Justification Letter - Request for permission to affix the FCC ID on the core unit of the device and on packaging, instead of the exterior of the product.

Dear Sir/Madame,

With reference to FCC part 2.925, nameplate or label shall be affixed on a permanently attached part of the equipment enclosure. KDB784748 states that FCC label may be placed in a "user accessible area" if the following conditions are met:

- Handheld device.
- The FCC identifier is visible at the time of purchase. The FCC ID on the box satisfies this requirement.
- The user accessible area must not require any special tools for access, and the FCC label must not be placed on a removable part.
- The FCC ID and Model Number must be on the label and must meet all general labelling requirements or policies that apply for Certification, Verification or DoC.

We, IKEA of Sweden AB, hereby confirm that the above conditions are met and we request permission to affix the nameplate to the core unit of the device, instead of the exterior of the device. In addition we will affix the FCC ID on packaging based on KDB784748.

Justification;

"Because of the product hardware configuration, with exchangeable back and front plastic covers, the core unit (permanently attached part of product) would be the most suitable surface to mark and identify the product. All markings will be easily accessible and viewable when you insert the battery for the first time, when you replace the battery or when you change the exchangeable covers. In addition, we have chosen to add marking on packaging."
