



Use and Care

To care for your Motorola phone, please keep it away from:



liquids of any kind

Don't expose your phone to water, rain, extreme humidity, sweat, or other moisture. If it does get wet, don't try to accelerate drying with the use of an oven or dryer, as this may damage the phone.



extreme heat or cold

Avoid temperatures below $0^{\circ}\text{C}/32^{\circ}\text{F}$ or above $45^{\circ}\text{C}/113^{\circ}\text{F}$.



microwaves

Don't try to dry your phone in a microwave oven.



dust and dirt

Don't expose your phone to dust, dirt, sand, food, or other inappropriate materials.



cleaning solutions

To clean your phone, use only a dry soft cloth. Don't use alcohol or other cleaning solutions.

battery

conserve battery charge

Using certain features can quickly deplete your battery's charge. These features can include downloading music, replaying video clips, and using Bluetooth® wireless connections.

You can conserve your battery's charge by doing the following:

- Turn Bluetooth power off when not in use (see page 101).
- Turn off wallpaper (see page 35).
- Reduce backlight (see page 36).

Battery Use & Battery Safety

 Motorola recommends you always use Motorola-branded batteries and chargers.

The warranty does not cover damage caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers. **Caution:** Use of an unqualified battery or charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard. Improper battery use, or use of a damaged battery, may result in a fire, explosion, or other hazard.

 Battery usage by children should be supervised.

- Important: Motorola mobile devices are designed to work best with qualified batteries. If you see a message on your display such as Invalid Battery or Unable to Charge, take the following steps:
 - Remove the battery and inspect it to confirm that it bears a Motorola "Original Equipment" hologram;
 - If there is no hologram, the battery is not a qualified battery;
 - If there is a hologram, replace the battery and retry charging it;
 - If the message remains, contact a Motorola Authorized Service Center.
- New batteries or batteries stored for a long time may take more time to charge.
- Charging precautions: When charging your battery, keep it near room temperature. Never

- expose batteries to temperatures below 0°C (32°F) or above 45°C (113°F) when charging. Always take your mobile device with you when you leave your vehicle
- When storing your battery, keep it in a cool, dry place.
- It is normal over time for battery life to decrease, and for the battery to exhibit shorter runtime between charges or require more frequent or longer charging times.
- Avoid damage to battery and mobile **device.** Do not disassemble, open, crush, bend, deform, puncture, shred, or submerge the battery or mobile device. Avoid dropping the battery or mobile device, especially on a hard surface. If your battery or mobile device has been subjected to such damage, take it to a Motorola Authorized Service Center before using. Do **not** attempt to dry it with an


- appliance or heat source, such as a hair dryer or microwave oven
- Use care when handling a charged battery—particularly when placing it inside a pocket, purse, or other container with metal. objects. Contact with metal objects (such as iewelry, keys, beaded chains) could complete an electrical circuit (short circuit), causing the battery to become very hot, which could cause damage or injury.

Promptly dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Contact your local recycling center for proper battery disposal.



Warning: Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode.

install the battery



charge the battery

New batteries are not fully charged. Before you can use your phone, you need to install and charge the battery. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

To charge using the charger:

 Insert the charger into the micro-USB connector on your phone as shown.



- 2 Plug the other end of the charger into the appropriate electrical outlet.
- 3 When your phone displays Charge Complete, remove the charger.

Tip: Motorola batteries have circuitry that protects the battery from damage from overcharging.

When you charge the battery, the battery level indicator at the upper right of the screen shows charging progress. At least one segment of the indicator must be visible to ensure full phone functionality while charging.

To charge from your computer:

You can also charge your phone's battery by connecting a cable from your phone's micro-USB port to a high-power USB connector on a computer (not a low-power one, such as the USB connector on your keyboard or bus-powered USB hub). Typically, USB high-power connectors are located directly on your computer.

Both your phone and your computer must be turned on, and you must have correct software drivers installed on your computer. Cables and software drivers are available in Motorola Original TM data kits, sold separately.

turn it on & off

To turn on your phone,

(日)

press and hold the Power/End key (1 until the display turns on.



The phone may require

several seconds to turn on. If prompted, use the keypad to enter your four-digit unlock code (which, by default, is the last four digits of your phone number) and press the center select key (•) (**0K**) to unlock the phone.

To turn off your phone, press and hold the Power/End key (①).

make a call

Enter a phone number and press the Send key ((to make a call.

To make a call outside the U.S.A., press and hold ★ until you see + . Then, press number keys to dial the country code and phone number, and press the Send key (⑤).

answer a call

When your phone rings and/or vibrates, press the Send key () to answer.

Tip: You can set the phone to answer calls when you open the flip (see page 34).

end a call

To "hang up," press the Power/End key (10).

You can also end a call by closing the flip, **if you are not connected to a headset or a handsfree car kit.**Closing the flip does not end the following:

- a data connection using a USB cable to connect the phone to a computer
- wallpapers, screen savers, banners, and other similar applications
- active BREW® download sessions, such as downloading music or ringtones

store a phone number

To store a phone number in Contacts:

- 1 Use the keypad to enter a phone number in the main screen and press the left soft key () (Save).
- 2 Select Add New Contact by pressing the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 3 Use the navigation key $(•\hat{\mathbf{Q}}•)$ to scroll to an entry type and press the center select key $(•\hat{\mathbf{Q}}•)$ (0K).
- 4 Use the keypad to enter a name and other details for the phone number and press the center select key (*\hat{\dagge}\cdot) (Save) to store the number.

To edit or delete a Contacts entry, see page 90.

Tip: You can set your phone to display a picture or play a special ringtone for a caller (see page 92).

call a stored phone number


- 1 From the main screen, press the right soft key () (Contacts) to open the Contact List.
- 2 Scroll to the Contacts entry.
 - If the entry has more than one phone number, press the navigation key $(\cdot \hat{\mathbf{Q}} \cdot)$ right or left to toggle between the numbers.
- **3** Press the Send key () to call the entry.

basics

main screen

The main screen appears when you turn on the phone.



To dial a number from the main screen, press number keys and the Send key (().

Press the center select key (••) to open the main menu. *Soft key labels* show current soft key functions. (For soft key locations, see page 2.)

Tip: You can quickly select a menu option by pressing the number for that option. For example, from the SETTINGS & TOOLS menu, press 5 to select Display Settings.


Press up, down, left, or right on the navigation key $(\hat{\mathbf{Q}})$ to open these shortcuts:

TEV 1X Signal Strength

EVDO indicator shows when phone is in EVDO coverage area (necessary for V CAST services). 1X indicator shows when phone is in 1x-RTT coverage area. Number of bars show strength of each signal.

▲ Roaming

Indicates phone is roaming off your home network.

S SSL

Indicates application verification is via SSL during a download session.

P Voice Privacy

Indicates Voice Privacy is On (see page 29.

alert/indicator

Shows during data call, tethered mode, or WAP/BREW application.

Indicates phone is dormant and PPP session is active

☑ No Service

Phone is in area with no service coverage.

Ω ΤΤΥ

Phone is in TTY mode.

■ Voice Call

Shows during an active voice call.

alert/indicator

⊕ E911

Indicates E911 is On.

Indicates Location is set to On.

Battery Level

Shows battery strength. The more bars, the greater the charge.

Speakerphone

Indicates handsfree speaker is on.

I Missed Call

Indicates a call was missed.

Shows when you receive a new message.

Shows number of calendar appointments.

New Voicemail New Voicemail

Shows when a voicemail message is received.

O Alarm On

Shows when an alarm has been set.

alert/indicator

™ Bluetooth Connection Active

Indicates your phone is paired to another Bluetooth device.

⊕ OFF ✓ Standalone Mode

Shows when your phone is in standalone mode.

adjust volume

Press the volume keys to:

- · turn off an incoming call alert
- change the earpiece volume during calls
- change the ringer volume from the main screen (see page 21)

change sound settings

Press the down volume key to switch to lower call sounds volume, then cycle through Vibrate Only, Alarm Only, and, All Sounds Off.



Press the up volume key to cycle back from All Sounds Off to Alarm Only, then Vibrate Only, and then to the lowest call volume setting.

handsfree

Note: The use of wireless phones while driving may cause distraction. Discontinue a call if you can't concentrate on driving. Additionally, the use of wireless devices and their accessories may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. Always obey the laws and regulations on the use of these products.

handsfree speaker

You can use your phone's handsfree speaker to make calls without holding the phone to your ear.

To activate the handsfree speaker during a call, press and hold the smart/-speakerphone key.



You will hear an audio alert and see the speakerphone indicator

The handsfree speaker stays on until you press and hold the speaker key again or turn off the phone.

To turn off the handsfree speaker, press and hold the smart/speakerphone key.

To end the call, press the Power/End key (). You will hear an audio alert.

Note: The handsfree speaker won't work when your phone is connected to a handsfree car kit or headset.

accessory volume settings (car kit or headset)



To adjust volume of headsets or car kit accessories that are enable for Bluetooth wireless connections, press your phone's up or down volume key during an active call.

standalone mode

Note: Consult airline staff about the use of **Standalone Mode** in flight. Turn off your phone whenever instructed to do so by airline staff.

Use *standalone mode* to turn off your phone's calling features in locations where wireless phone use is prohibited. **You cannot make or receive calls or use Bluetooth in standalone mode**, but you can use your phone's other non-calling features.

Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (★♠) (OK).
- Press center select key (*•) to select Standalone Mode.

When **Standalone Mode** is set to **On**, your phone displays indicators and a message on the main screen:



change lock code

Your phone's four-digit **lock code** is originally set to the last four digits of your phone number. To change the lock code:

- 1 Press the center select key (�) to open the menu.
- Use the navigation key (♣♠) to scroll to ★ SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 4 Scroll to Security and press the center select key (🏚) (OK).
- When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center select key (••) (OK).
- 6 Scroll to Edit Codes and press the center select key (♠) (OK).

- 8 Enter the new four-digit lock code in the Enter New Code entry area, then press down on the navigation key (*Q**) to move the cursor into the Re-Enter New Code entry area. Re-enter the new four-digit lock code.
- 9 Press the center select key (•••) (OK).

lock & unlock phone

You can lock your phone to keep others from using it. To lock or unlock your phone, you need the four-digit lock code (which is originally set to the last four digits of your phone number).

Note: You can make emergency calls on a locked phone (see page 46). A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages.

To manually lock your phone:

- 1 Press the center select key (•) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (��•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- Scroll to Security and press the center select key (*\ointing*) (OK).
- When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center select key (••) (OK).
- **6** Scroll to Lock Phone Now and press the center select key $(\hat{-\phi})$ (OK).

To **automatically lock** your phone whenever you turn it off:

Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.

- Use the navigation key (♠) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (*\outleter*) (OK).
- Scroll to Security and press the center select key (*\oightarrow*) (OK).
- When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center select key (•••) (OK).
- 6 Scroll to Phone Lock and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 7 Scroll to On Power Up and press the center select key (*\hat{\omega}*) (OK).
- 8 Press the Power/End key () to return to the main screen.

To unlock the phone, enter the four-digit lock code in the Enter Lock Code entry area and press the center select key ($\hat{\bullet}$) (OK).

manage memory



You can store multimedia content such as songs and photos on your phone's internal memory or on a removable microSD memory card.

Note: If you download a copyrighted file to your phone and store it on your memory card, you can use the file only when your memory card is inserted in your phone. You cannot send, copy, or change copyrighted files.

install memory card

- Remove the battery door from your phone (see page 13).
- With the gold contacts down, slide the memory card into the card slot and push the card in completely.



3 Replace the battery door.

Caution: Do not remove your memory card while your phone is using it or writing files to it. **To remove the memory card**, lightly press the memory card once to release it from the slot, and carefully slide it out.

set memory for multimedia content

You can set whether multimedia content that you download is stored in phone memory or on the memory card.

- Press the center select key (•••) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (��) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- Scroll to **Memory** and press the center select key $(\hat{\bullet})$ (**OK**).
- Scroll to Save Options and press the center select key (+♠+) (OK).

- Scroll to Pictures, Videos, or Sounds, and press the center select key $(\hat{\Phi})$ (OK).
- Select Phone Memory or Card Memory and press the center select key $(\hat{\bullet})$ (OK).

view memory information

- Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Memory and press the center select key (*\hat{\phi}*) (OK).
- 4 Select Phone Memory or Card Memory and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 5 Select My Pictures, My Videos, My Music, or My Sounds, and press the center select key (♠♠) (OK).

move files from phone to memory card

You can move files (such as photos, videos, sound, and music files) to the memory card to free up phone memory.

Note: Moving a file to the memory card deletes it from phone memory.

To move photos or video clips:

- 1 From the main screen, press right on the navigation key (�;) to open * GET IT NOW.
- 2 Use the navigation key (*•Q**) to scroll to Picture & Video and press the center select key (*•Q**) (OK).
- 3 Open the appropriate list (My Pictures or My Videos).
 A memory card icon in the picture thumbnail or next to a video file indicates that the file is stored on the memory card.

An an in the picture thumbnail indicates that the picture came preloaded on your phone and cannot be moved to the memory card.

If the picture or video is not marked with a memory card icon, it is stored on the phone.

- 4 Scroll to the thumbnail of the picture or video clip you want to move and press the right soft key () (Options).
- Select Move and press the center select key (••) (OK).
- 6 When your phone asks if you want to move the file, select Yes and press the center select key (••) (0K) to confirm that you want to move the file.

To move an audio clip that you recorded:

1 From the main screen, press left on the navigation key (*\hat{\hat{O}}*) to access Music &Tones.

2 Use the navigation key $(\hat{\mathbf{Q}})$ to scroll to My Sounds and press the center select key $(\hat{\mathbf{\Phi}})$ (OK).

A memory card icon beside the file name of an audio clip indicates that the audio clip is stored on the memory card.

If the file name is not marked with a memory card icon, the audio clip is stored on the phone.

- 3 Scroll to the file you want to move and press the right soft key () (Options).
- 4 Select Move and press the center select key (・♠・) (OK).

Your phone asks if you want to move the file.

5 Select Yes and press the center select key (-♠+) (0K) to confirm that you want to move the file.

TTY operation

You can use an optional teletypewriter (TTY) device with your phone to send and receive calls. You must plug the TTY device into the phone's headset connector and set the phone to operate in one of three TTY modes.

Notes:

- A TTY is a communication device used by people who are hard of hearing or have a speech impairment. TTY does not work from mobile phone to mobile phone.
- Use a TSB-121 compliant cable (provided by the TTY manufacturer) to connect the TTY device to your phone. Your phone has a 2.5mm jack.
- Set the phone to Medium volume level for proper operation. If you experience a high

- number of incorrect characters, adjust the volume as needed to minimize the error rate.
- For optimal performance, your phone should he at least 12 inches (30 centimeters) from the TTY device. Placing the phone too close to the TTY device may cause high error rates.

set TTY mode

When you set your phone to a TTY mode, it operates in that mode whenever a TTY device is connected.

- Press the center select key (••) to open the menu
- 2 Use the navigation key (•Ô•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- Scroll to Call Settings and press the center select kev (**1**♠•) (**0K**).

Select TTY Mode and press the center select key ('♠') (OK).

TTY Mode can include these options:

option	
TTY Full	Transmit and receive TTY characters.
TTY + Talk (VCO)	Receive TTY characters but transmit by speaking into microphone.
TTY + Hear (HCO)	Transmit TTY characters but receive by listening to earpiece.
TTY Off	All TTY modes are turned off.

When your phone is in a TTY mode, your phone displays the international TTY mode, the international TTY symbol, and the mode setting during an active TTY call.

return to voice mode

To return to standard voice mode, select **TTY OFF** from the **TTY MODE** menu

voice privacy

Encrypt outgoing voice calls and use secure channels when available:

- Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (•Q•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Call Settings and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 4 Scroll to Voice Privacy and press the center select key (♠) (OK).
- 5 Select 0n and press the center select key $(\hat{\bullet})$ (0K).

tips & tricks

From the main screen (page 17), you can use the following shortcuts:

AGPS & your location

Services may use your known location to provide useful information (for example, driving directions, or the location of the nearest bank). Your phone prompts you when the network or a service asks for your location. You can refuse at this point.

When ALI is set to **E911 Only**, your phone displays the Φ (ALI off) indicator, and the phone does not send location information unless you call the emergency phone number (such as 911).

- Press the center select key (♠) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (��•) to scroll to \$\infty\$ SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center select key (*♠*) (OK).
- 4 Scroll to Location and press the center select key (🏚) (OK).

- 6 Press the center select key (♠) (OK) to select the setting.

AGPS limitations & tips

Your phone uses Assisted Global Positioning System (AGPS) satellite signals to estimate your location. If your phone cannot find strong satellite signals, your AGPS might be slower, less accurate, or it might not work at all. AGPS provides only an approximate location, often within 150 feet (45 meters) but sometimes much farther from your actual location.

To improve AGPS accuracy:

- Go outside and away from underground locations, covered vehicles, structures with metal or concrete roofs, tall buildings, and foliage. Indoor performance might improve if you move closer to window, but some window sun-shielding films can block satellite signals.
- Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that

- might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.
- Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.

AGPS uses satellites controlled by the U.S. government and subject to changes implemented in accordance with the Department of Defense AGPS user policy and the Federal Radio Navigation Plan. These changes might affect AGPS performance.

emergency calls

Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers, such as 911, that you can call at any time, even when your phone is locked.

Note: Check with your service provider, as emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues. Do not solely rely on your wireless phone for essential communications such as medical emergencies.

To make an emergency call: Turn your phone on, exit any open application such as games, dial the emergency number, then press the *Send key* (to call the emergency number.

Tip: If you are injured, emergency workers may check your phone for emergency contact information. To store the phone numbers for relatives or friends as emergency contacts, press (whatever you do for Verizon).

emergency call alert

You can set your phone to play an alert when an emergency call connects. **To set an emergency call alert**:

- 1 Press the center select key (••) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the navigation key (•�•) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Sound Settings and press the center select key (*\outleter*) (OK).
- 4 Select Alert Sounds and press the center select key (*\hflare*) (OK).

Note: Master Volume must be set to High, Med High, Med, Med Low, or Low (see page 20). The emergency tone will not play if MASTER VOLUME is set to Vibrate Only, Alarm Only, or All Sounds Off.

AGPS during an emergency call



When you make an emergency call, your phone can use *Assisted Global Positioning System* (AGPS) satellite signals to tell the emergency response center your approximate location.

The AGPS feature has limitations, so always tell the emergency response center your best knowledge of your location. Remain on the phone for as long as the emergency response center instructs you.

AGPS might not work for emergency calls:

- Your phone's AGPS feature must be turned on (see page 37).
- Your local emergency response center might not process AGPS location information. For details, contact your local authorities.

For best results:

 Go outside and away from underground locations, covered vehicles, structures with metal or concrete roofs, tall buildings, and foliage. Indoor performance might improve if you move closer to windows, but some window sun shielding films can block satellite signals. Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.

If your phone cannot find strong AGPS satellite signals, the location of the nearest cell tower in contact with your phone is automatically provided to the emergency response center.

international call prefix

When you make an international call, your phone can automatically enter an international call prefix such as 1 or 011.

To set which international prefix your phone enters:

1 Press the center select key (••) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the navigation key (••Q••) to scroll to SETTINGS & TOOLS.
- 3 Scroll to Call Settings and press the center select key (**\outlete*) (OK).
- **4** Scroll to **Plus Code Dialing** and press the center select key (♠) (**OK**).
- 5 Scroll to an international dialing prefix and press the center select key (*.) (OK).
- 6 Press the Power/End key () to return to the main screen.

To automatically enter the international dialing prefix when making an international call, press and hold ** Your phone displays + to represent the prefix.

voicemail

Your network stores the voicemail messages you receive. When you **receive** a voicemail message, your phone shows the voicemail message indicator **2**^{*1}.

Note: Your service provider may include additional information about using this feature.

Select Listen Now by pressing the center select key (�•) (OK) to dial voicemail.

or

Use the navigation key $(\hat{\mathbf{Q}})$ to scroll to **Listen Later**, and then press the center select key $(\hat{\mathbf{Q}})$ (**DK**).

The voicemail message indicator (\$\mathbb{2}^{\mathbb{I}}|) appears on the bottom of the screen until you listen to your message.

To check voicemail messages later, press and hold 1 to call your voicemail number.

call times & data volumes

Network connection time is the elapsed time from the moment you connect to your service provider's network to the moment you end the call by pressing the Power/End key (1). This time includes busy signals and ringing.

The amount of network connection time you track on your resettable timer may not equal the amount of time for which you are billed by your service provider. For billing information, contact your service provider.

tap mode



Your phone supports Bluetooth wireless connections. You can connect your phone with a Bluetooth headset or car kit to make handsfree calls.

Note: The use of wireless phones while driving may cause distraction. Discontinue a call if you can't concentrate on driving. Additionally, the use of wireless devices and their accessories may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. Always obey the laws and regulations on the use of these products.

For maximum Bluetooth security, you should always connect Bluetooth devices in a safe, private environment, away from other devices with Bluetooth connection capabilities.

profiles supported

This section lists Bluetooth profiles currently supported by this device.

Advanced Audio Device Profile (A2DP—Stereo Bluetooth Profile)—Allows a device such as a Bluetooth enabled pair of headphones to receive stereo audio data stream from a Bluetooth enabled music player with the same profile.

Audio/Video Remote Control Profile

(AVRCP)—Provides a standard interface to control TVs, audio equipment, and similar devices. Allows a single remote control (or other device) to control all of the audio/video equipment to which a user has access.

Basic Imaging Profile (BIP)—Defines how an imaging device can be controlled remotely, how an imaging device may print, and how an imaging device can transfer images to a storage device. For example, BIP enables a mobile phone to control a digital camera.

Basic Printing Profile (BPP)—Allows devices to send text, emails, vCards, images, or other items to printers. It does not need printer-specific drivers.

Dial Up Networking (DUN)—Provides a standard to access the Internet and other dial-up services with a Bluetooth wireless connection.

Handsfree (HFP)—Describes how a gateway device can be used to place and receive calls for a handsfree device. For example, a vehicle handsfree kit could use a mobile phone as a gateway device.

Headset (HSP)—Describes how a Bluetooth enabled headset should communicate with a computer or

other Bluetooth enabled device, such as a mobile phone.

OBEX profiles—

- Audio/Visual Control Transport Protocol Profile (AVCTP) for controlling AV devices.
- Audio/Visual Distribution Profile (AVDTP) for streaming audio and video
- File Transfer Profile (FTP) and Object Push Profile (OPP) for device-generated content (image and video)
- File Transfer Protocol (FTP) for phone to PC transfers
- Generic Audio/Video Distribution Profile (GAVDP)
- Object Push Profile (OPP) for vCard only

Phone Book Access Profile (PBAP)—Makes information from a mobile phone's phonebook available to a handsfree device.

Serial Port Profile (SPP)—Defines the protocols and procedures to be used by devices using Bluetooth connections for RS232 (or similar) serial cable emulation.

Drive Safe, Call Smart SM

Check the laws and regulations on the use of mobile devices and their accessories in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. The use of these devices may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. Go to www.motorola.com/callsmart for more information.

Your mobile device lets you communicate by voice and data—almost anywhere, anytime, wherever wireless service is available and safe conditions allow. When driving a car, driving is your first responsibility. If you choose to use your mobile device while driving, remember the following tips:

 Get to know your Motorola mobile device and its features such as speed dial and redial. If available, these features help you to place your call without taking your attention off the road. When available, use a handsfree device. If possible, add an additional layer of convenience to your mobile device with one of the many Motorola Original handsfree accessories available today.



- Position your mobile device within easy reach. Be able to access your mobile device without removing your eyes from the road. If you receive an incoming call at an inconvenient time, if possible, let your voice mail answer it for you.
- Let the person you are speaking with know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions. Rain, sleet, snow, ice, and even heavy traffic can be hazardous.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving. Jotting down a "to do" list or going through your address book takes attention away from your primary responsibility—driving safely.

- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when your car is not moving or before pulling into traffic. If you must make a call while moving, dial only a few numbers, check the road and your mirrors, then continue.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting. Make people you are talking with aware you are driving and suspend conversations that can divert your attention away from the road
- Use your mobile device to call for help. Dial 911 or other local emergency number in the case of fire, traffic accident, or medical emergencies.*
- Use your mobile device to help others in emergencies. If you see an auto accident, crime in progress, or other serious emergency where lives are in danger, call 911 or other local emergency number, as you would want others to do for you.*
- Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless assistance number when necessary. If you see a broken-down vehicle posing no serious hazard, a broken traffic signal, a minor traffic accident where no one appears injured, or a vehicle you know to be stolen, call roadside assistance or other special non-emergency wireless number.*
