The Equipment Under Test (EUT) is a SUPERTOYS INDUSTRIAL CO., LTD. of Radio Control toy. It is a 1 switch, 1 wheel and 2 buttons transmitter and operating at 49.86MHz. The EUT continues to transmit buttons is being pressed, Modulation by IC, and type is pulse modulation.

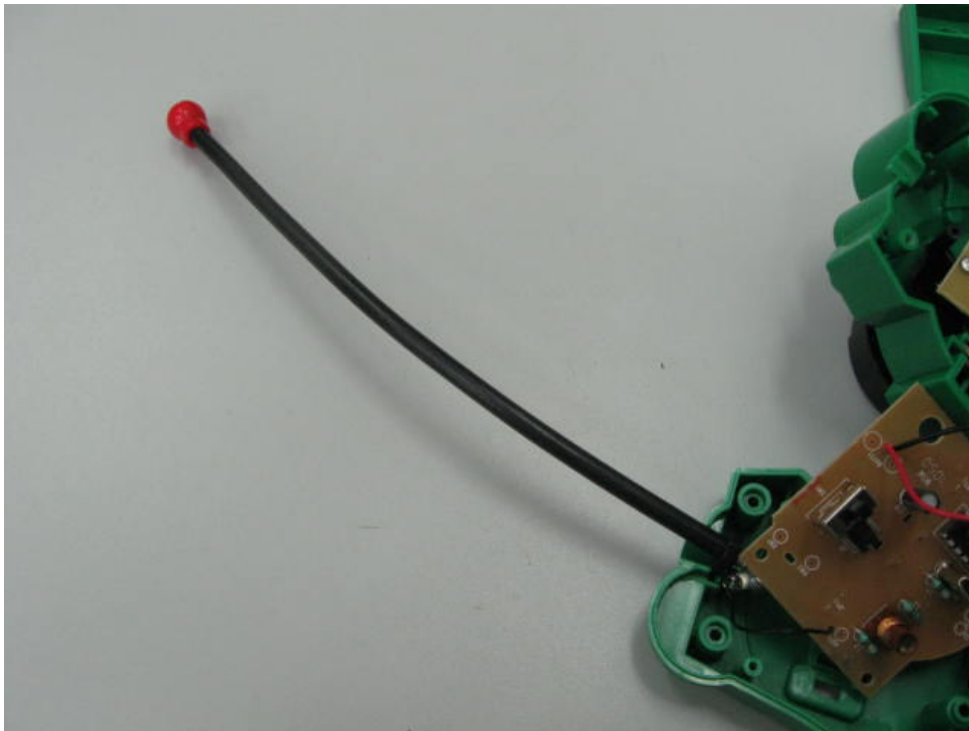
The transmitter has different control:

1. Switch – On / Off control
2. Wheel – Forward, Backward, Left & Right control
3. Upper button – "Try me" mode control
4. Lower button – Light & Sound control

Antenna Requirement (Section 15.203)

The EUT is use of a permanently antenna. The antenna consists of 11.0cm long metal spring covered with rubber. It is soldered on the PCB. The antenna is not replaceable or user serviceable. The requirement of S15.203 are met. There are no deviations or exceptions to the specifications.

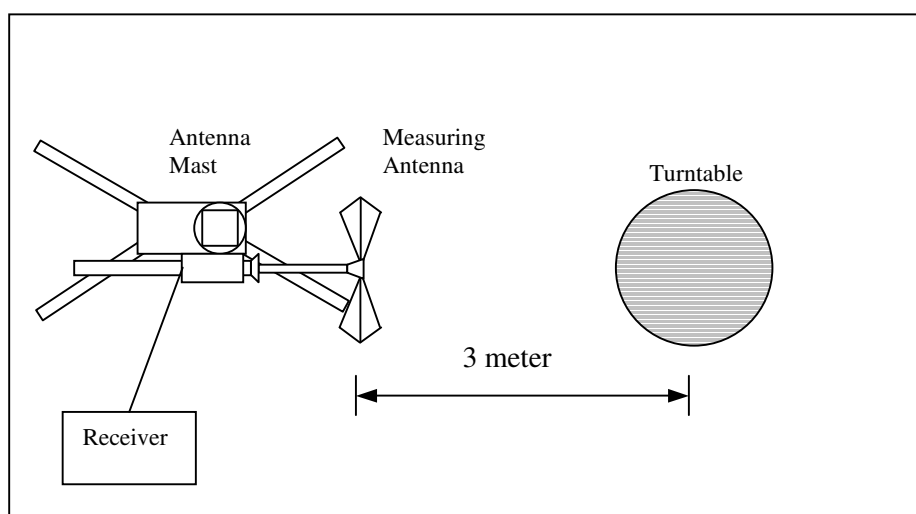
Radiated emissions measurements are investigated and taken pursuant to the procedures of ANSI C63.4 – 2003.

The equipment under test (EUT) was placed on a non-conductive turntable with dimensions of 1.5m x 1m and 0.8m high above the ground. 3m from the EUT, a broadband antenna mounting on the mast received the signal strength. During the test, each emission was maximized by: having the EUT continuously working, investigated all operating modes, rotated about all 3 axis (X, Y & Z) and considered typical configuration to obtain worst position, manipulating interconnecting cables. For battery operated equipment, the equipment tests shall be performed using new battery. The turntable was rotated to maximize the emission level. The antenna was then moving along the mast from 1m up to 4m until no more higher value was found. Both horizontal and vertical polarization of the antenna were placed and investigated.

For below 30MHz, a loop antenna with its vertical plane is placed 3m from the EUT and rotated about its vertical axis for maximum response at each azimuth about the EUT. And the centre of the loop shall be 1m above the ground.

Test Method:

The bandwidth is measured at an amplitude level reduced from the reference level by a specified ratio. The reference level is the level of the highest amplitude signal observed from the transmitter at the fundamental frequency. Once the reference level is established, the equipment is conditioned with typical modulating signal to produce the worst-case (i.e. the widest) bandwidth.

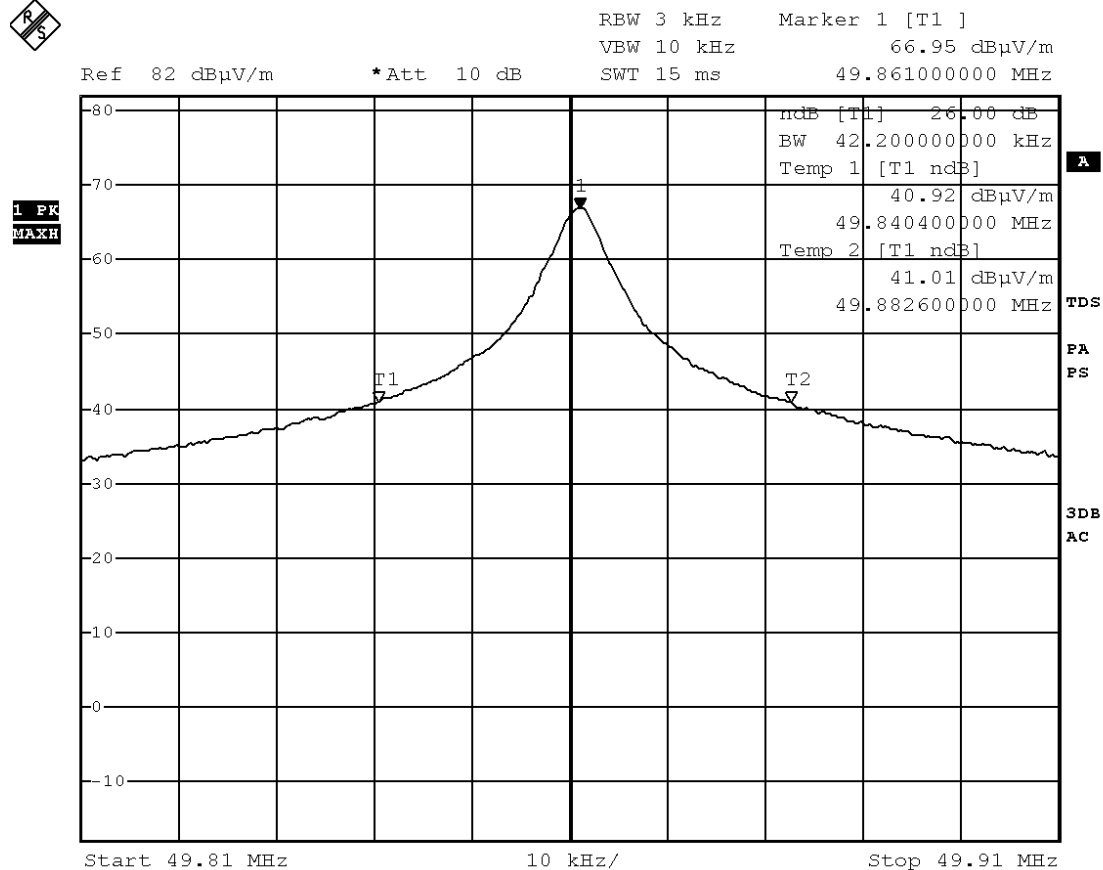

Duty Cycle Correction During 100msec:

Each function key sends a different series of characters, but each packet period (39.0msec) never exceeds a series of 6 long (1.8msec) and 10 short (0.6msec) pulses. Assuming any combination of short or long pulses may be obtained due to encoding the worst case transmit duty cycle would be considered $[(6 \times 1.8\text{msec}) + (10 \times 0.6\text{msec})]$ per 39.0msec=43.0% duty cycle. Figure A through C show the characteristics of the pulse train for one of these functions.

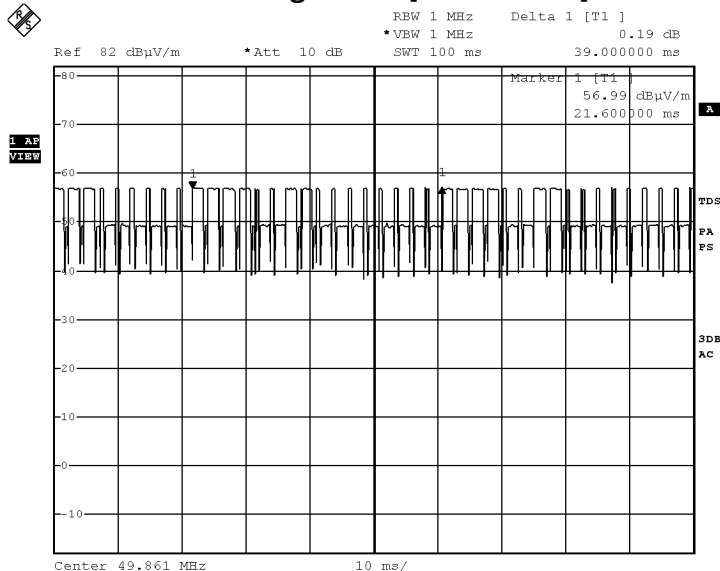
Remarks:

Duty Cycle Correction = $20\text{Log}(0.43) = -7.3\text{dB}$

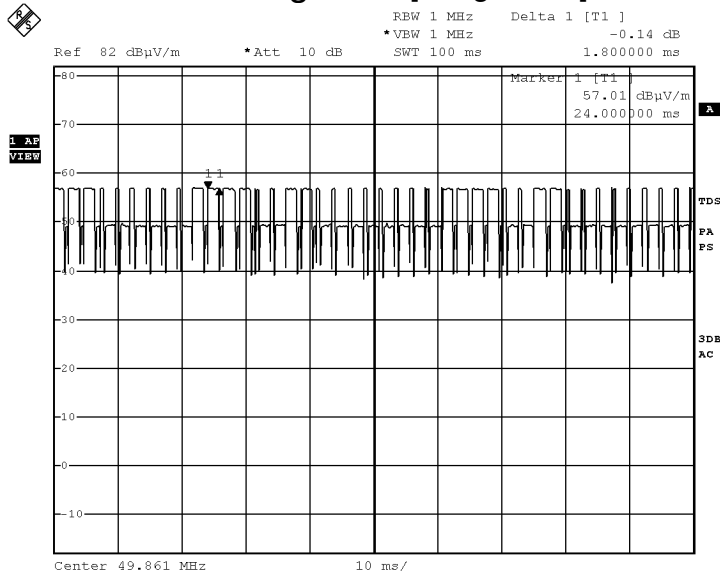

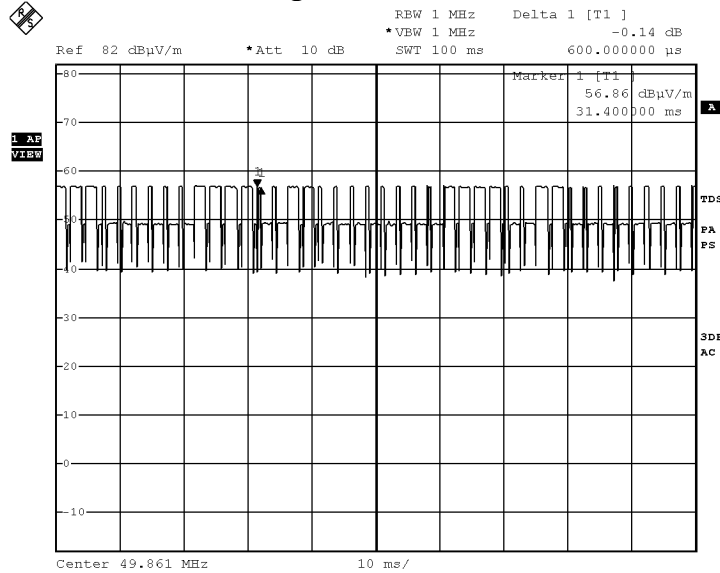
Figure B [Long Pulse]

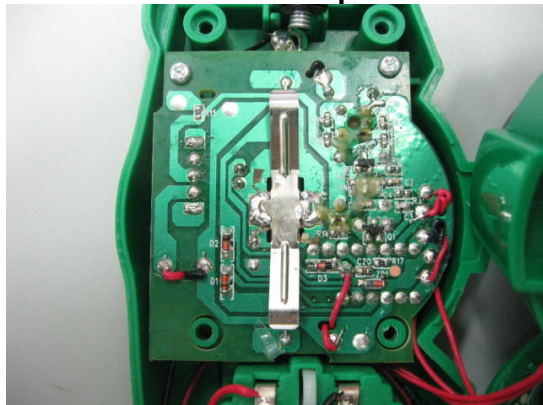

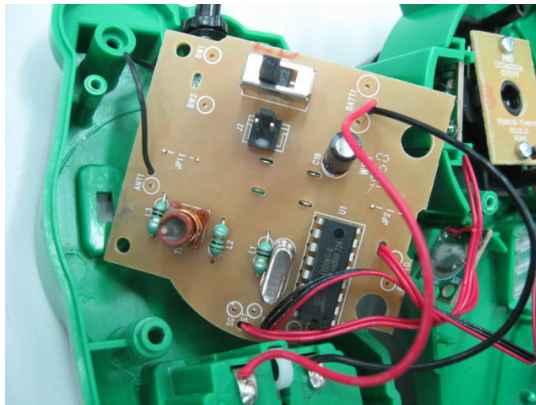

Inner Circuit Top View



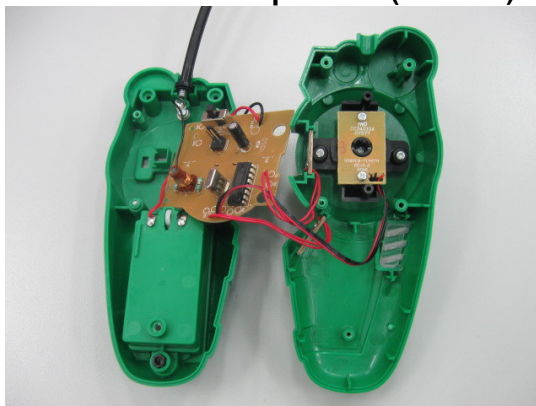
Inner Circuit Bottom View



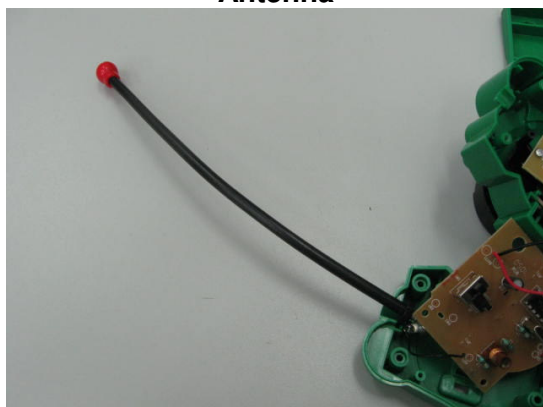
Front View of the product (Internal)
