamp flashes during the initialization, then turns off when the initialization is complete.) Only a handset which has this unique security code can make calls through the base unit. This system prevents the possibility of other cordless telephone handsets making calls through your base unit.

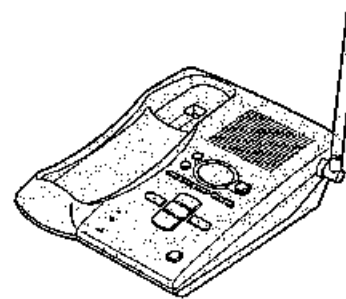

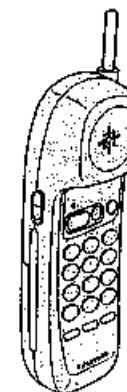

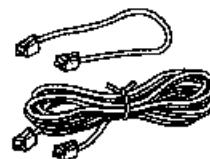

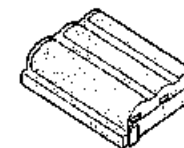

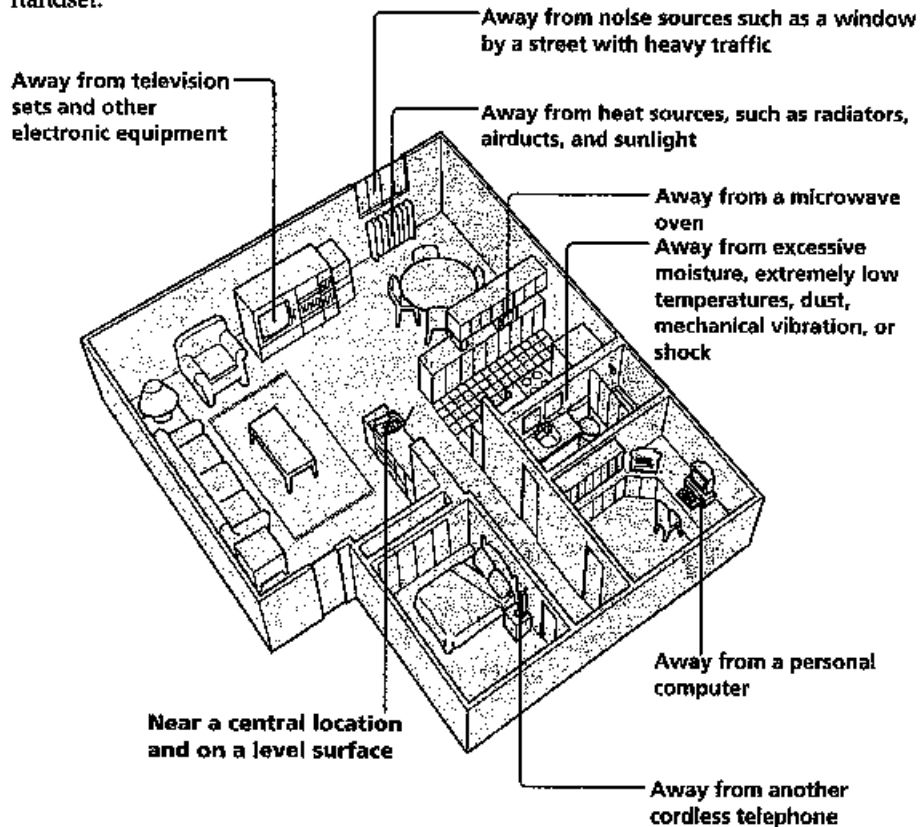
Setting up the base unit

Do the following steps:

- Choose the best location
- Connect the base unit
- Choose the dialing mode

Choose the best location

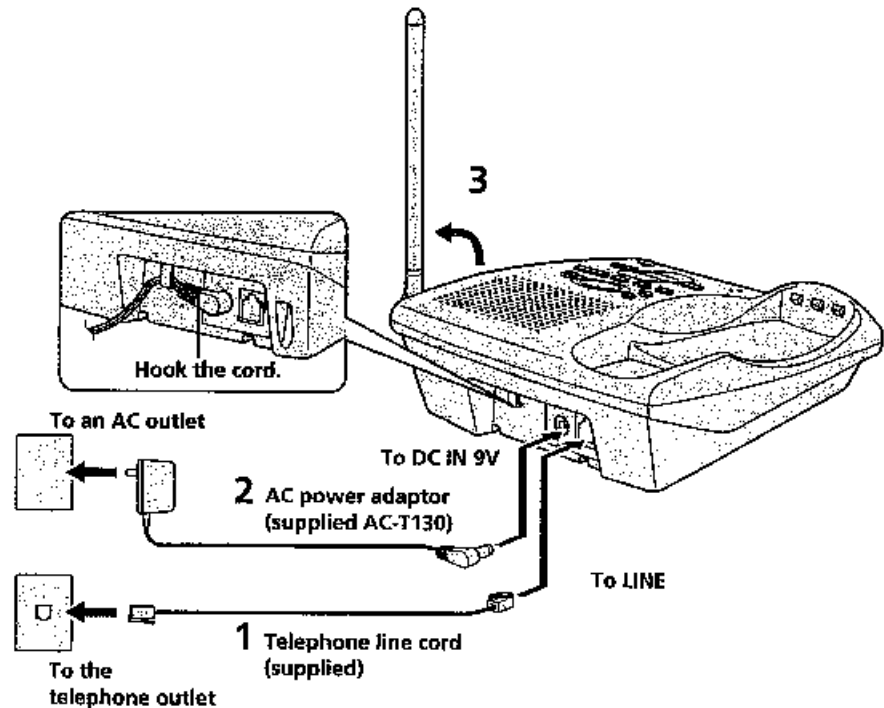
Where you place the base unit affects the reception quality of the handset.



CAUTION: • Should you experience intermittent loss of audio during a conversation, try moving closer to the base or move base unit away from other noise sources.
• The cordless telephone operates at a frequency that may cause interference to nearby TVs and VCRs; the base unit should not be placed near or on the top of a TV or VCR; and, if interference is experienced, moving the cordless telephone farther away from the TV or VCR will often reduce or eliminate the interference.

Connect the base unit

If you want to hang the base unit on the wall, see page 37.



- 1** Connect the telephone line cord to the LINE jack and to a telephone outlet.
- 2** Connect the AC power adaptor to the DC IN 9V jack and to an AC outlet.
- 3** Raise the antenna. Make sure it points towards the ceiling.

Step 2: Setting up the base unit (continued)

Notes

- Use only the supplied AC-T130 AC power adaptor. Do not use any other AC power adaptor.
- Connect the AC power adaptor to a continuous power supply.
- Place the base unit close to the AC outlet so that you can unplug the AC power adaptor easily.

Modular

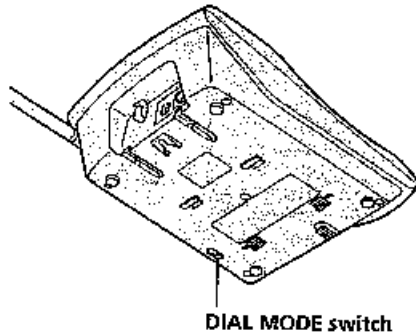


Tip

If your telephone outlet is not modular, contact your telephone service company for assistance.

Choose the dialing mode

For the telephone to work properly, select an appropriate dialing mode (tone or pulse).



DIAL MODE switch

Depending on your dialing system, set the DIAL MODE switch as follows:

If your dialing system is	Set the switch to
Tone	TONE
Pulse	PULSE

If you aren't sure of your dialing system

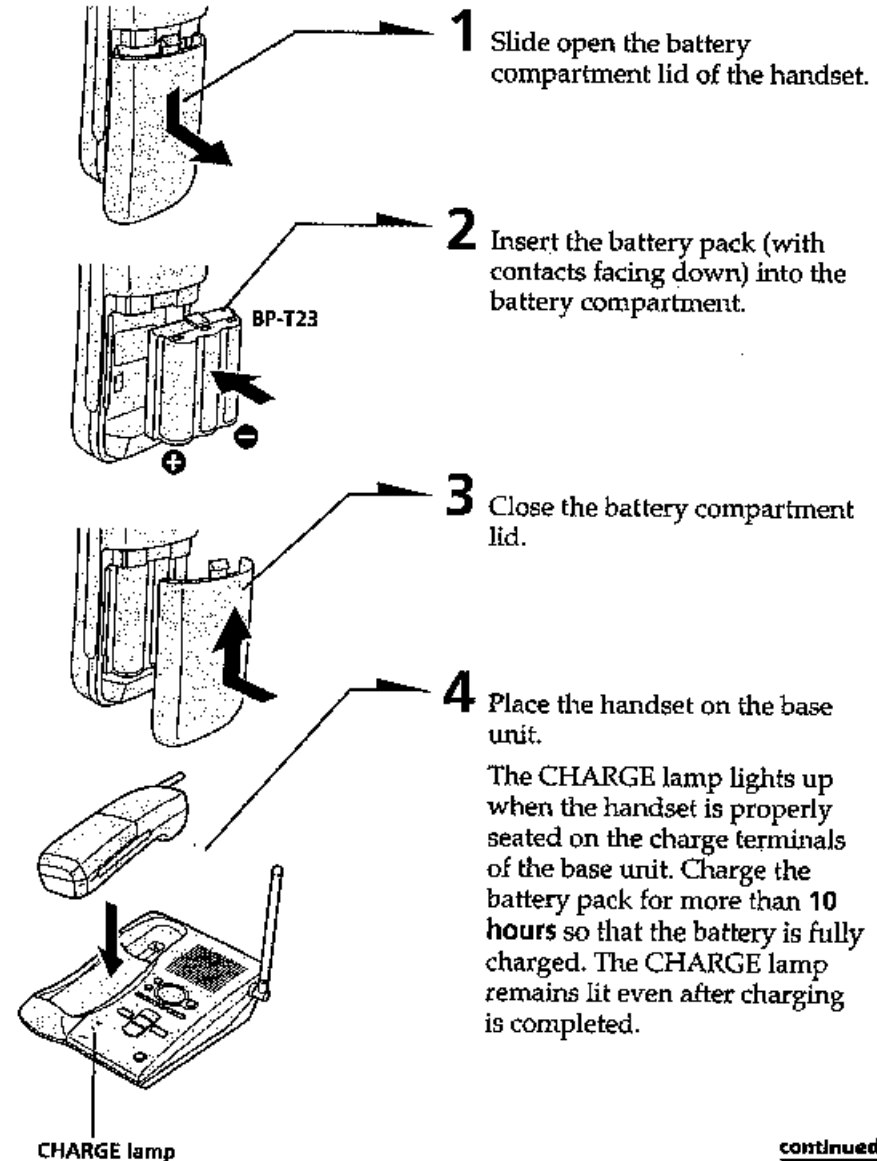
Make a trial call with the DIAL MODE switch set to TONE.

If the call connects, leave the switch as is; otherwise, set to PULSE.

Step 3

Preparing the battery pack

Charge the battery pack for more than 10 hours before you start using your phone.



Step 3: Preparing the battery pack (continued)

Battery duration

A fully charged battery pack lasts for about:

- Approx. 7 hours when you use the handset continuously
- Approx. 6 days when the handset is in standby mode.

Notes

- The battery pack will gradually discharge over a long period of time, even if not in use.
- If you leave the battery pack in the handset without charging it, the battery pack will be completely discharged. It may require several times of charging to recover its full capacity.

To obtain the best performance from the battery

Do not place the handset on the base unit after each call. The battery works best if the handset is returned to the base unit after two or three calls. However, do not leave the handset off the base unit for a long period of time as this will completely discharge the battery pack.

When to purchase a new battery pack

If the battery lasts only a few minutes even after 10 hours of charging, the usable life of the battery has expired and needs replacement. Contact your local Sony authorized dealer or service center, and ask for a Sony BP-T23 rechargeable battery pack.

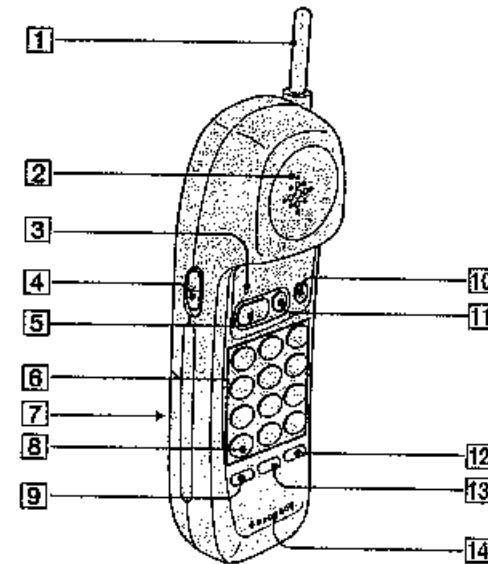

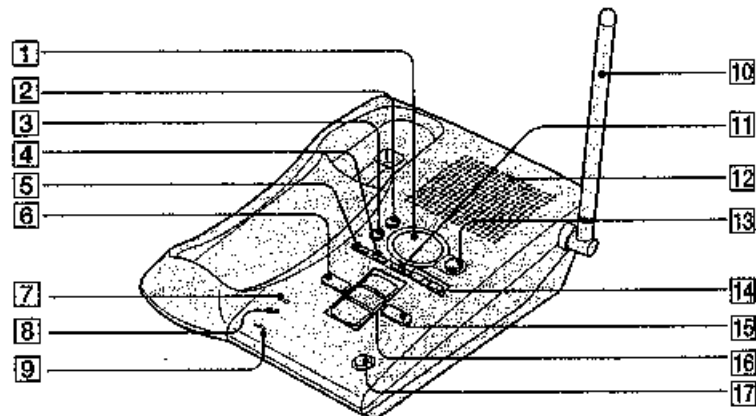

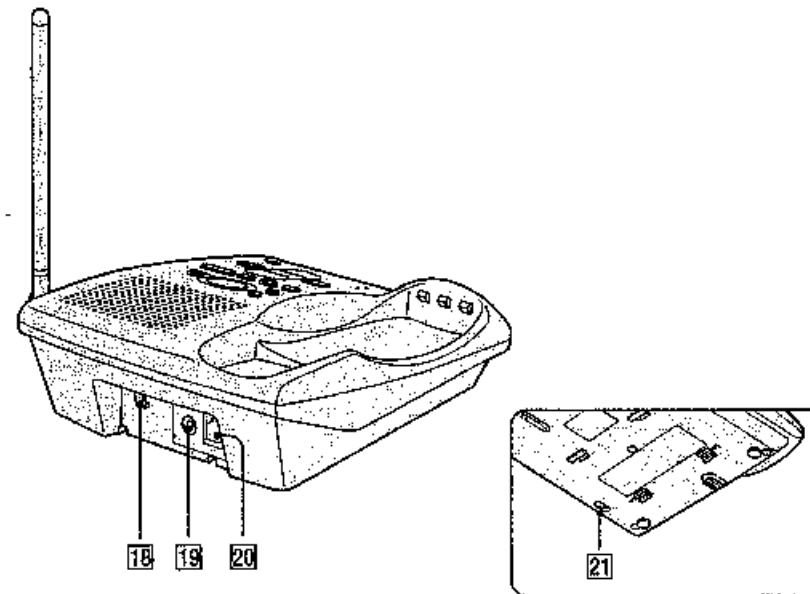
Identifying the parts (continued)

Base Unit



- 1** **Message counter** (p. 29)
Indicates the number of new messages recorded. "A" appears in the announcement only mode. "F" appears when there is no space to record messages.
- 2** **REC/MEMO button** (p. 25, 34)
Records a greeting or memo message.
- 3** **ERASE button** (p. 26, 31)
Erases the recorded greeting or messages.
- 4** **SELECT button** (p. 24)
- 5** **TIME/SET button** (p. 24, 35)
Press when setting the day and time, or to check the current time. Also used when setting the remote ID code (security code).

- 6** **REPEAT/SLOW button** (p. 30)
Press to repeat the current message or go back to the previous message. Keep the button pressed for slow playback of messages.
- 7** **CHARGE lamp** (p. 11)
Lights while the battery is being charged.
- 8** **IN USE lamp** (p. 18)
Lights when the cordless handset is in use.
- 9** **MIC (microphone)** (p. 25, 34)
- 10** **Antenna** (p. 9, 37)
- 11** **MENU button** (p. 24)
- 12** **Speaker**



- 13** **ANSWER ON/OFF button** (p. 29)
Turns the answering function on or off.
- 14** **VOLUME +/- buttons** (p. 31)
Adjusts the speaker volume.
- 15** **SKIP/QUICK button** (p. 30)
Press to skip to the next message. Keep the button pressed for quick playback of messages.
- 16** **PLAY/STOP (MAILBOX 1, 2, 3) buttons** (p. 30)
Plays back the messages in each mailbox.
- 17** **HANDSET LOCATOR button** (p. 23)
Allows you to page the cordless handset.
- 18** **Hook for AC power adaptor cord** (p. 9)
- 19** **DC IN 9V jack** (p. 9, 37)
- 20** **LINE (telephone line) jack** (p. 9, 37)
- 21** **DIAL MODE switch** (p. 10)
Selects pulse or tone dialing.
