Wi-Fi™ connect

If you want to use a Wi-Fi network for even faster Internet access, touch the Quick Settings Menu and drag upward.

Touch Settings > Wireless & networks > Wi-Fi settings. Then touch Wi-Fi to search for and connect to wireless networks.

Key tips

Sleep & wake up

To save your battery, prevent accidental touches. or when you want to wipe smudges off your touchscreen, put the touchscreen to sleep by pressing Power/Lock Co. To



pressing Power/Lock . To wake up the touchscreen, just press Power/Lock again.


Lock screen



Touch tips

Here are some tips on how to navigate around your DROID XOOM by Motorola.

Touch

To choose an icon o option, *touch* it.



Touch & hold

To open special options, touch and hold an icon or other item.



Drag

To scroll through a list or move slowly, *drag* across the touchscreen.

Tip: When you drag or flick a list, a *scroll bar* appears on the right. Drag the scroll bar to move the list to a letter A - Z.

Flick

To scroll through a list or move quickly, *flick* across the touchscreen (drag quickly and release).

Tip: When you flick a long list, touch the screen to stop it from scrolling.

Zoon

Get a closer look at maps or web pages. To zoom in, double-touch (tap twice, quickly) the screen. To zoom out, double touch the screen again.

You can also zoom in or out by pinching your fingers together or moving them apart on the screen.

Rotate the screen

In many apps, the touchscreen adjusts to display in landscape mode when you turn the phone sideways. Touch the Quick Settings Menu and drag upward, then touch Settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen.

Home screen

The home screen gives you all your latest information in one place.

Note: Your home screen might look a little different.

The home screen extends left and right to give more room for adding shortcuts, widgets, and

Notifications

Your home screen displays notifications such as status, email, or calendar or event reminders.



Touch a reminder to see details.

Use & change your home sereer

On your home screen, shortcuts are icons that open your favorite apps, Web bookmarks, contacts, mail labels, or music playlists. Widgets show you news, weather, messages, and other updates.

Flick the home screen left or right to open other panels of shortcuts and widgets.

 To open something, touch it. Touch Home
 to return to the home screen.

•	To add a widget, touch App shortcuts or App shortcuts or Touch an object and drag it into one of the home screen panels outlined at the top of the screen. (Flick left and right to see all available widgets.)

You can add a folder to organize your shortcuts.

 To move or delete something, touch and hold it until you feel a vibration, then drag it to another location, another panel, or to the trash at the top of the screen.

Personalize

Sounds: Open the Quick Settings Menu, then touch Settings > Sound

Display settings:

- To set display brightness, open the Quick Settings Menu and touch Settings > Display > Brightness.
- To set orientation, open the Quick Settings Menu and touch Settings > Display > Auto-rotate screen.
- To set animation, open the Quick Settings Menu and touch Settings > Display > Animation.

Note: Some apps are designed so that your tablet can "animate" them by rotating, fading, moving, and stretching one or more images.

Search

To search, touch Search , then use the search window that appears.



To search by **voice**, touch , then speak your keyword(s) when prompted.

To **type** your search, touch the search window, then enter your keyword(s) and touch .

Input methods


To select an input method, touch and hold a text entry area on the screen to open the **Edit text** menu. Touch **Input method**, then touch the method you want:

Multi-touch keyboard

Enter text a letter at a time. As you type, your phone suggests words from your dictionary and chosen language. Your phone also automatically enters apostrophes in some words, like "dont." You can also touch two keys at the same time, such as Shift with a letter.

Connect

Your phone uses the mobile phone network (over the air) or a Wi-Fi connection to automatically access the Web

Note: Your service provider may charge to surf the Web or download data.

To use a wireless network, press Menu : > Settings > Wireless & networks. Touch Wi-Fi to turn it on and touch Wi-Fi settings to search for nearby wireless networks. Touch a network to connect.

Select links

When you touch a link, your phone outlines it and goes to that page. If you touch



and hold the link, your phone shows options, like **Open** in new window or **Bookmark link**.

Play web videos

The icon on a web page or link indicates that a video is available. Just touch to begin playback. Double-tap the video during playback to enlarge it for better viewing.





- Select Store location, Focus mode, Exposure, Picture size, Picture quality, or Scene Mode.


Photo options—Until you exit the viewfinder, photos that you take are displayed as thumbnails. Touch a thumbnail to access these options:

- To start a slideshow of all of the thumbnails, touch
- To send the photo in a message, transfer it using Bluetooth® wireless, or post it online, touch ¥.
- To delete the photo, touch in.
- To see detailed information about the photo, touch Details.
- To rotate photo, touch Rotate Right or Rotate Left.
- To set the photo as a wallpaper or contact photo, touch > Set picture as > Contact Photo or Wallpaper.
- To crop the photo, touch > Crop.

Videos

Find it: Launcher icon Tapes > Camera, then slide the toggle (in the lower right corner) up to 4.

Note: To get the clearest videos, wipe the lens clean with a soft, dry cloth before you record a video.



To record the video, touch Touch to stop the recording.

Video modes—You can make adjustments to optimize your video. Touch one of the buttons on the right side of the viewfinder to make changes (you may need to touch the screen to make the buttons appear):

Select and view—Touch the Gallery option (such as Camera roll or Folders) you want. Next, touch a folder name or tag name if necessary. Photos and videos are displayed as thumbnails. Touch a thumbnail to select it for viewing or playback.

When you select a thumbnail, it is enlarged to normal viewing size. Videos are paused at the beginning. Touch the play and pause buttons on the screen to control video playback.

Note: To see the buttons while the video is playing, touch the display.

To send a photo or video in a message or post it online:

- 1 Touch the Gallery option (such as Camera roll or Folders) you want. Next, touch a folder name or tag name if necessary.
- 2 Touch and hold a photo or video, then touch **Share**.
- 3 Choose how you want to share—like Bluetooth or Email.

Manage photos & videos

Find it: Launcher icon PAPPS > Gallery

Media Share gives you an easy way to share your media content—photos, videos, and tunes—with friends and family.

Share your media via DENA devices: The Media
Share wizard guides you through the easy setup steps.

Share photos & videos: Share any photos or videos on your phone, even the ones you created. Or, if you want, see your photos and videos in HD quality on an HDTV or monitor

More tunes: Enjoy favorites from your phone playlist on your home sound system. Or get music from your portable music player and add it to your phone's music library.

Connect

You must be connected to a Wi-Fi network or another device:

- Connect to your computer with a USB cable (see "USB connection" on page 35).
- Connect to a Wi-Fi network or use your own Wi-Fi hotspot (see "Wi-Fi™" on page 33).

Media Share will lead you the rest of the way.

Options

Note: If you're using a Wi-Fi connection, you must allow access to other devices to download media from your phone to share your files. If you want to access media files on other devices, they must allow access.

After you open **Media Share**, touch the **Media Share** feature you want to use.

- Share media—Allow other devices to access media files on your phone. Without downloading any media from your phone, other people can view your pictures or videos, or play your songs, on their own devices.
- Sync media—Sync the media files on your tablet with other devices.
- Copy media—Copy a picture from one tablet to another.

 Play media—Select media for playback on another device in a Wi-Fi network.

DLNA

DLNA lets you expand the ways you can enjoy your photos and videos on a DLNA Certified computer, HDTV, or monitor, using your own Wi-Fi network.

Make sure your phone is connected to an active Wi-Fi network (see "Wi-FiTM" on page 33) and has access to a DLNA Certified device.

- 1 Touch Launcher icon T Apps > DLNA.
- 2 Touch Play media, Copy media to server, Copy media to phone, or Share media. Then follow the instructions you see on your phone.

HD viewing

You can create your own HD videos to view on your wide screen HDTV or monitor in the comfort of your home.

Music

when music is what you need...

Touch and play—instant music. Just open your music library, then select what you want to play.

Find it: Launcher icon P Apps > Music

Tip: When a song is playing, you can add it to a playlist

by touching Menu > Add to playlist.

Your tablet can play many types of files: AAC, AMR, MP3, WAV, WMA, AAC+, and MIDI.

Note: DRM-protected files are NOT supported.

Set up music

Transfer music from your Microsoft™ Windows™ PC or Apple™ Macintosh™ computer to your tablet by using a USB connection (see "USB connection" on page 35).

To transfer music, you'll need:

- USB data cable (included with your tablet).
- SD memory card (16GB—included with your tablet).

Your music is stored on your memory card. Your tablet supports removable microSD memory cards up to 32GB capacity. To make sure your memory card is installed, go to "Charge your tablet" on page 3.

Tip: To see the available memory on your memory card, open the Quick Settings Menu, then touch Settings > SD card & Phone storage.

What headphones can use?

Your phone has a 3.5mm headset lack for wired stereo listening. You can go wireless with Bluetooth® stereo headphones or speakers (see "Bluetooth® wireless" on page 32).


Play music

Open your music library, then select what you want to plav.



Your music is stored by New and recent, Albums, Artists, Songs, Playlists, and Genres. Open the pulldown menu in the top left corner of the screen and select the option you want, then touch the song or playlist you want to play. Touch Menu = > Party

shuffle to randomly play all your songs, or touch **Search** to look for a song.



Music player controls

To control music playback:

- Play/pause—Touch
- Previous/next—Touch
- Fast forward/rewind—Touch and hold
- View playlist—Touch = .
- Shuffle all—Touch ズ.
- Repeat all songs—Touch .
- Volume—Press the side volume keys.

- Add to playlist—Touch Menu > Add to playlist.
- Delete—Touch Menu > Delete.

Music player options

Any time you use the music player, touch, then select Manage music, Library options, Shuffle all, and Search.

Hide, wake, turn off

Touch Home to use another app. Your music continues to play.

When you see in the status bar, a song is playing. Flick down to see details. Touch the song to return to the music controls.

To turn off your music, touch

Playlists

To add a song from the music library to a playlist, touch and hold the song then touch **Add to playlist**. Choose an existing playlist, or touch **New** to create a new playlist.

To add a song to the playlist you're playing, touch Menu **> Add to playlist** in the music player.

To edit, delete and rename playlists, touch and hold the playlist in the music library.

email

sometimes it's best to email . . .

Quick start: email

Find it: Launcher icon > 🚇 Email

Tip: To see more messages, flick or drag up.

Read & reply to email messages
Find it: Launcher icon > Email

Touch a message to open it and all of its replies.

- To respond to a message, just open it and enter your response in the text box at the bottom.
 - To forward a text message, touch and hold a message in the conversation, then touch **Forward message**.
- To open options, touch and hold a message.

Create email nessages

Find it: Launcher icon > 🍱 Email

Choose a message type, such as **Text Messaging** or **Facebook**. Then, enter the recipient and message. In text messages and emails, touch Menu for options like **Insert...** or **Attach Files**.

Receive & open email attachments

When you receive a message with an attachment, open the message and touch the file name to download it. Then, touch the name again to open it. Some file formats can be converted to HTML for faster viewing, and your tablet will show **Get HTML version**.

While viewing the attachment, touch it to save it, share it, and more.

Tip: To send and receive large attachments faster, use a Wi-Fi[™] connection, in "Wi-Fi[™]" on page 33.

Set up email

The first time you turned on your tablet (see page 3), you logged in to your Gmail™ account. You can add any other email account that you set up.

Email contacts

Find it: Launcher icon > <a> Email > <a> Contacts

Touch a contact to view it.

Create contacts—Touch • Apps > Email > Menu > Add contact.

Touch any entry area to open the touchscreen keyboard. When you're finished adding the contact, touch **Save**

Search for contact—Touch and hold Menu to open a touchscreen keyboard, then type a name. To scroll quickly through the list that appears, flick or drag the scroll bar.

Google Maps™

where you are, where you're going

Quick start: Google Maps

Where am 1? What's around here? Don't worry—let Google Maps help you explore your surroundings and find what you're looking for.

Find it: Maps



Note: The map image you see may be a little different.

Set your location sources

Set your tablet to determine your location using GPS satellite signals (highly accurate, but uses battery

power) or using the mobile network (less accurate, but conserves battery power).

To set your location, open the Quick Settings Menu and touch Settings > Location & security > Use GPS satellites and/or Use wireless networks.

Find your location

Note: Don't forget to set your location sources.

From the main Google Maps screen, touch Menu
> My Location. Your location is shown on the map as

. The bigger the circle, the less accurate the location

Find any location

- 1 Touch Menu = > Search
- 2 Enter text in the search box, like an address, business, or city, then touch .

Tip: If it's an address you have visited before, select from the list shown.

3 Touch the search box to view all the results, then touch the one you want.

Get directions

Find your way with turn-by-turn directions. You can even have them spoken so you can keep your eye on the road.

- 1 Touch Menu > Directions
- 2 Enter a starting point address or touch [4] and select My current location, Contacts, or Points on map.
- 3 Enter an end point address or touch [1] and select Contacts or Points on map.
- 4 Select your mode of transport (car, public transport or walk), then touch Go. Your directions are shown as a list. To view your directions on a map, touch Show on map 1
- 5 When you have finished, touch Menu > More > Clear map.

Select map mode

Touch Menu > Layers to select from Traffic, Satellite. Latitude or recent searches, viewed positions or directions.



Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

Exposure to RF Energy

Your mobile device contains a transmitter and receiver. When it is ON, it receives and transmits RF energy. When you communicate with your mobile device, the system handling your call controls the power level at which your mobile device transmits

Your mobile device is designed to comply with local regulatory requirements in your country concerning exposure of human beings to RF energy.

RF Energy Operational Precautions

Specific Absorption Rate (IEEE)

Your model wireless phone meets the governmental requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured to not exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines. and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The quidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed for the safety of all persons. regardless of age or health, and to account for any variations in measurements. The exposure standard for mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The IEEE SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 watts per kilogram (W/kg), averaged over one gram of tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using procedures accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequencies. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be below the maximum value. The SAR information includes the Motorola testing protocol, assessment procedure, and measurement uncertainty range for this product.
