### 2.2 MPE Calculation Formula

 $Pd = (Pout*G) / (4*pi*r^2)$ 

where

Pd = power density in mW/cm<sup>2</sup>

Pout = output power to antenna in mW

G = gain of antenna in linear scale

Pi = 3.1416

R = distance between observation point and center of the radiator in cm

### 2.3 Classification

The antenna of this product, under normal use condition, is at least 20cm away from the body of the user. So, this device is classified as **Mobile Device**.

#### Conclusion:

The formula of calculated the MPE is:

CPD1 / LPD1 + CPD2 / LPD2 + .....etc. < 1

CPD = Calculation power density

LPD = Limit of power density

WLAN 2.4GHz + RFID = 0.058 + 0.00797/0.602 = 0.071 WLAN 5GHz + RFID = 0.025 + 0.00797/0.602 = 0.038 BT+ RFID = 0.002 + 0.00797/0.602 = 0.015

Therefore all the maximum calculations of above situations are less than the "1" limit.

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
