

Setting up in Windows@ 95/98:


- Shut down the computer and attach the 15-pin gameport connector to the gameport on the Sound or Game Card. Start Windows @ 95/98.
- From the START menu, choose SETTINGS and then CONTROL PANEL.
- Click on the JOYSTICK or GAME CONTROLLERS icon.
- If there is a Joystick icon, go to line 6. For Game Controllers, go to line 6A.
- Select Joystick 1 in Current Joystick
- Select 2-axis, 4-button Joystick Driver in Joystick Selection. Click on CALIBRATE and follow the on-screen instructions.
- After the gaming device has been calibrated, select TEST to verify the gaming device has been calibrated properly. Choose APPLY and then OK before exiting.
- 6A. Select ADD and choose 2-axis, 4-button Joystick Driver, then select OK.
- 7A. After selecting OK, the General screen will appear with the selected driver listed. Note: Remove any other drivers listed under Game Controllers on the
- 8A. Now choose PROPERTIES and then CALIBRATE.
- 9A. Once in the Calibration Utility, follow the on-screen instructions.
- 10A. After the gaming device has been calibrated, choose TEST to verify the gaming device has been calibrated properly. 11A. Select APPLY and then OK before exiting.

Setting up in Windows@3.X and MS-DOS:

Windows 3.X and MS-DOS games that support gaming devices have their own device drivers integrated into their software. Each Windows 3.X and MS-DOS games configures the gamepad differently. You will need to refer to the game manual

Troubleshooting

SYMPTOM In Windows® 95/98, the joystick control panel tells me that

the Raider P_{TO}^{TM} is not connected properly.

SOLUTION Make sure that your gameport is functioning properly. Go to

CONTROL PANEL, then choose SYSTEM. Click on the DEVICE MANAGER tab, and choose SOUND, VIDEO, AND GAME CONTROLLERS. If there is a yellow or red icon next to GAMEPORT JOYSTICK, then this device is not functioning properly. Contact your system manufacturer for information to fix this.

Care for the Unit

The controller is an electronic unit, and should be treated with care when handling. We recommend that you do not store the unit in direct sunlight or at extreme temperatures, or spill any liquids on the unit. Finally, do not open the case of the controller. An InterAct@ service technician must do all service and maintenance.
