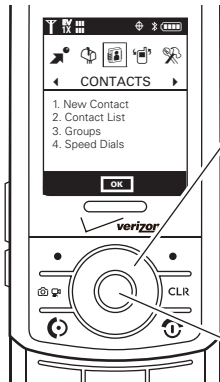
## Main Screen

③ Press the **Navigation Key** (⬆️/⬇️/⬇️/⬆️) up/down/left/right to highlight a menu feature.

④ Press the **Center Select Key** (⬇️) to select it.

# Use and Care

---

To care for your Motorola phone, please keep it away from:



## liquids of any kind

Don't expose your phone to water, rain, extreme humidity, sweat, or other moisture. If it does get wet, don't try to accelerate drying with the use of an oven or dryer, as this may damage the phone.



## dust and dirt

Don't expose your phone to dust, dirt, sand, food, or other inappropriate materials.



## extreme heat or cold

Avoid temperatures below 0°C/32°F or above 45°C/113°F.



## cleaning solutions

To clean your phone, use only a dry soft cloth. Don't use alcohol or other cleaning solutions.



## microwaves

Don't try to dry your phone in a microwave oven.



## the ground

Don't drop your phone.

## Battery Use & Battery Safety

- **Motorola recommends you always use Motorola-branded batteries and chargers.** The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.  
**Caution:** Use of an unqualified battery or charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard. Improper battery

use, or use of a damaged battery, may result in a fire, explosion, or other hazard.

- Battery usage by children should be supervised.
- **Important:** Motorola mobile devices are designed to work best with qualified batteries. If you see a message on your display such as **Invalid Battery** or **Unable to Charge**, take the following steps:
  - Remove the battery and inspect it to confirm that it bears a Motorola “Original Equipment” hologram;
  - If there is no hologram, the battery is not a qualified battery;
  - If there is a hologram, replace the battery and retry charging it;
  - If the message remains, contact a Motorola Authorized Service Center.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- **Charging precautions:** When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature. Never expose batteries to temperatures below 0°C (32°F) or above 45°C (113°F) when charging. Always take your mobile device with you when you leave your vehicle
- When storing your battery, keep it in a cool, dry place.
- It is normal over time for battery life to decrease, and for the battery to exhibit shorter runtime between charges or require more frequent or longer charging times.
- **Avoid damage to battery and mobile device.** Do not disassemble, open, crush, bend, deform, puncture, shred, or submerge the battery or mobile device. Avoid dropping the battery or mobile device, especially on a

hard surface. If your battery or mobile device has been subjected to such damage, take it to a Motorola Authorized Service Center before using. Do **not** attempt to dry it with an appliance or heat source, such as a hair dryer or microwave oven.

- **Use care when handling a charged battery**—particularly when placing it inside a pocket, purse, or other container with metal objects. Contact with metal objects (such as jewelry, keys, beaded chains) could complete an electrical circuit (short circuit), causing the battery to become very hot, which could cause damage or injury.

Promptly dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Contact

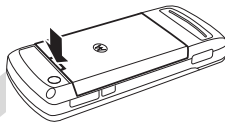

## charge the battery

New batteries are not fully charged. Plug the battery charger into your phone and an electrical outlet. Your phone might take several seconds to start charging the battery.



If you are charging your phone while it is off, your phone displays **Charge Complete** when finished. If you are charging your phone while it is on, it displays a temporary charge complete message, and the battery symbol stops flashing when finished.

**Tip:** Relax, you can't overcharge your battery. It will perform best after you fully charge and discharge it a few times.

You can charge your battery by connecting a cable from your phone's mini-USB port to a USB port on a computer. Both your phone and the computer must be turned on, and your computer must have the correct software drivers installed. Cables and software drivers are available in Motorola Original data kits, sold separately.



## conserve battery charge

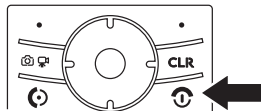
Using certain features can quickly deplete your battery's charge. **These features can include downloading music, using the camera, replaying video clips, and using Bluetooth® wireless connections.**

You can conserve your battery's charge by doing the following:

- Turn Bluetooth power off when not in use (see page 58).
- Turn off wallpaper (see page 41) and screensaver (see page 42).
- Reduce backlight (see page 43).

## turn it on & off

**To turn on your phone**, press and hold the Power/End key (⏻) until the display turns on.



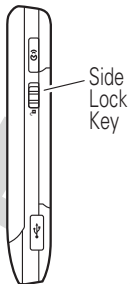
The phone may require several seconds to turn on. If prompted, use the keypad to enter your four-digit unlock code (which, by default, is the last four digits of your phone number) and press the center select key (•◊•) (OK) to unlock the phone.

**To turn off your phone**, press and hold the Power/End key (⏻).

## lock & unlock slider

You can lock your phone to keep from accidentally pushing external keys when the slider is closed. To lock the phone, push the Lock Key up.

When the phone is **off and the locked**, the phone will not turn on, but will briefly display a white padlock (🔒) to remind you that you have locked the phone.



## make a call

Open the slider, enter a phone number, and press the Send key (📞) to make a call.

To “hang up,” close the slider or press the Power/End key (🔌).

**Tip:** You can make a call with the slider closed. Select a contact, then press the Send key (📞) to call the number.





## answer a call

When your phone rings and/or vibrates, just open the slider or press the Send key (📞) to answer.

To “hang up,” press the Power/End key (🔌).

## store a phone number



You can store a phone number in **Contacts**:

- 1 Use the keypad to enter a phone number in the main screen and press the left soft key () (**Save**).
- 2 Select **Create New Contact** by pressing the center select key () (**OK**).
- 3 Use the navigation key to scroll to a type of entry and press the center select key () (**OK**).
- 4 Use the keypad to enter a name and other details for the phone number and press the center select key () (**Save**) to store the number.

To edit or delete a **Contacts** entry, see page 90.

**Tip:** You can set your phone to display a picture or play a special ringtone for caller (see page 92).



## call a stored phone number


- 1 From the main screen, press the right soft key () (**Contacts**) to open the Contact List quickly.
- 2 Scroll to the **Contacts** entry.
- 3 Press the Send key () to call the entry.

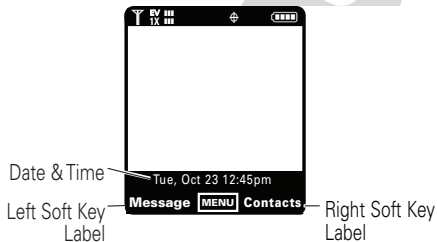

## main screen


The *main screen* appears when you turn on the phone.







To dial a number from the main screen, press number keys and the Send key ()

Press the center select key () to open the main menu. *Soft key labels* show current soft key functions. (For soft key locations, see page 2.)

**Tip:** You can quickly select a menu option by pressing the number for that option. For example, from the **SETTINGS & TOOLS** menu, press **5** to select **Display Settings**.

Press up, down, left, or right on the navigation key () to open these shortcuts:

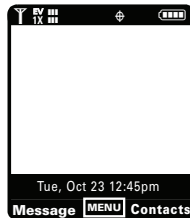

##### **EV 1X** Signal Strength








EVDO indicator shows when phone is in EVDO coverage area (necessary for V CAST services). 1X indicator shows when phone is in 1x-RTT coverage area. The number of bars show the strength of each signal.


##### **Roaming**

Indicates phone is roaming off your home network.

alert/indicator
 <b>SSL</b> Indicates application verification is via SSL during a download session.
 <b>Data Call, Tethered, or Embedded WAP/BREW Application</b> Shows during data call, tethered mode, or WAP/BREW application.
 <b>Dormant</b> Indicates phone is dormant and PPP session is active.
 <b>No Service</b> Phone is in area with no service coverage.
 <b>TTY</b> Phone is in TTY mode.


alert/indicator
 <b>Voice Call</b> Shows during an active voice call.
 <b>E911</b> Indicates <b>E911</b> is <b>On</b> .
 <b>Location On</b> Indicates <b>Location</b> is set to <b>On</b> .
 <b>Battery Level</b> Shows battery strength. The more bars, the greater the charge.
 <b>All Sounds Off</b> Indicates <b>Master Volume</b> is set to <b>Off</b> .
 <b>Alarm Only</b> Indicates <b>Master Volume</b> is set to <b>Alarm Only</b> .

<b>alert/indicator</b>
 <b>Vibrate On</b> Indicates <b>Master Volume</b> is set to <b>Vibrate On</b> .
 <b>Speakerphone</b> Indicates speakerphone is on.
 <b>Missed Call</b> Indicates a call was missed.
 <b>Message</b> Shows when you receive a new message.
 <b>Calendar Event</b> Shows number of calendar appointments.
 <b>New Voicemail</b> Shows when a voicemail message is received.
 <b>Alarm On</b> Shows when an alarm has been set.



## enter text


Some features allow you to enter text. This example shows a **Contacts** entry screen:



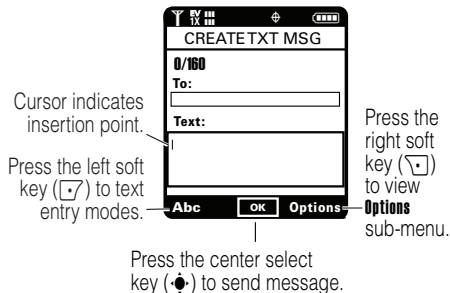
Highlighted Option

Press the left soft key () to change entry mode.

Press the center select key () to save entry information.

Press the navigation key () to scroll to more options.

## select entry mode

Multiple entry modes make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The default mode is **Abc** (tap mode, first character of a sentence in uppercase).

**To select an entry mode from the CREATE TEXT MESSAGE screen**, press the left soft key (□) (**Abc**), then select an entry mode.

**To select an entry mode from the CONTACT LIST screen**, press the left soft key (□) (**Edit**), and then press the left soft key (□) (**Abc**).

When your cursor is in a text field, you can select one of these entry modes:

entry modes	
<b>iTAP English</b>	The phone predicts each word (in English) as you press keys.
<b>iTAP Spanish</b>	The phone predicts each word (in Spanish) as you press keys.
<b>Abc</b>	Enter numbers and letters, first character of a sentence in uppercase.

entry modes	
ABC	Enter numbers and letters, all characters in uppercase (not available when editing a contact).
123	Enter numbers only.
Symbols	Enter symbols.

**Tip:** Press **[\*]** in a text entry screen to toggle through capitalization options:

abc	no uppercase letters
Abc	first letter of a sentence in uppercase
ABC	all uppercase letters

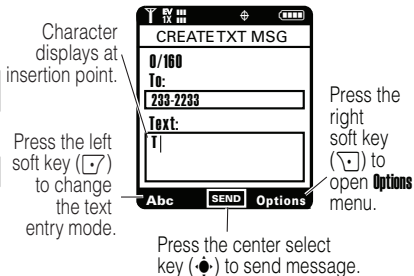
## tap mode

This is the standard mode for entering text on your phone. Regular tap mode cycles through the letters, numbers, and symbols of the key you press.

- 1 Press a key one or more times to select a letter, number, or symbol.
- 2 Enter the remaining characters in the same way.

**Tip:** Press **[#]** to enter a space.

When you enter text with tap mode, the soft key functions change:



- Press left or right on the navigation key (**[Left/Right]**) to move the flashing cursor in a text message.

- If you don't want to save your text or text edits, press the Power/End key (⏻) twice to exit without saving.

## iTAP® mode

iTAP software provides a predictive text entry method that combines your key presses into common words.

When you enter three or more letters in a row, your phone may guess the rest of the word. For example, if you enter **prog**, your phone might show:




Press the navigation key (⤴) right to accept **program**. Enter a space after **prog** to keep only **prog**.

If you want a different word (such as progress), continue pressing keys to enter the remaining letters.



If you enter a word the phone does not recognize, the phone stores it as a new word option. When you fill memory space for new word options, your phone deletes the oldest words to add new ones.



- Scroll up or down to view other possible combinations, and select the one you want.
- Press right on the navigation key (⤴) to enter the highlighted combination when it spells a word. A space is inserted automatically after the word.
- To enter numbers quickly, press and hold a number key to temporarily switch to numeric mode. Press the number keys to enter the numbers you want.
- Press **[1]** to enter punctuation or other characters.

## numeric mode

After selecting numeric mode, press number keys to enter the numbers you want. When you finish entering numbers, press the left soft key () (123) to switch to another entry mode.



## symbol mode

After selecting the symbols mode, in the **SYMBOLS** screen, use the navigation key () to scroll to the desired symbol and press the center select key () (OK) to select it.

To search for additional symbols, press the right soft key () (Next) to page down to the next set of symbols. Press the left soft key () (Prev) to page up to the previous set.

## delete letters & words

Move the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete, then:

- Press and **release**  to delete one letter at a time.
- Press and **hold**  to delete an entire word.

## adjust volume

Press the volume keys to:

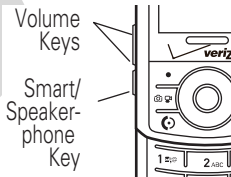
- turn off an incoming call alert
- change the earpiece volume during calls with the slider open
- change the ringer volume from the main screen (with slider open)

**Tip:** Sometimes silence really is golden. That's why you can quickly set your ringer to **Vibrate**

**Only** or **All Sounds Off** by holding the down volume key while in the main screen.

## change sound settings

Press the down volume key to switch to lower call sounds volume, then switch to **Vibrate Only**, then **Alarm Only**, and, finally, **All Sounds Off**. Press the up volume key to cycle back from silent to vibrate and then to the lowest call volume setting.



## handsfree speaker

You can use your phone's handsfree speaker to make calls without holding the phone to your ear.

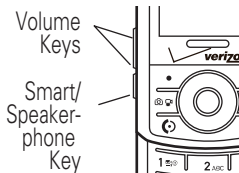
The handsfree speaker stays on until you press and hold the smart/speakerphone key again or turn off the phone.


**Note:** The handsfree speaker won't work when your phone is connected to a handsfree car kit or headset.

## slider open


**To activate the speakerphone during a call**, press and hold the smart/speakerphone key.

You will hear an audio alert and see the speakerphone indicator .




**To end the call**, press the Power/End key (). You will hear an audio alert.

**Note:** Closing the slider while using the speakerphone does not end the call (see “slider closed” below).

**To turn off the speakerphone**, press the smart/speakerphone key, or press and hold the Power/End key () to turn off the phone.

## slider closed




- 1 Open the slider.
- 2 Press and hold the smart/speakerphone key to turn on the speakerphone.
- 3 Enter the number you want to call and press the Send key ().
- 4 When the call connects, close the slider and continue your conversation.

- 5 To end the call, press and hold the smart/speakerphone key. You will see **Call Ended** and hear an audio alert.

## standalone mode

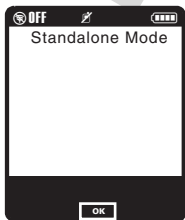
**Note:** Consult airline staff about the use of **Standalone Mode** in flight. Turn off your phone whenever instructed to do so by airline staff.

Use *standalone mode* to turn off your phone's calling features in locations where wireless phone use is prohibited. **You cannot make or receive calls or use Bluetooth in standalone mode**, but you can use your phone's other non-calling features.

- 1 Press the center select key () to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key () to scroll to  **SETTINGS & TOOLS**.


- 3 Scroll to **Phone Settings** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 4 Press center select key (•◉•) to select **Standalone Mode**.
- 5 Select **On** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).

Your phone indicates that **Standalone Mode** is set to **On** by displaying indicators and a message on the main screen:



## change lock code

Your phone's four-digit **lock code** is originally set to the last four digits of your phone number. To change lock code:

- 1 Press the center select key (•◉•) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (◉) to scroll to  **SETTINGS & TOOLS**.
- 3 Scroll to **Phone Settings** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 4 Scroll to **Security** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 5 When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 6 Scroll to **Edit Code** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).

- 7 Enter the new four-digit lock code in the **New Code** entry area, then press down on the navigation key (◂◃) to move the cursor into the **Confirm Code** entry area. Re-enter the new four-digit lock code.
- 8 Press the center select key (◂◃) (OK).


## lock & unlock phone

You can lock your phone to keep others from using it. To lock or unlock your phone, you need the four-digit lock code (which is originally set to the last four digits of your phone number).

**Note:** You can make emergency calls on a locked phone (see page 50). A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, **but you need to unlock it to answer.**









To **manually lock** your phone:


- 1 Press the center select key (◂◃) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the navigation key (◂◃) to scroll to  **SETTINGS & TOOLS.**
- 3 Scroll to **Phone Settings** and press the center select key (◂◃) (OK).
- 4 Scroll to **Security** and press the center select key (◂◃) (OK).
- 5 When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center select key (◂◃) (OK).
- 6 Select **Lock Mode** by pressing the center select key (◂◃) (OK).
- 7 Scroll to **Lock** and press the center select key (◂◃) (OK).

To **automatically lock** your phone whenever you turn it off:

- 1 Press the center select key (◂◃) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the navigation key () to scroll to  **SETTINGS & TOOLS**.
- 3 Scroll to **Phone Settings** and press the center select key () (OK).
- 4 Scroll to **Security** and press the center select key () (OK).
- 5 When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center select key () (OK).
- 6 Select **Lock Mode** by pressing the center select key () (OK).
- 7 Scroll to **On Power Up** and press the center select key () (OK).
- 8 Press the Power/End key () to return to the main screen.

**To unlock the phone**, enter the four-digit lock code in the **Enter Lock Code** entry area and press the center select key () (OK).

**Note:** You can lock the keys by using the switch on the side of the phone. See page 16.

## manage memory

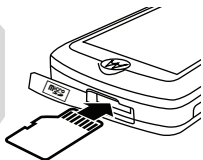


You can store multimedia content such as songs and photos on your phone's internal memory or on a removable microSD memory card.

**Note:** If you download a copyrighted file to your phone and store it on your memory card, you can use the file only when your memory card is inserted in your phone. You cannot send, copy, or change copyrighted files.

## install memory card


- 1 Open the memory card slot cover on the top of your phone.
- 2 With the gold contacts up, slide the memory card into the card slot and press the card in until it clicks.
- 3 Replace the memory card slot cover.




**Caution:** Do not remove your memory card while your phone is using it or writing files to it. **To remove the memory card**, lightly press the memory card once to release it from the slot, and carefully slide it out.

## set memory for multimedia content

You can set whether multimedia content that you download or create with your phone's camera is stored in phone memory or on the memory card.

- 1 Press the center select key (•◉•) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (◂◉◃) to scroll to  **SETTINGS & TOOLS**.
- 3 Scroll to **Memory** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 4 Scroll to **Save Options** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 5 Scroll to **Pictures**, **Videos**, or **Sounds**, and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 6 Select **Phone Memory** or **Card Memory** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).

## view memory information


- 1 Press the center select key (◂◃) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (◂◃) to scroll to  **SETTINGS & TOOLS**.
- 3 Scroll to **Memory** and press the center select key (◂◃) (OK).
- 4 Select **Phone Memory** or **Card Memory** and press the center select key (◂◃) (OK).
- 5 Select **Phone Memory Usage** or **Card Memory Usage**; **My Pictures**, **My Videos**, **My Music**, or **My Sounds**; and press the center select key (◂◃) (OK).

## move files from phone to memory card


You can move files (such as photos, videos, sound, and music files) to the memory card to free up phone memory.

**Note:** Moving a file to the memory card deletes it from phone memory.




### To move photos or video clips:




A memory card icon in the picture thumbnail or next to a video file indicates that the file is stored on the memory card.

An  in the picture thumbnail indicates that the picture **came preloaded on your phone and cannot be moved to the memory card.**

If the picture or video is not marked with a memory card icon, it is stored on the phone.




- 4 Scroll to the file you want to move and press the right soft key () (**Options**).
- 5 Select **Move** and press the center select key () (**OK**).
- 6 When your phone asks if you want to move the file, select **Yes** and press the center select key () (**OK**) to confirm that you want to move the file.

#### **To move an audio clip that you recorded:**

- 1 From the main screen, press left on the navigation key () to access **Music & Tones**.
- 2 Use the navigation key () to scroll to **My Sounds** and press the center select key () (**OK**).

A memory card icon beside the file name of an audio clip indicates that the audio clip is stored on the memory card.

If the file name is not marked with a memory card icon, the audio clip is stored on the phone.

- Your phone asks if you want to move the file.

# TTY operation

You can use an optional teletypewriter (TTY) device with your phone to send and receive calls. You must plug the TTY device into the phone's headset connector and set the phone to operate in one of three TTY modes.

## Notes:

- A TTY is a communication device used by people who are hard of hearing or have a speech impairment. TTY does not work from mobile phone to mobile phone.
- Use a TSB-121 compliant cable (provided by the TTY manufacturer) to connect the TTY device to your phone. Your phone has a 2.5mm jack.
- Set the phone to Medium volume level for proper operation. If you experience a high


number of incorrect characters, adjust the volume as needed to minimize the error rate.

- For optimal performance, your phone should be at least 12 inches (30 centimeters) from the TTY device. Placing the phone too close to the TTY device may cause high error rates.

## set TTY mode



When you set your phone to a TTY mode, it operates in that mode whenever a TTY device is connected.

- 1 Press the center select key (•◉•) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (◉◉◉) to scroll to  **SETTINGS & TOOLS**.
- 3 Scroll to **Call Settings** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).

- 4 Select **TTY Mode** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).

**TTY Mode** can include these options:

<b>option</b>	
<b>TTY Full</b>	Transmit and receive TTY characters.
<b>TTY + Talk</b>	Receive TTY characters but transmit by speaking into microphone.
<b>TTY + Hear</b>	Transmit TTY characters but receive by listening to earpiece.
<b>TTY Off</b>	All TTY modes are turned off.

When your phone is in a TTY mode, your phone displays the international TTY mode, the international TTY symbol, and the mode setting during an active TTY call.

## return to voice mode

To return to standard voice mode, select **TTY OFF** from the **TTY MODE** menu.






# AGPS & your location



Your phone can use the *automatic location information* (ALI) feature, along with *Assisted Global Positioning System* (AGPS) satellite signals, to tell the network where you are physically located.

When ALI is set to **Location On**, your phone displays the  (ALI on) indicator. Services may use your known location to provide useful information (for example, driving directions, or the location of the nearest bank). Your phone prompts you when the network or a service asks for your location. You can refuse at this point.

When ALI is set to **911 Only**, your phone displays the  (ALI off) indicator, and the phone does not send location information unless you call the emergency phone number (such as 911).

- 1 Press the center select key () to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key () to scroll to  **SETTINGS & TOOLS**.
- 3 Scroll to **Phone Settings** and press the center select key () (OK).
- 4 Scroll to **Location** and press the center select key () (OK).
- 5 Scroll to **Location On** or **911 Only**.
- 6 Press the center select key () (OK) to select the setting.

## AGPS limitations & tips

Your phone uses *Assisted Global Positioning System* (AGPS) satellite signals to estimate your location. If your phone cannot find strong satellite signals, your AGPS might be slower, less accurate, or it might not

work at all. AGPS provides only an approximate location, often within 150 feet (45 meters) but sometimes much farther from your actual location.

To improve AGPS accuracy:

- Go outside and away from underground locations, covered vehicles, structures with metal or concrete roofs, tall buildings, and foliage. Indoor performance might improve if you move closer to window, but some window sun-shielding films can block satellite signals.
- Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.
- Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.




AGPS uses satellites controlled by the U.S. government and subject to changes implemented in accordance with the Department of Defense AGPS user policy and the Federal Radio Navigation Plan. These changes might affect AGPS performance.



- 3 Press the Send key () to redial the number.

### To redial a busy number:

- 4 Press the Send key () from the main screen.
- 5 Use the navigation key () to scroll to the entry you want to call.
- 6 Press the Send key ()





## automatic redial



When you receive a busy signal, your phone displays **Call Failed, Number Busy**.

With automatic redial, your phone automatically redials the number for four minutes. When the call goes through, your phone rings or vibrates once, displays **Redial Successful**, and connects the call.

You must turn on automatic redial to use the feature:

- 1 Press the center select key () to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key () to scroll to  **SETTINGS & TOOLS**.
- 3 Scroll to **Call Settings** and press the center select key () (OK).

4 Select **Auto Retry** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).

5 Select **On** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).

When automatic redial is turned off, you can manually activate it to redial a number. When you hear a fast busy signal and see **Call Failed**, press the Send key (☎) or **RETRY** to automatically redial.

## recent calls

Your phone keeps lists of the calls you have received and dialed, even if the calls didn't connect. The most recent calls are listed first. The oldest calls are deleted as new calls are added.

**Shortcut:** Press the Send key (☎) from the main screen to view the **All Calls** list.

1 Press the center select key (•◉•) to open the menu.

2 Use the navigation key (◂◉◃) to scroll to ☎ RECENT CALLS.

3 Scroll to **Missed**, **Received**, **Dialed**, or **All** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK) to select the list.

## return missed calls

Your phone keeps a record of your missed calls, and displays the  (missed call) indicator and **[Number] Missed Calls**.

- 1 When you see the missed call alert, select **View Now** and press the center select key () (**OK**) to see the missed calls list.


**or**

- Select **View Later** and press the center select key () (**OK**). The missed call indicator () appears on the bottom of the main screen until you view recent calls by pressing the Send key () .
- 2 Use the navigation key () to scroll to the call you want to return.
- 3 Press the Send key () to make the call.

# speed dial

**Note:** Speed dial number 1 is already assigned to your voice mail number.

## To assign a speed dial number to an entry:

- 1 Press the center select key (•◉•) to open the menu.  **CONTACTS** is automatically selected.
- 2 Use the navigation key (◉◉◉) to scroll to **Speed Dials** and press the center select key (•◉•) (**OK**).
- 3 Scroll to an unassigned speed dial number and press the center select key (•◉•) (**SET**).
- 4 Scroll to a contact in the Contacts list and press the center select key (•◉•) (**OK**).
- 5 Select a number for that contact and press the center select key (•◉•) (**OK**).
- 6 Select **Yes** by pressing the center select key (•◉•) (**OK**).

## To see an entry's speed dial number:

- 1 From the main screen, press the right soft key (◁) (**Contacts**) to open the **Contact List**.
- 2 Use the navigation key (◉◉◉) to scroll to the entry and press the center select key (•◉•) (**View**). The speed dial number is displayed with the ⚡ icon.

## To speed dial an entry:


Call speed dial entries 1 through 9 by pressing and holding the one-digit speed dial number for one second.

For two-digit speed dial numbers, enter the first number, then press and hold the second number for one second.

# emergency calls

Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers, such as 911, that you can call at any time, even when your phone is locked.

**Note:** Check with your service provider, as emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues. Do not solely rely on your wireless phone for essential communications such as medical emergencies.

**To make an emergency call:** Turn your phone on, exit any open application such as games, dial the emergency number, then press the *Send key* () to call the emergency number.

# AGPS during an emergency call



When you make an emergency call, your phone can use *Assisted Global Positioning System* (AGPS) satellite signals to tell the emergency response center your approximate location.

The AGPS feature has limitations, so always tell the emergency response center your best knowledge of your location. Remain on the phone for as long as the emergency response center instructs you.

AGPS **might not work** for emergency calls:


- Your phone's AGPS feature must be turned on (see page 44).
- Your local emergency response center might not process AGPS location information. For details, contact your local authorities.

For best results:


- Go outside and away from underground locations, covered vehicles, structures with metal or concrete roofs, tall buildings, and foliage. Indoor performance might improve if you move closer to windows, but some window sun shielding films can block satellite signals.
- Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.

If your phone cannot find strong AGPS satellite signals, the location of the nearest cell tower in contact with your phone is automatically provided to the emergency response center.

## voicemail


Your network stores the voicemail messages you receive. When you **receive** a voicemail message, your phone shows the voicemail message indicator .

**Note:** Your service provider may include additional information about using this feature.

Select **Listen Now** by pressing the center select key () (OK) to dial voicemail.

**or**

Use the navigation key () to scroll to **Listen Later**, and then press the center select key () (OK).

The voicemail message indicator () appears on the bottom of the main screen until you listen to your message.

**To check voicemail messages later**, press and hold  to call your voicemail number.




## send a multimedia (picture/video) message







A *multimedia message* contains embedded media objects (possibly including photos, picture, sounds, or voice records). You can send a multimedia message to other Verizon Wireless multimedia messaging-capable phones and to other email addresses.

### create & send message

- 1 From the main screen, press the left soft key () (**Message**) to open  **MESSAGING**.
- 2 Press center select key () to select **New Message**.

## receive a multimedia (picture/video) message

When you receive a multimedia message, your phone displays a **NEW PIC/VIDEO MSG** notification, and plays an alert sound.

To view the message immediately, scroll to **View Now**, and press the center select key (◉). To save it in your **Inbox** to view later, scroll to **View Later** and press the center select key (◉).

## To view messages in your Inbox:

- 1 From the main screen, press the left soft key (Message) to open **MESSAGING**.
- 2 Use the navigation key (◂) to scroll to **Inbox** and press the center select key (●) (**OK**).
- 3 Scroll to the desired message.
- 4 Press the center select key (●) (**Open**) to open the message.

Multimedia messages that you receive can contain different media objects:

- Photos, pictures, and animations are displayed as you read the message.
- A sound file begins playing when its slide is displayed. Use the volume keys to adjust the volume as the sound file plays.

## Bluetooth® connections

Your phone supports Bluetooth wireless connections. You can connect your phone with a Bluetooth headset or car kit to make handsfree calls.

**Note:** The use of wireless phones while driving may cause distraction. Discontinue a call if you can't concentrate on driving. Additionally, the use of wireless devices and their accessories may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. Always obey the laws and regulations on the use of these products.

**Note:** All multimedia (video player, audio player, shutter tone, V CAST) will play from the speakerphone

when your phone is connected to another Bluetooth device.

**For maximum Bluetooth security**, you should always connect Bluetooth devices in a safe, private environment.

## turn Bluetooth power on or off

- 1 Press the center select key (•◉•) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (◉◉◉) to scroll to  **SETTINGS & TOOLS**.
- 3 Scroll to **Bluetooth Menu** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 4 Press the left soft key (◻◻) to turn Bluetooth power **On** or **Off**.






**Note:** To extend battery life, use this procedure to set Bluetooth power to **Off** when not in use. Your phone will not connect to devices until you set Bluetooth

power back to **On** and connect your phone with the device again.


## pair with a headset, handsfree device, or PC


**Note: If you use your Motorola Bluetooth headset with both an audio device and your phone, use your phone's Bluetooth menus to connect the phone with the headset.** If you establish the connection by pressing a button on the headset, or if you allow the headset to connect automatically by turning it on, you may experience unexpected results.


**Before you try to connect your phone with another Bluetooth device**, make sure your phone's Bluetooth power is **On** and the other device is in *pairing* or *bonding* mode (see the user's guide for the device). You can connect your phone with only one device at a time.

- 1 Press the center select key () to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key () to scroll to  **SETTINGS & TOOLS**.
- 3 Scroll to **Bluetooth Menu** and press the center select key () (OK).
- 4 Scroll to **Add New Device** and press the center select key () (OK).


**Note:** If your Bluetooth power is not turned on, your phone will prompt you to turn it on.

Your phone lists the devices it finds within range. If your phone is already connected to a device, your phone identifies that device with a  (in-use) indicator.

- 5 Scroll to a device in the list.
- 6 Press the center select key () (**Pair**) to connect to the device.

- 7 If the device requests permission to bond with your phone, press the center select key () (**YES**) and enter the device PIN code to create a secure connection with the device. (The PIN code is typically set to 0000).

**Note:** See the instructions that came with your device for the device PIN code and other information about the device.

When the connection is made, the Bluetooth indicator  or a **Bluetooth** message displays in the main screen.

**Tip:** When Bluetooth power is on, your phone can automatically connect to a handsfree device you have used before. Just turn on the device or move it near the phone.

## transfer files

You can use a Bluetooth connection to transfer files between your computer and phone.

**Note:** Your computer's Bluetooth interface may be different.

- 1 Pair your phone and computer (see “pair with a headset, handsfree device, or PC”) and place your phone in discoverable mode.
- 2 **On your computer**, right-click the Bluetooth icon in your System Tray.
- 3 Select “Send a File.”
- 4 Click “Browse” to locate your phone name, and then click “Next.”
- 5 Click “Browse” to locate the file you want to transfer, and then click “Next.”

- 6 **On your phone**, when prompted, press the center select key (•◉•) (ACCEPT) to accept the file transfer.
- 7 When you are finished transferring files, press the Power/End key (⏻) on your phone to close the connection.

**Note:** Breaking the link with your computer does not turn off Bluetooth power on your phone. You might want to turn Bluetooth power off to conserve battery charge.

## connect with another phone

You can use a Bluetooth connection to transfer a contact or file to another phone.

**To transfer a contact to another phone:**

**Note:** Make sure the phone receiving the entry has Bluetooth power on and is in Find Me mode. The receiving device must also be capable of receiving a vCard. Not all Bluetooth devices have this capability.

- 1 From the main screen, press the right soft key (⏏) (**Contacts**) to open the **Contact List**.
- 2 Use the navigation key (⬆) to scroll to the entry you want to transfer and press the right soft key (⏏) (**Options**).
- 3 Scroll to **Send Name Card** and press the center select key (⬇) (**OK**).
- 4 Scroll to **Bluetooth** and press the center select key (⬇) (**OK**).
- 5 Press the center select key (⬇) (**SEND**).
- 6 Scroll to **[Add New Device]** or scroll to the device that you want and press the center select key (⬇) (**OK**).

**Note:** If your phone does not already have Bluetooth power turned on, it prompts you to turn it on.

- 7 If prompted, enter the default PIN code **0000** or accept the transfer.

When the phones connect, and the sending phone begins the transfer. The receiving phone is prompted to accept the transfer. When the receiving phone accepts the transfer, the entry transfers.

### **To transfer a file to another phone:**

**Note:** Make sure the phone receiving the file has Bluetooth power on and is in Find Me mode. The receiving phone must be capable of receiving the file type.

- 1 On your phone, select the file (such as a picture, video, or sound) you want to transfer and press the right soft key (⏏) (**Options**).
- 2 Use the navigation key (⬆) to scroll to **Send** and press the center select key (⬇) (**OK**).
- 3 Scroll to **Bluetooth** and press the center select key (⬇) (**OK**).

- 4 Scroll to **[Add New Device]** or scroll to the device that you want and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).

**Note:** If your phone does not already have Bluetooth power turned on, it prompts you to turn it on.

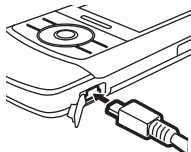
- 5 When your phone prompts you to confirm that you want to send the file, select **Yes** by pressing the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 6 If prompted, enter the default PIN code **0000** or accept the transfer.

When the phones connect, and the sending phone begins the transfer. The receiving phone is prompted to accept the transfer. When the receiving phone accepts the transfer, the file transfers.

## cable connections



Your phone has a mini-USB port so you can connect it to a computer.



- You must use the cables in the Motorola Original™ data kit (see the data kit user's guide for more information).
  - Connect the phone to a high-power USB port on your computer (not a low-power one such as the USB port on your keyboard or bus-powered USB hub). Typically, USB high-power ports are on your computer.
- Note:** If you connect your phone to a low-power USB port, the computer may not recognize your phone.
- Make sure both your phone and the computer are turned on.

## download V CAST music directly to phone



- 4 To buy a song, highlight the song and select the center select key () (**Buy**).


After you press **Buy** your phone shows song details and price.

- 5 Press the center select key () (**BUY**) to confirm your selection.


- 6 When you see a confirmation that your purchase was successful and your music is available for download, press the center select key () (**OK**) to continue, or press the left soft key () to download later.

- 7 When prompted to select a storage location, scroll to **Phone Memory** or **Memory Card** and press the center select key () to begin downloading.


Your phone displays a status indicator. After downloading, you must wait for the phone to acquire the content license.

- 8 Press the right soft key () (**Play**) to play the downloaded song immediately.

**or**

Press the left soft key () (**Library**) to go to the **MUSIC LIBRARY**.

**or**

Press the center select key () (**OK**) to return to the previously viewed music catalog.

## transfer music from a computer



You can transfer songs from a computer to your phone with a USB cable connection. You can purchase these songs from the V CAST Music Store or import them from your CD collection.

## computer system requirements

To access the V CAST Music Store from a computer or to transfer music from a computer to your phone, you need the Windows® XP operating system, Windows Media Player 10 or later version, and an active internet connection.

If you have the Windows XP operating system and an internet connection, you can download Windows Media Player 10. From your computer's Web browser, go to

<http://www.microsoft.com>.

## buy music from V CAST Music Store

- 1 On your computer, launch Windows Media Player.
- 2 In the Windows Media Player window, select the "V CAST Music" option.
- 3 Click on the "Log In" button, then log in by entering your mobile phone number and password.

If you have not registered yet, click on the "Register" button, then follow the instructions to register and get your password.

- 4 Browse or search the store to find the songs you want.

To preview a song, click on the headset icon next to the song title.

- 5 To buy a song, click on the "Purchase" or "Buy" button next to the song title.

- 6 Repeat steps 4 and 5 to add more songs to your shopping cart.

- 7 When you finish shopping, click on "MY PURCHASES," then follow the on-screen instructions to complete your purchase(s) and download the song(s) you have purchased.

Downloading can take several minutes. When downloading is complete, click on the "Library" tab in

the Windows Media Player window to see the songs you purchased.

To transfer the songs to your phone, see “transfer songs to your phone” on page 66.

### import songs from an audio CD

- 1 On your computer, launch the Windows Media Player.
- 2 Insert an audio CD into your computer's CD ROM drive.
- 3 Click on the “Rip” tab in the Windows Media Player window.
- 4 Highlight the songs you want to import and click on the “Rip Music” icon.

The songs are imported to the Windows Media Player Library.

To transfer the songs to your phone, see “transfer songs to your phone” on page 66.

### If you do not see the songs you downloaded in the Windows Media Player Library:

- 1 On your computer, launch Windows Explorer.
- 2 In the Windows Explorer window, open the My Documents folder, then open the My Music folder and look for the songs you downloaded.
- 3 Right-click on each song and select “Add To Now Playing List.”

The song will be added to the Windows Media Player Library.

### transfer songs to your phone

- 1 **On your computer**, launch Windows Media Player.
- 2 **On your computer**, click on the “Library” tab in the Windows Media Player window.
- 3 **On your computer**:

- **If using Windows Media Player 10**, click on the “Select list options” selection (to the right of “Library Options”) in the Windows Media Player window. Then select “Sync List” from the pull-down menu.

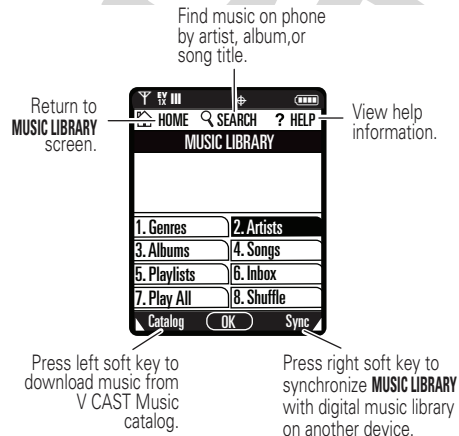
If this is the first time you have connected the phone to a computer with a USB cable, additional software drivers may be installed. (For more information on using a USB cable connection, see page 62.)

- 6 On your phone** from the main screen, press left on the navigation key (◂) to access **Music & Tones**.
  - 7** Use the navigation key (◂) to scroll to **Sync Music** and press the center select key (◉) (OK).
- Wait until the phone display shows **Connected**. (This can take 30-60 seconds.)
- 8 On your computer**, click on the “Start Sync” icon in the Windows Media Player window.
  - 9 On your phone**, wait until the transfer is complete, then press the Power/End key (⏻).
  - 10** Disconnect the cable from the phone and the computer.

You can now use your phone’s music player to play the songs you transferred from your computer.

<b>Inbox</b>	View alert notifications received when new music from a selected artist is available for download.
<b>Play All</b>	Play all songs in the Music Library in list order.
<b>Shuffle</b>	Play songs in the Music Library in random order.

- Press **CLR** from any Music Library screen to return to the previous screen.

- Press the Power/End key (**⏻**) from any Music Library screen to return to the main screen.

#### From the GENRES screen:

- 1 Select the **genre** you want by pressing the center select key (◀◉▶) (OK).
- 2 Scroll to the **artist** you want and press the center select key (◀◉▶) (OK).
- 3 Scroll to the **album** you want to play and press **Options**.
- 4 Select **Play album** by pressing the center select key (◀◉▶) (OK).

Press the right soft key (◻) (**Options**) to select another option (see page 74).

#### From the ALBUMS screen:

### **play all songs on phone**

- 1 From the main screen, press left on the navigation key (◐) to access **Music &Tones**.
- 2 Use the navigation key (◐) to scroll to **My Music** and press the center select key (•◐•) (**OK**).
- 3 Scroll to **Play All** and press the center select key (•◐•) (**OK**).

### **play music from a playlist**

- 1 From the main screen, press left on the navigation key (◐) to access **Music &Tones**.
- 2 Use the navigation key (◐) to scroll to **My Music** and press the center select key (•◐•) (**OK**).
- 3 Scroll to **Playlists** and press the center select key (•◐•) (**OK**).

**To play an entire playlist**, scroll to the playlist you want, press the center select key (•◐•) (**OK**), and then

press the center select key (•◉•) (**Play**) to start the first song. The music player plays all songs in that playlist.

**or**

Press right soft key (⏏) (**Options**), then select **Play playlist** by pressing the center select key (•◉•) (**OK**).

**To play a song from a playlist**, scroll to the playlist you want and press the center select key (•◉•) (**OK**), then scroll to the song you want to play and press the center select key (•◉•) (**Play**).

## music library options menus

**When you scroll to a song** and press **Options**, your phone displays these options:

<b>Add To Playlist</b>	Add the selected song to a playlist.
<b>Move Song</b>	Move the song from the memory card to the phone or from the phone to the card.

<b>Reinitialize Library Database</b>	Under normal conditions, the Music Library is maintained automatically. If the library behaves unexpectedly, use this option to reinitialize it. This option deletes the existing library and creates a new one that contains all currently installed music.

When you press **Options while a song is playing**, your phone displays these options:

**Note:** The song is paused when you press **Options**.

option	
<b>Play All</b>	Play all songs in the Music Library in list order.
<b>Shuffle</b>	Play songs in the Music Library in random order.
<b>Get V CAST Music</b>	Connect to the V CAST Music catalog to download more songs.
<b>Buy music by artist</b>	Connect to the V CAST Music catalog and go directly to a list of music available by the artist performing the current song.

## play music—slider closed

To activate the music player or to resume playback **while the slider is closed**, press and hold the smart/speakerphone key.

The music player begins playback in **Play All** mode (see page 75).

## listening tips

When you're on the go, you can listen to your music through a wired headset with a 2.5mm headset jack, an EMU (Enhanced Mini USB) connector, or by using Bluetooth® A2DP stereo headphones (see page 58).

**Note:** You cannot charge your phone when an EMU headset is connected.

When the phone's slider is open and you are not using a wired or wireless headset, music is played through the phone's speaker.

## create a playlist

- 1 From the main screen, press left on the navigation key (◂) to access **Music & Tones**.
- 2 Use the navigation key (◂) to scroll to **My Music** and press the center select key (●) (OK).

- 3 Scroll to **Playlists** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 4 If playlists already exist, press the right soft key (∇) (**Options**), then scroll to **Create playlist** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).  
**or**  
If no playlists exist, press the right soft key (∇) (**Create**).
- 5 Use the keypad to enter a title for the playlist on the **CREATE PLAYLIST** screen and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 6 Press **CLR** to return to the **MUSIC LIBRARY** menu.
- 7 Select **Genres**, **Artists**, or **Albums**, navigate to the **ALBUMS** screen (see page 70), scroll to an album, and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 8 Scroll to a desired song and press **Options**.

- 9 Select **Add to Playlist** by pressing the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 10 Scroll to the desired playlist and press **ADD** (•◉•).
- 11 Repeat steps 5 through 8 to add more songs.
- 12 When finished adding songs to the playlist, press **CLR** to return to the previous screen or the Power/End key (⏻) to return to the main screen.

## edit a playlist

- 1 Open a playlist (see page 73) and scroll to the playlist you want to edit and press the right soft key (∇) (**Options**).
- 2 Use the navigation key (•◉•) to scroll to **Edit playlist** and press the center select key (•◉•) (OK).
- 3 Edit the playlist as desired.

To change the order of songs in your playlist, scroll to a song and press the center select key (•◉•) (**Move**). Then scroll up or down to move

the song up or down in the playlist. When finished, press the center select key (•◉•) (**Save**).

To delete a song, scroll to the song and press the right soft key (◁) (**Remove**).

- 4 Press **CLR** to return to the previous screen or Power/End key (⏻) to return to the main screen.

## record & play voice records

You can create a voice record that you can play back later as a reminder for yourself.

### create voice record

- 1 From the main screen, press left on the navigation key (◀) to access **Music & Tones**.
- 2 Use the navigation key (◀) to scroll to **My Sounds** and press the center select key (•◉•) (**OK**).

- 3 Scroll to **Record New** and press the center select key (•◉•) (**OK**).
- 4 Press the center select key (•◉•) (**OK**) to begin recording, then press the center select key (•◉•) (**STOP**) when finished.

The voice record is automatically saved and displayed in the **MY SOUNDS** list.

**Tip:** To create a voice record quickly, press and hold the voice key (on the right side of the phone), then press the center select key (•◉•) (**OK**) to begin recording. Press the center select key (•◉•) (**STOP**) when finished. You can press the left soft key (◁) (**Save**) to save it, press the center select key (•◉•) (**SEND**) to send it, or press the right soft key (▷) (**Erase**) to erase it. Press the Power/End key (⏻) to exit.

### play voice record

- 1 From the main screen, press left on the navigation key (◀) to access **Music & Tones**.

- 2 Use the navigation key (◂◃) to scroll to **My Sounds** and press the center select key (◂◃) (OK).
- 3 Scroll to the file name of the desired voice record and press the center select key (◂◃) (PLAY).

**Tip:** You can rename voice records. In **My Sounds**, your phone displays an 🎤 indicator beside the names of voice records that you created. Scroll to the voice record you want to rename, press the right soft key (⏏) (Options), then scroll to and select **Rename**.

## record & play video clips

You can record a video clip with your phone and send it in a multimedia message to other wireless phone users.

Your camera lens is on the back of your phone when the phone is open (see page 1). **To get the clearest**

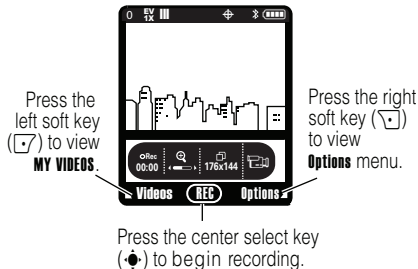
**video clips, wipe the lens clean with a soft, dry cloth before you capture a video clip.**

## record a video clip

To activate your phone's camcorder:

- 1 Press and hold the camera key (📷).

The active viewfinder image appears:



**Note:** You can change the view from the default portrait mode to landscape orientation by pressing up on the navigation key (◂◃). Press up

to switch back. “Up” changes depending on how you are holding your phone.

- 2 Point the camera lens at the video subject.

Press left and right on the navigation key (◂◃) to zoom in and out.

- 3 Press the center select key (◉) (REC) to begin recording.

Press the right soft key (⏸) (Pause) to temporarily stop recording. Press the right soft key (⏪) (Resume) to continue.

- 4 Press the center select key (◉) (STOP) to stop recording.

- 5 Press the left soft key (⏮) (Save) to save the video clip.

(**Max Memory**), and switching the storage device to a 2 GB removable memory card.

## play video clip

To play a video clip stored on your phone:

- 2 Use the navigation key (◂) to scroll to **Picture & Video** and press the center select key (◉) (OK).

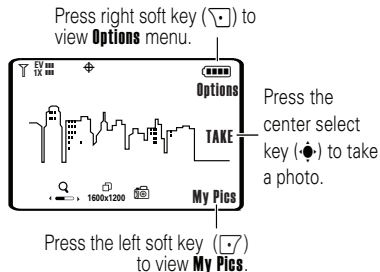
Your phone has a 2 megapixel digital camera that can take photos at up to 1200 x 1600 pixels resolution. You can use camera mode when the slider is closed. You can take a photo with your phone and send it in a multimedia message to other wireless phone users.



Your camera lens is on the back of your phone (see page 2). **To get the clearest photos, wipe the lens clean with a soft, dry cloth before you capture a photo.**

## take & send photo


- 5 To activate the camera, press the camera key ()..

The active viewfinder image appears on your phone's screen in landscape mode by default:



**Note:** You can change the view to portrait orientation by pressing up on the navigation key (). In landscape mode, up is toward .

Press left and right on the navigation key () to zoom in and out.

Press the right soft key () (**Options**) to see more options.

- 7** Press the center select key (•◉•) (**SEND**) to save the photo and go to the **CREATE PICTURE MESSAGE** screen.

**or**

Press the right soft key (☐) (**Erase**) to delete the photo and return to the active viewfinder.

- Speak numbers at a normal speed and volume, and pronounce each digit distinctly. Avoid pausing between digits.
- Your phone may be set to play voice command instructions through the speakerphone when you press the voice key, enabling you to see the **VOICE COMMANDS** menu. If you then use the **Call** command to place a call, audio plays through the phone’s earpiece when the call connects. You can turn this feature off if desired (see page 98).

### voice recognition settings

#### Choice Lists

If your phone is not sure that it has correctly identified a name or number that you speak, it can display up to three choices and prompt you to confirm the correct one.

You can control when choice lists appear:

**Automatic**—Display a list of choices from multiple alternatives.

**Always On**—Always display a list of choices when there are multiple alternatives.

**Always Off**—Never display a choice list. The phone chooses from the best alternatives.

### voice recognition settings

#### Sensitivity

This setting allows you to fine tune the phone's ability to recognize voice commands.

**If sensitivity is too strict**, your phone will often reject voice commands and display "Please repeat..." or "No match found." Adjust the sensitivity toward **Reject Less**.

**If sensitivity is too forgiving**, you will often experience false activations (indicating that the phone detects a wrong match). Adjust the **Sensitivity** setting toward **Reject More**.

## voice recognition settings

### Digit Dialing

Adapt digit dialing to your voice:

**Adapt Digits**—Adapt digits to improve recognition of spoken phone numbers. Adaptation takes about sixty seconds.

**Reset Digits**—Erase any digital adaptation you did previously and reset digit recognition to the factory default. If you have not adapted digits, this option appears in gray (not available).

## voice recognition settings

**Sound**—Customize the voice recognition interface by turning playback on or off for prompts, names, and numbers. You can also adjust the speed and volume of name playback.


**Prompts**—Turn playback on or off for prompts such as “Please say a command.”

**Digits**—Turn playback on or off for digits (for example, when confirming a phone number).

**Names**—Turn playback on or off for names.




## This model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 W/kg.<sup>1</sup> Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR

level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this model phone when tested for use at the ear is 1.49 W/kg, and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 1.08 W/kg.<sup>2</sup>

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.

## External Antenna Care
